• **México: diputados aprueban reforma para recuperar nacionalidad**
MEXICO (AP): La Cámara de Diputados aprobó el jueves una reforma constitucional para que los mexicanos por nacimiento que hayan perdido su nacionalidad por haber obtenido una extranjera, puedan recuperarla en cualquier momento.
Con 386 votos a favor, 37 en contra y 16 abstenciones se aprobó la reforma que elimina plazos para recuperar la nacionalidad y establece que los mexicanos podrán hacer el trámite en cualquier fecha ante consulados y embajadas de México en el extranjero.
«La reforma constitucional (también) tiene por objeto la pérdida de la nacionalidad mexicana, independientemente de que se adopte alguna otra nacionalidad o ciudadanía», dijo el diputado Jesús Lomelí, del Partido

Revolucionario Institucional.
«La modificación... es fundamentalmente para corregir un defecto (legal) garrafal», señaló el diputado Arturo Nahle, del Partido de la Revolución Democrática (PRD).
El 20 de marzo pasado venció un plazo establecido en una ley de 1998, que por cinco años permitió reclamar la nacionalidad mexicana a quienes la hubieran perdido.
Cinco días después, el Senado aprobó reformas a la Constitución para eliminarlo.
Para que las modificaciones entren en vigor, sin embargo, se necesita que también sean aprobadas por la Cámara de Diputados y al menos 16 de los 31 congresos locales de México.
El jueves, la Cámara aprobó las reformas, por lo que ahora sólo falta que lo hagan los congresos locales.
«Nuestro compromiso es con el respaldo a los



Police Chief Rivera claims the mayor "blatantly lied"

Lorain Mayor Craig Foltin is running for re-election on November 4th.
As part of his campaign literature, he mailed to numerous Lorain residents a large political postcard, bearing greetings from the mayor and proclaiming that the "Lorain Police Support Mayor Foltin."
Foltin, a Republican, is seeking his second term as mayor, running against former mayor and current house representative, Joseph Koziura.
Lorain's Police Chief Cel Rivera has taken offense with the Foltin literature and claims that Foltin "blatantly lied."
The Fraternal Order of Police (FOP) has endorsed the mayor but not the police department. They are two distinct entities according to Rivera.
Rivera also was critical of Foltin for utilizing a photograph in the postcard that




depicted Rivera with Captain Reséndez of the Lorain County Sheriff's Office.
According to Rivera, the photograph was taken at a memorial service to honor city and county law enforcement officers and should not be used for political purposes.
Rivera stated, "I had personally asked the Mayor not to use this picture as it would trivialize the sacrifice of these men for political purposes... that this service is very personal and sacred to those in law enforcement... [The mayor] specifically promised that it would not be used in a partisan manner to indicate support for his candidacy; it is difficult to believe that he blatantly lied and I consider it a personal betrayal."
River continued that the emboldened "Lorain Police Support Mayor Foltin" is "deceitful and disrespectful to the three other unions that comprise the Lorain Police Department."
Rivera further made it clear that he was not endorsing the mayor for re-election, that he wanted to remain neutral, and that "it is absolutely essential that the Lorain Police Department remain a non-political entity and perform its law enforcement duties impartially."
In response, Mayor Foltin informed *La Prensa* that he was "very hurt by the harshness of the Chief's words but that he did not have any intent to deceive or misrepresent" by his campaign literature.
"I had no motivation to do anything improper. I wanted to put together a positive piece on my F.O.P. endorsement for mayor. I feel very badly about its interpretation," said Mayor Foltin.
Foltin admits that the timing of Rivera's statements "was a blow to his campaign."

Return Koziura to the mayor's office

La Prensa strongly endorses Joe Koziura for Lorain Mayor.

Koziura narrowly lost to the current mayor, Craig Foltin, four years ago and during the latter's tenure as mayor, the city of Lorain has accumulated almost 2 million dollars in debt. Moreover, the city's bond rating has dipped twice this year.

Foltin is attempting to take credit for positive Lorain developments such as the Black River landing and Harbor Walk, but both of these projects were initiated by Koziura when he was mayor.

What concerns *La Prensa* most is the State of Ohio Ethics Commission's findings in 2001.

