

Vuelos nacionales: El Real ID será obligatorio a partir de mayo

El Departamento de Seguridad Nacional de Estados Unidos (DHS) implementó una nueva medida, obligatoria, para las personas que tengan vuelos nacionales. El Real ID será necesario al momento de abordar un avión a cualquier destino dentro del país.

El DHS tiene como objetivo mejorar la seguridad en los aeropuertos nacionales y en otras instalaciones federales, exigiendo identificaciones más confiables para evitar cualquier documentación falsa. Este nuevo método entrará en vigor a partir del próximo 7 de mayo de 2025.

De acuerdo a varios reportes, el Real ID será esencial para abordar aviones dentro del país, por lo que quienes no cuenten con este requisito, o un pasaporte vigente, no podrán abordar sus vuelos. Ante ello, es importante revisar y actualizar tus documentos con anticipación para evitar contratiempos.

¿QUÉ ES EL REAL ID?

Como propósito de unificar los estándares de seguridad en las licencias de conducir, en el 2005 se implementó el Real ID como una normativa federal y su principal objetivo es reforzar los controles de identidad y

prevenir el uso de documentos falsificados, mejorando así la seguridad en el país.

Su implementación se creó luego de trágicos atentados del 11 de septiembre de 2001 y en la actualidad no solo será necesario para viajar en vuelos comerciales dentro del país, sino también para ingresar a instalaciones federales y acceder a ciertas áreas restringidas. No obstante, no será la única identificación aceptada, ya que también podrán usar pasaportes vigentes, tarjetas de identificación militar y algunas credenciales federales para los vuelos.

¿CÓMO OBTENER UNA LICENCIA REAL ID?

El Real ID puede ser obtenido por cualquier ciudadano. Estos deberán dirigirse a la oficina local de vehículos motorizados (DMV) y presentar una serie de documentos que verifiquen su identidad y residencia. Los requisitos son los siguientes:

- Un comprobante de identidad, como un pasaporte vigente o un acta de nacimiento.
- Un comprobante del número de Seguro Social.
- Dos documentos que verifiquen el domicilio del solicitante,

como facturas de servicios públicos o estados de cuenta bancarios.

Los interesados en sacar su Real ID deberán consultar los requisitos específicos de su estado, pues estos pueden variar en algunas ocasiones.

¿CUÁL ES EL COSTO PARA OBTENER UNA REAL ID?

Para lograr obtener el Real ID no siempre es el mismo costo, ya que esto dependerá del estado en el que se solicite, por lo que los precios generalmente oscilan entre los \$20 y \$60 dólares. Es recomendable que los interesados verifiquen el costo exacto en su oficina local de vehículos motorizados.

SIN EL REAL ID, ¿PODRÁN ABORDAR VUELOS NACIONALES?

Según la Administración de Seguridad en el Transporte de Estados Unidos (TSA) aquella persona que no presente una identificación compatible con el Real ID u otra forma aceptada, no podrán abordar vuelos nacionales, por lo que enfatiza en la importancia de actualizar los documentos con antelación para evitar inconvenientes. El tiempo límite para cumplir con esta normativa será el 7 de mayo de 2025.

Trump pone fecha para firmar el decreto para aumentar aranceles a México



El presidente electo de Estados Unidos, Donald Trump, advirtió que apenas asuma el cargo firmará un decreto para imponer aranceles a México, Canadá y China, como estrategia para combatir la inmigración ilegal y el tráfico de drogas.

En su plataforma de redes sociales Truth Social, el republicano escribió que "el 20 de enero, como uno de mis muchos primeros decretos, firmaré todos los documentos necesarios para cobrar a México y Canadá un arancel del 25% sobre todos los productos que ingresen a Estados Unidos".

Dijo que los nuevos aranceles permanecerían en vigor "hasta detener esta invasión de drogas, en parti-

cular del fentanilo, y de todos los extranjeros ilegales a nuestro país".

