
El 16 de septiembre es una fecha emjudica en la historia de México, ya que marca el inicio de la lucha por la independencia del país. Esta fecha es celebrada con fervor y orgullo por millones de mexicanos, no solo en México, sino también en diversas partes del mundo donde residen personas de ascendencia mexicana. La conmemoración de este día es un recordatorio de la valentía y determinación de los héroes que lucharon por la libertad y soberanía de México, y de la importancia de mantener vivo su legado en las generaciones actuales y futuras.

Para entender la relevancia del 16 de septiembre, es necesario remontarse al contexto histórico en el que se dio este acontecimiento. A finales del siglo XVIII y principios del XIX, México, entonces conocido como la Nueva España. era una colonia del Imperio Español. La sociedad estaba profundamente dividida entre los peninsulares, españoles nacidos en la Península Ibérica, que gozaban de privilegios y poder, y los criollos, hijos de españoles nacidos en América, que a pesar de su ascendencia española, se veían relegados a una posición social y económica inferior. Además, la gran mayoría de la población, compuesta por indígenas, mestizos y afrodescendientes, vivía en condiciones de pobreza extrema y marginación.

Este escenario de desigualdad social y económica, sumado a las ideas de la Ilustración que se habían propagado desde Europa, y el ejemplo de otras revoluciones, como la independencia de Estados Unidos en 1776 y la Revolución Francesa en 1789, inspiró a un grupo de criollos a buscar un cambio radical en la estructura política y social de la Nueva España. A esto se sumó la crisis en España, provocada por la invasión napoleónica en 1808, que debilitó el control de la metrópoli sobre sus colonias. **EL GRITO EDOLORES** 

El 16 de septiembre de 1810, en el pequeño pueblo de Dolores, en el actual estado de Guanajuato, el sacerdote Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla, acompañado por Ignacio Allende, Juan Aldama y otros lideres insurgentes, lanzó un llamado a la insurrección contra el dominio español. Este evento, conocido como el "Grito de Dolores", es considerado el acto inaugural de la guerra de independencia de México.

Hidalgo, un sacerdote criollo con ideas progresistas, había estado planeando un levantamiento para liberar a la Nueva España del yugo español. Sin embargo, al ser descubiertos sus planes. decidió adelantar la rebelión. En la madrugada del 16 de septiembre, tocó las campanas de su parroquia para convocar a la población y, desde el atrio, pronunció un apasionado discurso en el que instaba a los presentes a levantarse en armas contra el gobierno virreinal y luchar por la libertad. Aunque no se conocen las palabras exactas que pronunció Hidalgo, su mensaje caló profundamente en la población, que se unió a la causa insurgente.



#### EL DESARROLLO DEL CONFLICTO

La guerra de independencia que siguió al Grito de Dolores fue larga y cruenta. A lo largo de once años, los insurgentes, inicialmente liderados por Hidalgo y posteriormente por otros líderes como José María Morelos, Vicente Guerrero y Agustín de Iturbide, lucharon contra las fuerzas realistas leales a la Corona española. Aunque Hidalgo fue capturado y ejecutado en 1811, su sacrificio no fue en vano, ya que la llama de la independencia continuó ardiendo en el corazón de los mexicanos.

Durante la guerra, los insurgentes enfrentaron numerosas dificultades, incluyendo la falta de recursos, la desorganización interna y la brutal represión por parte de las autoridades coloniales. Sin embargo, la determinación de los líderes y la creciente insatisfacción de la población con el régimen colonial permitieron que el movimiento independentista siguiera adelante.

Finalmente, el 27 de septiembre de 1821, tras la firma del Plan de Iguala y la entrada triunfal del Ejército Trigarante en la Ciudad de México, se proclamó la independencia de México. Este hecho marcó el fin de tres siglos de dominación española y el nacimiento de una nación libre y soberana.

#### EL 16 DE SEPTIEMBRE EN LA ACTUALIDAD

Hoy en día, el 16 de septiembre es una de las fechas más importantes del calendario cívico de México. Cada año, en la noche del 15 de septiembre, el presidente de la República encabeza la ceremonia del Grito de Independencia desde el balcón del Palacio Nacional en la Ciudad de México, donde recrea el histórico, grito de Hidalgo, agitando la bandera nacional y tocando la campana de Dolores. Esta ceremonia es transmitida en vivo por televisión y seguida por millones de mexicanos, tanto en el país como en el extranjero.

