Canciller venezolano: Bush expresa "mucha amargura"

CARACAS, el 12 de marzo de 2008 (AP): El canciller venezolano Nicolás Maduro rechazó el miércoles los comentarios que realizaron el presidente George W. Bush contra el gobierno de Hugo Chávez, y afirmó que el mandatario estadounidense expresa "impotencia" y "mucha amargura".

Maduro hizo la declaración en repuesta a un discurso que ofreció este miércoles Bush quien planteó que Chávez está lleno de "promesas vacías y sed de poder".

"Lo que se expresa en Bush es impotencia, mucha amargura, porque no han podido revertir las corrientes de cambio", declaró el canciller a la televisora estatal.

"El balance (de Estados Unidos) en la región es de fracaso. Hoy tenemos un continente más autónomo y soberano", agregó.

Maduro denunció que Bush "tiene un plan de dejar un planeta desestabilizado" que obligue al próximo gobernante estadounidense a mantener una "política de guerra, la política belicista, la política intervencionista que ha instalado la Casa Blanca".

Bush fustigó a Chávez por lamentar la muerte de uno de los jefes de las Fuerzas Armadas Revolucionarias de Colombia (FARC).

"Este es el paso más reciente en un inquietante patrón de conducta provocadora del régimen de Caracas, que también ha pedido que los

terroristas de las FARC sean reconocidos como ejército legítimo, y altos funcionarios suyos se han reunido con sus líderes en Venezuela", denunció el gobernante estadounidense.

Según Bush, quien no pronunció el nombre de Chávez, dijo que en la medida en que éste "trata de expandir su influencia por Latinoamérica, su régimen dice que promueve la justicia social cuando en realidad su agenda no es más que de promesas vacías y sed de poder".

"Ha derrochado su riqueza petrolera en un esfuerzo de promover su visión hostil y antiestadounidense. Y ha dejado a sus propios ciudadanos frente a la carencia de alimentos mientras amenaza a sus vecinos", agregó.

Por otra parte, el canciller objetó el planteamiento que realizó un congresista estadounidense en cuanto a que Washington debería iniciar un proceso que puede concluir en la designación de Venezuela como un estado que auspicia el terrorismo.

"No le reconocemos a ningún gobierno del mundo, a ninguna institución de gobierno o de país del mundo la potestad para calificar a ningún país y menos a Venezuela", acotó Maduro.

Indicó que cualquier paso "aventurero" que den los Estados Unidos para catalogar al gobierno de Chávez como terrorista, ellos saldrían "más perjudicados", pero no ofreció detalles.

"Venezuela no tiene nada que temer. Nosotros tenemos un país que actúa bajo la

legalidad internacional estricta, bajo el respeto de los principios fundamentales de convivencia en el campo internacional, y además es un país que es modelo de democracia, de respeto a los derechos humanos", puntualizó.

El subsecretario de Estado Thomas Shannon declaró el miércoles que el gobierno estadounidense estaba "estudiando cuidadosamente" la información disponible sobre la denuncia colombiana de que el presidente Chávez tendría vinculación con la guerrilla de ese país.

La muerte de uno de los miembros del secretariado de las FARC, Raúl Reyes, quien falleció a inicios de mes durante un ataque que realizaron militares colombianos a un campamento de ese grupo que estaba en Ecuador, desató duras críticas de parte de Chávez contra el gobierno de Alvaro Uribe.

La crisis diplomática regional desatada luego del ataque al campamento de las FARC fue superada la semana pasada durante la XX Cumbre de Grupo de Río que se realizó en República Dominicana.

Canciller mexicana visita Cuba

LA HABANA, el 13 de marzo de 2008 (AP): La canciller mexicana Patricia Espinosa llega el jueves a Cuba para recomponer las tensas relaciones binacionales durante una visita de dos días.

Espinosa encabezará una reunión entre las cancillerías que marcará el reinicio de un mecanismo de diálogo entre ambos países, el cual ha estado paralizado tras varios años de tensiones.

