Study: Latinos in elected office increase by 37 percent in decade

(AP) Latinos have increased their presence at all levels of government over the last decade, with more than two of every five serving, for example, in Texas, a Latino political group reported.

At the start of this year, 5,132 Latinos were in elected office around the country—a 37 percent increase from 1996, when 3,743 Latinos held elected posts.

The results were part of a study announced June 21 in Dallas to kick off the annual convention of the *National Association of Latino Elected and Appointed Officials* (NALEO, www.naleo.org). It was its 23rd annual conference.

"It's in everyone's interest, it's in every party's interest, to cultivate the number of Hispanic elected officials," said Adam J. Segal, director of

the *Hispanic Voter Project* at Johns Hopkins University.

Latino elected officials now hold office in 43 states, but a whopping 42 percent of them call Texas home. Most other Latino officials represent areas with large Latino populations, such as California, Florida, New Jersey, New York, and Illinois, the study said.

Twenty-five Latinos serve in Congress and seven are statewide officials, including New Mexico Gov. Bill Richardson. A decade ago there were no Latino U.S. senators, but now there are three: Republican Mel Martínez of Florida and Democrats Ken Salazar of Colorado and Bob Menéndez of New Jersey.

"I think Americans are getting used to voting for Latinos. It was a novelty before," said Simon Rosenberg, president of the New Democrat Network.

Georgia and New Hampshire had no Latinos in elected office in 1996, but

now have seven and three, respectively, the NALEO Educational Fund study found. Antonio Villaraigosa, meanwhile, became Los Angeles' first Latino mayor since 1872.

Latinos commonly hold education-related elected positions, such as seats on school boards, the study found. Toledo, Ohio is a case in point with positions going throughout the years to *Sofia Quintero*, *Anita López*, and *Roberto Torres*.

At its conference, NALEO also condemned the right-wing Republican conservatives who derailed the *Voting Rights Act of 1965* renewal (HR 9)—these same Republican conservatives spearheaded the draconian HR 4437 and are unwilling to compromise with more moderate Republicans in the Senate to fashion immigration reform.

Top border security official says huge walls not the answer to undocumented immigration

Basham said, "It doesn't make sense, it's not practical."

(AP) Two weeks on the job, the new head of U.S. Customs and Border Protection said Tuesday he does not favor building a huge wall along the Mexican border.

"I don't support, I don't believe the administration supports a wall," Commissioner W. Ralph Basham said in Tucson, where he met with patrol officials and agents before embarking on a tour across the Arizona desert.

Asked about proposals in

Senate- and House-approved

immigration measures to

build security walls 380 or

700 miles long, respectively,

Basham, including so-called smart fencing with imbedded sensors, vehicle barriers and lighting will be part of the infrastructure improvements needed, Basham said. But a layered approach that mixes technology and air operations for observation and responding to illegal crossings will be necessary to control of the border, he said.

"There is not a silver bul-

let out there, there's not one answer," he said.

Basham is touring the Southwest border region for a firsthand look at the challenges the Border Patrol is facing as National Guard troops arrive to begin assisting efforts to control the border.

"You can sit in Washington, D.C., and you can get briefings and you can look at maps and hear from people what the challenges are out here," Basham said. "But until you get up there and you look and you see what kind of terrain you're dealing with and the difficulties of it, you really don't have a true appreciation."

"You know you're a pendejo/a when..."

Sorry if I offended anyone, but these national organizations need to close the gap between their conference organizers and their real constituents, the grass-roots folks. It's the Juan's and Maria's who never get a knock on their door that are missing at these conferences again, and again, and again. We have become what we have criticized the government of doing when it comes to the census under-counting—we walk right pass our gente's neighborhoods. *Shame on you!*

Schwarzenegger blasts House Republicans on immigration stance

(AP) Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger sharply criticized House Republican leaders June 21st for calling summer hearings on a proposed immigration overhaul before trying to compromise with the Senate.

The Republican governor said public forums across the country were unnecessary because "we know what the facts are."

"It would be inexcusable, it would be ludicrous for them to say, 'Well, we can't work it out,'" Schwarzenegger said after a helicopter ride along the Mexican border to see where National Guard troops will soon be deployed. "That's their job—to work it out."

