Conservative's victory in México may be high-water mark for Latin America's leftist tide—An AP News Analysis

MÉXICO CITY (AP)—Conservative Felipe Calderón's apparent victory could signal that the leftist tide sweeping Latin America has reached its high-water mark, as voters frightened by the radicalism of Venezuela's Hugo Chávez seek refuge in more mainstream ideas across the region. That trend has emerged with México's presidential vote count Thursday, the setback dealt to Bolivian President Evo Morales in a referendum Sunday, and Peruvian moderate Alan García's victory over Chavez ally Ollanta Humala last month.

Intolerance, confrontation, messianic attitudes and stridency—once staples of Latin America's left—are proving less attractive than leaders who can provide stability and strengthen historically weak institutions, like the separation of powers, independent central banks and judiciaries.

Manuel Camacho Solis, an adviser to leftist Mexican candidate Andres Manuel López Obrador, said a month before the election that avoiding class polarization was the key to the campaign. Indeed, the campaign became polarized, and López Obrador lost.

"More than 50 percent of Mexicans are center, or conservative, so you can't hope to have a very pure leftist government in México," Camacho Solis said. "What society wants is a progressive government, a broad alliance. It doesn't want a class-division thing."

The "leftist tide" idea likely oversimplifies by tossing Indian-rights movements, radicals and moderates into the same boat. The right hasn't exactly gained a mandate, and most of the region's leftist presidents haven't abandoned the market-oriented policies that have improved their economies, even as they assert political independence from Washington.

López Obrador arguably did better than any truly leftist candidate has ever done in México, an essentially conservative country. But he also lost the large lead he had early in the race, and may have scared voters with pledges to change an economic model that has brought stability and low inflation, if not much job creation or wage increases.

"Attacking some of the programs, including some of the economic strategy, was a mistake," said Ana María Salazar, a former U.S. defense official and Mexican political analyst. "At least part of the middle class and the lower-middle class for the first time in many decades have access to loans to buy things.... People felt there was some benefit to them."

The right also hasn't regained the kind of power it enjoyed in the early 1990s, when government after Latin American government imposed austere budgets, dropped restrictive tariffs and embarked on wholesale privatizations.

Such policies enriched the elites and slowly expanded the middle classes but did little to alleviate poverty in the region, and widespread frustration with the Washington prescription swept a wave of left-leaning governments into power. But most have been more like European social democracies than the 1960s "red tide" of communist guerrilla movements.

"There is no such thing as a red tide today," López Obrador adviser Porfirio Muñoz Ledo said last week. "The social tide exists because the (conservative) model didn't work."

The specter of Chavez's quasi-socialist and confrontational rhetoric scared voters toward the middle in both Peru and México. Calderón's campaign surged only after he bought television attack ads suggesting López Obrador was a Chavez in the making.

México: Calderón gana conteo oficial

MÉXICO (AP): La autoridad electoral ratificó el jueves que el candidato oficialista Felipe Calderón ganó el conteo oficial de la reñida disputa presidencial de México, mientras su rival izquierdista aseguró que impugnará los resultados por vía judicial.

"El candidato que obtuvo el mayor porcentaje de la votación presidencial es Felipe Calderón Hinojosa del Partido Acción Nacional", dijo el consejero presidente del Instituto Federal Electoral (IFE), Luis Carlos Ugaldé, en una sesión del organismo.

"La regla de oro de la democracia establece que gana el candidato que tiene más votos", añadió.

Calderón dijo en un discurso triunfal que "los mexicanos me han conferido el honor y a la vez la gran responsabilidad de ser el próximo presidente de México".

Se comprometió a buscar alianzas con todas las fuerzas políticas para gobernar para "el interés de todos los mexicanos" y asumió "los anhelos, las razones que motivaron a millones de ciudadanos a votar por otros candidatos".

El IFE registró 15,000,284 votos a favor de Calderón, equivalentes al 35.89%, mientras a Andrés Manuel López Obrador le correspondió el 35.31%. La ventaja equivale a 243,934 sufragios o 0.58 puntos porcentuales.

La votación total fue de 41,791,322 votos, de los cuales 904,604 fueron nulos. Les tomó 31 horas seguidas a los funcionarios escrutar las actas. Este conteo incluyó los 32,632 sufragios de los residentes en el extranjero.