El día siguiente, 16 de septiembre, se realizan desfiles militares y civiles en todo el país, donde participan miembros de las fuerzas armadas, estudiantes, organizaciones civiles y grupos folklóricos. Las calles se llenan de música, bailes, y los colores verde, blanco y rojo de la bandera nacional. Además, es común que las familias se reúnan para disfrutar de platillos tradicionales y celebrar la identidad mexicana.

El 16 de septiembre es mucho más que una fecha histórica; es un símbolo de la lucha por la libertad, la justicia y la igualdad. Es un recordatorio de que, a pesar de las adversidades, es posible lograr grandes cambios cuando existe unidad y determinación. Celebrar esta fecha no solo es honrar a los héroes que nos dieron patria, sino también reflexionar sobre el México que deseamos construir para las futuras generaciones. Así, cada 16 de septiembre, el eco del Grito de Dolores resuena en los corazones de los mexicanos, renovando el compromiso con los valores que dieron origen a nuestra nación.

# Your Vote Decides Who Sits on the Michigan Supreme Court

Chances are, you know what's at stake in the next few years: reproductive rights, abortion laws, gun safety, immigrant rights and fair elections – and there's no telling what other issues may come before the court. The Michigan Supreme Court makes the ultimate decisions on the most challenging legal cases in the state, which require thoughtful, insightful, and robust deliberation to help ensure a fair outcome.

In Michigan, Supreme Court candidates are nominated by a political party, but their party affiliation is not included on the ballot. The justices are elected for eight-year terms, which means the votes you cast this year will make a difference for nearly a decade.

Plenty of Michiganders like to check the straight-party box, which is just fine – but don't stop there. To cast your vote for the Supreme Court candidates of your choice, you have to keep going to the non-partisan section of your ballot. You can't miss it. Get to know the candidates in advance, then mark the ballot to vote for the two people you think will do the best job of ensuring a strong, equitable future for our state.

Being a Michigan Supreme Court justice requires integrity, fairness, and a strong understanding of the law. In fact, candidates must be a licensed Michigan lawyer for at least five years. The Michigan Supreme Court is one of the three equal branches of our state government, along with the Legislature and Governor. Michigan voters have the privilege of choosing who is appointed to all three branches – and it's an important responsibility.

Remember: Don't stop at the top! Go all the way down the ballot to cast your vote for the two Michigan Supreme Court candidates of your choice. Your vote counts in every race, so make sure your voice is heard in this one, too.

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

# Por la boca se envejece bien



Madrid.— Un estudio basado en datos recolectados durante más de treinta años demostró que mantener una dieta saludable a partir de los 40 ayuda a envejecer con salud y a mantener un buen estado físico, cognitivo y mental hasta los 70 años o más.

El trabajo, que revela la estrecha relación entre la dieta en la mediana edad y el envejecimiento saludable, fue dirigido por investigadores de la Universidad de Harvard y se presentó en Nutrition 2024, el congreso anual de la Sociedad Estadounidense de Nutrición, que se celebra en Chicago.

La investigación, basada en datos de más de 100,000 personas a lo largo de 30 años, demostró que los que seguían una dieta saludable a partir de los 40 tenían entre 43 y 84 por ciento más de probabilidades de funcionar bien física y mentalmente a los 70 años, en comparación con las que no lo hacían.

"Las personas que seguían pautas dietéticas saludables en la mediana edad, especialmente las ricas en frutas, verduras, cereales integrales y grasas saludables, tenían muchas más probabilidades de envejecer de forma sana, lo que sugiere que lo que se come en la mediana edad puede desempeñar un papel importante en cómo se envejece", dice Anne-Julie Tessier, investigadora de la Escuela de Salud Pública de la Universidad de Harvard.

En cuanto a los alimentos, los investigadores descubrieron que un mayor consumo de fruta, verdura, cereales integrales, grasas insaturadas, frutos secos, legumbres y lácteos desnatados se asociaba con una mayor probabilidad de envejecer de forma saludable, mientras que un mayor consumo de grasas trans, sodio y carnes rojas y procesadas se asociaba a una menor probabilidad de envejecer de forma saludable.