"Tanto México como Canadá tienen el derecho y el poder absolutos para resolver fácilmente este problema que lleva tanto tiempo latente", aseguró.

"Exigimos que utilicen este poder y hasta que lo hagan ¡es hora de que paguen un precio muy alto!", enfatizó.

También amenazó con cobrar a China un arancel adicional del 10%, "por encima de cualquier arancel adicional", sobre todos los productos que entran a Estados Unidos por preocupaciones sobre las drogas, incluido el fentanilo.

Trump añadió que ha mantenido muchas conversaciones con China so-

bre la ingente cantidad de droga, particularmente fentanilo, que se envía a Estados Unidos.

"Pero ha sido en vano, representantes de China me dijeron que instituirían su pena máxima, la de muerte, para cualquier narcotraficante sorprendido haciendo eso, pero desafortunadamente nunca lo cumplieron y las drogas están llegando a nuestro país, principalmente a través de México, en niveles nunca antes vistos", aseguró.

No está claro si Trump realmente cumplirá las amenazas o si las está utilizando como táctica de negociación antes de asumir el cargo en el nuevo año.

¿POR QUÉ DECIMOS...?

"Más vale un tamal en la mesa que un pavo volando"

La frase "Más vale un tamal en la mesa que un pavo volando" es una adaptación humorística del refrán tradicional "Más vale pájaro en mano que cien volando", adaptada al contexto de las festividades navideñas en México. A continuación, te explico su origen, significado y por qué se dice.

ORIGEN

El refrán original, "Más vale pájaro en mano que cien volando", tiene raíces en la literatura española y es uno de los dichos más antiguos del idioma español. Su origen se remonta al siglo XV y se encuentra en escritos como La Celestina de Fernando de Rojas. El refrán enfatiza la idea de valorar lo que se tiene asegurado en lugar de arrriesgarse por algo incierto o inalcanzable.

La versión mexicana sustituye "pájaro" por "tamal" y "cien volando" por "un pavo volando", jugando con elementos culturales y gastronómicos típicos de las celebraciones navideñas en México. Esto refleja la importancia de la comida tradicional mexicana, como los tamales, que son más accesibles y comunes que el pavo, considerado más sofisticado o caro.

POR QUÉ SE DICE

Se utiliza para resaltar el valor de lo que ya se tiene (en este caso, el tamal en la mesa) frente a lo que se desea o se idealiza (el pavo, que puede ser más caro o complicado de conseguir). También es un guiño humorístico que celebra la tradición y la sencillez de los tamales, un plato profundamente arraigado en la cultura mexicana.

EJEMPLO DE USO

1. En una conversación familiar:

"Este año no alcanzó para pavo, pero hicimos tamales."

"Pues más vale un tamal en la mesa que un pavo volando."

2. Entre amigos bromeando sobre la cena navideña:

"Yo quería pavo relleno, pero mi mamá hizo tamales otra vez."

"No te quejes, más vale tamal en la mesa que pavo volando."

Crecen tristeza y soledad en el mundo, revela estudio de la OCDE



LOS sentimientos de tristeza y soledad aumentaron, o se mantienen estancados, en la mayor parte de los países de la OCDE, una tendencia que se atribuye en gran parte al impacto de los confinamientos de la crisis del Covid-19 (2019-2022). Así lo indica el informe publicado por la Organización para la Cooperación y el Desarrollo Económico (OCDE) titulado "¿Cómo va la vida? 2024?" y que indaga en indicadores de bienestar que no son meramente económicos como el sentimiento de soledad, el número y calidad de interacciones sociales y la ayuda de allegados.

La OCDE, un organismo multilateral con sede en París que agrupa a varias de las principales economías del mundo, detalló que 10 de los 38 países del club registraron un aumento de personas que se declararon tristes entre 2019 y 2023, mientras que solo en cinco hubo mejoras. Los 23 restantes arrojaron un estancamiento. "El porcentaje de personas que declararon un sentimiento de tristeza creció en los países de la OCDE, sobre todo en el corto plazo", indican los autores del estudio, que sitúan en un 21% la proporción de personas de los países de la OCDE que dicen haber sentido "mucho tristeza" el día anterior de participar en la encuesta.

