Chávez será expuesto en urna de cristal de museo

CARACAS, Venezuela. 7 marzo del 2013 (AP): El presidente Hugo Chávez quedará expuesto indefinidamente en el local donde comenzó a construir su carrera, un museo militar desdese donde dirigió un golpe de estado en 1992.

Desde la Academia Militar, al oeste de Caracas, donde los restos del jefe de Estado son velados desde la víspera, el vicepresidente venezolano Nicolás Maduro anunció el jueves que el cuerpo del presidente Chávez será embalsamado.

Tal decisión causó sorpresa e incredulidad entre algunas personas y fue considerada por analistas como un intento del oficialismo por crear un mito de la desaparecida figura presidencial.

Antes de ese proceso de embalsamamiento, los restos primero serán expuestos siete días más. Este viernes, se realizarán los funerales oficiales a partir de las 11 de la mañana (1530GMT).

Maduro dijo que delegaciones de al menos 55 países asistirán a los funerales del viernes. Antes, el canciller Elías Jaua dijo que 33 de esas delegaciones serán encabezadas por jefes de Estado y de gobierno.

El jueves, los invitados principales _presidentes y altos funcionarios_ empezaron a arribar para los funerales de Estado, mientras en la calle la gente se agolpaba de a miles para poder dar una última mirada a su líder.

Los mandatarios de Cuba, Raúl Castro, y de Brasil, Dilma Rousseff, llegaron uno detrás del otro a Caracas.

Junto con la dirigente brasileña arribó el ex presidente Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva, un cercano aliado de Chávez y quien en duros momentos, durante protestas y un paro general de la industria petrolera venezolana en 2003, lo ayudó con embarques de combustible enviado de Brasil.

Por la noche, Castro, acompañado de Maduro, acudió a la Academia Militar para presentar sus respetos a Chávez, quien en vida fuó uno de los más cercanos y claves aliados de La Habana en los últimos tiempos.

Castro se sentó al lado derecho del féretro, junto al presidente de Uruguay José Mujica, quien llegó al país la noche del martes. Castro también tenía a su lado a Elena Frías de Chávez, la madre del fallecido mandatario y conversó brevemente con Rosa Virginia, la mayor de los cuatro hijos de Chávez.

Casi simultáneamente arribó al país el presidente de Colombia Juan Manuel Santos, quien fue recibido por el canciller venezolano Jaua.

La presidenta Rousseff, acompañada de Lula, se presentó al velatorio y se le vio comovida cuando se acercó al féretro, donde presentó sus respetos a los restos del mandatario. Ambos líderes brasileños fueron tratados y se recuperaron del cáncer.

Rousseff concluyó satisfactoriamente en agosto de 2011 un tratamiento contra un tumor maligno bajo su brazo izquierdo por el cual fue intervenida quirúrgicamente en 2009, cuando era candidata presidencial.

Lula, que con un tratamiento de quimio y

radioterapia se libró de un cáncer, se notó emocionado y en dos ocasiones se inclinó para ver a su aliado a través del cristales de la urna de cristal abierta.

El ex mandatario

peso a notarse más delgado y no tener la barba que ha sido su estampa desde que surgió como figura pública en los años 70, como uno de los principales líderes sindicales del país lució saludable.

Rousseff abrazó, besó y dialogó con varios de los familiares del mandatario venezolano, entre ellos el hermano mayor de Chávez, Adán.

"El comandante Chávez va a estar en posibilidad de ser visto por lo menos siete días más por parte del pueblo de Venezuela", dijo Maduro en declaraciones divulgadas por la televisora oficial.

Añadió que se va a "preparar el cuerpo del comandante presidente, embalsamarlo porque quede abierto eternamente... así como esté Ho Chi Minh, como esté Vladimir Lenin, como esté Mao Tse-Tung".

"Quedará el cuerpo de nuestro comandante en jefe embalsamado en el Museo de la Revolución de manera especial, para que pueda estar una urna de cristal y nuestro pueblo pueda tenerlo por siempre", explicó.

El anuncio generó diversos comentarios en las calles de Caracas.

"¿En serio? ¿No es una broma?", preguntó Juan Ferreira, un vendedor de alimentos de 51 años.

"Bueno, que hagan lo que quieran con el cuerpo de Chávez, lo importante es que nos dejen en paz y nos den tranquilidad para trabajar, que no sigan ponéndonos a todos los venezolanos a pelear", comentó el hombre en el centro de la ciudad.

Ferreira en tono de broma agregó que ya se sabía que lo querían hacer un santo.

"Ahora lo único que espero es que no suban los impuestos, para que el comerciante sea el que pague esa tumba de cristal", dijo.

