Debaten en EEUU ampliar cerca en frontera con México

WASHINGTON (AP): Los legisladores analizaban el jueves la conveniencia de construir una cerca a lo largo de cientos de kilómetros en la frontera sur del país, una costosa barrera que por sí sola podría no frenar a los inmigrantes ilegales.

Ya existen cercas—colocadas una tras otra—en aproximadamente 120 kilómetros de la frontera de 3.218 kilómetros entre Estados Unidos y México, la mayor parte en ciudades como San Diego, El Paso—estado de Texas—y

EEUU: Suspendido juez que amenazó a indocumentada

LOS ANGELES (AP): Un juez que amenazó con deportar a México a una indocumentada que pedía una acción legal contra su marido fue retirado de la lista de los jueces de tiempo parcial en el Corte Superior del condado de Los Angeles.

Bruce R. Fink, un juez de lo familiar en el condado de Orange, fue suspendido de la lista de unos 1.200 jueces que laboran como sustitutos en el condado, dijo el vocero de la corte Allan Parachini el viernes.

"Hay gente que le huye a la controversia", consideró Fink. "No me molesta" pues "yo estaba haciendo esto como voluntario", agregó.

Fink aseguró en una entrevista publicada el miércoles por el periódico Los Angeles Times que su intención fue evitarle problemas a la mujer porque, explicó, si emitía la orden de restricción que buscaba habría sido arrestada y deportada.

En una audiencia realizada el 14 de julio en

Pomona, California, Aurora González solicitó a Fink una orden de restricción contra su marido a quien acusó de maltrato verbal y de amenazarla con denunciarla a las autoridades de inmigración.

Fink le preguntó si era inmigrante ilegal y al recibir una respuesta positiva le dijo a González que iba a contar hasta 20 para que saliera de la corte y evitara su deportación, de acuerdo a una transcripción de la audiencia.

"Odio las leyes de inmigración que tenemos, pero creo que el alguacil puede llevarla al servicio de inmigración y enviarla a México", dijo el juez a González.

"Uno, dos, tres, cuatro, cinco, seis. Cuando llegue a 20, la van a arrestar y va para México", expresó Fink, de acuerdo a la transcripción.

González salió de la sala de audiencias y Fink sobreescribió el caso.

U.S. officials condemn "meddling" by third parties in Cuba

(AP): U.S. officials on Friday condemned potential outside interference in Cuba's future by those who do not support democratic elections there—singling out Venezuelan President Hugo Chavez as "meddling" in Cuban affairs.

U.S. Sen. Mel Martinez, a Florida Republican, distinguished between aid from Venezuela and other countries to help the current Cuban government maintain its control over the island after 79-year-old Cuban President Fidel Castro dies, and U.S. aid to promote democracy.

"There's a big difference between attempting to prevent a transition and being of assistance to a transition," Martinez said. "If there are those who believe they can impose upon Cuba a succession of a tyranny, they are wrong, and this government will not permit that."

Martinez, who fled Cuba as a teenager, was joined by three Cuban-American U.S. Representatives and Commerce Secretary Carlos Gutierrez to promote a presidential commission report calling for democracy in Cuba. They met with reporters after speaking at an event sponsored by the nonpartisan lobbying group Cuba Democracy Advocates.

The 93-page report, released earlier this month, includes a proposed \$80 million (euro63 million) to help develop Cuban civic society and open communication on the island.

Gutierrez, who is also Cuban-American and co-chaired the commission's

report, told reporters that during a transition in Cuba, the U.S. would help with food and humanitarian aid and assist in helping set up elections only if asked.

"That's a different story than trying to be in there and manipulating and planning something regarding the lives and future of the people of Cuba," he said.

The report repeatedly cites the relationship between Castro and Chavez and efforts by the two to expand their influence throughout the hemisphere using money Venezuela receives from its oil exports.

The U.S. buys more than \$30 billion (euro23.66 billion) in petroleum related products from Venezuela, according to the U.S. Commerce Department.

