New president of LULAC seeks unity within oldest Latino rights group

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M., July 22, 2015 (AP): The newly elected president of the nation's largest and oldest Latino civil rights group says he hopes to end years of infighting with a call for unity to better serve the interests of the nation's 54 million Latinos.

Roger Rocha, of Laredo, Texas, told The Associated Press he's reaching out to key members of the *League of United Latin American Citizens* (LULAC) following his election, seeking to bring together various interests.

"It's a big challenge, and I'm up for the challenge," said Rocha, who became LULAC president last week in Salt Lake City at the group's convention.

He's ready to help the organization move "together as a united LULAC."

He takes over a group plagued by squabbling, including spats over a can-

celed election, a disputed real estate deal and national board eligibility.

Rocha, a 44-year-old health care provider, said the group's focus now should be on pushing federal immigration reform and better health care for the nation's growing Latino population.

He said old, internal conflict should be discarded for the sake of unity. "We've already moved past it,"

Rocha said from the organization's Washington, D.C., headquarters. "If there are one or two individuals (who) are dwelling on it, guess what? They are getting left behind because the membership of this organization has moved forward."

Officials say LULAC has around 100,000 members.

Former New Mexico LULAC state director Pablo Martínez said many members are willing to give Rocha and his board a chance. "I wish him the best because there is a lot at stake and it's

not just about us," Martínez said.

Founded in 1929 in Corpus Christi, Texas, LULAC was largely made up of Mexican-American World War I veterans who sought to fight discrimination.

The organization later became a key player in U.S. politics, and its members helped influence the passage of civil rights legislation in the 1960s.

In recent years, LULAC has been fighting for relevance amid competing civil rights groups and its internal battles, said Tatcho Mindiola, director of the *Center for Mexican American Studies* at the University of Houston.

"It could be that their energies have been directed inward rather than outward," Mindiola said. "But I just don't see (LULAC) quoted very often locally or nationally on various issues. They've been relatively quiet."

Restaurant ordered to cover up Mexican-American mural

SALT LAKE CITY, July 23, 2015 (AP): A large mural depicting Mexican-American icons may have to be removed from the side of a West Jordan restaurant, because city officials say it violates code.

The artist behind the mural, Miguel Galaz, said the painting is meant to teach kids and the community about Latino culture. But city officials argue that it is in violation of a sign ordinance, which states that a mural can only cover 15 percent of a building's facade.

Galaz is an art teacher at *Mano Academy*, a charter school in West Valley City. He said he uses the side of the restaurant as a teaching tool.

"This is my classroom," he said. "When I come out here, I show the kids about color theory. I show them about their culture."

The mural wraps all the way around the *Taqueria Azteca de Oro* building.

Interim city manager Bryce Haderlie said the city's problem concerns the murals coverage and not the content of the art.

"They're exceeding the

area of the wall that can be covered with a sign or other types of art, things of that nature," Haderlie said.

The city council on Wednesday agreed to postpone fines of \$100 a day for the restaurant owners and to keep the mural up for now.

The city plans to work with the restaurant owners to possibly make changes to the city's ordinance pertaining to murals, such as the one painted by Galaz.

"There's always opportunity for change, and we'll work with them on that," Haderlie said.

Pres. Obama threatens to veto House/GOP immigration bill on "sanctuary cities"

WASHINGTON, DC, July 23, 2015 (AP): The White House is threatening to veto a House GOP bill that would crack down on "sanctuary cities" that shield residents from federal immigration authorities.

An Obama administration statement says the legislation being voted on Thursday

would threaten civil rights by allowing law enforcement officials to gather immigration status information from any person at any time. The statement says such an approach would lead to mistrust between local communities and law enforcement agencies.

The bill comes in the wake of the shooting in San Fran-

cisco where a woman was killed, allegedly by an immigrant who was in this country illegally despite a long criminal record and multiple deportations.

The bill would cut off certain federal grants and spending for cities that don't cooperate with federal immigration requests.

San Francisco supervisor stands by sanctuary policies

SAN FRANCISCO, July 21, 2015 (AP): A San Francisco supervisor is standing by this city's much-criticized *sanctuary policies* even as he wants the sheriff to rescind an order curtailing staff from talking to federal immigration authorities.

Supervisor Mark Farrell introduced legislation Tuesday in response to the shoot-

ing death of a woman at a San Francisco pier.

Her alleged killer was in the country illegally and released from jail because San Francisco, along with other jurisdictions, does not honor immigration detainee re-

quests.

Farrell said he wants Sheriff Ross Mirkarimi to rescind a March memo limiting depart- ment communications with immigration officials.

Mark Nicco, deputy legal counsel for the sheriff's office, said there is no department-wide gag order,

only a limit on the immi-

gration-related information shared.

He said the office wel- comes legislative guidance from the board.

Congreso busca cambios tras homicidio en San Francisco

WASHINGTON, DC, 21 VII 15 (AP): Apremados por el testimonio del padre de una víctima de homicidio, el Congreso protagonizó el martes un acalorado debate sobre inmigración, ya que legisladores republicanos prometieron cancelar recursos para las llamadas ciudades refugio—como San Francisco—que protegen a inmigrantes de la deportación.