Oscar Vallés, analista político y profesor de la Universidad Metropolitana de Caracas dijo que "parecerá que Nicolás Maduro y su gobierno están construyendo una aureola que hace muy difícil, diría yo, que a futuro, los opositores pretendan promover una alternativa de gobierno".

Ex-Mexico official: List of missing people doesn't exist

MEXICO CITY, Feb. 22, 2013 (AP): A member of former Mexican President Felipe Calderón's administration disputed on Friday that there is a list of 27,000 missing people as announced by the current government of President Enrique Peña Nieto.

José Vega, who was Calderón's coordinator of the National Security System, an entity responsible for collecting and analyzing security data, said that the only registry on disappeared people contains 5,319 names.

Some of the missing people are those whose disappearances are blamed on organized crime, but others include those who may have voluntarily stopped contacting their families, Vega wrote in a letter sent to Mexican and international media.

Vega said that it's up to state authorities to investigate missing person reports and to keep records on those people. He said the list that includes 5,319 people who went missing in the last decade is not complete because local authorities didn't send the federal government the requested information when Calderón's administration tried to compile a list.

This lead him, Vega wrote, to "categorically reject the existence of a list alluded to by national and international

media and based on alleged leaks by the federal Attorney General's Office."

Lia Limón, deputy secretary for human rights at the Interior Department, told reporters this week that the government plans to unveil a database containing more than 27,000 records of missing people that were gathered by the federal Attorney General's Office. She said she had not seen it and did not have details of specific cases.

Limón made the comments the same day Human Rights Watch criticized Calderón in a report on disappearances in México, saying he ignored the problem that the group called "the most severe crisis of enforced disappearances in Latin America in decades."

A Mexican civic organization released a database late last year that it said contained official information on more than 20,000 people who had gone missing in Mexico over the previous six years—the term of Calderón, who stepped up the government's campaign against drug cartels.

In posting the database on its website, *Propuesta Cívica*, or Civic Proposal, said the information was collected by the federal Attorney General's Office during Calderón's administration.

Senators look to early April for immigration bill

WASHINGTON, DC, March 5, 2013 (AP): Senators in a bipartisan group crafting a comprehensive immigration bill said Tuesday they're not sure whether they can meet a self-imposed March deadline but they're optimistic about a deal soon.

The lawmakers in the "Gang of Eight" have been meeting several times a week to write sweeping legislation that would strengthen the U.S.-Mexico border, improve legal immigration, crack down on employers who hire illegal immigrants and provide an eventual pathway to citizenship for the 11 million illegal immigrants already in the U.S.

When they unveiled legislative principles in January, the senators announced they hoped to release a bill sometime in March. Now, several senators—including John McCain, Lindsey Graham and Marco Rubio—say they're not sure if they'll meet the goal. But lawmakers downplayed the significance of a short delay.

"I don't know about timeframe, I'd rather do it right than do it fast,"

Rubio said. "But I think we're making good progress."

Congress is on recess the last week of March and first week of April. The senators are likely to release their legis-

the toughest is figuring out the design of a temporary worker program that would govern how future low-skilled workers can come to the U.S. Graham and Sen. Charles Schumer, D-N.Y., had asked the Chamber of Commerce and AFL-CIO to try to work together to resolve the issue, but after agreeing last month on broad principles, the two sides have not reached final resolution.

Senators have been intervening to try to work out the details and AFL-CIO President Richard Trumka and Chamber of Commerce President Tom Donohue both were on Capitol Hill Tuesday for meetings.

"You don't want to leave it hanging out for two weeks to get shot up," he said.

NM GOP fails to force immigrant license debate

SANTA FE, N.M., March 6, 2013 (AP): Allies of Republican Gov. Susana Martínez narrowly failed Wednesday in trying to revive legislation to stop New Mexico from issuing driver's licenses to most undocumented immigrants.

A Martínez-backed license proposal has been bottled up in a House committee by majority Democrats, most likely dooming the bill as time runs out in the legislative session. Lawmakers will adjourn in 10 days and similar license legislation has stalled in the Senate.

Republicans tried a rarely successful procedural move to bypass three House committees assigned to review the bill. That would have advanced the measure to the 70-member House for debate and a vote, with a strong chance that it could pass as occurred the past two years.

The effort fell one vote short, but there's still a possibility the bill could reach the House before the Legislature ends. Even if that happens, the measure would face problems in the Senate, which has turned down license restrictions since Martínez took office in 2011.

Democratic Rep. Brian Egolf of Santa Fe maneuvered the procedural maneuvering as a "political game" by the governor's supporters.