Martinez said recent tightening of the United States' 47-year embargo on Cuba has not had the desired effect because Cuba has turned to Venezuela and China for aid, but he cautioned that the U.S. should not abandon the policy.

Inocencia perdida en el Internet

SAN JUAN (AP): Durante dos semanas Puerto Rico ha esperado la buena nueva de que Kamile Stephanie Burgos, de 12 años, regresó a su hogar.

Pero si es cierta la teoría policial y familiar de que se fue por su propia voluntad con alguien que conoció a través de internet o en canales de videos musicales, es muy posible que no regrese, según el sicocanalista Alfredo Carrasquillo.

"La adolescencia se ha transformado con el internet", dijo Carrasquillo a Prensa Asociada, explicando que el mundo cibernético ha llevado a los adolescentes a estar más "expuestos y vulnerables a la perversión".

El país despertó una mañana con la noticia de primera plana de que Kamile había desaparecido el 8 de julio de su hogar en San Lorenzo, un pequeño pueblo al sureste del país, luego de recibir una llamada en su teléfono móvil.

La madre, Carmen Ortiz, informó a las autoridades que la niña, que terminó el séptimo grado en mayo, pasaba largas horas "chateando" en la internet.

Tras publicarse la noticia de Kamile, otra familia, esta vez de la parte suroeste de la isla, informó que su nieta, Cristina Ruiz Rodríguez, de 13 años, también había desaparecido tras mucho "chateo".



Ambas jovencitas, antes de partir, borraron de sus computadoras información que pudiera dejar pistas.

Información en poder de la policía apunta a que ambas pudieran estar con hombres mayores de edad que conocieron a través del internet o por canales de video musicales en los que las personas ofrecen sus números telefónicos para que le llamen.

Hablando del caso de Kamile, el sargento de la policía Carlos Cruz dijo que, por la edad, es necesaria la ayuda de un adulto para moverse y evadir las autoridades como lo ha hecho.

Según el sicocanalista Carrasquillo, los adolescentes utilizan el internet "para enamorarse", para enganchar de alguna manera", en un momento de sus vidas en que están rebelándose contra sus padres y buscando independencia.

Explicó que durante la pre adolescencia, como es el caso de ambas niñas, se da "un 'come back' del complejo de Edipo", en el que las niñas se "enamoran" de sus padres, o de hombres mayores.

Longer fence on Mexican border favored by Republicans

WASHINGTON (AP): Lawmakers grappled Thursday with whether to build a fence along hundreds of miles on the nation's southern border, weighing combating undocumented immigration against a costly barrier that alone might not stop migrants.

Layered fencing stands on about 75 miles of the 2,000-mile U.S.-Mexico border, mostly in cities like El Paso, Texas; Nogales, Ariz., and San Diego. In an election year fixated on undocumented immigration and border security, Congress is considering proposals to put fencing on up to 850 miles on the border, costing billions of dollars.

"San Diego was a no-man's land when we built that fence," Rep. Duncan Hunter, R-Calif., told a House panel examining border barriers as a way to stem illegal immigration. He said immigrant gang-related murders, drug traffic and human smuggling have dropped dramatically since a fence just south of the city was built in 1996.

"The fence did work," Hunter said.

But Rep. Silvestre Reyes, D-Texas, a former top U.S. Border Patrol official, said fencing could cost as much

as \$2.2 billion and might not be effective in all areas.

"There are, in my opinion, no one-size-fits-all solutions for border security," Reyes said. "I think it wastes money. I think it's not a good investment of taxpayer dollars."


The Border Patrol last year arrested 1.2 million undocumented immigrants who crossed into the United States at the Mexican border. But agents estimate that two or three migrants go undeterred for every one who is stopped.

Border Patrol Senior Associate Chief Kevin Stevens said fences have stopped, or at least slowed, undocumented migrants. But he questioned whether fencing would be effective where there are natural barriers, like mountains or deserts. He wouldn't talk about specific plans to extend the fence to any length.

"Can you look the American people in the eye and say this is needed? And that it's the most practical use of taxpayer dollars?" asked Rep. Elijah E. Cummings, D-Md.