La jefa de la diplomacia mexicana se reunirá con su homólogo Felipe Pérez Roque y el vicepresidente Carlos Lage y tras el encuentro se divulgará un comunicado conjunto, indicó un programa de la cancillería.

La presencia de Espinosa en Cuba es "la manifestación de la voluntad del señor presidente (Felipe) Calderón no sólo de

recomponer, sino de fortalecer las relaciones", dijo a periodistas el embajador mexicano en La Habana, Gabriel Jiménez Remus.

La composición de la delegación es un reflejo de los temas que abordarán las partes como asuntos consulares y migratorios, temas de derechos humanos y de cooperación.

Espinosa permanecerá en Cuba hasta el viernes, y su visita tiene lugar tres semanas después de la toma de posesión de Raúl Castro como jefe de gobierno, en sustitución de su hermano Fidel, convaleciente de una serie de operaciones intestinales.

"Los cambios (en la isla) no fueron previstos cuando se negoció la visita", manifestó el embajador al ser consultado sobre si este nuevo escenario varía la política mexicana hacia la nación caribeña.

Según el diplomático, México es "respetuoso" de la institucionalidad interna de la isla por lo que



Inmigrantes que obtuvieron ciudadanía en 2007 podrían votar

WASHINGTON, el 11 de marzo de 2008 (AP): Algunos inmigrantes que buscaron la ciudadanía estadounidense a mediados del año pasado en momentos de un gran retraso en la atención de las solicitudes podrían naturalizarse a tiempo para votar en las elecciones presidenciales, informó un funcionario gubernamental.

Emilio González, director de los Servicios de Ciudadanía e Inmigración, dijo a una comisión de la Cámara de Representantes que aquellos que presentaron su solicitud en junio podrían convertirse en ciudadanos a finales de septiembre. La espera para aquellos que solicitaron la ciudadanía después del mes de junio sería de hasta 16 meses.

Anteriormente, la oficina de González había dicho que aquellos que solicitaron la ciudadanía después del 1 de junio

tendrían que esperar entre 16 y 18 meses.

El funcionario señaló que su oficina ha adoptado medidas para avanzar a pesar del retraso que se generó, en parte, cuando cerca de medio millón de personas solicitaron la ciudadanía estadounidense en julio del 2007, el mes en el que las tarifas de solicitud de inmigración subieron en forma drástica.

Un total de 460.294 solicitudes de ciudadanía fueron presentadas sólo durante el mes de julio, de acuerdo con cifras de la oficina de Ciudadanía y Servicios de Inmigración obtenidas por el Instituto de Políticas de Migración, una organización de estudio con sede en Washington.

Aproximadamente un millón de solicitudes de beneficios diversos, como adopciones internacionales, permisos de trabajo y renovaciones de tarjetas de residencia también fueron presentadas en julio del

2007. Aproximadamente 230.000 solicitudes fueron presentadas en ese mes para obtener residencia legal.

En total, esa oficina gubernamental recibió 7,7 millones de solicitudes en el año fiscal del 2007, que concluyó el 30 de septiembre.

William Ramos, director de la oficina en Washington de la Asociación Nacional de Funcionarios Latinos Elegidos y Nombrados, señaló que su organización desea que los estados con amplias poblaciones latinas amplíen las fechas límite de registro de votantes para los nuevos ciudadanos.

Incluso algunos estados ya están ampliando esas fechas, como California, Nueva York e Illinois, los cuales están permitiendo que los nuevos ciudadanos se inscriban al padrón electoral en fecha posterior, informó la asociación.

EEUU: Se retira director de servicio de ciudadanía e inmigración

WASHINGTON, el 13 de marzo de 2008 (AP): El director de los Servicios de Ciudadanía e Inmigración, la agencia de seguridad interna que recibe a los nuevos ciudadanos, anunció el jueves que deja el cargo.

Emilio González dijo a la AP que el jueves haría el anuncio a los empleados de la agencia.

Agregó que ya lo informó a la Casa Blanca, al secretario de seguridad interna Michael Chertoff y a algunos de sus colaboradores el miércoles.