"Once again, we're at-

tempting to divert this body's attention to an issue that is not at the forefront of the most pressing needs of this state," said Rep. Brian Egolf, a Santa Fe Democrat.

New Mexico and Washington State allow undocumented immigrants to obtain the same driver's license as a U.S. citizen. Utah grants a special driving permit to immigrants that can't be used for identification.

House GOP Whip Nate Gentry of Albuquerque said the House should debate the license measure because there's support among New Mexico voters for ending licenses for illegal immigrants—a policy that Martínez made a centerpiece of her campaign in 2010.

The latest legislation, he said, is less restrictive than what the House has approved the past two years.

"I think the legislation has merit. It's a good compromise and every attempt that we've made to address this issue has failed," Gentry said.

The measure would provide temporary driver's licenses to younger immigrants who came to the U.S. as children and are covered by a federal policy deferring deportation. However, no licenses would be issued to other immigrants who illegally came to the country without documentation.

Besides those temporary licenses for some immigrants, the legislation would provide for a new driver's license for state residents to comply with the federal *Real ID Act*, which would permit it to be used as identification in the future to board airliners.

Democrats contend there's no compromise in the legislation, however. The immigrant youth covered by the federal policy are considered to be lawfully in the country, can obtain work permits and receive Social Security numbers, which would entitle them to a traditional driver's license in New Mexico and many other states.

The House agreed on 36-34 votes to move the bill around two committees but deadlocked 35-35 on steering it around the final committee and to the House.

The series of votes left the license measure pending in the Appropriations and Finance Committee, where Democrats hold a 10-8 edge in membership. However, two Democrats on the panel voted last year for a bill to end licenses for undocumented immigrants.

After a similar parliamentary move in 2011, the House voted to end licenses for undocumented immigrants. That measure died in the Senate, which blocked a similar license proposal last year.

Henry Ford Community College to screen Oscar-nominated documentary, "5 Broken Cameras," April 5

Dearborn, March 11, 2013: The Henry Ford Community College (HFCC) Arab Cultural Studies Program will screen the Oscar-nominated documentary, "5 Broken Cameras," on Friday, April 5, from 6 to 9:30 p.m. at the Berry Amphitheater, located in the Andrew A. Mazzara Administrative Services & Conference Center (ASCC) on the main campus.

Directed by Emad Burnat and Guy Davidi, "5 Broken Cameras" is a first-hand account of the protests in Bil'in, a West Bank village impacted by the Is-

raeli Wall, which is called "the fence" in the documentary. The fence is built on village land, which isolates the village from the majority of its farmland that the Israelis will then confiscate. However, the villagers resist. Burnat films their plight, which places his family in jeopardy. Daily arrests, violent attacks, loss of life and night raids become prevalent in Bil'in. The cameras used to document these events get smashed, hence the title.

The social hour will be from 6 to 7 p.m., the actual screening of the documentary from 7 to 8:30 p.m., followed

by a dialogue about the documentary from 8:30 to 9:30 p.m. Dr. Nabeel Abraham, director of the HFCC Honors Program, and Imad Nouri, director of the HFCC Counseling Division, will lead the dialogue.

TRAVERSE CITY, March 7, 2013 (AP): The Obama administration says it's making plans to continue a long-range Great Lakes cleanup program, although decisions about paying for it will be made on a year-by-year basis.

A spokeswoman for the White House Council on Environmental Quality told The Associated Press on Thursday that federal agencies will begin work this summer on a new five-year blueprint for the Great Lakes Restoration Initiative.

The program is designed to make progress on some of the

says the FBI has agreed to investigate possible bias incidents at the historically liberal college.

Spokesman Scott Wargo says the college approached the FBI with "significant concerns" about the incidents, which began the first week of February. He says

the FBI notified Oberlin on Thursday that it would begin investigating.

Classes were canceled Monday after a report of someone wearing what looked like a Ku Klux Klan-type hooded robe on campus.

A police report has also detailed the defacement of Black History Month post-

ers with the N-word, a "whites only" sign written above a water fountain, a swastika drawn on a science center window and a student knocked to the ground by a person making a derogatory comment about ethnicity. Two students are being investigated for possible involvement in the graffiti.

Two diesel-electric hybrid models among ten new TARTA buses.

March 4, 2013: Two new, 35-foot hybrid-electric buses are set to begin operation in the Toledo Area Regional Transit Authority's service area in the near future. These hybrid-electric models operate on battery power at lower speeds and are part of a group of 10 new buses received recently by TARTA.