His remarks highlighted divisions among Republicans on how to tackle the most sweeping immigration reforms in two decades. House Republicans said Tuesday that they wanted to hold a round of public hearings that may delay negotiations with the Senate until the fall, just as November's congressional elections approach.

Schwarzenegger called for more secure borders and "a legal way" for Mexicans to work in the United States.

"I think everyone in the United States is expecting immigration reform," he said.

Schwarzenegger addressed reporters on a dirt road used by the Border Patrol after a 22-minute flight that extended from the Pacific Ocean to the mountains east of San Diego.

The governor initially resisted President Bush's plans to send up to 6,000 National Guard troops to four southern border states, but he relented after a 17-day standoff with the White House.

Schwarzenegger said Wednesday that he was reassured after the federal government promised to withdraw troops by the end of 2008, pay the full cost of their deployment and extend rotations beyond two weeks. A "majority" of Guardsmen will serve between six months and a year on the border.

According to the Guard, 235 troops have already arrived on California's southern border to prepare for their new assignments. About 200 troops are expected to arrive



every week until their numbers reach 1,000 to 1,200 by the end of July.

Troops from the Pacific Ocean to the Arizona state line will observe the border for illegal activity and notify the Border Patrol if they see anything, said Guard Col. Kevin Ellsworth. The Guard will not make any arrests. Troops will carry weapons in self-defense if they are considered to be threatened.

Schwarzenegger was briefed by Border Patrol officials before flying in a National Guard Blackhawk helicopter over dusty trails used by migrants and inspecting a 15-foot steel fence that has dramatically reduced illegal border crossings in the San Diego area.

The trip "reinforced my belief that the federal government has to do much more to secure our borders," he said.

Republican congressional leaders say a broad immigration bill unlikely to pass this year

WASHINGTON (AP) In a defeat for President George W. Bush, Republican congressional leaders said June 20th that broad immigration legislation is all but doomed for the year, a victim of election-year concerns in the House and conservatives' implacable opposition to citizenship for millions of undocumented immigrants.

"Our number one priority is to secure the border, and right now I haven't heard a lot of pressure to have a path to citizenship," said House Speaker Dennis Hastert, announcing plans for an unusual series of hearings around the nation to begin in August on Senate-passed immigration legislation.

"I think it is easy to say the first priority of the House is to secure the borders," added Rep. Roy Blunt, the Republican whip.

In deference to the president, neither Hastert nor any other Republican official in either house said publicly that the president's ambitious plan—including a guestworker program as well as an opportunity for citizenship for many undocumented immigrants—was dead for the year.

But several Republicans in both houses, speaking on condition of anonymity, were less guarded.

"There will be no path to


citizenship," said one lawmaker who attended a strategy session in Hastert's office.

Some officials added that Republicans have begun discussing a pre-election strategy for seizing the political high ground on an issue that so far has served to highlight divisions within the party. Among the possibilities, these officials said, are holding votes in the House or Senate this fall on additional measures to secure the borders, or on legislation that would prevent illegal immigrants from receiving Social Security payments or other government benefits.

"The discussion is how to put the Democrats in a box without attacking the president," said one aide, speaking on condition of anonymity.

White House spokeswoman Dana Perino said after Hastert's announcement of hearings, "The president is undeterred. We are committed and we have been working very hard with members (of Congress) to see if we can reach consensus on an issue the American people have said they want action on."

The Republican-controlled House passed border security legislation last year, largely along party lines (HR 4437). By contrast, the Senate approved a bipartisan bill calling for tougher border



enforcement; penalties against employers who hire undocumented immigrants, a new guestworker program, and a shot at citizenship for most of the estimated 12 million immigrants in the country without documentation.

The measure won the support of only 23 of the Senate's 55 Republicans. Frist, a likely presidential contender for 2008, is under pressure from conservatives not to agree to a compromise bill they oppose.

Democrats, on the other hand, are insisting on assurances that any final bill will remain bipartisan.