"We need an appropriate mix," Stevens answered. "It's not about fencing. It's not about Border Patrol agents. It's not about technology. It's about all of those things."

Critics said little will stop undocumented immigration



while jobs are so readily available for migrants. The Homeland Security Department recently began cracking down on employers who hire immigrants—many of whom work for cheaper wages and with fewer benefits. But the Bush administration is pushing Congress to approve a temporary worker program that would let undocumented immigrants have some legal status.

Conservative Republicans, particularly in the House, largely oppose such a program, which they view as giving amnesty to criminals. An estimated 12 million undocumented immigrants live in the United States.

"As long as illegal immigrants can readily obtain employment in the United States, neither barriers nor increased staffing will discourage millions of impoverished people from crossing our borders annually," said T.J. Bonner, president of the National Border Patrol Council, a labor union that represents about 10,500 U.S. Border Patrol agents.

Republican proposes electrical fence along Mexican border to "electrify" Mexicans

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP): Last Thursday, an Iowa congressman showed off his model of an electrical wire-topped fence that he wants built along the U.S.-Mexico border to prevent undocumented immigration.

Republican Steve King brought his model to a House immigration hearing Thursday in Washington, saying the wall would remain "for perhaps a hundred years, if necessary."

The House and Senate each have approved bills calling for hundreds of miles of fencing, and King estimates his plan would cost about \$1.3 million per mile and up to \$680 million total. The wall would include 6-inch-thick concrete panels dropped in with a crane and anchored 5 feet deep.

"We could also electrify this wire with the kind of current that would not kill somebody, but it would be a discouragement for them to be fooling around with it," said King, who also brought his model to the House floor last week. "We do that with livestock all the time."

The immigration hearing was held by the Government Reform and Homeland Security committees and included other lawmakers, construction contractors and Border Patrol officials.

The House and Senate agree on the idea to build a wall, but the details are being debated.

The House bill mandates the construction of 854 miles of double-layer fencing, including lights and cameras in California, New Mexico and Texas. The Senate voted for 370 miles of triple-layer fencing and 500 miles of vehicle barriers.

"Though the question of whether we should have more border fencing has occasionally generated more heat than light, the fact is that this proposition is more or less settled in

Congress," said Rep. Mark Souder, R-Ind., the chairman of the hearing.

The U.S. Border Patrol maintains about 75 miles of fence along the southwest border, mostly in urban areas. The fence has been successful when combined with proper lighting and patrol, said Kevin Stevens, the Border Patrol's senior associate chief.

Stevens said previous fencing has been cut down or moved by immigrants, such as chain-link fences or barbed wire. Even heavy fence material can be cut through or climbed over, but placing more obstructions on top has helped, he said. "A fence does in fact deter some and it delays those who won't be deterred," he said.



University of Michigan President Mary Sue Coleman sets the record straight about MI affirmative action ballot initiative

Mary Sue Coleman, the first woman to serve as president of the University of Michigan has become one of the leading spokespersons against the controversial Michigan affirmative action ballot initiative, on the ballot this November.

While the provisions of the proposed amendment would be detrimental to the gains made by Latinos, African-Americans, Native Americans and other minorities, it would also adversely affect women in their continuing struggle for equality.

President Coleman took time off from her busy schedule on July 7 to talk to La Prensa by e-mail about this serious issue. Here is the full text of the interview.

La Prensa: How would you describe the Michigan ballot initiative?

President Coleman: The ballot initiative is a proposed amendment to the state Constitution that would forbid any use of affirmative action throughout the public sector, in employment, contracting, and education at all levels.

"It was brought from California to Michigan by Ward Connerly, who led the campaign for California's Prop 209, a constitutional amendment virtually identical to his Michigan proposal. He succeeded there, and Prop 209 went into effect in 1996. His initiative in Michigan is financed overwhelmingly by people and corporations outside of Michigan.