"Mi esposa y yo hemos estado hablando de esto

durante algún tiempo y esto es estrictamente familiar", afirmó González en una entrevista. "He estado viajando desde 1999. He tenido una relación de tiempo parcial con mi familia. Este es mi octavo año de viajes y he pensado que sería un buen año para ir a casa".

Su renuncia será efectiva a partir del 18 de abril. Se aleja pocos meses después de que su agencia aumentó drásticamente las tarifas que cobra a los inmigrantes para solicitar la ciudadanía y otros beneficios inmigratorios.

Ese aumento provocó una cifra récord de solicitudes el año pasado que inundaron la agencia. Muchos inmigrantes no podrán hacerse ciudadanos a tiempo para votar en noviembre debido a las numerosas solicitudes.

González dijo que ha estado trabajando en Washington y viviendo en Miami desde 1999.

Afirmó que su partida no tiene que ver con las críticas a los aumentos de tarifas y las demoras en el procesamiento en un año electoral. Algunos grupos y legisladores han dicho que la agencia debió haber estado mejor preparada para el salto en solicitudes que precedió al aumento de tarifas.

Papa inicia Semana Santa celebrando misa de Domingo de Ramos

CIUDAD DEL VATICANO, el 16 de marzo de 2008 (AP): El Papa Benedicto XVI celebró al aire libre en la Plaza de San Pedro la misa del Domingo de Ramos, con lo cual dio comienzo a la solemnidad de la Semana Santa.

Al comienzo de la celebración, el Papa bendijo las hojas de palma y de olivo con agua bendita y luego avanzó en procesión hasta el altar instalado en la escalinata de la Basílica de San Pedro, ataviado con intrincados ornamentos con brocados en hilos de oro y llevaba en la mano una fronda de palma tejida.

En el Domingo de Ramos, los católicos recuerdan la

entrada triunfante de Jesucristo a Jerusalén y con esa misa se da comienzo a la semana más solemne del año litúrgico de la Iglesia Católica, que incluye la escenificación del lavatorio de pies, la última cena y la institución del sacramento de la eucaristía en Jueves Santo; el viacrucis, o sea, el recuerdo del juicio, condena y crucifixión de Jesucristo el Viernes Santo, así como su resurrección el Domingo de Pascua.

El Sumo Pontífice le recordó a los fieles que durante la Semana Santa, ellos deben recordar lo que



calificó como "el drama más sublime de la historia que es el drama de nuestra salvación".

"Recordemos que El (Jesucristo) no entró en la ciudad para ser coronado, sino para ser condenado y crucificado", señaló el Papa.

La Iglesia Católica festejó el mismo el Día anual de la Juventud Mundial y los jóvenes estuvieron presentes, pues varios cientos de ellos llevaron grandes ramos de hojas de palma trenzadas en frondas al comienzo de la procesión hasta Plaza de San Pedro.



Granholm signs bill to create optional driver's licenses

LAN-SING, March 13, 2008 (AP): Governor Jennifer Granholm has signed legislation to create optional Michigan driver's licenses designed to make it easier to cross the nation's borders.



The legislation is aimed at meeting tougher identification rules required by the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative.

The optional driver's licenses and ID cards are enhanced to meet passport requirements. The licenses will be available only for Michigan residents who also are U.S. citizens.

Those who choose not to get an enhanced license would receive a standard license.

Supporters say the IDs will help keep commerce flowing smoothly between Michigan and Canada.

La Sonnambula debuts at the Michigan Opera Theatre

DETROIT: Michigan Opera Theatre opens its 2008 Spring Opera Season with the company's first-ever production of Vincenzo Bellini's *La Sonnambula*, a haunting tale of love, betrayal and redemption, with five performances, March 29-April 6, 2008.

This premiere marks the first time *La Sonnambula* has been presented in Detroit in the 37-year history of Michigan Opera Theatre.

"We are excited to bring a Bellini masterpiece to Detroit audiences for the first time. It's such a thrill to be able to present this beautiful production with such an illustrious production team that includes such well-known names in the opera world as Renata Scotto and Richard Bonynge," said Michigan Opera Theatre General Director David DiChiera.