Los defensores de los inmigrantes censuraron la propuesta y acusaron a los republicanos de seguir el ejemplo de su precandidato presidencial Donald Trump de satanizar a los hispanos.

Sin embargo, después de la muerte de *Kathryn Steinle*, de 32 años, ocurrida este mes por un disparo atribuido a un inmigrante que tenía antecedentes penales y carecía de autorización para vivir en el país, incluso algunos demócratas exigieron que el legislativo aborde el enredo ineficaz de leyes y políticas federales y locales que

habían permitido al hombre quedar libre en las calles.

"Creemos firmemente que alguna iniciativa debe ser discutida, decretada o modificada a fin de retirar para siempre de las calles a estos criminales inmigrantes indocumentados", dijo Jim Steinle, padre de Kathryn Steinle. Padre e hija caminaban por un popular muelle en San Francisco cuando murió alcanzada por un disparo.

"Creamos que si una ley relacionada con Kate salva a una hija, un hijo, una madre, un padre, la muerte de Kate no habrá sido en vano", agregó.

En su testimonio ante la Comisión de Asuntos Jurídicos del Senado en un ambiente de suma seriedad, Jim Steinle dijo que su hija era una persona amistosa, feliz, audaz, llena de sonrisas y amor.

Tras ser alcanzada por el disparo al azar ante la mirada de su padre cuando ambos caminaban tomados del brazo, sólo tuvo tiempo de decir "ayúdame, papá".

"Fueron las últimas palabras que escuché de mi hija", declaró Steinle. "Estaríamos orgullosos de

ver el nombre de Kate relacionado con alguna nueva legislación al respecto", apuntó.

El presunto homicida, *Juan Francisco López Sánchez*, tenía muchas condenas por delitos graves y lo habían deportado en cinco ocasiones, pero las autoridades de San Francisco lo dejaron en libertad tras rechazar la solicitud de las autoridades migratorias federales de que lo retuvieran hasta que pudieran llevárselo detenido.

San Francisco figura entre las centenares de jurisdicciones a nivel nacional que declinan cumplir las solicitudes de las autoridades migratorias federales de que se retenga a alguien, medida que los defensores de los inmigrantes afirman puede afectar injusta y específicamente a extranjeros que no han hecho nada malo o sólo tienen faltas menores.

Comisión del Senado de EEUU vota para permitir viajes a Cuba

WASHINGTON, DC, 23 VII 15 (AP): Una comisión del Senado de Estados Unidos controlada por los republicanos votó a favor de terminar con una prohibición de décadas a los estadounidenses para viajar a Cuba, lo que da el impulso que el presidente Barack Obama necesita para reducir las restricciones a los viajes y abrir más las relaciones con el país caribeño.

La Comisión de Asignaciones Presupuestarias también votó para abolir una ley que prohibía a los bancos y otros negocios estadounidenses financiar ventas de exportaciones agrícolas de Estados Unidos a Cuba.

La provisión de la Cámara de Representantes bloquearía las nuevas normas emitidas en enero que reducen las restricciones de viaje a Cuba y permiten vuelos programados con regularidad.

La iniciativa del Senado va más allá de esas normas, que terminaron con el requisito para los viajeros de obtener permiso del Departamento de Tesoro antes de viajar a Cuba. En vez de eso, todo lo que necesitan los viajeros es demostrar que su visita tiene fines educativos, religiosos o de otros motivos permitidos.

"Tenemos la oportunidad de aumentar las posibilidades de que el pueblo cubano tenga mayores derechos y libertad con la capacidad de conectarnos con ellos", dijo el promotor de la iniciativa, Jerry Moran. "También diría que como estadounidenses tenemos ciertas libertades que valoramos mucho y que

hoy los estadounidenses pueden viajar por el mundo sin excepción, ningún país está totalmente prohibido, a excepción de Cuba".

En cambio, la Comisión de Asignaciones Presupuestarias avanzó a dirección opuesta, pero el desacuerdo entre los republicanos hace menos probable que el Congreso controlado por ese partido trate de usar los gastos del gobierno para oponerse al acercamiento de Obama con Cuba.

El gobierno de Obama emitió normas en enero para facilitar los viajes a Cuba y permitir que haya vuelos programados con regularidad. La votación de la Comisión de Asignaciones Presupuestarias, de 18 votos a favor y 12 en contra, surge días después de que Estados Unidos y Cuba terminaran formalmente con más de medio siglo sin relaciones diplomáticas.

"El cambio positivo en Cuba llevará tiempo", dijo el senador Patrick Leahy. "Pero llegará, no como resultado de la nostalgia necia de unos pocos escandalosos por la era de Batista, sino por visitar Cuba, escuchar al pueblo cubano y relacionarse con ellos".