Despite its name, the Michigan initiative is not about civil rights. It is about closing doors, rather than opening them. I believe it would turn back the clock in Michigan, in every part of the public sector—employment, contracting, and education at all levels.

"I wish we lived in a time when we no longer needed to be concerned about racial, ethnic, and gender injustices, in a society free of inequities, with fully integrated neighborhoods, jobs and

schools. But we all know there is so much more to do before we can say we have succeeded.

Affirmative action is one of the many different tools we can use to help make a difference in society. In 2003, the University of Michigan defended its use all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court, because we need it to help us achieve a diverse student body that reflects our society, and a majority of the Court's justices agreed with us.

"The Court ruled that diversity is a compelling interest to the nation, and that we would need to be able to use affirmative action to achieve it—maybe for another 25 years. That was only three years ago."

"We must pay attention to ethnicity. We must pay attention to socioeconomic class. If we look away, the future is bleak, and one need only visit the state of California to see what happens when we go down a road that ignores these factors." "Here's an example of Prop 209's impact in higher education." "The state of California is the most diverse state in this country, with the fifth-largest economy in the world—is educating fewer and fewer underrepresented minority students, at a time when its citizenry is growing more and more diverse.

Before 209 banned affirmative action in higher education admissions, underrepresented minorities made up 38 percent of California high school graduates and 21 percent of the Uni-

versity of California's entering freshman class. Within eight years, underrepresented minorities accounted for 45 percent of California's high school graduates, but only 19 percent of incoming UC freshmen.

La Prensa: How will the ballot initiative affect women and minorities?

President Coleman: Based on the experience in California under Prop 209, we know that the Michigan initiative would likely shut down programs that increase educational access, opportunity, and success in all public employment, contracting, and education.

If we leave behind talented Latinos, African Americans, Native Americans and women, we will be abandoning the state's and the country's future.

La Prensa: What are the biggest accomplishments of affirmative action?

President Coleman: Affirmative action is an essential, successful, moderate tool that helps our society deal with the inequities that still exist. We have experienced amazing change in our society, with the help of tools such as affirmative action. For instance, the rate of minority homeownership has increased substantially, as have the ranks of minority contractors and other business owners; tradesmen and women; doctors, lawyers, and other professionals; managers and executives. The very best educational institutions have opened their doors more widely to talented and energetic students

of all races and ethnicities, and the learning experience for all college students has been improved by increased diversity in and out of the classroom.

We know from research that students who study in diverse educational environments think better, learn more, and grow to become better citizens. Affirmative action has had a major role in making this possible. Research also tells us that people who experience a diverse environment in college more frequently choose, as adults, to break down existing patterns of segregation, live in integrated neighborhoods, send their children to integrated schools, and work in integrated workplaces.

La Prensa: How would the U-M look without affirmative action?

President Coleman: Based on the impact of California's Prop 209, we know that it would limit outreach and recruitment, mentoring and financial aid available to hard-working and capable Latinos, African Americans, and Native Americans, and women of all races and ethnicities. We have looked at the question very carefully, and determined that our underrepresented minority (Latino, African American, and Native American, com-

bined) enrollment could fall from about 14% to about 4%. This would be a monumental loss.

In ruling in the University's favor, the Supreme Court said, "The path to leadership must be visibly open to talented and qualified individuals of every race and ethnicity." Higher education is the most reliable pathway, and the Michigan initiative would make it impassable for growing numbers of minority students.

La Prensa: How will Michigan be affected if the ballot initiative is approved?

President Coleman: I believe the Michigan initiative will only worsen an already tragic situation in race relations. The U.S. Census found that Michigan is home to two of the nation's most segregated cities (Livonia and Detroit), and, according to the FBI, home to the third-highest rate of hate crimes in the country.

And I believe the Michi-

gan initiative would hurt efforts to improve the state and national economy. We face an acute shortage of professional workers, especially scientists and engineers, doctors and nurses. Michigan lags behind much of the country in the percentage of citizens with a college education.