On March 19, 2001, the Lorain County Prosecutor referred to the Ethics Commission its investigation into possible ethics violations by Foltin with respect to his use of influence and authority as mayor to obtain city employment for attorney Michael Provenza, his business partner.

The Ethics Commission found such a violation, stating:

"Based on its examination, the Commission informed the Prosecutor that Mayor Foltin and [Michael] Provenza could be determined to be business associates, and that Foltin's appointment of [Michael] Provenza to the City Sealer position on March 13, 2000 occurred in violation of the Ethics Laws.

"Furthermore, to the extent that Foltin sought to influence the hiring of [Michael] Provenza for the other two positions, this conduct was likewise prohibited by the Ethics Law... Furthermore, in conjunction with the Lorain County Prosecutor and as part of a resolution of this matter, the Commission publicly reprimanded Mayor Foltin for his conduct and advised Foltin that any future violations would be investigated and, if warranted by the facts, be recommended to be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law."

The entire finding can be found at: www.ethics.state.oh.us/PressReleases/05242001.html. As rightly endorsed by *The Chronicle*, "Koziura has been... a dependable leader" and, therefore, should be returned to the office of *alcalde* by the citizens of Lorain.



Growing immigrant population heightens need for bilingual police

DETROIT (AP): When Jorge Casanas called Detroit police to report a hit-and-run accident, the response he got wasn't what he expected.

"I dialed 911 to get help for my friend, who was bleeding from his shoulder, but they said something like 'no speak Spanish' and hung up," said Casanas, who doesn't speak English.

"I tried it again, and again the same thing happened, until one of my friend's relatives who speaks English got through," the 60-year-old told the Detroit Free Press for a Monday story.

Detroit police officials say they don't condone that kind of behavior and would discipline operators who just hang up. But Casanas' experience underscores the challenges confronting both departments and residents as immigrants from Latin America, Asia and other parts of the world arrive in Michigan speaking little or no English.

Police officials say proficiency in a second language can mean the difference between life and death, and it's something they're working to promote in their departments.

A U.S. Census Bureau report released this month highlights the country's new cultural fabric. The report says

that roughly 1 in 5 people in the U.S. speak a language other than English at home, a 47 percent increase since 1990.

So far, Spanish is the most common foreign language. But with new arrivals from around the Middle East, Africa and south Asia, police departments in Michigan are under pressure to recruit candidates with skills in languages such as Arabic, Hindi or Urdu.

"The two things we talk about most when hiring at the Sheriff's Department are...for officers that speak another language and candidates that know how to use computers," said Macomb County Sheriff Mark Hackel. "For us, language is becoming as important an issue as technology."

"It is vital that our officers be able to communicate with residents," said Lt. Col. Peter Muñoz of the Michigan State Police.

In Dearborn, where roughly one-third of the city's almost 100,000 residents hail from the Middle East, several of the police department's 180 officers speak Arabic and Spanish. It also has officers who speak Japanese, Polish, Italian and Maltese.

Detroit Police Lt. John Serda, president of the 120-member Hispanic Police Officers Association

of Michigan, said the number of first-generation Hispanic immigrants arriving in areas patrolled by officers in the 3rd and 4th precincts has jumped.

Most speak little to no English and Serda says he's worried the language barrier may cause additional problems for newcomers.

"Unfortunately, a lot of times, these citizens won't get the services they need," he said.

More than just good public policy, having bilingual officers on the force may go far in preventing what could become tragic situations.

On April 28, 1993, two Detroit officers shot dead a Cuban immigrant in southwest Detroit because they thought he was reaching for a gun. No weapons were found and the officers were later acquitted of murder charges.

Many in the Latino community suggest the incident could have been avoided if the officers involved had understood what the man was telling them in Spanish.

"There is a barrier between officers and citizens," said Lisa Alvarado, an officer in Detroit's 3rd Precinct who said she uses her Spanish-language skills daily while on patrol.

"A lot of people in the community don't come to the police for help because of the language issue," she said.