Hastert told reporters he had conveyed his views on immigration privately to Bush in recent days, and other officials said opinions among House Republicans hardened when Republican Rep. Brian Bilbray won a special election this month in the San Diego area. Bilbray campaigned for tougher immigration measures than Bush favors, and equated the president's approach to amnesty.



Kaptur: Act Now to Save on Federal Student Loans

If you have a student loan—or if you're a parent who borrowed money for your children's college expenses—the following information might save you literally thousands of dollars.

The cost of those loans is about to rise substantially. Every July 1, the federal government adjusts the rates on student loans. With interest rates on the rise, the out-of-pocket increase this year to students and families will be substantial—\$3,500 or more for the average borrower. But you can avoid most of the increase if you act quickly.

How do you avoid this rate increase? By consolidating your loans and converting those variable rate loans into fixed-rate loans.

If you have a Direct Loan through the U.S. Department of Education, call 800-557-7392 or apply online at www.loansconsolidation.ed.gov. If you have a bank-based loan through the FFEL program, contact one of the companies that own or service your student or parent loan(s). If you have loans with more than one lender, you should consider consolidating those loans through the Department of Education.

The rate on Stafford loans for students who are currently in school, or whose loans are in grace period or deferment, will rise from 4.7% to 6.54%. The rate for Stafford loans already in repayment will rise from 5.3% to 7.14%. The rate for PLUS loans (for parents) will rise from 6.1% to 7.94%.

After June 30, students can no longer consolidate Stafford loans while they are still in school.

I am concerned about the high levels of debt with which many students leave college. I have opposed cuts in the federal student aid programs and supported legislation to cut student loan interest rates in half. However, until the congressional leadership addresses this problem, the best course of action for Ohio families is to take advantage of the consolidation option.





Toledo Zoo Adds Two Minority Board Members

The Toledo Zoo, during its annual meeting on June 19, voted to add three new members to its board of directors. Two of the three are prominent members of Toledo's minority community: Toledo City Councilman Michael Ashford and the Farm Labor Organizing Committee's (FLOC) Founder/President Baldevar Velásquez.

The Zoo, which has been awash in controversy over the past few years, at least in part because of the perception that the organization has lacked a commitment to diversity in its hiring practices, has made a studied attempt of late to correct its hiring deficiencies.

A task force appointed by the Lucas County Commissioners last year issued a report on July 8, 2005 concluding that the

Zoo had had "an embarrassing lack of racial diversity."

Subsequently the Zoo itself assembled an external diversity committee and hired a local diversity consultant. While the numbers of minority employees are still low, the Zoo has increased its full-time minority employees from two to four (of a work force of about 150) over the last year and has increased its part-time and seasonal minority staff from 12 to 14 percent.

"I think the board, as has the entire Zoo, has been turning our attention to diversity," said Dr. Anne Baker, executive director, who started in her position this past March. "We want to be more reflective of the entire community for two reasons. First it's the right thing to do and second, it's good business. We want to be more hospitable to all of the citizens of Lucas County."

When asked if the move to improve the Zoo's image, especially among minority communities, was result of the mixed results of the last levy campaign – which saw a yes vote on the operating levy and a no on the capital improvement levy – Dr. Baker demurred.

"I don't know that 'no' would be a perfectly honest answer, but it's not the levy," she replied. "We wouldn't have asked [Ashford and Velásquez] just because of that. The African-American and Hispanic communities supported us in those levies. When I say it's good business ... for example, the Hispanic community is the fastest growing. Both groups are potential visitors and we want them to come here and if we want

them to come here, we have to be welcoming."

Ashford spoke of his own reasons for agreeing to become part of the Zoo organization.

"The Zoo is a great institution and given the fact that they recognize that they have had problems and that the oversight committee recommended that they diversify the board, it makes sense for me to come aboard," he said.

How difficult will it be to improve the Zoo's minority hiring practices in the skilled areas, Ashford was asked?

"I don't think it's going to be difficult here in 2006. I'm going to look at the overall plan and help them to make sure the plan is aggressive enough."

Velásquez was unavailable for comment with FLOC negotiations in North Carolina.

209, advierte el informe.