In order for Michigan's economy to recover and compete globally, we need to educate as many of our citizens as possible. If we do not train more women and people of color, our economy will fail to change and grow with the times, and we will not be able to compete. In education, it would go far beyond college admissions, support, and financial aid programs. For instance, today, the California organization headed up by Mr. Connerly is fighting a legal case that is even trying to close down magnet schools in Los Angeles, saying they are prohibited by his Prop 209.

Anita López vows to curtail auditor's office travel

Over the past four years the Lucas County Auditor's Office has spent approximately \$450,000 on travel expenses, according to Democratic challenger Anita López, Lucas County recorder.

Such spending on the part of the incumbent, Republican Larry Kazcala, prompted López to issue a "Pledge to the People" last week promising that, should she be elected, the auditor's office will "serve as an independent watchdog of public funds."

"We have schools that are closing, we need an auditor who will help others to monitor the expenses [of the county offices], not an auditor who is going to spend as if there is no tomorrow," said López at a news conference last week to unveil the "pledge."

"Those kind of expenditures are not going to be taking place under my watch," she said.

The trips that López referenced sent members of the Auditor's Office to such far-flung locales as Miami, San Diego, Hong Kong and Nova Scotia, primarily for fact finding and training seminars.

By contrast, López pointed to the fact that during her tenure in the Recorder's Office over the last year and a half, there had only one authorized out-of-state trip — one she herself took to Chicago. López criticized not only the frequency

and destination of such trips but also the tendency of the Auditor's Office to send, in some cases, up to five employees at a time, to such seminars.

"I discovered that when I returned I didn't need to travel out of state to collect such information," she said. "We try to send individuals and then it's their responsibility to return and train the rest of the staff on the information."

López, who won election to the Lucas County Auditor's seat last November after serving on the Toledo Board of Education for several years, promised to hold a series of press conferences over the months leading up to November's general election to address the "level of performance we should be expecting from the

auditor's office ... \$450,000 in travel is not being fiscally responsible."

López's *Pledge to the People* includes the following points: "maintain an office that is accessible to all Lucas County residents ...; develop a professional staff to be hired based on their knowledge, skills, and accomplishments as opposed to who they are related to, contribute money to or are friends with; act as a rue fiscal watchdog for the public funds of Lucas County especially within my own office ... include[ing] limiting travel for practical purposes ...; operate the Auditor's office as an independent agency; and protect the public funds entrusted to Lucas County for appropriation and investment from theft or misuse ..."

Honduras Cardinal says U.S. could ease immigration through development

CINCINNATI, July 19 (AP): A Latin American cardinal says the United States could do more to ease illegal immigration if it focused on economic development rather than border crackdowns.

"Instead of trying to build walls or putting the National Guard on the border, we should see how development can be enhanced and labor services created," said Roman Catholic Cardinal Oscar Andres Rodríguez Maradiaga of Honduras.

"Instead of looking only at the consequences, we should go to the roots because development has not grown in most of the Latin American countries," he said in an interview last week with The Associated Press. He was in the United States to speak at conferences on Catholic evangelization and Hispanic youth.

Rodríguez Maradiaga, the archbishop of Tegucigalpa, is a linguist and a scientist—and a widely respected Latin American moderate. He is often mentioned as a potential candidate to become the first pope from

Latin America.

Rodríguez Maradiaga said the U.S. has been enriched by diversity, as has the church. Immigration, however, troubles Latin Americans as much as it does those in the U.S. who want to slow or stop it, he said.

"We are losing our people, especially the young," he said. With economic development, the cardinal said, his own country could supply palm oil and sugar cane for use in alternative fuels such as biodiesel and ethanol.

"When we could have help for development, we could have labor for our people, so immigration will not be so big," he said.

CARTAGENA, Colombia (AP): Dos oro en el voleibol de playa y tres en karate le permitieron a Cuba el domingo recortar un poco la ventaja que le lleva México en la punta de los Juegos Centroamericanos y del Caribe, que fueron afectados por un torrencial aguacero.

Cuba se impuso en la final del voleibol de playa femenino y masculino, al tiempo en que se apoderó de tres de las seis finales dirimidas en la segunda fecha del karate. Venezuela ganó dos, mientras que Puerto Rico una.