Israel, con un aumento de algo más de 10 puntos porcentuales, y el Reino Unido, con cerca de 7, figuran como las naciones con un deterioro más agudo entre 2019 y 2023. Chile consta entre los cuatro países con mejoras, con una caída del sentimiento de tristeza de algo más de 3 puntos porcentuales.

España, por su parte, estuvo estable en ese periodo con un 25% de sus habitantes reconociendo que se sienten tristes, el séptimo porcentaje más elevado entre los 38 países. El informe constata que "la prevalencia del sentimiento de tristeza aumentó de ritmo durante la pandemia del Covid".

Esta crisis sanitaria y social que implicó rígidas restricciones a la movilidad y confinamientos en buena parte de los países también contribuyó a agravar el sentimiento de soledad, de acuerdo con el estudio, que analiza a 23 de los 38 países de la OCDE.

"Estimaciones demuestran que la prevalencia de la soledad pasó, en los países de la OCDE con datos disponibles, de un poco menos del 4% al 14% en 2023", señala el documento, que asevera que las medidas de distanciamiento social de la covid "afectaron a todos los grupos de edad", no solo a los de mayor edad.

Entre 2019 y 2023, el sentimiento de preocupación también creció o se estancó en buena parte de los países del conocido como "club de las naciones ricas".

Entre las 12 en las que empeoró, se encuentra España, con un aumento de algo más de 3 puntos porcentuales, lo que coloca al país ibérico con cerca del 50% de su población con sentimiento de preocupación, solo superados por los portugueses (más del 55%).


Respecto al indicador que mide la satisfacción media con la vida, que va de una escala del 0 al 10, se ha mantenido en un 7.4 en el conjunto de la OCDE en 2023, lo que demuestra "un estancamiento" de ese índice desde la crisis del Covid.

Beware of fake charity scams this Holiday Season

COLUMBUS, Ohio: During this season of giving, the *Ohio Department of Commerce's Division of Financial Institutions (DFI)* urges Ohioans to be cautious of holiday scams, particularly those involving fraudulent charitable organizations.

Fraudsters often use this time of year to exploit the trust and generosity of well-intended individuals. Last year alone, Americans donated \$374 billion to charities; however, according to a survey conducted by AARP regarding holiday donations, 6 in 10 Americans surveyed said they don't always research an organization before contributing. In 2023, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) reported that consumers lost more than \$10 billion to fraud in general, which marked an all-time high.

"It is unfortunate that during a season meant for good will and generosity, there are those who seek to take advantage of unsuspecting individuals," said DFI Superintendent Kevin Allard. "We want to remind everyone to make sure they conduct due diligence before making a financial gift to ensure their contributions support legitimate causes and they don't line the pockets of criminals."

Holiday scams come in various forms, including unsolicited calls, texts, fake advertisements, and emails. Fake charity scams are prevalent, as scammers create deceptive phone calls and websites to steal money and personal information from unsuspecting individuals. Scammers often attempt to closely imitate legitimate charities' phone numbers and con-

tact information, adding another layer of deception.

Ohioans should be particularly wary of unsolicited calls and text messages. The FTC has previously warned of fake shipping notifications via email and text messages. When a link contained in those messages is clicked, malware can be installed on your device, allowing scammers to potentially steal your data or gain unauthorized access to systems or information. Remember, the U.S. Postal Service does not send unsolicited messages or emails containing links.

Tips to Avoid Fake Charity Scams

- Verify First:** Ask for the charity's full name, website, and mailing address, then use the Tax-Exempt Organization Search (TEOS) tool on IRS.gov to verify the legitimacy of a charity. You also can check eligibility for tax-deductible contributions and access information about an organization's tax-exempt status and filings. You may also consider using resources like the BBB's Wise Giving Alliance or Charity Watch.