El estudio también revela que la enmienda en California llevó a reducciones importantes de contratos gubernamentales con minorías y negocios propiedad de mujeres, la contratación de profesores de minorías y mujeres en el sistema de la Universidad de California y en la matriculación de estudiantes de minorías en el sistema de la Universidad de California.

Entre los programas que fueron mermados tras la aprobación de la propuesta 209 se incluyen los de asistencia y preparación pre universitaria para estudiantes de bajos ingresos y minorías; asistencia y financiamiento para mujeres y minorías para estudios de matemáticas, ciencias y tecnología; programas de ayuda a minorías y mujeres para aprender oficios especializados; y esfuerzos de diversidad en los nombramientos realizados por el gobernador para las jun-

tas de cárceles y para otorgar la libertad condicional.

El informe del CEM proyecta resultados similares en Michigan si se adopta la enmienda, incluyendo desafíos legales, que ya existen, contra el estado, condado, municipalidades y distritos escolares.

El estudio proyecta, basándose en la experiencia de California, que las Universidades públicas en Michigan posiblemente sufrirán una reducción en la matriculación de minorías de baja representación lo que podría "empeorar a través del tiempo, lo que hará muy difícil mantener un cuerpo estudiantil que prepara a estudiantes para la vida y el trabajo en el Siglo XXI". Según el informe, esto podría resultar en una "disminución de diversidad entre... graduados que son buscados para empleos por negocios en Michigan" y "como resultado habrá una disminución en el número de médicos, abogados y otros profesionales dispuestos a servir a las comunidades desatendidas del estado y del país, con

serias consecuencias para el estatus de la salud y el desarrollo de liderazgo en comunidades de color".

El informe del CEM destaca la importancia de la diversidad en la educación y empleo citando investigaciones que demuestran que estudiantes de todas las razas que viven y aprenden entre compañeros de distintas etnidades y orígenes se transforman en pensadores más críticos y originales, desarrollan una mayor tolerancia frente a las diferencias y son empleados eficientes en el Mercado global.

Según el informe de CEM, la experiencia de California sugiere que la asistencia financiada por el estado para fomentar que minorías y mujeres sigan la carrera de matemáticas, ciencias y tecnología será eliminada o enmendada con toda probabilidad, como así también la ayuda financiera y becas que toman como factores, sexo, raza, etnicidad y origen nacional.

Otras consecuencias posibles sugeridas por la experiencia en California incluyen una disminución en el acceso a contratos gubernamentales por



negocios de propiedad de minorías o mujeres, y una reducción en la contratación de facultad de color y mujeres en las universidades públicas del estado.

El informe advierte que la segregación racial generalizada en Michigan en escuelas y vecindarios es un factor importante en los bajos logros educacionales, la pobreza y la emigración. Michigan está en el lugar 31 del país por el número de residentes mayores de 25 años, que han logrado un título universitario de un establecimiento educacional de cuatro años.

El estudio de CEM recoge informes recientes sobre los desafíos económicos de Michigan y advierte que "resolver la crisis económica de Michigan, exige que todos los ciudadanos sean educados en la plenitud de sus intereses y habilidades, especialmente en ciencias y áreas técnicas".



La multitud en el Zócalo estalló de alegría con el gol de Rafael Márquez, que puso quedaron con las ganas de festejar. Sólo lo hicieron animadamente al ganarle 3-1 a Irán en su debut en el mundial, pero después quedaron silenciados con el tanto del empate marcado por Hernán Crespo.

Cuando Maxi Rodríguez

anotó el tanto del triunfo, a los siete minutos del primer tiempo extra, los seguidores se sumieron en la tristeza y algunos comenzaron a abandonar el lugar.

"La verdad fue un partido, que cualquiera pudo ganar", dijo Ramos, quien con la cara pintada con los colores de la bandera mexicana, se retiró a su casa.

"Claro que estamos tristes, por que creo que pudimos ganar. Fue un partido de gran marca y que se decidió por un gol de diferencia. Por mala suerte volvimos a perder ante Argentina, que es un gran equipo", dijo Francisco Pacheco, estudiante que siguió el partido en el Zócalo.