Aunque muchos estudios anteriores demuestran que una dieta sana puede ayudar a prevenir las enfermedades crónicas, la nueva investigación es única en su enfoque del envejecimiento saludable, definido no solo como la ausencia de enfermedad, sino como la capacidad de vivir de forma independiente y disfrutar de una buena calidad de vida a medida que aumentamos de edad.

Los investigadores analizaron los datos de 106,000 personas desde 1986. Los participantes tenían al menos 39 años y no presentaban enfermedades crónicas al inicio del estudio y proporcionaron información sobre su dieta a través de cuestionarios cada cuatro años.

En 2016, casi la mitad de los participantes en el trabajo había fallecido y solo el 9.2% sobrevivió hasta los 70 años o más manteniendo la ausencia de enfermedades crónicas y una buena salud física, cognitiva y mental.

El equipo comparó las tasas de envejecimiento saludable entre las personas de los quintiles (índices) más altos frente a las de los más bajos en cuanto a adherencia a cada uno de los ocho patrones dietéticos saludables definidos por estudios científicos anteriores.

La correlación más fuerte se observó con el índice de alimentación saludable alternativa, un patrón que refleja una estrecha adhesión a las Guías Alimentarias para los Estadounidenses.

Los participantes en el quintil superior de este patrón dietético tenían un 84% más de probabilidades de lograr un envejecimiento saludable que los del inferior.

También se hallaron fuertes correlaciones con los que seguían la dieta para la hiperinsulinemia (asociado a un 78% más de probabilidades de envejecimiento saludable), la dieta de salud planetaria (68%), la dieta mediterránea alternativa (67%), la dieta para detener la hipertensión (DASH) (66%), la dieta de intervención mediterránea-DASH para el retraso neurodegenerativo (MIND) (59%) y el patrón dietético inflamatorio empírico (58%).

La dieta vegetal saludable mostró una asociación algo más modesta (43%).

"Una de las conclusiones más destacadas fue la asociación entre dieta de salud planetaria y envejecimiento saludable", revela Tessier.

"Esta dieta hace hincapié en frutas, verduras, cereales integrales, proteínas vegetales y grasas saludables de fuentes sostenibles. El hecho de que haya surgido como uno de los principales patrones dietéticos asociados al envejecimiento saludable es especialmente interesante porque respalda que podemos seguir una dieta que puede beneficiar tanto a nuestra salud como al planeta", subraya la investigadora.

Los vínculos entre la dieta y el envejecimiento saludable siguieron siendo fuertes incluso cuando los investigadores tuvieron en cuenta la actividad física y otros factores que se sabe que influyen en la salud.

#### Más vale pájaro en mano que cien volando

La frase "Más vale pájaro en mano que cien volando" es un refrán popular que se usa en muchos países de habla hispana para expresar la idea de que es mejor tener algo seguro, aunque sea pequeño, que arriesgarse a perderlo por perseguir algo más grande pero incierto

Sus raíces son antiguas y se ha transmitido oralmente a través de generaciones. Su origen puede remontarse a la tradición europea medieval, donde se usaban fábulas y refranes para transmitir enseñanzas morales y prácticas. La metáfora del "pájaro en mano" y "cien volando" hace referencia a la caza de aves, donde atrapar un solo pájaro es más valioso que intentar atrapar muchos más que están fuera de alcance y podrían escapar.

El refrán significa que es mejor asegurar algo que ya se tiene, incluso si es modesto, que arriesgarlo por la posibilidad de obtener algo más grande que no está garantizado. En otras palabras, se aconseja valorar y conservar lo que se tiene, en lugar de correr riesgos innecesarios por algo que podría no concretarse.

#### Cuándo se dice:

Cuando alguien está considerando tomar un riesgo que podría llevar a perder algo seguro.

En situaciones donde se debe decidir entre conservar una ganancia o un beneficio seguro y apostar por algo incierto.

Al dar consejos para ser prudente en la toma de decisiones, especialmente en contextos financieros, laborales o personales.

#### Por qué se dice:

Para destacar la importancia de la seguridad y la prudencia.

Para aconsejar a alguien que no arriesgue lo que ya tiene en busca de algo que puede no materializarse.

Para resaltar que a veces lo seguro, aunque sea menos, es más valioso que lo potencialmente grande pero incierto.

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

#### **2024 HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH:** Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together.