- Avoid Pressure:** Legitimate charities will accept donations at any time and at any amount. Don't rush into giving.

- Protect Personal Information:** Treat personal information like cash; don't give it freely.

- Be Cautious of Payment Methods:** Avoid making donations



via cash, gift cards, via wiring money, services such as Venmo, or cryptocurrency. By making donations via credit cards, Ohioans can stay better protected from financial concerns.

5. Verify Text Donations: Before making a donation via text, be sure to confirm the charity's number on its website to ensure it is a valid number.

6. Crowdfunding

Caution: Exercise caution when donating to individuals on crowdfunding sites. If you do, make sure it's someone you personally know and trust.

7. Act Fast if You Become a Victim: If you encounter a suspicious charity, you are encouraged to consult the FBI's resources on Charity and Disaster Fraud.

Catedral de Notre Dame revela su interior renovado 5 años después de incendio devastador

PARÍS, Nov 29, 2024 (AP) — Después de más de cinco años de frenéticos trabajos de reconstrucción, la Catedral de Notre Dame mostró su nuevo aspecto al mundo el viernes, con techos altos reconstruidos y una cantería cremosa como nueva que borra los sombríos recuerdos de su devastador incendio en 2019.

Las imágenes transmitidas en vivo de una visita al sitio del presidente francés Emmanuel Macron mostraron el interior de la icónica catedral como podrían haberlo experimentado los fieles en la época medieval, sus amplios y abiertos espacios llenos de luz brillante en un día de invierno fresco y soleado que iluminaba los vibrantes colores de los vitrales.

Afuera, el monumento sigue siendo un sitio de construcción, con andamios y grúas. Pero el interior renovado —mostrado en todo su esplendor el viernes por primera vez antes que el público pueda volver el 8 de diciembre— resultó ser impresionante.

Los canteros arreglaron los techos arrasados

Ya no están los enormes agujeros que el incendio abrió en los techos abovedados, dejando montones de escombros carbonizados. Nueva cantería ha sido cuidadosamente ensamblada para reparar y llenar las heridas que habían dejado el interior de la catedral expuesto a los elementos. Delicados ángeles dorados observan desde el centro de uno de los techos reconstruidos, elevándose nuevamente sobre el transepto.

Las paredes de piedra caliza de color crema brillante de la catedral parecen nuevas, limpias no sólo del polvo del

incendio sino también de la suciedad que se había acumulado durante siglos.

La catedral atraía a millones de fieles y visitantes anualmente antes del incendio del 15 de abril de 2019, que obligó a cerrarla y convirtió el monumento en el corazón de París en una zona prohibida excepto para artesanos, arquitectos y otros movilizados para la reconstrucción.

Macron entró a través de las gigantescas y detalladamente talladas puertas frontales de la catedral y miró hacia los techos con asombro. Estuvo acompañado por su esposa, Brigitte, el arzobispo de París y otros.


Se desplegaron técnicas nuevas y antiguas

Potentes aspiradoras se utilizaron primero para eliminar el polvo tóxico liberado cuando el incendio derritió los techos de plomo de la catedral.

Luego se rociaron finas capas de látex sobre las superficies y se retiraron unos días después, llevándose la suciedad con ellas. También se utilizaron geles de limpieza en algunas paredes que habían sido pintadas, eliminando muchos años de suciedad acumulada y revelando sus colores brillantes una vez más.

"Da la sensación de que se construyó ayer, como si acabara de nacer, a pesar de que Notre Dame es muy antigua", dijo el cantero Adrien Willeme, que trabajó en la reconstrucción. "Como se ha restaurado y limpiado con tanto cuidado, tiene un aspecto realmente extraordinario".

También se utilizaron geles limpiadores en algunas paredes que habían sido pintadas, eliminando muchos años de suciedad acumulada y revelando de nuevo sus brillantes colores.