El sector hotelero y otras ramas comerciales de Estados Unidos no pueden hacer negocios en Cuba todavía. El presidente de Marriot In-

ternational, Arne Sorenson, acaba de regresar de Cuba y es representante de muchas empresas que desean hacer negocios ahí, especialmente ahora que más estadounidenses viajarán a la isla.

"Ya que están en aumento los viajes a Cuba, los hoteles cubanos existentes están al máximo de su capacidad y las compañías hoteleras de otros países corren para asegurar tantos hoteles nuevos como sea posible antes de que lleguen Marriott y otros competidores estadounidenses", dijo Sorenson.

Las votaciones de las comisiones reflejan el sentimiento cada vez más fuerte, incluso entre algunos conservadores republicanos, para reducir el embargo y las restricciones de viaje a Cuba que suman más de cinco décadas, y no han servido para llevar al gobierno de Castro hacia la democracia.

"Tras casi 60 años quizás debamos probar algo diferente", dijo Moran.

El panel del senado también votó para retirar las restricciones a los barcos que envían productos a Cuba y tienen que esperar seis meses para regresar a Estados Unidos.

La ley sobre Cuba fue agregada a una iniciativa de 21.000 millones de dólares para el Departamento del Tesoro, que se encarga de revisar el cumplimiento del embargo económico sobre el país caribeño.

Michigan Civil Rights Commission honors George Romney

July 26, 2015: In recognition of this weekend's 20th anniversary of the death of former Governor George W. Romney, the Michigan Civil Rights Commission (MCRC) this week unanimously approved a resolution honoring his life and work. The resolution commends Romney for his championing of civil rights and his role in creating the MCRC.

"George Romney was a leader ahead of his time," said Arthur Horwitz, Chairman of the MCRC. "He clearly believed equality for all people was a moral imperative, but he also recognized that everyone benefits and our economy grows when people are treated fairly and given an opportunity to realize their full potential."

While serving as chairman of the Michigan Constitutional Convention in 1963, Romney advocated strongly for including both civil rights protections and a commission to enforce them in the state constitution. As a result, Michigan became the first state to create a civil rights commission with constitutional authority.

As governor, Romney appointed the first members of the newly-created commission. His decision to name co-chairs – one an African-American and a Democrat, the other a white Republican – set the tone of bi-partisanship and compromise that still guides the work of the commission more than 50 years later.

"At a time of national upheaval and violence, George Romney laid a foundation for tolerance, fairness and cooperation in Michigan," said Horwitz. "At a time when our country is once again tackling the challenges of racism, hate and bigotry, Romney's example should serve as a guide for us all."

The MCRC adopted a resolution which stated in part: "To mark the twentieth anniversary of his passing on July 26, 1995, the Michigan Civil Rights Commission honors one of Michigan's greatest voices for equality. George Wilcken Romney accomplished so much in his 88 years that his enormous contribution to his success."

"In his inaugural speech on January 1, 1963, Romney called residential segregation a "crucial and pressing problem."

Among his first acts as Governor was to appoint co-chairs to lead the new Civil Rights Commission – Damon Keith and John Feikens. His appointment of one white and one Black person to serve as equals sent a clear

message about what the MCRC stood for. In his first State of the State address, Romney declared that "Michigan's most urgent human rights problem is racial discrimination—in housing, public accommodations, education, administration of justice, and employment."

"During his tenure as Governor, civil rights were never far from the public consciousness, and Romney never shied away from his convictions. He personally participated in many civil rights marches. In 1963 he appeared, uninvited, at an NAACP demonstration against housing discrimination in Grosse Pointe. Asked to speak, he proudly described his role in enshrining the Commission in the constitution, stating: 'This document is the clearest, strongest, most complete statement of civil rights of any constitution in the land.'

"President Richard Nixon appointed George Romneys as the nation's first Secretary for Housing and Urban Development. Secretary Romney created "Operation Breakthrough," a program to further fair housing, breaking what he called the "white noose" by opening white suburbia to African-Americans. He argued that low income housing should not be built in disadvantaged communities where it only added to existing segregation and placed additional students into schools that were already overburdened."

"Romney also championed the cause of civil rights. He was among the most effective advocates for including civil rights guarantees and provisions to protect those guarantees. The Michigan Civil Rights Commission, the only state body in the country with constitutional authority, is an ongoing testament to his success."

"Romney, who believed restructuring would not be effective if it was not accompanied by new leadership, was persuaded become the Republican candidate for Governor. He took on the sitting governor and won decisively."

"In his inaugural speech on January 1, 1963, Romney called residential segregation a "crucial and pressing problem." Among his first acts as Governor was to appoint co-chairs to lead the new Civil Rights Commission – Damon Keith and John Feikens. His appointment of one white and one Black person to serve as equals sent a clear

"After leaving the cabinet, Romney focused on promoting volunteerism. He became chair and CEO of the National Center for Voluntary Action and guided it through mergers into the National Volunteer Center. When President Bush created the Points of Light Foundation in 1990, Romney received its first lifetime achievement award. When he was later asked to chair the Foundation, he merged the two organizations. George Romney's final speech promoted this important cause."