WASHINGTON: The National Council of Hispanic Employment Pro-Managers gram (NCHEPM) announces the 2024 Hispanic Heritage Month National Poster: "Pioneers of Change: Shaping the Future Together." The theme encapsulates the spirit of innovation, resilience, and unity that define the Hispanic ex-NCHEPM perience. members. Federal agency partners, Employee Resource Groups, and members of the general public selected the poster through a substantive voting process.

Mariana I. Purcell Rivera, a Puerto Rican artist and architecture student at the Pontifical Catholic University of Puerto Rico, submitted the winning theme, stating:

"When we think about the future, it is not difficult to envision wealth, unity, and technological progress. It's easy to fantasize about a society that is flawless, but these forecasts only reflect the possible product of children who will ultimately transform the world as we know it. That is what lies ahead. We Hispanics are deeply rooted in that reality, with many other trailblazers who defied social norms and cleared the path for aspirational Hispanics, such as Sonia Roberto Sotomayor. Clemente, Ellen Ochoa, Julia Alvarez, Cesar Chávez, Rita Moreno, and many others. They help us understand that



there are no boundaries to what we can do and offer to the world.

I aimed to depict all this in my drawing: trailblazers embracing the future and motivating them to co-create the world ahead. In addition we can also see the children's dreams shining above them as they ascend with hopeful glints in their eyes. I also made everyone stare forward in an attempt to get the observer to join in and dream. Our limit is only imposed by our own ambitions, and the future is ours to shape."

From September 15 to October 15 each year. Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month, a time to celebrate the achievements, histories, traditions and cultural diversity of Hispanic/Latino/Latinx Americans whose heritage is rooted in 20 Latin American countries and territories: Spain, Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia, Paraguay, Chile, Argentina, Uruguay, Cuba, Puerto Rico, and the Dominican Republic. The NCHEPM supports the Federal government's observance activities by selecting the annual theme. The national observation began in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson. It was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover 30 days starting September 15 and ending October 15 of each vear. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402.

The goal is to provide an op-portunity for the community to attend a one stop- shop event, focused on introducing kinship caregiver families to resources and support they need to navigate through

the challenges they may experience as a caregiver. Per Monica Morales, NHA's Project Coordinator and committee chair for this event, "all aspects of the event were focused around the most common challenges kinship caregiver families face: Accessing Services; Social, Family Relationships, Parenting, Legal, Financial, and physical and mental healthcare. There are thousands of children across the country, in Ohio and in Lucas County living with their grandparents, relatives, or some type of kin and the numbers are growing. It is most certainly a concern and issue and that is why we and our community partners chose to put together an event that provides caregivers with as much information as they can get in one morning as opposed to chasing after information throughout the city".



Last year, the chair highlighted the legal challenges families face, this year the committee chose to highlight the subject of mental health. "It is important for people to maintain a healthy mindset when going through changes /challenges in life such as caring for someone else's child, that is why we wanted to highlight that particular subject this year' per Monica.

This year's event will include three guest speakers; attendees will hear caregiver testimonials. learn tips on how to care for others that have experienced trauma from experienced professionals and tips on how to practice self-care, especially when experiencing challenging times in one's life.

The planning committee is especially excited to announce that the Ohio Justice Bus will also be onsite for the duration of the event providing free legal consultation for registered attendees. The Area Office on Aging, Lucas County Job and Family Services, Harbor and Unison will present the vari- at 419-309-1312.

ous programs and resources their organizations have available for kinship families. 

#### Movie Review: Bring your global entry card — 'Beetlejuice' sequel's a soul train ride to comedy joy By JOCELYN NOVECK AP National Writer

"I have global entry!"

Now, does that sound like a funny line? Of course it doesn't. Whatever in the history of mankind and airport lines could be funny about global entry?

But put it in the mouth of comedy goddess Catherine O'Hara, and place it in the singularly inventive world of Tim Burton and that wacky afterlife waiting room from "Beetlejuice," and it may become the one blessed time in your life you'll ever guffaw about global entry.

It likely won't be the only thing you'll guffaw about. Burton is back ---and more significantly he is BACK - with <u>"Beetlejuice</u> Beetlejuice," 36 years after the original. And for once, the question "Why a sequel?" is moot.