Cuba también se alzó con una de los dos finales del balonmano disputado en República Dominicana, en un día en que México evitó irse en blanco gracias a sus dos oro en el pentatlón moderno femenino y masculino logrado en República Dominicana.

La novena jornada se vio afectada por la tarde a raíz de un aguacero que obligó a la suspensión de la final en el béisbol entre las novenas de Cuba y

Dominicana. El partido por el tercer lugar entre México y Venezuela también tuvo que pararse en el sexto episodio cuando estaba empatado 3-3.

Ese resultado fue declarado oficial y a ambos países se les dio una preseca de bronce.

La semifinal del softbol masculino entre Dominicana y Venezuela, que había sido suspendida inicialmente por los efectos de la lluvia, se disputa siempre el domingo por la noche en otro campo a petición de los venezolanos. El ganador se medirá luego a Cuba por el oro.

La final del béisbol se dirimirá el lunes por la mañana.

Al concluir la jornada, las posiciones en el cuadro de medallas quedaron igual, aunque Cuba sumó más preseas doradas y le recortó cuatro de oro a México.

México se mantuvo en la cima con 74 medallas de oro, 64 de plata y 49 de bronce. Cuba llegó a las 60 del metal dorado, a las 41 de plata y 28 de bronce.

Colombia, que sólo pudo sumar una preseca dorada en la competencia de ecuestre que culminó en Bogotá, terminó la jornada con 41 de oro, 36 de plata y 35 de bronce.

La anfitriona le llevaba diez medallas de oro de diferencia a Venezuela, que se adjudicó dos de oro en el karate, incluyendo la de su campeón mundial Luis Plumacher en kumite, y la primera dirimida en bols en la modalidad de parejas mixtas.

Colombianos y venezolanos llegaron a los juegos con la misma empresa: Alcanzar el tercer puesto.

La delegación "vinotinto" quedó con registro de 31-57-75.

Más atrás, en el quinto lugar, seguía Puerto Rico con 12-11-24. Los boricuas celebraron el domingo un oro en karate y otro en ecuestre.

Dominicana (10-5-13), Jamaica (6-3-1), Barbados (6-1-5), El Salvador (5-12-18), Guatemala (3-8-15) y Costa Rica (2-1-0) seguían en el cuadro de medallas.

A diferencia de otros

deportes, al voleibol de playa no le cayó nada mal la lluvia y cerró el telón con una fiesta cubana.

Dalixia Fernández y Tamara Larrea vencieron a las mexicanas Marta Revuelta y Vanessa Virgen 21-14 y 21-19 en la final y poco después Francisco Alvarez y Wilfredo Villar derrotaron a los venezolanos Igor Hernández y Jackson Rodríguez 21-13 y 21-18 en la playa de Boca Grande, para sumar el segundo oro cubano.

Puerto Rico se quedó con el bronce en mujeres y México con la medalla del mismo metal en la competencia de hombres.

En los cuartos de final del fútbol, Colombia aplastó a Jamaica 6-0 y se medirá el miércoles en semifinales contra Honduras, que había eliminado un día antes a México.

Costa Rica venció a Panamá 3-1 y se enfrentará ese día en la otra semifinal a Venezuela, que dejó en el camino a El Salvador.

Questions from the Journey: A Fallen Marine Parents' Quest

CLEVELAND: Dr. Paul E. Schroeder, co-founder of Families of the Fallen for Change, will provide an inside look at moving from quiet support for a son in Iraq to political activism after his death at noon on Wednesday, August 2, 2006, at The City Club of Cleveland.

Schroeder and his wife, Rosemary Palmer, founded Families of the Fallen for Change, a non-partisan organization, after the death of their son Marine LCPL Edward "Augie" Schroeder on August 3, 2005. Since its launch in November, the organization has grown to 1,200 members from 47 states.