Man sues DMV for refusing to translate, interpret exam

PROVIDENCE, R.I., July 23, 2015 (AP): An Italian immigrant is suing the Rhode Island Department of Motor Vehicles for refusing to translate the written driver's license exam or allow for an interpreter.

The Rhode Island chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) on Thursday announced it

had filed a federal complaint with the U.S. Department of Justice on behalf of Danilo Saccoccio.

The complaint says the DMV is violating a law that requires agencies receiving federal funding to accommodate individuals with limited English proficiency. The complaint asks the DMV to accommodate

Saccoccio.

The ACLU says the DMV will only allow Saccoccio to take the exam in English, Spanish or Portuguese.

Saccoccio received his green card in November and is married to an American citizen.

A message seeking comment from the DMV was not immediately returned.

Gov. Kasich is 16th notable entry into GOP race; 1st debate is in Cleveland on August 6

COLUMBUS, July 23, 2015 (AP): Ohio's John Kasich, a blunt governor who embraces conservative ideals but disdains the political sport of bashing Hillary Rodham Clinton, has become the 16th notable Republican to enter the 2016 GOP presidential race.

The second-term governor and former congressman declared his candidacy Tuesday at Ohio State University, where

as a freshman political science major in 1970, he audaciously wrote a letter that landed him a 20-minute audience with President Richard Nixon.

His entry nearly rounds out an unusually diverse Republican lineup with two Latinos, an African-American, one woman, and several younger candidates alongside older white men such as Kasich, 63, and Jeb Bush, 62. The field is so crowded it's unclear whether Kasich will qualify for the GOP's first debate in Cleveland on August 6, 2015.

"How did we end up with 20 people running for president?" Kasich asks with a smile in a video recently released by his political action committee. He cites his experience with the federal budget, national security and his leadership of Ohio. "Of all those people running, there's not one that has experience in all those critical three areas."

Kasich has demonstrated a willingness to buck his own party when practical: He departed from Republican orthodoxy to expand Medicaid in line with the federal health care law.

He's spent the year testing his political style around the country, for part of that time as chief spokesman for a national effort to pass a federal balanced-budget constitutional amendment. It remains to be seen how Kasich's risky habit of working without a script will play in the 24/7 hothouse of presidential politics.

Even so, he signaled early on that he wasn't interested in piling on Hillary Clinton, the leading Democratic contender, or President Barack Obama, a ritual almost as ingrained as the pledge of allegiance at Republican gatherings. Asked at a New Hampshire forum to give

esty and personal responsibility—and call on people to work together and help others as a way to rise above their anxiety about the economic future, Kasich also told his personal story in Tuesday's speech and pitch himself as having the qualifications, character, and enthusiasm necessary to lead the nation.

The man who once figuratively told lobbyists to get on his bus or he'd run them over and who called a police officer an "idiot" helped erase a budget deficit projected at nearly \$8 billion when he entered office, boasts Ohio's rainy-day fund to a historic high and seen private-sector employment rebound to its post-recession level. This, through budget cutting, privatization of parts of Ohio's government and other, often business-style methods.

Unions that turned back an effort by Kasich and fellow Republicans to limit public workers' collective bargaining rights say Kasich's successes have come at a cost to local governments and schools, and that new Ohio jobs lack the pay and benefits of the ones they replaced.

Kasich has demonstrated a willingness to buck his own party when practical: He departed from Republican orthodoxy to expand Medicaid in line with the federal health care law.

He's spent the year testing his political style around the country, for part of that time as chief spokesman for a national effort to pass a federal balanced-budget constitutional amendment. It remains to be seen how Kasich's risky habit of working without a script will play in the 24/7 hothouse of presidential politics.

Even so, he signaled early on that he wasn't interested in piling on Hillary Clinton, the leading Democratic contender, or President Barack Obama, a ritual almost as ingrained as the pledge of allegiance at Republican gatherings. Asked at a New Hampshire forum to give

three reasons Ms. Clinton would make a bad president, he declined and said briskly: "If I've got to spend my time trashing people to be successful in this, you can count me out."

He's largely lived up to that, at least so far. But when Clinton accused other GOP governors of trying to disenfranchise voters by limiting early ballots and requiring photo ID to vote, he grew exasperated. "What is she talking about?" Kasich asked. "Don't be running around the country dividing America."

A fixture on Sunday talk shows and at one-time a Fox commentator, Kasich faces an immediate challenge to qualify for the first Republican debate. That faceoff takes place next month in his home-state city of Cleveland and only the top 10 candidates in national polling will be invited.

No Republican has won the White House without carrying Ohio.

In recent months, he's made trips to New Hampshire, South Carolina, Iowa, New York, and Michigan, and will be returning to early voting states after his announcement. His allies at the political organization New Day for America reported raising \$11.5 million on Kasich's behalf before his entry into the race.

Kasich was born in McKees Rocks, Pennsylvania, the son of a mail carrier and grandchild of Hungarian, Czech and Croatian immigrants. At Ohio State, he wrote to Nixon praising his leadership and seeking a meeting that would be "a dream come true." Nixon obliged, and Kasich flew to Washington for a chat and handshake in the Oval Office.