"These buses not only reduce energy operating costs, but they also will save on maintenance," said James K. Gee, TARTA's general manager. "Estimates are TARTA should experience a 30 percent saving in miles per gallon with the hybrid-electric buses."

The buses, manufactured by Gillig of Hayward, California, use battery power at lower speeds and switch automatically to the vehicle's biodiesel engine at higher

speeds. The buses will be used primarily on TARTA's fixed-line service.

The hybrid electric buses were acquired through the Ohio Department of Transportation's Clean and Green Program from federal funds. This \$1.2 million investment by ODOT is part of the overall \$40 million 21st Century Transit Partnerships for Ohio's Next Generation program.




"TARTA is indebted to both the Ohio Department of Transportation and the Federal Transit Administration for their help in funding the purchase of these buses," Gee said. "We have every reason to believe these buses are the first of many more hybrid-electric buses in the TARTA fleet of the future."

All of TARTA's buses run on a blend of biodiesel, a do-

mestic, renewable fuel. TARTA expects to use more than one million gallons of biodiesel in 2013.

About TARTA: The Toledo Area Regional Transit Authority was formed in 1971 and is a political subdivision under Ohio law, similar to a park district or a school district. TARTA carries nearly 3.5 million passengers annually and provides interconnected regional service to seven communities in Lucas County – Toledo, Maumee, Waterville, Ottawa Hills, Sylvania and Spencer and Sylvania townships and Rossford in Wood County.





San Antonio mayor to address Ohio Dems

Standing-room tickets are all that is left for the Ohio Democratic Party's 2013 *Legacy Dinner*. The likely reason is the keynote speaker: San Antonio Mayor Julián Castro, the youngest mayor of a top 50 American city and considered a rising star in the Democratic Party. Many have described him as "the Latino Obama," because of the belief he has the potential to become the first Latino president of the United States.

Latino Democrats from across the state plan to head to Columbus for Friday night's grassroots political fundraiser, being hosted by US Senator Sherrod Brown (D-Ohio), former Ohio Gov. Ted Strickland, and Ohio Democratic Party Chairman Chris Redfern (D-Catawba Island), who also serves in the Ohio House of Representatives.

Robert Torres, Northwest Ohio Hispanic Chamber of Commerce executive director, is working behind the scenes to draw additional Latino Democrats across the state to attend Castro event. Lucas County Auditor Anita López will be among the local Latinos in attendance.

"The appearance of Mayor Castro is unprecedented in our State's political history," said Torres. "This past election in which

Latinos and their interests and concerns got more attention than ever—in the media, and by conservative and liberal politicians alike—brought Ohio's Latino vote to the national dialogue. Both political parties, their candidates and surrogates, made numerous appearances to this state. This visit underscores that Latino voters in Ohio are poised to play a major role in future electoral races throughout the state."

"Mayor Julian Castro's appearance at the Democratic Party's Legacy dinner is significant because it shows the important economic and political role that Latinos have in Ohio and throughout the nation," added **Isabel Framer**, a Northeast Ohio Latina and Democratic activist, who plans to attend. "It is great to see the Ohio Democratic Party realizing that a national Latino leader like him can be a big draw to a fundraiser. I was amazed and at the same time excited and proud to hear that tickets are sold out."

The Cleveland-based *Hispanic Roundtable*, through Torres and an organizing committee, already has extended an invitation to Castro to make a second trip to Ohio at its "Convención 2013" event in October. The group hopes to follow-up in person Friday.

"Last year's presidential election was a stepping stone

for the Ohio Democratic Party and this state is now positioned to gain the attention of future presidential aspirants," said Torres. "Rather, this visit by Mayor Castro will be a stepping stone for Ohio's Latino community, for Latino elected leadership, and for the rights of immigrants and Latinos."

"I see it more as recognition by him of the important contributions of Latinos to the Democratic Party in Ohio and the economy of our state," said Ms. Framer. "Only he would know if he wants bigger, more national prominence but coming to Ohio, an historic swing state, as well as building ties with other states, is certainly a stepping stone. I would love to see Julian move towards bigger things politically. He is certainly laying the groundwork."

Castro was first elected mayor of San Antonio in 2009 at the age of 34. He easily won re-election two years later with 82 percent of the vote. He is the fifth Latino mayor of that city. His political career started when he was elected as the youngest city councilman in San Antonio's history in 2001 at age 26. Four years later, he lost his first bid for mayor.

Castro served as a co-chairman of President Obama's re-election campaign in 2012.

Castro has received national attention and recognition for his focus on raising the bar of his city's economy and education. In 2010, the city opened *Café College*, a one-stop center offering guidance on college admissions, financial aid, and standardized test preparation.