In the debate on Iraq, the organization takes a middle ground between continuing the current Administration's policies and immediate withdrawal. Schroeder will discuss the organization's position, its proposal for a step-by-step withdrawal of American forces from Iraq in exchange for concomitant reduction in violence, and its efforts to gain Congressional support.

Schroeder is managing director of East-West Trade Development, Ltd., a Cleveland international trade and consulting firm. He holds a doctorate in Chinese politics and international relations from The Ohio State University.





'Miami Vice' film release conjures images of city's cocaine past

(AP): The release of the new "Miami Vice" film conjures up memories of the city's "cocaine cowboy" past, when rival drug traffickers had shootouts with automatic weapons, bags of drugs washed up on beaches and police were outspent, outgunned and sometimes corrupted.

"When the drugs came flowing in, it just changed the landscape here," said Mark R. Trouville, chief of the federal Drug Enforcement Administration field office in Miami.

"It kind of became the Wild West down here for a while," added Trouville, who began his DEA career here in 1979.

Miami remains a key command center for the worldwide cocaine trade, particularly for Colombian cartels, and is still a major drug money-laundering locale. But the violence has largely

disappeared as the cocaine kingpins have become less "Scarface" and more corporate.

"They have become more diverse and less flamboyant," said Guy Lewis, a former federal prosecutor in Miami now in private practice. "One thing that has not changed is the money. The trade is still awash in cash."

The "Miami Vice" TV series (1984-89) accurately reflected those crazy times, according to people who lived through them. The movie, opening Friday and starring Colin Farrell and Jamie Foxx, is set in the present and does not resurrect the old days, according to its producers.

Robert Hoelscher, a Miami-Dade County police sergeant and consultant for the TV show, said: "85 percent of what we put on television was a paraphrase of actual cases."

"There was a constant turf war," said Hoelscher. "We

were out-equipped. They had better aircraft. They had bigger, faster boats. They had automatic weapons. We were outgunned in many respects."

Drug traffickers were regularly gunned down on

city streets, sometimes in broad daylight, and bullet-riddled bodies turned up frequently in remote locations. One lawyer was shot to death in his office after he was subpoenaed in a drug case. A

(Continued from Page 15) liquor store at a popular shopping mall was shot up by men wielding sub-machine guns and driving around in an armored panel truck.

Bryan Page, chairman of the University of Miami's anthropology department, said the "cocaine cowboy period" in the city's history began in the 1970s when an established Cuban network of traffickers and cocaine users attracted the attention of Colombians who saw a potentially lucrative market.

"The violence that was taking place was essentially Colombians taking over Cuban territory," Page said. "They were very bold. People would get shot up sitting at traffic lights. It was that kind of Wild West atmosphere that attracted the attention of the people putting together 'Miami Vice.'"

In the 1983 Brian De Palma film "Scarface" written by Oliver Stone, Al

Pacino played Tony Montana, a Cuban immigrant who rises to the top of the Miami criminal underworld then dies a spectacularly violent death.

In between, Montana narrowly escapes a chain saw, watches someone hanged from a helicopter and battles his rivals with ("Say hello to my little friend!") an M-16 assault rifle and other heavy artillery.

The DEA's Trouville said that was not too far from the truth.

"They were shooting each other left and right," he said. "It was a time when there were no rules yet. Everybody was trying to establish themselves in the drug world here."

Although cocaine continues to flow into Miami, it has been eclipsed by the U.S. border with Mexico as a drug trade flashpoint. There is far less violence today. And as shown by the recent indictment of members of an alleged drug ring responsible for bringing some 70 tons (63.7 metric tons) of cocaine into the United States, the drug lords have blended into South Florida society.

"They used to drive Ferraris and Porsches," Lewis said. "Now they drive Camrys. They've gone from the penthouse to the suburbs."

Colombian-born Pablo Rayo Montano, currently awaiting extradition from Brazil, and 31 members of his alleged drug trafficking organization were indicted in May on various drug charges. Court documents in that case show that family members and associates had businesses and other assets in South Florida, including homes in quiet Broward County suburbs and tried to stay under the radar.