López Obrador, abanderado del Partido de la Revolución Democrática (PRD), advirtió desde temprano en rueda de prensa que "no podemos aceptar, reconocer esos resultados. Hay muchas irregularidades".

El aspirante del PRD aseguró que "son muchas las inconsistencias o irregularidades, por decirlo de manera suave, en el proceso; entonces vamos a

acudir en el término que establece la ley y vamos al Tribunal Federal Electoral (Trife)".

Tras saberse el cómputo oficial hay cuatro días para presentar impugnaciones ante el Trife, que tiene hasta el 31 de agosto para resolver. El presidente electo debe ser declarado el 6 de septiembre por ley.

El izquierdista cuestionó a los funcionarios del IFE por su precipitación y porque "no actuaron con rectitud y hay muchísimas pruebas". Mencionó que el programa de resultados electorales preliminares fue manipulado en su contra.

Añadió que "en 24 horas, con una prisa inusual... resuelven en una elección que numéricamente está sin decisión, es decir que no hay ventaja de nadie y en 24 horas preparan un operativo para acelerar todo y resolver un cómputo que por necesidad requería tiempo".

En un final parecido a una competencia de velocidad, Calderón vino desde atrás reduciendo la primacía de hasta 2 puntos porcentuales que López Obrador mantuvo el miércoles y en la madrugada del jueves lo rebasó.

Esa tendencia se reflejó en la bolsa, que el miércoles

reportó pérdidas del 4% pero se recuperó el jueves con la variación en los resultados electorales y subió 2.4%.

Desde temprano, un sonriente Calderón le comunicó a seguidores concentrados en su cuartel de campaña que el Partido Acción Nacional "está arriba en la elección".

Agregó que "vamos a defender los votos y les pido que estén atentos, porque vamos a requerir de cada uno de ustedes para que esos votos... no sean tirados a la basura, no se cancelen".

En tanto, el izquierdista convocó a sus seguidores a concentrarse el sábado en una "asamblea informativa" en la explanada del Zócalo, en el centro de la capital, donde pidió actuar de manera responsable.

Calderón encabezará el segundo gobierno consecutivo del PAN, que con la victoria de Vicente Fox hace seis años acabó con la hegemonía mantenida por el Partido Revolucionario Institucional (PRI) desde 1929.

Roberto Madrazo, el candidato del PRI, quedó relegado al tercer lugar con el 22.26% de la votación.

Los resultados preliminares y conteos rápidos le daban la victoria a Calderón.

Comicios en México reflejan divisiones sociales del país

MEXICO (AP): El frente de la batalla electoral por la presidencia de México se extiende desde los barrios pobres que rodean a la Ciudad de México hasta las mansiones palaciegas en los vecindarios más ricos de la capital.

Felipe Calderón, del Partido Acción Nacional, prometió continuar las políticas económicas de libre mercado de ese grupo conservador que gobierna el país, y Andrés Manuel López Obrador, del Partido de la Revolución Democrática, de corte izquierdista, se comprometió a gobernar para los pobres.

En ese marco, la contienda electoral, aún no resuelta, ha puesto de manifiesto las profundas divisiones de clase en México, y ha colocado en la parte más alta de la agenda las dolorosas desigualdades acumuladas durante siglos.

En México residen al menos 10 personas con fortunas de miles de millones de dólares, pero la mitad de los 103 millones de habitantes vive con sólo 4,50 dólares diarios. Ese

abismo social y cultural que divide al país fue la piedra angular durante la campaña de López Obrador.

Le guste o no, el próximo líder de México tendrá que enfrentar la tarea titánica de hacer el país más igualitario antes que las tensiones sociales estallen.

"México es una bomba de tiempo", dijo Sergio Ernesto Josué, un chofer de 65 años, quien al hablar muestra sus dientes rotos y manchados. "Todos ellos aquí han hecho sus fortunas adentro del país. México tiene mucha riqueza natural pero está muy mal repartida. Los de arriba han hecho un mal ejemplo por lo que genera el país".

Sigue sin estar definido quién sucederá al presidente Vicente Fox, cuya administración de seis años concluye el 1 de diciembre. Parece posible que ocurran protestas callejeras, luego de que López Obrador desafió el martes la aparente victoria de Calderón y exigió un conteo voto por voto.

Un conteo preliminar dio a Calderón una ventaja de 400.000 sufragios, pero las autoridades electorales no pueden declarar un ganador antes del miércoles, cuando

comenzará el conteo oficial.