5,000 took advantage of the effort in the first year, leading to a rapid expansion of the center. He also led a referendum to increase the sales tax in order to offer full-day prekindergarten to 22,000 four-year olds over the next eight years.

Castro served as the keynote speaker at the 2012 Democratic National Convention, the first Latino chosen for that role in the party's history. The Roman Catholic is a 1996

graduate of Stanford University, where he majored in political science and communications. He graduated from Harvard Law School in 2000.

Castro has a twin brother, Joaquin, who serves as a state representative

in the Texas legislature and is running for a seat in US Congress.

He is a San Antonio native who is married to an elementary school teacher. The couple has a four-year old daughter.

Castro's mother Rosie served as a leader of the *La Raza Unida* movement, which sought to defend the civil rights of Mexican-Americans in Texas in the 1970s. Organizers of the group believed the effort would help boost the *Chicano* movement in Texas and become more influential in politics.

"Had the privilege of meeting both Joaquin and Julian at the Democratic National Convention, and to hear Julian's keynote remarks," said Ms. Framer. "Julian is an inspirational Latino that I believe can further awaken the Latino elec-

torate which will lead to more influence for Latinos in this country. His personal story of humble beginnings and success reflects the American dream."

"Mayor Castro's visit can help redefine the politics of Ohio's future opportunities for Latinos," emphasized Torres. "My hope is that Castro will help to define Ohio Democratic principles that will oppose Arizona-like legislation, avoid unnecessary English-only legislation, advocate for *DREAMers* and immigration reform."

The Legacy Dinner serves as a showcase for up-and-coming Democratic political candidates, many of whom plan to run for state-wide or local office in 2014. The dinner also honors Democratic activists—and there are many who contributed to President Barack Obama's re-election last year, when he carried swing-state Ohio by winning over the Latino vote.

Tickets for the event already are sold out at the Downtown Columbus Antheneum, 32N. 4th St. The standing-room-only tickets are going for \$30 apiece. The event includes a 6 p.m. private reception, followed at 7 p.m. by dinner and the evening's program.

Andreanna Rivera-Pérez nació y criada en Findlay, Ohio, descendiente de abuelos mexicanos y españoles. Sus padres, procedentes de Texas, se mudaron a Ohio previo al nacimiento de Andreanna. Junto con cuatro hermanos y una hermana menor, recuerda su infancia dentro de una familia latina tradicional y con valores bien marcados. "Mi madre se quedó en la casa para criarnos, mientras mi padre era quien salía a trabajar."

Estando lejos de su familia materna y paterna, no tuvo la oportunidad de pasar mucho tiempo para conocer a sus abuelos, primos y demás. Y en los últimos años y a través de los medios sociales y tecnológicos, ella se reencontró con muchos de ellos. Esto le hizo conocer que muchos de sus familiares se dedicaron a la educación y al trabajo de asistencia, al igual que ella.

La Sra. Rivera-Pérez se graduó con un Bachillerato en Trabajo Social de la Universidad de Findlay. "Yo sabía a temprana edad que quería ayudar a la gente". Ella disfruta de proveer dirección, ser mentor/a y de fortalecer a jóvenes latinos.

De donde renunció en el año 2010 de su posición de Directora de Programas y Servicios. Hasta el día de hoy, muchos de los participantes de dichos programas la contactan para contarle de sus progresos y de sus vidas. "Es tan valioso ver que uno hizo impacto en sus vidas. Y tan emocionante volverlos a ver como adultos jóvenes, algunos con niños".

Andreanna Rivera-Pérez, finding balance between motherhood and career



Toledo, March 15, 2013: Andreanna Rivera-Pérez was born and raised in Findlay, Ohio. She descends from Mexican and Spanish grandparents. Her mother and father are from Texas, and they moved to Ohio right before Andreanna was born. Together with four brothers and one sister, she recalls her family to be traditional, with strong Latino values. "My mother stayed home to take care of us, while my father was going to work."

Because her extended family resides in Texas, she didn't have the opportunity to get to know them very well, or to share much of her childhood with them. In the past few years, however, thanks to social media and electronics, she has reunited with several family members. She found out that many of them were educators or worked in social services just like her.

Ms. Rivera-Pérez graduated from the University of Findlay with a Bachelor's degree in Social Work. "I knew at a young age I wanted to help people," she explained. She enjoys providing guidance, mentoring, and empowering young Latinos.

Andreanna stated she knows what it means not to have somebody to advise you in your career within your family. "My parents always supported me and they were

proud, but they didn't know how to guide me with this," she said.