In 1978, he launched his political career by defeating an incumbent Democrat to become the youngest person elected to the Ohio Senate, at age 26.

"I'm a normal person," he told The Associated Press this year, "but that makes me unorthodox in politics."

LATINA PROFILE: Pandora-Gilboa HS graduate Olivia Velásquez awarded \$100,000 McDonald's Scholarship

GILBOA, OH, July 31, 2015: Olivia Velásquez had always dreamed of attending Harvard University to earn a degree in medicine. Now, thanks to Harvard, other supporters, and her entering a national scholarship competition sponsored by Hispanic McDonald's owner/operators, Ms. Velásquez's dream will come true.

Last week, Ms. Velásquez, accompanied by her parents, Rick and Amy Velásquez of Gilboa, OH received an over-sized check for \$100,000 representing her RMHC (Ronald McDonald House Charities)/ HACER National Scholarship. The award was presented at a ceremony at the Ottawa McDonald's franchise.

The RMHC/HACER Scholarship was established in 1985 to help Latino high school students finance their college education. Scholarships awards range from \$1,000 to \$100,000. In 2008, the RMHC/HACER National Scholarship was created, which to date has provided \$3.1 million in financial assistance to 31 students. RMHC/HACER National Scholarship recipients are selected based on their academic achievement, community involvement and financial need.

Ms. Velásquez will leave

for Cambridge, Massachusetts later this summer where she will apply the scholarship grant towards the study of biology and Spanish at Harvard.

"I was pretty surprised when I looked on line and found out I had won," recalled Ms. Velásquez.

A 2015 graduate of Pandora-Gilboa High School with a cumulative GPA of 3.98, Ms. Velásquez is the niece of Baldemar Velásquez, the charismatic president and founder of the Farm Labor Organizing Committee (FLOC) AFL-CIO, and himself an alumnus of Pandora-Gilboa, from where he graduated in 1965.

Ms. Velásquez is one of four college-bound Latino students who were awarded the national scholarship this year. The other recipients are Janet Gómez of Naples, Florida, who will also be attending Harvard; Manuel Tejeda of Tampa, Florida, who will be attending Stanford; and Juliana Peña from Ashburnham, Massachusetts, who will be attending the University of Pennsylvania.

The 18-year-old Ms. Velásquez has already received an impressive array of the scholarships including the

Boyd Loughridge Festival Scholarship, Hancock-Wood Electric Cooperative Scholarship, and the Rieman Scholarship. Included among her other honors are having been named a National Hispanic Recognition Program Scholar, National Merit Commended Scholar, American Legion Americanism Contest, Bluffton University, and the Lima News Leaders of Tomorrow Scholarship finalist as well as a host of recognition for her writing, oration, musical, and athletic abilities.

Scholarship recognition apparently runs in the family, Rick Velásquez told La Prensa. "Our oldest daughter, Melisa, now 23, graduated from the University of Toledo on scholarships. She now works for the Thomson Reuters software company in Michigan. And hopefully our youngest daughter, Michelle, who is going into the 7th grade, will follow in her sisters' footsteps."

Rick is one of eight siblings in the illustrious Velásquez family which has also produced the highly acclaimed muralist Oscar Velásquez.

Ms. Velásquez has already enjoyed a unique guided tour of the Harvard campus in the company of her uncle

Baldemar. "Harvard really looked like a college the way I thought a college should always look," said Ms. Velásquez. "The streets in Cambridge were so small that they were just like those in Gilboa. It was a safe, closed environment," she added.

But not every student aspiring to attend Harvard is lucky enough to have a tour guide with the credentials of Baldemar Velásquez to take her around the campus.

Baldemar Velásquez told La Prensa he "works with PAPSAC (Private and Public, Science, Academic and Consumer Food Policy Group) which is based at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard and is led by Professor Ray Goldberg."

He said he also works with Marshall Ganz, who was César Chávez's right-hand man in the United Farm Workers Union and is now at the Harvard Labor Work Life Program. Velásquez said he will be at Harvard this fall participating in the programs to which he has been invited.

Velásquez added that Olivia has worked with FLOC as a volunteer in the FLOC Clinics for migrant workers beginning with the summer of 2014.


The Clinics were originally created to provide health screening in the migrant worker camps. They literally came of age during FLOC's Campbell Soup strike in the mid-1980s, when Velásquez's wife, Sara Templin Velásquez, a Registered Nurse, became a strike nurse.

"She had a station wagon full of medical supplies and provided first aid treatment for various ailments to allow the migrant workers to have healthcare," said her husband. Eventually more volunteers, including many from the ProMedica Health Providers, joined the program.

"We received a major boost when St. Charles Hospital provided a mobile unit with two examination rooms which broadened the program and made it more viable. Now every week we were able to go to a different area of the state and to the larger camps," recalled Velásquez.

The mobile health unit now treats approximately 200 patients every July and August, and provides dental services, HIV testing and vision testing to workers in the migrant camps.

