(Movidéndonos Adelante por Notables Héroes de Derechos Civiles) invita cordialmente al evento histórico que se llevará a cabo este sábado 28 de agosto del medio día alas 3:00pm para cambiar el nombre de la Grandville Avenue a César E. Chávez Avenue y Franklin Street a Martin Luther King, Jr. Street con el objetivo de honrar la vida y legado de estos grandes líderes.

Diferentes organizaciones y grupos comunitarios visitarán las casas y negocios de la Grandville Ave, SW y Franklin St, SE, durante la Campaña de Apoyo a la Petición de cambio de nombre, para explicar la importancia de contar con su apoyo.

Lupe Ramos- Montigny, Presidenta del Comité para Honrar a César Estrada Chávez, informó: "Estamos dividiendo las calles por bloques para que cada grupo sea responsable de visitar a todos y cada uno de los residentes y negocios de la sección que le corresponda. Le estoy pidiendo que cada uno lleve una playaera con el nombre de su asociación, negocio o grupo al que representa para que se vea la gran diversidad de personas que apoyan esta noble acción. El propósito es

informar a los residentes sobre la vida y obra de César E. Chávez Martin Luther King, Jr para tocar sus corazones y comprendan la importancia de este cambio. Si informan correctamente, todos van a querer apoyarnos y firmar la petición".

El objetivo es conseguir la mayor cantidad de firmas y cartas de recomendación para llevar a la ciudad y solicitar el cambio de nombre. "Es importante demostrar que es una petición de la comunidad y no únicamente Lupe Ramos", agregó la entrevistada, quien comentó que mucha gente no está enterada del trabajo de los grandes líderes comunitarios, por eso se requiere informarles. "Hay una organización en la avenida Grandville que estaba en contra de la propuesta pero me reuní con ellos para explicarles, como somos juntos y les comenté lo que Cesar decía: Cuando te invitan a una casa y te dan de comer, se vuelven amigos para el resto de sus días. A partir de ese momento nos hicimos grandes amigos y ahora contamos con su apoyo".

La Campaña de Apoyo dará inicio a las 11:30am con una rueda de prensa y a las 12:00pm comenzará la actividad con una bienvenida de los organizadores, música en vivo por parte de Erick Picard and Company, así como Zumba por Yeli. Posteriormente se entregarán

los materiales para comenzar con el recorrido "Construyendo Unidad en la Comunidad Bloque por Bloque", y se concluirá con un refrigerio. En caso de que las organizaciones no concluyan la visita de las casas que les corresponden, podrán regresar otro día, pero ninguna casa deberá quedarse sin visitar.

Montigny dijo que ya cuentan con el apoyo de varios negocios de la avenida Grandville pero es importante informar a todos los residentes de esa área. Grupos de diferentes países se han unido a la causa ya que en el grupo de Cesar E. Chávez se le da la bienvenida a todo mundo, no hay divisiones; su legado no es nada más para los campesinos, sino para todas las personas.

Cabe destacar que desde hace 21 años Lupe Ramos comenzó el movimiento para renombrar la avenida Grandville. "En ese entonces nos autorizaron realizar un reconocimiento a nombre de Cesar E. Chávez en algunas calles y hace cuatro años regresé con la propuesta para renombrar la avenida. También me reuní con la comunidad afroamericana para extender la propuesta y renombrar a la calle Franklin con el nombre de Martin Luther King, Jr", relató. "Cuando llegó el nuevo Gerente de la Ciudad me reuní con él y entre otras cosas le

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pedí que nos apoyara con este cambio, sin embargo hay que llevar firmas y cartas para que vengan el apoyo de la comunidad".

Para la entrevistada, este cambio es muy importante ya que el nombre de Cesar E. Chávez lleva un mensaje, es la historia de un hombre con un legado. "Es un hombre que trabajó para mejorar la vida de los campesinos, quienes hasta la fecha nos ponen la comida en la mesa a diario. Esos mismos trabajadores son los que ahora con la pandemia no pudieron quedarse en casa, tenían que salir a trabajar para que nosotros pudieramos comer. Cesar los ayudó con una gran paciencia, entendimiento y el uso de la no violencia; ayunó muchos días y eso fue lo que afectó sus órganos, pero Dios lo bendijo con una muerte que no sintió nada, se

quedó dormido. Su legado es importante para todos y en especial para nuestros hijos, tenemos que enseñar a los demás que los hispanos también contribuimos en la historia de este país, de Michigan, de Grand Rapids y de la Avenida Grandville".

Con respecto al gran legado del líder de los campesinos, Lupe cuenta con orgullo las anécdotas que le cuentan las personas con las que convive. "La familia Quintino tuvo la fortuna de trabajar con Cesar y tiene un hermoso testimonio. También Arturo Morales Romero, un mexicano que se mudó a California y consumió cuando apenas tenía 10 años, ellos trabajaban en el campo y un día Cesar le dijo, nosotros no queremos que los jovencitos trabajen en las labores sino que

vayan a la escuela para que sean doctores, ingenieros, profesionales que dirijan el futuro de ese país. Ahora Arturo es ingeniero, trabaja durante el día y por las noches pinta, está preparando su obra para participar en el ArtPrize de este año; además lo invite para que haga un cuadro de Cesar y presentarlo el día de la gala. Es muy gratificante ver como dos familias que trabajaron con nuestro líder, me confirman el gran legado y vida de Cesar".