Cuyahoga County reaches deal on Medical Mart project

CLEVELAND, March 13, 2008 (AP): Months of negotiations have led to a deal on building a "Medical Mart" exhibit hall in Cleveland to host medical trade shows and conferences as part of a convention center.

Cuyahoga County's negotiator, lawyer Fred Nance, told commissioners on Thursday that an agreement had been reached with a Chicago-based developer, *Merchandise Mart Properties Inc.* He said the developer will invest \$20 million. The county's share hasn't been specified.

The county had set a deadline for Thursday to reach a deal. Issues in dis-

pute included how much Merchandise Mart would contribute and where the development should happen.

Cuyahoga County commissioners had insisted the Medical Mart be in downtown Cleveland, tied to a convention center.

But Merchandise Mart wanted it closer the campuses of *Cleveland Clinic* and *University Hospitals*, about five miles east of downtown.

Merchandise Mart-rented and agreed to a downtown location, said Mark Falanga, senior vice president of Merchandise Mart Properties.

Last summer, commissioners increased the countywide sales tax by one quarter of one percent to help pay for the project, without a deal completed.

Falanga said a final, detailed and signed agreement hasn't occurred, although an agreement was reached. He confirmed the \$20 million commitment.

"The purpose of this facility would be primarily to attract medical trade shows into Cleveland as well as manufacturers who could take permanent exhibition space or show rooms," Falanga said.







Since 1972, the *Latino Student Union (LSU)* at The University of Toledo has been a staple of activism and support for students pursuing a higher education. Report: Minority neighborhoods hit hardest by subprime shakeoutBy JULIANA BARBASSA

March 6, 2008 (AP): Subprime lenders that went out of business with the industry's collapse had targeted minority neighborhoods, leaving them to struggle disproportionately with foreclosures and crumbling home values, according to a new survey that includes Charlotte, N.C.

These companies' high-risk loans made up 20 percent of all loans in predominantly minority communities, compared to 4 percent of total loans in mostly white areas, according to the report released Thursday by an alliance of policy, research and advocacy organizations.

"These high risk lenders were targeting their loans to particular neighborhoods—to communities of color," said Saara Nifici of the Neighborhood Economic Development Advocacy Project in New York, one of the organizations participating in the study. "That's where they focused their marketing practices."

The study analyzed the

geographic operating patterns of 35 high-risk lenders that were very active in 2006, but that went bankrupt, were closed or sold in 2007 as the industry imploded.

Chief among them were *New Century Mortgage Corporation*, *WMC Mortgage Corporation*, *Fremont Investment & Loan*, and *Argent Mortgage Company*.

In addition to Charlotte, the survey focused on lending to minority urban markets in New York, Los Angeles, Chicago, Boston, Cleveland, and Rochester, N.Y.

In six of these seven urban areas, high-risk lenders' market share in minority neighborhoods was at least three times the share in white neighborhoods. In Los Angeles, these subprime lenders had a market share in communities of color that was 9.5 times larger than their hold on mostly white areas, the report stated.

Part of their growth in those areas can be explained by the lack of other available resources—simply not having another lender in the



neighborhood, Nifici said. But researchers believe there's more to the issue.

"It's a question of access and a question of steering," Nifici said. "If you walk into the local subprime office, there's no incentive for them to send you to a different lender where you can qualify for a prime loan. People are steered downward, not upward."

This concentration of risky loans happened in low-income areas, but also in middle-class minority communities like the predominantly African- and Caribbean-American areas of southeast Queens in New York, said Nifici.

In these cases, "race and ethnicity played a bigger part" in lending decisions than income, she said.

This concentration means these minority communities will shoulder most of the negative impacts of the subprime crisis—foreclosures, sinking property values, lower tax bases, abandoned homes and higher crime.

Recommendations from the report to policy makers interested in protecting the stability of these neighborhoods included protecting borrowers and tenants from foreclosures and passing mortgage reform legislation.