At the Movies: "The Road to Guantanamo"

The filmmakers behind "The Road to Guantanamo" make no effort to present a balanced chronicle of three British Muslims who were held without charges for two years at the U.S. military prison in Cuba.

But given the news accounts of prisoner abuse and recent suicides at the Cuban prison, it's difficult to accuse the filmmakers of overstating the hardship, maltreatment and degradation the film depicts.

"The Road to Guantanamo" is a movie that will make some U.S.-Americans ashamed to be U.S.-Americans, or at least ashamed of things the three young men say was done in America's name. Yet it's one that Americans should see, a story that puts sympathetic faces on the bystanders caught up in the unyielding war on terror.

Directors Michael Winterbottom and Mat Whitecross mix interviews with the three men and narrative segments using actors to re-create their journey from Britain to Pakistan and Afghanistan, where they were captured and eventually shipped to Guantanamo Bay.

The film is a challenge to watch, not only for its harsh subject matter but also for its abruptness of style and relentless pace. Winterbottom and Whitecross (the latter a protege who collaborated on several of Winterbottom's films) treat their subjects' story with little dramatic adornment.

"The Road to Guantanamo" hurtles into the action as Asif Iqbal, then 19, leaves Britain for Pakistan to meet the woman his mother has arranged for him to marry shortly after the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist at-

tacks. Three friends—Ruhal Ahmed, Shafiq Rasul and Monir Ali—later join him there.

After a few days relaxing in Pakistan, they heed a call for humanitarian aid in Afghanistan, where they arrive just as the U.S. begins its post-Sept. 11 assault. Separated from the others, Monir vanishes and is never heard from again.

Asif, Ruhal and Shafiq are

captured by Northern Alliance troops and turned over to U.S. forces, who hold them in Pakistan then transfer them to Guantanamo in early 2002.

In the film, the prisoners are held in small wire-mesh cages and subjected to humiliating abuse and brutal interrogation. They are chained in painful positions to a hook in the floor and bombarded with screeching

music and strobe lights.

Their U.S. inquisitors show them a video tape of an Osama bin Laden rally and insist the prisoners were present. The allegation eventually was disproved when British officials learned all three were home in England at the time.

Winterbottom's eye for terrifying absurdity is well-suited to the story. Some of the images, particularly those of the men masked and

Esta montada sobre un ambiente y detalles art-decó decadentes, pero a la vez resulta muy actual. Es alegre con la posibilidad del descubrimiento, y a la vez profundamente conmovedora. Deberá satisfacer a los puristas y atraer a nuevos fanáticos del superhéroe.

Pero aún más importante para un éxito de taquilla de verano, esta película es rotundamente emocionante.

At the Movies: 'Superman Returns'

Finally this summer, the type is justified.

"Superman Returns" is everything you'd want it to be. It's reverential of the source material, yet a unique film all its own. It's steeped in decadent art-deco mood and details, yet completely current. It's joyous with the possibility of discovery, yet deeply moving in its melancholy. It should satisfy purists and attract new converts.

But most importantly for a summer blockbuster, it's just outright thrilling.

With technology having vastly improved since the original "Superman" from 1978, director Bryan Singer has constructed a visual marvel. The enormous set pieces are jaw-droppingly elaborate, especially a visceral near-plane crash toward the film's start that will leave you on the verge of simultaneous laughter and tears. (At a recent screening, it prompted many in the packed theater to burst into applause, and justifiably so.)

Having infused the first two "X-Men" movies with equal amount of dazzle and heart, Singer shows he's the ideal choice to take over the beloved franchise. He definitely has his own vision, but he was smart enough to retain key elements from the original film, including John Williams' score—the first few notes of which will surely inspire a wistful sense of childhood nostalgia—and archive footage of Marlon Brando as Superman's father, Jor-El.

And yet, there's something softer, sweeter, warmer about this "Superman" than its predecessors, both in its tone and its performances.

With his jet-black hair, blue eyes, chiseled facial features and muscular build, Brandon Routh bears a great resemblance to the late Christopher Reeve—and is just as lovably klutzy in bespectacled Clark Kent

mode—but he portrays the DC Comics superhero with more introspection and vulnerability, and not as much slam-bang charisma.