The FLOC Clinics have just received a \$7,000 grant in support for the mobile worker clinic. The grant is to the "Campaign for Migrant Worker Justice," the educa-

tion and training 501(c) (3) non-profit that operates in partnership with FLOC. Velásquez proudly told La Prensa.

The efforts of FLOC to obtain justice for worker's rights have not gone unheralded by the greater community. On June 3, Velásquez accepted the prestigious *Labor Rights Defender Award* for Grass Roots Organization, U.S., at a ceremony in Washington, D.C.

Last week Velásquez and a large contingent of FLOC volunteers returned from a bus trip to North Carolina where FLOC continues to press for recognition of the rights of exploited tobacco workers.

The group, led by Velásquez, marched through downtown Winston-Salem protesting the R.J. Reynolds tobacco giant's repressive policies towards its workers in the fields.

Members of the group actually spent time in the tobacco fields with the workers. "They were drenched in sweat after only five minutes," said Velásquez. "It was 94 degrees out there and they saw the conditions under which the workers toil for 10 to 13 hours a day. 'This is slavery,' they said, having now received a full appreciation of the conditions under which we put food on our table.

"These were members of our FLOC Homies Union and the adult LOBOS (Latinos Organizing Barrios) community organizing groups. They held a fundraiser to fund the bus trip," said Velásquez.

The mobile health unit now treats approximately 200 patients every July and August, and provides dental services, HIV testing and vision testing to workers in the migrant camps.

The group has focused its attention upon several major issues, one of which is improving relationships with the police in regards to unwarranted stops, searches and sei-

zures. There have been many incidents here, and we want the police to do something about it. We are trying to have them build a better relationship with the Latino community, but clearly some of the officers on the force are not practicing these policies day-to-day. Their excuse is that they are following the rule book, but there is good policing and bad policing, and the latter is what we are going to stop.

"The police do not have permission to search you. We have established a program on our website to report these incidents. Far too often these little misunderstandings turn into escalation. It is a provocation," said Velásquez.

There have been some breakthroughs in this historic impasse. Velásquez points to the creation of a FLOC photo ID. "It does not replace a driver's license, but it provides documentation. We have sent a copy of the ID to the police force for their distribution," he said.

So how does Velásquez feel about the anti-Mexican rhetoric spewed by would-be Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump?

"He is just digging his own hole," said Velásquez. "Only marginally thinking people follow his rants. I have more faith in the American people to repudiate these beliefs. The truth will prevail. During the Campbell Soup strike I encountered the Nazis, the KKK, I saw them all. I had a death threat from the Minutemen. I've heard from far worse crazies (than Trump) during the years.

"Even Campbell Soup tried to buy us off with a cosmetic anti-poverty program. But we prevailed, and we are still here serving the people," added Velásquez.

Villanueva, addressing an audience of OHBA members, and community lead-


ers, recounts Feliciano's history of many firsts, including:

México supera 3-1 a Jamaica y gana su 7ma Copa de Oro

FILADEFIA, 26 VII 15 (AP): Instalado en la final con poco fútbol y la ayuda decisiva de los árbitros, México salvó su honor el domingo al derrotar convincentemente 3-1 a Jamaica con goles de Andrés Guardado, Jesús Coronay Oríbe Peralta y conquistar por séptima vez la *Copa de Oro*.

Guardado, que había anotado de penal los dos goles en la polémica victoria 2-1 sobre Panamá en las semifinales, abrió la cuenta a los 30 minutos al empalmar de primera un centro desde la derecha de Paul Aguilar y la defensa jamaicana regaló otros dos tantos.

El "Tecatito" Coronado anotó los 46 tras robarle un balón a Michael Hector y Peralta cerró la cuenta cuando el mismo Hector se empeñó tratar de despear un centro y le dejó servida la pelota a dentro.

Daren Mattocks descontó los 79 en el implemento estadio Lincoln Financial Field de los Eagles de la NFL, que registró la asistencia más grande de su historia, casi 69,000 aficionados, en una gran mayoría mexicanos.

El técnico mexicano Miguel Herrera, que parecía tambalearse en la cuerda floja después del partido contra Panamá, que los canaros casi ganan pese a jugársela casi todo el encuentro con un hombre menos, agradeció a sus jugadores "su entrega y determinación".

"Hicimos un partido bien pensado, bien manejado", indicó, aludiendo a la forma en que su equipo explotó las debilidades de su rival y aprovechó cualquier resquicio que se le abrió.

"Nos borramos de la cabeza el partido malo que tuvimos" contra Panamá y "jugamos con una gran concentración", manifestó "Piojo".

Jamaica calificó mejor los primeros minutos y despidió algunas carencias defensivas mexicanas en su flanco izquierdo, donde Garath McCleary le ganaba con facilidad las espaldas a Diego Reyes y Osvaldo Alanís. Pero poco a poco el "Tri" se plantó mejor en el terreno y tomó el control de las acciones a partir del despegue de Guardado y Jonathan dos Santos en medio de la calidez de Coronariba.