In the year 2000, she did an internship at the *Friendly Center* in North Toledo. After completion, she was hired to work as a Youth Program Manager. In the 2004, she was hired at *Adelante, Inc.* in the South End in Toledo. Here she worked much closer with the Latino community, focusing on programs to empower and educate youth. She resigned in 2010 from her position as a Director of Programs and Services.

She recalls that until today many participants from those programs contact her to share their progress and their lives. "It has so much value to see that we make an impact on their lives. It is so emotional to see them as young adults and some of them with children of their own."

Also in Toledo, she met her husband, *Guadalupe "Pito" Pérez*. "The chemistry was immediately," she said. "both of us come from Latino families, with the same values and the same norms." Andreanna and Pito have a son, *Mariano*, who is about to turn five.

"My most precious role, to be a mom," stated. Andreanna shared the birth of her son was a big transition. She went from to be complete dedicated to her career, to find out about her priorities. "I was always very fortunate to be part of a group of professionals that understood me as a mother; and there was always room for Mariano."

After staying at home for several months, she decided to go back to work part time. And this time, she found the balance between motherhood and career.

Currently, she is an Instructor at *Owens Community College*; Facilitator for Bridges Out of Poverty Program in Hancock County and Outreach Coordinator for Mothers and More, a Non-Profit organization in Findlay, Ohio. Also, she develops special activities for the participants' children at *El Centro de la Mujer*, together with her son.

Regarding her professional achievements in 2006 Graduate of Leadership Toledo; 2007 Recipient of City of Toledo Youth Empowerment Award; 2012 Graduate of Hancock Leadership, and she was Board Member of City of Toledo Youth Commission.

Now that she found an equilibrium, in reference to giving a message to young Latinas, she said "being *bicultural*" can be complicated but most of all, it is an amazing opportunity. I encourage young Latinas to discover their gifts/talents and create goals for themselves. Find a mentor and create actions steps to being the best she can be for her family and community. Chávez será expuesto en urna de cristal de museo

Una alternativa de política "distinta a la que se está manejando porque están constituyendo alrededor del gran mito que están solidificando ahí en la Academia Militar la idea o la creencia de que hay un compromiso histórico de proseguir el legado de Hugo Chávez Frías, usando todos los recursos que la patria dispone paralelo, entendiendo por ello fuerza armada e incluso con la fuerza de ser necesario", agregó Vallés.

Conchita Ruiz, una mujer de 60 años que venía de ver a Chávez junto a su hija y dos nietos, dijo que le parecía buena idea.

"El se veía tan bonito y merece que no lo olviden en una tumba por ahí", dijo.

En la academia militar, Chávez yacía en un ataúd cubierto de vidrio vestido con el uniforme militar verde oliva y la boina roja de sus días de paracaidista. Lucía demacrado y pálido y sus labios se encontraban apretados.

En una muestra de la

inseguridad que azota el país, los asistentes al funeral tuvieron que someterse a pasar por un detector de metales, y para evitar que captaran una foto del cadáver del presidente, se retiraron las baterías a los teléfonos celulares.

Cuando arribaban al féretro, muchos ponían su mano en sus corazones o lo saludaban con ciertas rigidez.

Algunos alzaban y sostienen a sus hijos para que pudieran ver el rostro de Chávez.

La presidenta argentina Cristina Fernández, una de las primeras mandatarias que llegó a Venezuela para despedir a Chávez, recurrió al Twitter para contar sus sensaciones durante el funeral del líder venezolano, a quien recordó como "el

mejor amigo que tuvo la Argentina cuando todos le soltaron la mano. Le guste a quien le guste".

"No podíamos esperar. Infinita tristeza: nuestro compañero, el amigo de Argentina, había emprendido la partida. Al menos, eso creí", escribió la mandataria para justificar su apuro por viajar a Venezuela junto a su colega uruguaya José Mujica el mismo martes del deceso de Chávez.

"Pepe (por Mujica) me dijó en el avión, cuando viajábamos, que no recordaba en la historia un gobernante tan generoso" agregó la gobernante.

Luego relató sus sensaciones mientras el féretro con el cuerpo de Chávez era trasladado hasta la academia militar para el funeral. "Cómo me gustaría estar ahí! No puedo: el calor, mi hipotensión crónica y el médico me lo prohíben" pero "no aguanté más en el hotel, voy a esperarlo a la Academia. Luego de horas finalmente llega. En la entrada, un tumulto indecriptable".

Admitió que cuando estuvo frente al féretro no quiso mirar el cuerpo de Chávez porque "solo quería recordarlo vivo. Porque está vivo".