Los carpinteros trabajaron a mano como sus homólogos medievales mientras tallaban vigas gigantes de roble para reconstruir el techo y la aguja que colapsaron como una lanza llameante en el infierno. Las vigas muestran las marcas del trabajo de los carpinteros, con abolladuras hechas en la madera por sus hachas de mano.

Se talaron unos 2,000 árboles de roble para reconstruir estructuras de techos tan densas e intrincadas que se les apoda "el bosque".

Se desplegaron técnicas nuevas y antiguas

Es un adelanto antes de la reapertura La visita de Macron dio inicio a una serie de eventos que marcan la reapertura de la obra maestra gótica del siglo XII. Al final de su recorrido, el presidente se dirigió a cientos de trabajadores reunidos en el interior de la catedral y les agradeció su labor en lo que denominó la "obra del siglo".

"La conmoción de la reapertura será, quiero creerlo, tan fuerte como la del incendio. Pero será un shock de esperanza", dijo. "El infierno de Notre Dame fue una herida para la nación. Y ustedes fueron su remedio".

Macron regresará el 7 de diciembre para pronunciar un discurso y asistir a la consagración del nuevo altar durante una misa solemne al día siguiente.

not required to pay for the processing of the venison.



Fallece Silvia Pinal, primera actriz y diva del Cine de Oro mexicano

Ciudad de México, Nov 28, 2024 (AP) — La primera actriz mexicana Silvia Pinal, diva del Cine de Oro y quien compartió créditos con Cantinflas, Tin Tan y Pedro Infante, y protagonizó la cinta de Luis Buñuel "Viridiana" que fue laureada en Cannes, falleció el jueves. Tenía 93 años.

La Asociación Nacional de Intérpretes y la secretaría de Cultura de México, Claudia Curiel de Icaza, lamentaron su fallecimiento en sus cuentas de X.

"Su legado como artista y su contribución a nuestra cultura son inolvidables. Descanse en paz", escribió la secretaria.

Días antes, sus familiares informaron que estaba hospitalizada por afecciones de una infección en vías urinarias. En sus últimos años también padeció COVID-19, neumonía y llagas en su espalda. En 2020 debió someterse a una cirugía de cadera tras sufrir una caída.

Pinal tuvo una carrera de más seis décadas en las que apareció en más de 60 películas producidas en México, Argentina, España e incluso Estados Unidos. A partir de la década de 1960, comenzó su igualmente prolífica carrera televisiva, con programas como "Mujer casos de la vida real" y "Silvia y Enrique" y las telenovelas "El privilegio de amar" y "Soy tu dueña".

A la par de su faceta como actriz, Pinal sobresalió como productora teatral, incursionó en la política y fue líder de la Asociación Nacional de Actores entre 2010 y 2014.

"Lamentamos el fallecimiento de la primera actriz Silvia Pinal Hidalgo, cuyo talento cinematográfico y teatral es parte de la memoria cultural de México. Muchas generaciones de mexicanas y mexicanos crecimos admirándola. Nuestras sinceras condolencias a sus familiares y amigos", escribió la presidenta Claudia Sheinbaum Pardo en su cuenta de X.

Estableció toda una dinastía de mujeres dedicadas al arte. Sus hijas Sylvia Pasquel y Alejandra Guzmán emprendieron exitosas carreras en el teatro y en la música, respectivamente. Asimismo, fue abuela de la cantante y actriz Stephanie Salas, de la modelo y empresaria Frida Sofía, y bisabuela de la modelo Michelle Salas (la hija primogénita de Luis

Miguel).

"Mamacita querida, aunque tu partida deja una gran tristeza en nuestras vidas, también nos dejas un legado de amor, fortaleza y creatividad artística que honramos. Siempre vivirás en los corazones de todos los que te amamos y admiramos", escribió Pasquel, en su cuenta de Instagram tras darse a conocer el deceso.