HELP FOR PROPERTY OWNERS IMPACTED BY COVID-19

August 3 - September 2, 2021



Property owners or commercial tenants (lease requires to pay property taxes) can file property value complaints with the Board of Revision and seek property tax reductions for **tax year 2020**

Property owners must prove specifically how COVID-19 caused a reduction in property value and should be prepared to provide the following:

- Audited financial statements or tax returns for the owner of the real estate for calendar years 2018, 2019, & 2020
- Year-to-date financial income and expenses, up to and including 60 days prior to the hearing date
- Property appraisal utilizing authorized approaches to value
- Description and amounts of federal funds received as of date of appeal including, but not limited to: funds received under the CARES act
- Written summary outlining and supporting your request
- Other evidence supporting your request may also be submitted

Corte Suprema suspende aplicación de "Permanecer en México"

WASHINGTON, DC. 21 VIII 21 (AP): La Corte Suprema suspendió temporalmente la orden de un juez que hubiera obligado al gobierno a reintroducir una política de la administración de Donald Trump según la cual los inmigrantes deben esperar en el lado mexicano de la frontera mientras sus solicitudes de asilo son procesadas.

El magistrado Samuel Alito emitió la orden tarde el viernes. Estará vigente hasta el martes en la noche para que las partes puedan debatir sus argumentos ante el máximo tribunal.

Previamente, un juez federal en Texas había ordenado reimponer el programa, llamado oficialmente Protocolos de Protección al Migrante y pero conocido como "Permanecer en México", el sábado. El gobierno de Joe Biden seguidamente le pidió a un tribunal de Nueva Orleans posponer el regreso de la política, pero esa solicitud fue denegada el jueves.

La política obligaba a los miles de migrantes que pedían asilo en la frontera sur estadounidense a permanecer en México.

mientras sus casos eran considerados. La idea era desalentar el pedido de asilo pero los críticos denunciaban que privaba a la gente de su derecho legal de pedir protección a Estados Unidos, y les obligaba a permanecer en condiciones inhóspitas en ciudades mexicanas fronterizas.

El juez en Texas judge, Matthew J. Kacsmaryk, ordenó reinstaurar el programa en respuesta a una demanda presentada por Texas y Missouri, cuyos gobernadores ansían volver a aplicar las duras medidas antiinmigración d la administración Trump.

La administración Biden había argumentado que el presidente tiene "la clara autoridad de determinar las políticas migratorias" y que el secretario de Seguridad Nacional Alejandro Mayorkas tiene la discreción de decidir si a los solicitantes de asilo se les debe regresar a México.

En su argumento ante la Corte Suprema el viernes, el gobierno de Biden argumentó que la política había quedado en suspenso por más de un año y reinstaurarla abruptamente "causaría perjuicio a las relaciones entre Estados Unidos e importantes aliados

regionales, entorpecería gravemente sus operaciones en la frontera sur y podría crear una crisis diplomática o humanitaria".

La administración Trump dejó de aplicar la política "Permanecer en México" al inicio de la pandemia, ya que desde ese entonces rechazó prácticamente a todos los que llegaban a la frontera sur bajo otro argumento, el de la salud pública, lo que sigue en vigencia.

La administración Biden argumentó que la política había quedado rezagada por meses incluso antes de la pandemia.

El presidente Joe Biden suspendió la política en su primer día en el cargo y el Departamento de Seguridad la cesó en junio.

Kacsmaryk fue nominado para la magistratura federal por Trump. El panel del 5to Circuito que falló la noche del jueves incluye a dos nominados de Trump: Andrew Oldham y Cory Wilson, junto con Jennifer Walker Elrod, nominada a la corte de apelaciones por el presidente George W. Bush.

Tras cinco décadas Cuba le da luz verde a la pequeña empresa

LA HABANA, 20 VIII 21 (AP): Por primera vez en más de cinco décadas, los cubanos podrán abrir pequeñas y medianas empresas privadas, contratar empleados y acordar salarios, medidas de apertura económica postuladas por años y que llegan en momentos en que la isla atraviesa una crítica situación económica.

Las autoridades dieron a conocer en la Gaceta Oficial un paquete con una veintena de normas y resoluciones que organizan el trabajo independiente del Estado, incluido el reconocimiento de las micro, pequeñas y medianas empresas (pymes), eliminadas en la década del 60 al tiempo que crecía el sistema centralizado y socialista bajo la influencia de la antigua Unión Soviética.

A partir de ahora, según el Decreto-Ley 46, se reconocerán diferentes tipos de propiedades y participantes económicos como "actor que incide en la transformación productiva del país" y bajo la forma de Sociedad de Responsabilidad Limitada (SRL). Estas deberán ser aprobadas por el Ministerio de Economía e inscriptas en un registro mercantil para su funcionamiento.