Hombres como Chávez no se mueren nunca. Vive y vivirá en cada venezolano y venezolana que dejó de ser invisible y se tornó protagonista... Antes de partir me acerco y sin mirarlo toco la bandera que está sobre el féretro. Me despidí, por ahí", concluyó Fernández, quien ya emprendió el regreso a Buenos Aires.

Cuando Chávez protagonizó el 4 de febrero de 1992 un intento de golpe de Estado, siendo entonces un teniente coronel del Ejército, ubicó su comando en un pequeño museo sobre una colina cercana al Palacio de Miraflores, la sede de

gobierno, en el centro de la ciudad.

Ese museo militar, actualmente el comando de las milicias creadas por Chávez, será el lugar donde repose.

Los anuncios de Maduro pusieron fin a dos días de especulaciones e incertidumbre sobre si Chávez sería sepultado y dónde. El presidente falleció el 5 de marzo a los 58 años tras dos años de padecer de cáncer.

Funcionarios de gobierno y simpatizantes de Chávez pedían que el mandatario fuera sepultado en el Panteón Nacional, una vieja iglesia en el centro de la capital y que tras varias remodelaciones albergara los restos del libertador Simón Bolívar.

"Me sumo a la mayoría del pueblo venezolano que pide a nuestro comandante en el Panteón Nacional, desde la AN (Asamblea Nacional) haremos todo para que así sea", escribió Cabello en la red social.

Pero Rafael Riera, secretario general del partido opositor Un Nuevo Tiempo en el estado Barinas, donde nació Chávez, dijo en diálogo telefónico con The Associated Press que parientes del mandatario querían que las exequias fueran en aquella zona del oeste venezolano porque ese fue el deseo del presidente.

"La información que yo tengo es que Chávez había dispuesto con su familiares, había solicitado que él quería acompañar a su abuela" Rosa

Inés Chávez en el mismo cementerio, que está ubicado en Barinas, dijo Riera.

Chávez, recordó Riera, fue criado por su abuela, "la que veló por él, la que le dio cariño, la que de pequeño lo levantó. Ese sería su deseo. Sus familiares están pidiendo a la dirección nacional del PSUV (Partido Socialista Unido de Venezuela) que deben hacer respetar ese deseo".

El jueves los invitados principales -presidentes y altos funcionarios- empezaron a arribar para los funerales de Estado, mientras en la calle la gente se agolpaba de a miles para poder dar una última mirada a su líder.

Los mandatarios de Cuba, Raúl Castro, y de Brasil, Dilma Rousseff, llegaron uno detrás del otro a Caracas.

Junto con la dirigente brasileña arribó el ex presidente Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva, un cercano aliado de Chávez y quien en duros momentos, durante protestas y un paro general de la industria petrolera venezolana en 2003, lo ayudó con embarques de combustible enviado de Brasil.

A unos pocos kilómetros de distancia de la Academia Militar, Ana Teresa Sifontes, una ama de casa de 71 años, parecía molesta con todo el barullo desatado con el sepelio del mandatario.

"El presidente para mí hizo cosas buenas por los pobres, pero hizo cosas contra el país como regular nuestro dinero a otros países", dijo Sifontes. "¿Por qué tenemos que mantener a Cuba?... (Chávez) dividió totalmente (a Venezuela) con un odio pronunciado por la voz de él", indicó.

Chávez desarrolló una estrecha amistad con los hermanos Fidel y Raúl Castro en Cuba y acuerdos, que incluyeron la venta de crudo a cambio de apoyo a planes de salud y deportes, entre otros.

La oposición ha mantenido silencio y sólo expresó sus condolencias tras conocerse la muerte de Chávez.

Sin embargo, la ex precandidata presidencial María Corina Machado dijo en un comunicado que estas horas invitan "a la introspección y a la revisión de los factores que han propiciado que las diferencias entre los venezolanos se hayan profundizado, alcanzando niveles sin precedentes en nuestra historia contemporánea".

Agregó que ante la proximidad de las elecciones presidenciales "es indispensable crear la confianza en el voto como expresión de la voluntad soberana. Ello requiere un proceso transparente, limpio y justo".

Jaua y el ministro de Información Ernesto Villegas destacaron que el gobierno está siguiendo las normas constitucionales y que están en capacidad de garantizar la paz social del país, en medio de interrogantes sobre cuándo serán las elecciones para elegir a un nuevo jefe de Estado.

En Venezuela "hay una constitución con procedimientos muy claros de qué hacer frente a la falta absoluta del jefe de Estado y de la dirigencia política que queda a cargo, bajo el mandato del vicepresidente Nicolás Maduro... vamos a hacer cumplir la constitución de la República Bolivariana de Venezuela", dijo el canciller.