En 2022 el Instituto Nacional de Bellas Artes y Literatura de México le realizó un homenaje con cine, teatro musical y un show digno de una gala de televisión.

"¡Ay mamacita!", dijo Pinal, provocando risas del público cuando estaba en el escenario. "Me siento tan emocionada en este momento, me siento llena de cosas".

Pinal bailó animada en su silla de ruedas cuando recibió un reconocimiento por su labor artística como egresada distinguida de la Escuela Nacional de Arte Teatral. Durante la gala estuvo acompañada por sus hijas Sylvia, Alejandra, su nieta Stephanie y su bisnieta Michelle, entre otros familiares y amigos como las actrices Diana Bracho, María Rojo, Angélica Aragón, Fela Domínguez y Bianca Marroquín.

"Quiero agradecerle, madre", dijo Guzmán en el homenaje. "Todas las cosas que nos has demostrado que cualquier mujer puede hacer, porque tú has hecho más que eso, has logrado tus sueños ... Gracias por darnos talento, darnos tu sangre, darnos tu casta y darnos esa sonrisa siempre".

Pinal nació en Guaymas, en el norteño estado mexicano de Sonora, el 12 de septiembre de 1931. Su familia se mudó a la Ciudad de México cuando ella todavía era pequeña. Comenzó su carrera como actriz a muy temprana edad en el teatro y la radio. A los 17 años obtuvo su primer papel en la película "Bamba" (1948) de Miguel Contreras Torres.

Su voz ronca y su atractivo físico la colocaron rápidamente como una estrella a pesar de su corta edad. Al año siguiente ya estaba actuando con Cantinflas en "Puerta, joven" y con Tin Tan en "El rey del barrio".

En esos primeros años también compartió créditos con Marga López, en "Azahares para tu boda" de Julián Soler, y con Pedro Infante en "La mujer que yo perdí", de Roberto Rodríguez.

El amor tampoco tardó en llegar a su vida. Se casó a los 17 años con el productor Rafael Banquells, con quien tuvo un año más tarde a Sylvia. Pero el matrimonio no duró mucho; se divorciaron en 1952, cuando Pinal obtuvo su primer premio Ariel (el equivalente mexicano del Oscar) a la mejor coactuación por "Un rincón cerca del cielo", en la que volvió a coincidir con Infante.

Su papel en "Un extraño en la escalera" (1954) al lado de Arturo de Córdova la convirtió en una de las favoritas del público en la década de 1950, cuando recibió dos Ariel más por su trabajo en "Locura pasional" (1955) y "La dulce enemiga" (1956).

Con el director argentino Túlio Demicheli su carrera dio un giro aún más sensual y se consagró como mujer fatal, con títulos como "Préstame tu cuerpo", "Una golfa" y "Desnúdate Lucrecia", todas estrenadas en 1958. Tan exitosa fue su colaboración, que Pinal y Demicheli decidieron mudarse a España para ampliar sus carreras. Fue así como la actriz filmó "Adiós, Mimí Pompon" y "Maribel y la extraña familia" en la península Ibérica.

En 1961 contrajo matrimonio con el empresario Gustavo Alatriste, con quien tuvo a su segunda hija, Viridiana, antes de divorciarse en 1967. Alatriste también produjo, junto a Juan Antonio Bardem, el filme clave de Buñuel: "Viridiana".

La película marcaba el regreso del director a su natal España. Buñuel se mudó de su país en 1937 y se nacionalizó mexicano en los años posteriores a la guerra civil. A pesar de que el director obtuvo autorización para filmar en territorio español, la censura franquista hizo que modificara el final de la cinta.

Es considerada una de las mejores películas del cine español y por años fue la única de ese país en conseguir la Palma de Oro en el Festival de Cine de Cannes. Pero en su momento, una reseña negativa de El Vaticano llevó a que "Viridiana", que retrata a una novicia (Pinal) cuyo tío (Fernando Rey) se siente atraído a ella e intenta poseerla después de doparla, se prohibiera en España y a la persecución del director.