Las firmas o talleres más pequeños podrán tener desde uno hasta 10 empleados y las más grandes hasta 100, y en general se permitirán todas las actividades menos algunas reservadas como la edición de diarios o revistas, la educación o las ocupaciones relacionadas con el ejercicio de las profesiones como arquitectos o abogados.

La norma especificó que estas pymes podrán ser además de privadas, estatales -por ejemplo, dependientes de una universidad o un ministerio- y mixtas. "Es un buen documento, son viables (las medidas) en el sentido de que permiten formas no estatales que funcionaban, pero no estaban autorizadas", explicó a The Associated Press el economista

cubano Omar Everleny Pérez. "La práctica demostrará si es suficiente para que el país cambie la orientación de sus estadísticas en términos de crecimiento económico.. vamos a ver cómo se pronuncia la burocracia porque tengo dudas de que el Ministerio de Economía sea lo más ágil".

"Lo que es evidente es que la economía cubana se encuentra en un momento crítico y los márgenes de maniobra para la toma de decisiones son extremadamente limitados. Por eso creo que se puede avanzar más en término de actividades que se permiten. Los hechos (protestas) del 11 de julio demuestran que el tiempo sí es importante para que los reclamos populares se solucionen", agregó Pérez.

El Producto Bruto

Interno retrocedió en la isla en un 11% en 2020 y miles de personas se manifestaron ese día de julio en las calles en rechazo al desabastecimiento de bienes básicos como alimentos o productos de aseo y los cortes de luz.

Para constituir una pyme privada las personas deberán tener más de 18 años y ser ciudadanos cubanos residentes permanentes en el país, lo que limita las expectativas de muchos emigrados que se mostraron dispuestos a invertir en la isla.

La creación de estas empresas está prohibida para los funcionarios y se les dará luz verde para importar y exportar sin imposición de precios, aunque deberán hacerlo mediante organismos estatales.

El paquete de leyes publicadas también actualiza y organiza las reglas de los llamados Trabajadores por Cuenta Propia o TCP, que eran la forma en que se desarrollaban hasta ahora muchas de estas pequeñas empresas que surgieron al calor de una reforma iniciada en 2010 por el expresidente Raúl Castro y que permitió en estos años una incipiente iniciativa privada compuesta por talleres de oficios, restaurantes,

el reconocimiento de la necesidad de las pymes como una organización fiscal y productiva que dinamizara la economía comenzó hace cinco años, pero las autoridades dilataron su publicación. Aunque reconocen su papel en la generación de empleo y mejoras para la población, las autoridades dijeron que la apuesta de la isla seguirá siendo la empresa estatal socialista.

U.S. Census Bureau Releases 2020 Census Demographic Data to 'Kick Off Redistricting 2021'

August 22, 2021: The U.S. Census Bureau has released demographic data from the 2020 Census that will paint a detailed picture of the U.S.'s diverse communities.

The local level data will be shared with all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico.

States and localities use the data to redraw federal, state, and local legislative district boundaries that will shape each state's elections for the next decade. The process is meant to ensure that as populations grow and change, every U.S. American continues to

have equal representation and equal voice in government.

The data release provides the first detailed look in ten years at the demographic characteristics of communities.

The data includes the breakdown of race and ethnicity, voting-age population, occupied and vacant housing units, and people living in group quarters, such as nursing homes, prisons, military barracks, and college dorms, of the nation's communities by state, city, and county.

While the data release is the beginning of the 2021 redistricting process, it is also the culmination of the 2020 Census count, the national effort to count every single person living in the United States, which takes place once every ten years. From April 1 to October 15, 2020, states and localities encouraged all residents to be counted to secure a complete and accurate count of the American people.

C-VAP equips neighborhood advocates, community outreach workers, and local activists, with resources and tools to:

- Explain the benefits and potential side effects of the COVID-19 vaccines;
- Dispel myths and misinformation about the COVID-19 vaccines; and
- Answer questions and provide resources related to COVID-19 vaccine readiness.

Developed by Case Western Reserve University, in partnership with the Cleveland Department of Public Health, C-VAP is a 3-hour training divided into two, 1.5 hours virtual sessions. 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"Flora and Fauna" themed murals installed in East and Uptown Toledo

TOLEDO, August 2021: The Arts Commission's Creative Placemaking program have debuted a series of local Flora and Fauna-themed murals. Two of three artworks in the "Reclamation Series" have been completed:

"Reclamation | Uptown Water Cycle," located in Laburnum Alley at 18th Street and Adams (behind Carlos Poco Loco and adjacent to a rain garden in Uptown Green Park), and "Reclamation | East Toledo Flood Plain Train," located at Harry Kessler Park, 328 Main Street. Both murals were completed by Graphite Design + Build and Natalie Lanese.

The Flora and Fauna Mural Series is a culmination of multiple years of community engagement work led by the Creative Placemaking Team, in concert with multiple residents, partners, community groups, and organizations. The murals celebrate the local natural en-

vironment with references to each neighborhood's connection to water filtration, clean water advocacy, and neighborhood industrial history.

Both murals are sited to address resident-identified safety and beautification initiatives and to support ongoing community planning efforts in each neighborhood. 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