Hoelscher said the drug traffickers claimed that violence—besides putting their own lives in constant jeopardy—was bad for business because of the heat it brought from law enforcement.

"There's more sophistication today," Hoelscher said. "You can do it much easier with payoffs and corruption than you can with the gun-in-the-ear kind of thing."

Los padres de Kamile se separaron cuando ella era una bebé de apenas dos años y la niña se ha criado con su madre en una familia que el tío abuelo, Luis Cruz, describe como "muy unida y religiosa".

"Cualquier persona que escuche (al adolescente), que suene comprensiva, afectiva, le ofrece una salida a las limitaciones de la adolescencia que la puede lanzar a largarse", opinó Carrasquillo.

A su juicio, la jovencita es responsable de su partida, ya que fue su decisión huir del hogar porque quiere ser libre y hacerse cargo de sí misma. "Está hechizada, pero nadie deja de ser responsable de dejarse

hechizar. Es responsable de su decisión. Es una responsabilidad complicada, está bajo un hechizo, en un mundo de fantasía", expresó.

Sus declaraciones coinciden con la teoría de la policía: "Hasta el momento no tenemos indicio de que ella esté en contra de su voluntad", según el agente Cruz. De acuerdo a Carrasquillo, es muy difícil que la alternativa de regresar esté en la mente de la joven.

"Si vuelve es porque le prometen algo distinto a lo que tenía. Si engancha con una de esas promesas, regresará, pero tarde o temprano se volverá a ir", sentenció.

El agente José Figueroa

dijo a Prensa Asociada que la familia tiene la esperanza de que Kamile esté tratando de dejar pistas por medio de una llamada silenciosa que se recibe a diario en la casa.

Sergio Rubio Paredes, director del Negociado de Investigaciones Especiales (NIE) del Departamento de Justicia, confirmó que la INTERPOL trabaja en el caso. También investiga la Agencia federal de Inmigración y Aduana.

"Al igual que la policía, tenemos la preocupación de cómo los padres deben estar atentos a las actividades de sus hijos, especialmente en las computadoras hasta altas horas de la noche y el uso de celular con canales que pasan mensajes y videos", dijo el también fiscal.

Nogales, Arizona. En un año electoral en que se destacan los temas de la inmigración ilegal y la seguridad fronteriza, el Congreso está analizando propuestas para establecer cercas en hasta 1.360 kilómetros de frontera, a un costo de miles de millones de dólares.

"San Diego era tierra de nadie cuando construimos esa cerca", dijo el representante republicano Duncan Hunter a un panel de la Cámara de Representantes que analiza las barreras fronterizas como una forma de impedir el paso a los inmigrantes ilegales.

Desde que se construyó una cerca justo al sur de la ciudad en 1996, indicó, los homicidios relacionados con pandillas de inmigrantes, el narcotráfico y el contrabando de personas

han disminuido dramáticamente.

"La valla sí funcionó", señaló Hunter.

Pero el representante demócrata Silvestre Reyes, quien fue un alto funcionario de la Patrulla Fronteriza, dijo que el colocar las cercas podría costar hasta 2.200 millones de dólares y tal vez no sean efectivas en todas las zonas.

"En mi opinión, para la seguridad fronteriza no pueden aplicarse soluciones similares en todas las zonas", señaló Reyes. "Creo que desperdicia dinero y que no es una buena inversión de los dólares de los contribuyentes".

El año pasado, la Patrulla Fronteriza arrestó a 1,2 millones de inmigrantes ilegales que cruzaron hacia Estados Unidos desde México. Sin embargo, los agentes calculan que, por cada inmigrante detenido, dos o tres cruzan la frontera sin ser vistos.

Kevin Stevens, subjefe de

la Patrulla Fronteriza, dijo que las cercas han impedido el paso a los inmigrantes ilegales, o por lo menos los han obligado a avanzar más lento. "Necesitamos una mezcla adecuada", respondió Stevens. "No se trata de cercas, ni de agentes de la Patrulla Fronteriza ni de tecnología. Es acerca de todas esas cosas".