Josué, quien busca clientes fuera de las mansiones rodeadas por altos muros de piedra en el vecindario adinerado de Las Lomas, dijo que la inmigración a Estados Unidos representa la única forma de que gente pobre como él salga adelante.

El chofer votó por López Obrador, a la espera de que el izquierdista fomenta por fin una repartición más justa de la riqueza.

La campaña de este año ofreció esas y otras esperanzas a los desposeídos de México. Alentados por el sorprendente triunfo de Fox en el 2000, que puso fin a siete décadas de gobierno de un solo partido, y decepcionados después por la incapacidad del presidente para generar los millones de empleos prometidos, esos "olvidados" parecieron creer verdaderamente que López Obrador les daría prioridad.



Health 'Fiesta' seeks to reduce disparities for Latinos July 16 event focuses on screenings, education, & prevention



ANN ARBOR: Studies show that Latina women suffer from higher rates of diseases such as diabetes or cancer and are more likely to be in poor health than white women. To help reduce these health disparities in the Latino community, the University of Michigan Comprehensive Cancer Center has brought a national event to Washtenaw County.

Día de la Mujer Latina is an interactive health fiesta, a unique cultural intervention focusing on reducing health disparities in the Latino community by providing health education, resources and health screenings. The event will be from noon to 5:00 p.m. Sunday, July 16, at Ypsilanti High School.

The concept for *Día de la Mujer Latina* was launched in 1997 in Atlanta, Ga., by its founder, Venus Gines, in an effort to eliminate health disparities within the Latino population. Initially focused on breast cancer awareness, this event now includes a variety of culturally and linguistically competent health awareness and preventive care services for the entire Latino family.

Participants will be eligible to receive free breast cancer education; diabetes, cholesterol and blood pressure screenings, as well as educational resources on domestic violence and prenatal care.

In the last three years, the program has been promoted nationwide and is now being duplicated in more than 18 cities across the United States and in Puerto Rico.

The Washtenaw County event has been a collaborative planning effort with the U-M Comprehensive Cancer Center, U-M Health System Program for Multicultural Health, UMHS Community Health Services, the UMHS Program for Women's Health, the U-M Minority Health Research Program, the Latin American and Native American Medical Association, the U-M School of Nursing, and Nurse Managed Centers. Community partners include the American Cancer Society, Latinos Unidos, Global Design, the Safe House Center and the Washtenaw County Health Department.

Similar events have

been coordinated and conducted in Ohio by the Ohio Department of Health and Adelante, Inc. of Toledo.

Houston (AP): Mayor Kwame Kilpatrick remained hospitalized Sunday in Houston where he is recovering from diverticulitis, an inflammation of the intestines, the mayor's office said.

"He's doing well," spokesman James Canning said Sunday. "Once he returns he will be on bed rest."

Kilpatrick, 36, became ill July 9th, 2006, while attending a Church of God In Christ convention. Kilpatrick checked himself into a hospital Friday morning and was diagnosed with diverticulitis, his office said.

The second-term mayor was responding positively to intravenous antibiotic treatment but will remain hospitalized in Houston until midweek, his office said.

Kilpatrick's appointments for the coming week will be canceled and rescheduled. His staff and cabinet, under the direction of Deputy Mayor Anthony Adams, will continue normal city operations while the mayor recuperates.



Mundial: Francia estuvo a punto de dar el golpe

BERLIN (AP): Al principio Francia parecía desahuciada. A lo último estuvo cerca de la gloria y apenas la rozó.

Un subcampeonato mundial no es para despreciar, pero cuando se llega a la instancia final siempre se quiere más, con Zinedine Zidane como estandarte de esas pretensiones.

Zidane, de 34 años, jugó su último partido con "Les Blues" en la derrota 5-3 por penales (1-1 en el tiempo regular) y allí le pasó de todo: Metió el gol de penal que abrió la cuenta y fue expulsado por agresión antes de que el partido se definiese por esa vía.

Con un grupo de "viejitos" encabezado por "Zizou", Francia se clasificó raspando en su grupo, con dos empates seguidos que hacían presagiar al principio su eliminación: 0-0 con Suiza y 1-1 ante Corea del Sur, para reaccionar con un 2-0 frente a Togo que le dio el pasaporte y donde comenzó a insinuar una remontada.

En la segunda ronda venció 3-1 a España; en cuartos de final eliminó por 1-0 a Brasil y en las

semifinales dio cuenta de Portugal por ese mismo resultado.