"Teníamos en frente un equipo difícil, que empezó con todo. Pero el equipo se fue asentando. Tomamos el ritmo que queríamos, manejamos el juego y aprovechamos las posibilidades", dijo Herrera.

"Paramos festones una medallada plata. Esde oro", sostuvo por su parte el técnico de Jamaica Winfield Schaefer. "Nadie nos daba posibilidades".


México, que eliminó a Costa Rica en cuartos de final y a Panamá en las semifinales ayudado por penales inexistentes, jugó sin Carlos Vela y Giovanni dos Santos, descartados ambos por lesión. Pero no sintió esas ausencias y pasó elusto inicial, en que los centros jamaicanos generaron bastante zozobra, sobre todo en el centro. Ya antes del primer gol el "Tecatito" había estado dos veces cerca de anotar, con un cabezazo que fue desviado lucidamente por el portero jamaiquino Dwayne Miller y un tiro alto desde buena posición.

El gol cayó exactamente al media hora de juego, en que Paul Aguilar envió un centro desde la derecha y Guardado le dio de primera al balón, sin dejar que tocara el piso, clavándola pelota en el ángulo superior.

Las cosas se simplificaron a los mexicanos después del tanto ya que Jamaica comenzó a perder la línea. Los doce goles siguientes fueron regalos de la defensa caribeña. En el primero el "Tecatito" le robó una pelota a Hector, enfilaron hacia adelante y anotó con un tiro bajo. Sobre la hora de juego el mismo Hector no pudo despear un centro, se empeñó con la pelota y se la dejó servida al portero jamaiquino Dwayne Miller y un tiro alto desde buena posición.

"El gol de Corona nos mató", expresó Schaefer.

Con el partido definido Miller convirtió en figura, Mattocks, que acababa de ingresar, descontó de contragolpe.



La Habana muestra la historia entre EEUU y Cuba por doquier

LA HABANA, 21 VII 15 (AP): La reapertura de embajadas de esta semana y la reanudación de relaciones diplomáticas entre Estados Unidos y Cuba abren un nuevo capítulo en la complicada relación entre ambos países.

Pero cualquier visitante de la capital cubana puede ver que las relaciones bilaterales son profundas y de vieja data con sólo mirar las atracciones que incluyen muestras de la cultura y la historia de Estados Unidos. A pesar de décadas de hostilidad, algunos de estos sitios incluso parecen celebrar a los estadounidenses, mientras que otros reflejan puntos de vista antiestadounidenses.

Aquí un vistazo:

HEMINGWAY: El escritor estadounidense Ernest Hemingway vivió en Cuba intermitentemente durante años, y aquí trabajó en algunas de sus obras más famosas, como "Por quién doblan las campanas" y "El viejo y el mar". Uno de los mayores atractivos turísticos de La Habana es su antigua vivienda, la Finca La Vigía, que es visitada tanto por peregrinos literarios de todo el mundo como por cubanos. No se puede entrar en la casa,

pero las grandes ventanas abiertas permiten echar un buen vistazo al interior. Botellas de licor y revistas colocadas astutamente entre los sofás y las mesas crean la sensación de que Hemingway volverá en cualquier momento. También en el lugar se encuentra el bote de Hemingway, "El Pilar".

Las fotos de Hemingway posando con trofeos de pesca y con el líder de la revolución cubana Fidel Castro decoran muchos bares y hoteles, incluido el hotel Ambos Mundos de La Habana Vieja, donde pueden visitar una habitación en la que vivió Hemingway. Y dos bares de La Habana atraen a un constante flujo de turistas en parte gracias a la célebre declaración dipsómana de Hemingway: "Mi mojito en La Bodeguita, mi daiquirí en El Floridita". La frase, supuestamente escrita a mano por el propio Hemingway, está enmarcada sobre la barra de La Bodeguita del Medio. El Floridita tiene una estatua de Hemingway.

Otros sitios incluyen un club náutico llamado Marina Hemingway, y un monumento a Hemingway en el poblado pesquero vecino de Cojimar.

PRESIDENTES DE EEUU: Varios sitios en La Habana hacen referencia a presidentes de Estados Unidos, pero no todos son halagadores.

Dentro del Museo de la Revolución se exhiben caricaturas de Ronald Reagan, George H.W. Bush y George W. Bush en el "Rincón de los Cretinos". Afuera del museo hay restos de un avión espía estadounidense que fue derribado en Cuba en 1962 durante la Crisis de los Misiles Cubanos, un momento decisivo para la presidencia de John F. Kennedy.

Abraham Lincoln es honrado con dos estatuas: una escultura pequeña afuera de una escuela de idiomas extranjeros, en Avenida de los Presidentes, entre la Calle 17 y la Calle 19, en el barrio de El Vedado, y un busto en el Parque de la Fraternidad, sobre Paseo del Prado.

Incluso el Capitolio de La Habana parecerá familiar para los estadounidenses. Está diseñado a semejanza del Capitolio de Estados Unidos en Washington D.C.