As Lex Luthor, Kevin Spacey does his best work since "American Beauty" and reminds us that, after starring in a string of maudlin flops, he still knows how to deliver a complex, subtle performance. He doesn't chew the scenery as Gene Hackman did in portraying the self-professed criminal mastermind, but he's a smolderingly smarmy in a way that's just as amusing.

Kate Bosworth, meanwhile—who happened to play Sandra Dee opposite Spacey's Bobby Darin in the soggy biopic "Beyond the Sea"—gives us a surprisingly toned-down Lois Lane. It's a bit jarringly at first until you stop and realize that the hard-driving, chain-smoking girl reporter is a woman now; the mother to a young son with her longtime fiancé (James Marsden), Lois has matured and found that her priorities have somewhat shifted.

She doesn't need Superman to save her. She even wrote an editorial, "Why the World Doesn't Need Superman," to prove it—and earned a Pulitzer Prize in the process.

Things have changed in "Superman Returns." And things have stayed the same.

Sort of a sequel to 1980's "Superman II," this new film takes a little while to get going, but begins with the Man of Steel returning to Metropolis after a five-year absence. He'd gone searching for the remnants of his destroyed home planet, Krypton, and comes back to Earth finding that he still hasn't found what he's looking for.

But he knows to begin life again as Clark Kent at The Daily Planet (where Frank Langella has taken over as a comparatively authoritative Editor Perry White) and he responds just as instinctively to the first signs of trouble.

At the same time, Lex Luthor is back, too. He's gotten out of prison on a technicality

and has an expanded posse of sycophants, including the always hilarious Parker Posey as his floozy Girl Friday in an eye-popping array of '40s-style ensembles. Here, as in the original "Superman," Lex has his eye on land, but instead of taking over California, he wants his own continent.

As always, Superman must stop him while simultaneously rescuing Lois, both literally and emotionally. Yes, "Superman Returns" is rooted firmly in the action-packed comic book world, which should keep the fanboys happy. But fundamentally, it's also a romance—a story of unattainable, impossible love that aches with longing and sadness.

There is, of course, the theory that Superman functions as a Christ figure—that Jor-El sent his only son to Earth to light the way for humanity. And you could argue that now, more than ever, we need a superhero to swoop down and fight for truth, justice and the U.S.-American way.

You could even view the timing as significant in "Superman Returns": that the Man of Steel was gone for five years, the same period that's passed since the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001. (And it is a bit conspicuous that the Trade Center towers, which figured so prominently in those romantic late-night flights of the previous films, are absent now.)

All those elements are in there—if you choose to see them, if you need to find them.

So does the world really need Superman? Maybe not everyone. But people who love movies do.

"Superman Returns," a Warner Bros. Pictures release, is rated PG-13 for some intense action violence. Running time: 157 minutes. Three and a half stars out of four.

México realizará elecciones presidenciales el 2 de julio, y López Obrador comparte el favoritismo del electorado con el candidato oficialista Felipe Calderón.

La mención del diario a López Obrador aparece en un comentario sobre la decisión de la dirigencia de la Cámara de Representantes de realizar audiencias en Washington y otras ciudades sobre su propio proyecto de inmigración aprobado en diciembre y el del Senado aprobado en mayo.

Esa convocatoria es inusual para proyectos ya aprobados por ambas cámaras sobre un mismo tema. El procedimiento tradicional es nombrar negociadores de ambas partes para una conferencia de armonización de un proyecto unificado.

The Washington Post califica la maniobra de la cámara baja como "irresponsible" y le sugiere tener en cuenta que cada año ingresan al país unos 400,000 mexicanos, de manera que toda demora "es costosa".

"Más aún, esa demora puede incrementar el flujo dadas las tendencias de la economía mexicana", dijo el diario indicando que China estaba desplazando a México del mercado estadounidense y varias empresas tecnológicas como Sony, NEC y Kodak han trasladado sus operaciones de México a China.

"Si el señor López Obrador gana (las elecciones) y sigue las políticas económicas populistas a las que ha estado asociadas en el pasado, el flujo de mexicano que llegan a Estados Unidos podría acelerarse", agregó.