"No los voy a consolar, sino que simplemente los admiro y los estimo", dijo el presidente francés Jacques Chirac al canal de televisión TF-1 desde Berlín, donde vio el partido.

"No tienen motivos para estar tristes. Hicieron algo extraordinario que hizo vibrar a toda Francia", señaló.

"Deben estar orgullosos de lo que hicieron".

A Francia le costó hacer goles, pero a sus rivales les costó marcárselos.

Además de Zidane, el equipo se apoyó en el arco en Fabien Barthez, un poco irregular pero a la larga eficiente; con una línea de cuatro clásica, con Lilian Thuram sobresaliendo, al igual que Willy Sagnol, por el lateral derecho.

Claude Makelele y Patrick Vieira cumplieron la doble función de contener por un lado y auxiliar por el otro a los atacantes, donde Thierry Henry no fue el cañonero implacable del Arsenal inglés pero en general cumplió.

Por los costados se movió un jugador clave y símbolo de la renovación gala: Franck Ribery, la nueva estrella del fútbol francés,

quien demostró habilidad y rapidez.

Ribery, del Marsella, es uno de jugadores que encarnan la sangre nueva llamada a reemplazar a Zidane, Barthez, Thuram, Makelele y Vieira, entre otros que ya anunciaron su jubilación de "Les Bleus" o están a punto de hacerlo.

Francia arrancó titubeante, fue en ascenso y llegó nada menos que a la final, una instancia que vieron en sus casas selecciones ilustres como Brasil, Argentina, Inglaterra y España.

"Son un equipo de gran calidad", comentó el técnico italiano Marcello Lippi, quien le encontró algo de justicia divina al revés francés.

Lippi recordó que en la final de la Eurocopa 2000, Francia derrotó a Italia con un gol de David Trezeguet en el alargue.

En esta ocasión, Trezeguet falló el único disparo en la definición de penales que dio la victoria a la "Azzurra".

"La vida es así, a veces quita lo que uno se merece, y da lo que uno se merece menos", señaló Lippi. "Esta noche ellos pagaron, era el destino".

A Klose le siguieron ocho con tres goles, incluyendo al brasileño Ronaldo, los argentinos Hernán Crespo y

Maxi Rodríguez.

En el mundial de Corea-Japón de 2002 el máximo artillero fue Ronaldo, con ocho goles. Con los tres que anotó en Alemania, Ronaldo quedó a la cabeza en la historia con un total de 15.

El francés Just Fontaine es el principal goleador de todos los tiempos en un solo mundial, cuando metió 13 en Suecia en 1958.







Electoral en respaldo de las acusaciones del candidato, que incluyen afirmaciones de que hubo manipulación empleando computadoras. Tres soldados montaban guardia, pero la situación estaba en calma.

Un día antes, López Obrador presidió una gran manifestación en el centro histórico de la Ciudad de México y le pidió a sus seguidores que no perdieran las esperanzas en obtener un resultado positivo para él en la contienda electoral más reñida en la historia del país.

Las autoridades electorales dijeron el jueves que el conservador Felipe Calderón, del Partido Acción Nacional, derrotó a López Obrador por menos de 244.000 votos en los comicios, un margen de sólo el 0,6%.

La apelación legal no buscará la anulación de las elecciones del 2 de julio, sino que intentará obligar a las autoridades a efectuar un recuento manual de los 41 millones de boletas. El candidato izquierdista argumenta que algunos de los sufragios en favor suyo no fueron contados o fueron declarados nulos sin una razón válida.

López Obrador también argumenta que el presidente Vicente Fox empleó fondos del gobierno para apoyar al candidato del PAN, al que también pertenece el mandatario.

Fox ha negado haber interferido en los comicios, y los observadores de la Unión Europea dijeron que no hallaron irregularidades en el conteo de los votos.

Gerardo Fernández, portavoz del Partido de la Revolución Democrática al que pertenece López Obrador, dijo que la elección había sido muy irregular, y el PRD pide que se cuente voto por voto para legitimizar al presidente electo.

Fernández, quien el domingo por la noche se encontraba frente al tribunal a la espera de la llegada de los abogados, advirtió que no reconocerán el triunfo de Calderón a menos que los comicios sean legítimos.

Indicó que los abogados estaban retrasados porque estaban sacando copias de los alegatos, que abarcan 800 páginas.