LOS ROSENBERG: Julius y Ethel Rosenberg fueron ejecutados por el gobierno de Estados Unidos

tras ser acusados de pasar secretos atómicos a la Unión Soviética. Sus muertes fueron criticadas en diversas partes del mundo y dejaron huérfanos a dos hijos pequeños. El testimonio de un jurado investigador de 1950 que fue difundido recientemente indica que Ethel podría haber sido inocente. En La Habana, un monumento de ladrillo en la esquina de Zapata y Paseo está decorado con sus imágenes, siluetas de palomas y las palabras: "Por la paz, el pan y las rosas enfrentemos al verdugo. Ethel y Julius Rosenberg. Asesinados el 19-6-1953".

MAFIOSOS, ESTRELLAS DE CINE Y BEISBOLISTAS: Muchos hoteles exhiben fotografías y relatos del auge prerrevolucionario de La Habana, que retratan a la capital cubana como un sitio de diversión glamoroso para mafiosos, estrellas de cine y jugadores de béisbol, desde una placa sobre Babe Ruth en el vestíbulo del Hotel Plaza hasta una exposición fotográfica en el Hotel Nacional que incluye imágenes de Nat King Cole,

Frank Sinatra y Fred Astaire. La historia oficial del Hotel Nacional dice que en 1946 fue el lugar de reunión de jefes de la mafia. La reunión inspiró pasajes de la película "El Padrino: Parte II".

Algunas fotos en blanco y negro también decoran el bar "Sloppy Joe's", en La Habana Vieja, que alguna vez frecuentaron Hemingway y otras celebridades. Sloppy Joe's también es mencionado en la cultura británica, en el libro y filme "Nuestro hombre en La Habana", de Graham Greene, que relata la historia de un espía torpe.

JOHN LENNON, NEÓN Y ORQUINO HONORARIO: John Lennon era británico, pero los neoyorquinos lo consideraban uno de ellos: Vivió y murió en Manhattan. Uno de los parques más bellos de La Habana lleva su nombre, y en él hay una banca en la que los visitantes pueden posar junto a una escultura del cantante. Cuando los turistas se acercan, un asistente coloca gafas sobre el rostro de la estatua. Hay una inscripción en español con extractos de la canción "Imagine" de Lennon:

"Dirías que soy un soñador, pero no soy el único".

USS MAINE: El buque de guerra USS Maine fue destruido por una explosión en el puerto de La Habana en 1898 que dejó 266 muertos. "Recuerden el Maine", se convirtió en eslogan para quienes azuzaban la guerra entre Estados Unidos y España. La victoria estadounidense liberó a Cuba, que había sido una colonia española, pero también llevó a la intervención de Estados Unidos en asuntos internos de Cuba.

Un monumento a las víctimas del Maine, con dos torres blancas, se sitúa sobre el Malecón de La Habana. Una águila de bronce que coronaba el monumento fue derribada en 1961 durante una protesta contra Estados Unidos, y la cabeza del ave se conserva en la misión diplomática que acaba de convertirse en embajada de Estados Unidos. El resto del águila está a resguardo de la Oficina del Historiador de La Habana. Algunos dicen que las relaciones entre Estados Unidos y Cuba estarán normalizadas por completo cuando el águila sea restaurada y colocada de nuevo sobre el monumento.

María Sosa named Lorain's new Fair Housing Administrator

Lorain city government has named a Latina as its new fair housing administrator to address complaints of discrimination in lending, leasing, and other housing-related issues.

Maria Sosa has more than a decade's worth of experience working in the housing industry, both in the private and non-profit sectors. The native of Puerto Rico is bilingual, which will serve her well in a community that is one-quarter Latino. Ms. Sosa will work in Lorain's Department of Building, Housing, and Planning.

"The role of a fair housing administrator is important because housing discrimination continues to be a major social problem in the United States," said Ms. Sosa, who emphasized federal law and city ordinances offer strong tools against housing discrimination. "However, education, monitoring and enforcement are key factors. My role as the fair housing administrator for the city of Lorain is to implement strategies in order to educate the public, monitor housing practices and help in the process of enforcing fair housing laws within the city."

According to Ms. Sosa, the city of Lorain must continue to "affirmatively further fair housing." As part of that effort she plans to help city officials to analyze discriminatory patterns, promote fair housing practices for all persons, provide op-

portunity for inclusive patterns of housing occupancy, promote housing that is structurally accessible and usable by all persons, and foster compliance with nondiscriminatory provisions of both federal and local laws.

Ms. Sosa, who moved to Northeast Ohio from Puerto Rico just before entering high school, has seen both sides of the coin when it comes to housing.

"My roles have been diverse, since I have worked for nonprofit organizations as a HUD-certified counselor, and the private sector as a mortgage broker/banker, among other roles," she said.

Her duties involve working with city residents to address matters that fall within Lorain's fair housing ordinance, which protects people from discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, disability, and familial status. The fair housing code also addresses lending practices that may adversely affect persons during the home-buying process.