Not because we know the answer. (Do we?) But, who cares? It's funny. It may even make you feel better about, well, death, "death though not death." And Michael Keaton somehow looks exactly the same as he did in 1988 (to be fair, it

helps that his character Davis, alas not back). was already dead.)

Returning to his tale of Keaton's ghostly, fiendish "bio-exorcist," director Burton brings back much of the team behind the original, including, alongside O'Hara and Keaton, the still-lovely Winona Ryder as Lydia the Goth Girl (also, Bob the shrunken-head guy).

And we've gained Justin Theroux, Monica Bellucci, Willem Dafoe, and for the younger generation, Jenna Ortega, who, as a relatively normal figure, serves as an appealing anchor, her story moving the plot along.

Speaking of plot: if you didn't see the original, not to worry. It all gets explained (as much as it should be ) in time. We begin in Winter River, Connecticut, still home to Lydia Deetz (Ryder), who came as a teenager with batty stepmom Delia and dad Charles, only to learn her new house was haunted by the recently deceased Adam and Barbara (Alec Baldwin and Geena

Lydia looks much the

same - dressed all in black, with spiky bangs and pale skin - but is now a widowed mother, a psychic mediator, and host of a cheesy reality show, "Ghost House," in which she sees ghosts and asks, "Can the living and the dead co-exist?" But one day she sees

something in the audience that scares her: visions of Beetlejuice, who wrought havoc when she was a teen and who, when we last left him, was wasting away in the afterlife waiting room (apparently, HE did not have global entry.)

Waiting just off set to comfort Lydia after this terrifying vision is her manager and boyfriend, Rory (Theroux), who has a little ponytail almost as smarmy as himself.

Lydia then gets a concerning message from Delia (O'Hara), an artist of questionable talent and unquestionable ego. who's mounting a gallerv show in which she herself is the canvas. There, Delia tells Lydia that she's lost Charles.



"Is he divorcing you?" gasps Lydia. "What a horrible thought!" replies Delia. "No, he's dead." (Such lines are catnip for O'Hara, a genius of comic timing). Lydia calls her daughter, Astrid (Ortega), at boarding school. Astrid lists Lydia in her contacts as "Alleged

Mom," which tells you much of what you need to know about their fraught relationship.

But let's pause this account of the living, because we also have to catch you up on the dead. Down where Beetlejuice is stuck, where the dead live - but not the "dead dead" -- Delores, Beetlejuice's ex-wife, has escaped from the crates (emphasis on plural) in which her body has resided. Watching the glamorous Bellucci literally staple herself together is just one of the glorious creative moments Burton and crew give us here. Alas, Delores doesn't have much else to do but this

is rather spectacular. We're approaching spoiler territory, so let's just say that things really get complicated when Astrid goes home to Winter River for her father's funeral. There, she



a marriage proposal from smarmy Rory, Racing off to escape, Astrid runs into a cute young guy reading Dostoyevsky.

A relationship begins, one that will lead to unexpected mayhem. Let's just say Lydia will need to call upon - gasp! -Beetleiuice, who will exact a fearsome price for his services, as he is wont to do.

And he appears none too soon. Keaton, in his white caked makeup and blackened eyes and hair that looks like he is perpetually sticking his hand into a plug in the wall, slips remarkably smoothly into his old role. "The juice is loose," as he likes to say.

But you know who's also got the juice flowing? Burton. It's his inimitable energy that infuses this movie - a joyously rendered sequel that sometimes makes sense, and sometimes

doesn't, but just keeps rollicking. Among the ridiculous delights along the way: A "soul train" in the afterlife, which is not only literally a train of souls, but a replica of the variety show "Soul Train," with people in Afros dancing their way to wherever they are going.

And if we don't have the lip-synced "Day-O (The Banana Boat Song)" from the original, we do have a lips y n c e d

"MacArthur Park," the Donna Summer version "Someone left the cake out in the rain," go the ridiculous words of the disco classic. "I don't think that I can take it. 'cause it took so long to bake it, and I'll never have that recipe again."

In the Burtonian spirit. let's just say it took a long time to bake it, yes, but the director has recovered the recipe - at least enough to make us smile, chortle, even guffaw, for 104 minutes. And we can be happy with that.

"Beetlejuice Beetlejuice," a Warner Bros. Pictures release. has been rated PG-13 by the Motion Picture Association "for violent content, macabre and bloody images, strong language, some suggestive material and brief drug use."