Pinal contaba que contrabandeó la única copia de "Viridiana" que

se logró rescatar, pues las autoridades franquistas habían ordenado su destrucción.

El trabajo de Pinal con Buñuel continuó en la película conceptual "El ángel exterminador" (1962) y la comedia "Simón del desierto" (1965). A lo largo de esa década, Pinal también realizó comedias, grabaciones musicales y diversos programas de televisión.

En 1967 contrajo terceras nupcias con Guzmán, un cantante y actor que era 12 años menor que ella. A pesar de la diferencia de edad, el matrimonio tuvo dos hijos, Enrique y Alejandra, quienes se convertirían en una de las cantantes pop-rock más destacadas de México al paso de los años.

Con Guzmán filmó la popular "¡Cómo hay gente sin vergüenza!" (1971) de René Cardona Jr.

Años después, Pinal revelaría en su autobiografía "Esta soy yo" que la relación con Guzmán era abusiva, situación que también fue retratada en su serie biográfica "Silvia Pinal, frente a tí" de 2019, protagonizada por Itati Cantoral y transmitida por el canal Las Estrellas de Televisa.

La vida de Pinal no estuvo exenta de otras desgracias. La muerte de su hija Viridiana a los 19 años en un accidente

automovilístico la marcó en 1982. Se distanció por años de su hija mayor, Pasquel, porque ésta tuvo una relación sentimental con un hombre con el que Pinal también había estado involucrada. En el 2000, tuvo que salir de México para evitar la prisión mientras resolvía sus presuntos adeudos fiscales.

Los teatros Silvia Pinal y Diego Rivera y comenzó la transmisión de su famoso programa televisivo "Mujer, casos de la vida real", que duró más de 20 años al aire y se transmitió con éxito en Latinoamérica y Estados Unidos.

La siguiente década se vio marcada por su incursión en la política.

Pinal fue diputada, senadora y asambleísta del Distrito Federal por el Partido Revolucionario Institucional. También fue

por un tiempo secretaria general de la Asociación


Nacional de Intérpretes.

Pero en el 2000 tuvo problemas con el fisco, que la acusaba de no haber pagado impuestos por la transmisión de "Mujer" durante años. Esto llevó a que la actriz saliera del país y viviera un tiempo en Estados Unidos mientras se resolvía su situación.

Los años siguientes apareció en otras telenovelas, entre ellas "Carita de ángel", "Amarte es mi pecado" y "Una familia de diez".

En 2006 fue condecorada con la orden de Isabel La Católica y dos años después recibió el Ariel de Oro por su trayectoria cinematográfica.

Le sobreviven sus hijas Sylvia y Alejandra, su hijo Enrique, sus nietas Stephanie y Frida Sofía, y su bisnieta Michelle.

Begun in the early 1960s by Cesar Chavez, Dolores Huerta, Larry Itliong, and other organizers, the United Farm Workers of America is the nation's first enduring and largest farm workers' union. The UFW continues its activism in major agricultural sectors, chiefly in California. UFW contract agreements protect thousands of vegetable, berry, winery, tomato, and dairy workers in California, Oregon, and Washington state. More than 75



percent of California's fresh mushroom industry is now under union contract. Many landmark recent UFW-sponsored laws and regulations protect all farm workers in California, especially at non-union ranches. They include the first state laws in the nation providing farm workers with overtime pay after eight hours a day in California, Washington state, and Oregon; the first comprehensive standards in the U.S. to prevent heat deaths and illnesses in California; and recent COVID19 protec-

tions for agricultural workers. The UFW is a leader in the national movement for immigration reform. It's most recent reform bill for immigrant field workers passed the U.S. House on a broad bipartisan vote last year. The union continues proactively championing legislative and regulatory reforms for farm workers covering issues such as overtime, heat safety, other worker protections, and pesticides.