Fuentes AP: Obama nombrará a latino para Trabajo

WASHINGTON, DC, 10 de marzo del 2013 (AP): El presidente Barack Obama se apresta a designar al funcionario hispano Thomas Pérez como el próximo secretario del Trabajo, dijeron dos personas allegadas a las deliberaciones en la Casa Blanca.

Pérez, de 51 años, ha dirigido la División de Derechos Humanos del Departamento de Justicia desde 2009 y anteriormente fue el secretario de Trabajo en el estado de Maryland. Se espera que reciba un respaldo firme de los sindicatos y de la comunidad hispana, que desea verse representada en el gabinete de Obama.

Su nombramiento podría hacerse oficial pronto, incluso el lunes, dijeron las personas familiarizadas con el proceso de selección. Ellas hablaron el sábado bajo condición de no ser identificadas porque aún no se ha hecho el anuncio oficial. El portavoz de la Casa Blanca Matt Lehrich declinó hacer declaraciones.

De ser nominado y confirmado, Pérez sustituirá a Hilda Solís, quien renunció en enero para regresar a su estado natal de California.

Pérez fue el primer latino elegido para el Concejo del condado de Montgomery en Maryland, donde sirvió de 2002 a 2006.

Pérez llegaría al Departamento de Trabajo mientras Obama impulsa una reforma migratoria amplia, que podría incluir cambios en cómo los empleadores contratan a

los trabajadores extranjeros. Los funcionarios del Departamento de Trabajo también han tenido un papel destacado en apoyar los esfuerzos de Obama para aumentar el salario mínimo federal, de 7,25 dólares a 9 dólares la hora.

El Departamento de Justicia, Pérez tuvo un papel clave en la decisión de impugnar leyes que buscaban que los votantes en Texas y Carolina del Sur contaran con identificación oficial, algo que podría haber restringido el derecho de voto de las minorías. Un tribunal federal revocó posteriormente la ley de Texas y retrasó la aplicación de la ley de Carolina del Sur hasta después de las elecciones de 2012.

El Senado confirmó fácilmente a Pérez por su cargo en el Departamento de Justicia, pero desde entonces, algunos legisladores republicanos lo han criticado por su papel en persuadir a la alcaldía de St. Paul, en Minnesota, para que retirara una demanda entablada ante la Corte Suprema de Justicia. A cambio, el Departamento de Justicia se abstuvo de unirse a dos juicios contra St. Paul que podrían haber devuelto millones de dólares al gobierno federal en daños y perjuicios.

Obama poised to pick Pérez for Labor

WASHINGTON, DC, March 10, 2013 (AP): President Barack Obama is close to naming Thomas Pérez, a civil rights official in the Justice Department, as his choice to head the Department of Labor, two people familiar

with the process say.

His nomination could come as early as Monday, the people familiar with the process said Saturday. They spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized to speak prior to the official announcement.

If confirmed, Pérez would replace Hilda Solís, who resigned in January.

White House spokesman Matt Lehrich declined to comment.

Pérez, 51, has led the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division since 2009 and previously served as Maryland's labor secretary. He is expected to have solid support from organized labor as well as the Hispanic community, which is eager to have representation in Obama's second-term Cabinet.

Solis was the first Hispanic woman to head an agency at the Cabinet level. Pérez was the first Latino elected to the Montgomery County Council in Maryland, where he served from 2002 to 2006.

Pérez would come to the Labor Department as Obama pushes a major immigration overhaul, which could include changes in how employers hire guest workers. Labor Department officials have also taken a prominent role in supporting Obama's effort to raise the federal minimum wage from \$7.25 to \$9 an hour.

At the Justice Department, Pérez played a leading role in the decision to challenge voter ID laws in Texas and South Carolina that could restrict minority voting rights. A federal court later struck down the Texas law and delayed implementation of the law in South Carolina until after the 2012 election.

Pérez was easily confirmed by the Senate for his Justice Department post, but since then, some GOP lawmakers have criticized his role in persuading the city of St. Paul, Minn., to withdraw a lending discrimination lawsuit from the Supreme Court. In exchange, the Justice Department declined to join two whistle-blower lawsuits against St. Paul that could have returned millions of dollars in damages to the federal government.

The St. Paul case had challenged the use of statistics to prove race discrimination under the 1968 Fair Housing Act, and Justice Department officials were concerned the court could strike down the practice.

After last year from four Republican lawmakers, including Sen. Chuck Grassley of Iowa and Rep. Darrell Issa of California, criticized Pérez for a "quid pro quo arrangement" that potentially cost taxpayers more than \$180 million.