More than 300 illegal immigrants seized in raids on Wal-Mart

LITTLE ROCK (AP): Federal agents raided Wal-Mart's headquarters and 60 of its stores across the country Thursday, arresting more than 300 illegal workers in an immigration crackdown at the world's biggest retailer.

The workers were members of cleaning crews hired by outside contractors, but federal law enforcement officials cited recordings of meetings and conversations among Wal-Mart executives, managers and contractors.

"We have seen no evidence of this from the INS, and, if that turns out to be true, we will cooperate fully with law enforcement officials," Wal-Mart spokeswoman Mona Williams said.

The workers were arrested as they finished their night shifts at Wal-Mart stores in 21 states. Agents also hauled away several boxes of documents from an executive's office at Wal-Mart headquarters in Bentonville.

An employer can face civil and criminal penalties for knowingly hiring illegal immigrants or failing to comply with certain employee recordkeeping regulations.

Wal-Mart Stores had sales last year of \$244.5 billion.

The company has about 1.1 million employees in the United States, and it uses more than 100 third-party contractors to clean more than 700 stores nationwide, Williams said.

"We require each of these contractors to use only legal workers," she said.

The law enforcement sources said the investigation grew out of earlier probes of Wal-Mart cleaning crew contractors in 1998 and 2001.

All the arrested workers were in the country illegally, said Garrison Courtney, a spokesman with Immigration and Customs Enforcement. They were detained at local immigration offices. Those who had no criminal record were released with instructions to appear before immigration judges.

Wal-Mart is not the first big company to be targeted in an immigration investigation. Six managers at Tyson Foods, based in town away from Wal-Mart in Springdale, were charged in an immigrant-smuggling case in 2001.

One defendant shot himself to death a few months after being charged, and two managers entered guilty pleas early in the case. A jury acquitted the poultry company and three other managers.

Ulysses A. Yannas, an analyst with the investment firm Buckman, Buckman and Reid, said it is too much to expect Wal-Mart to keep track of all of its vendors' workers. But he said the investigation could present a problem for the com-

pany. "It is a question of what else it might bring out. These are long, drawn-out processes," Yannas said.

Top Wal-Mart officials learned of Thursday's sweep when store managers began calling headquarters for guidance in dealing with the raids.

Courtney said agents searched the office of one of Wal-Mart's executives, Williams, the spokeswoman, said they spent several hours in the office of a "mid-level manager" at Wal-Mart's headquarters and carried away several boxes of paperwork.

She said she did not know if any other Wal-Mart administrative offices were searched.

The arrests were made at stores in Alabama, Arkansas, Arizona, Connecticut, Delaware, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Maryland, Michigan, North Carolina, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and West Virginia.

The Rev. Jesse Jackson of the Rainbow Push Coalition called The Associated Press to denounce Wal-Mart's management practices in general. Jackson, who has been working on labor issues in Los Angeles and elsewhere, said Wal-Mart is "the economic Trojan horse" of America. He said the company offers goods at low prices at the expense of workers, who he said are paid low wages and receive meager health benefits.

millones de mexicanos que residen en el exterior, así como de protección y salvaguarda de sus derechos», señaló el diputado Alvaro Elías, del Partido Acción Nacional (PAN).

Datos de la cancillería mexicana señalan que más de 10 millones de personas que nacieron en México viven en el extranjero, y de ellas alrededor del 98% radican en Estados Unidos.

Cifras del último censo de Estados Unidos, señalan que alrededor de 1,6 millones de personas que nacieron en México habían adquirido la nacionalidad estadounidense.

Días después de que concluyera el plazo de cinco años establecido en el decreto de 1998, la cancillería informó que sólo unas 67.000 personas habían recuperado la nacionalidad mexicana.

EEUU niega denuncias que comprometen a la CIA en Venezuela

CARACAS (AP): El

embajador de los Estados Unidos en Caracas, Charles Shapiro, negó el jueves las denuncias hechas por congresistas oficialistas venezolanos que acusaron a la agencia de inteligencia CIA de estar promoviendo un plan terrorista para derrocar al presidente Hugo Chávez.

«Estoy convencido que el señalamiento no es cierto. No tiene fundamento», dijo Shapiro al arribar al congreso para reunirse con el congresista oficialista Nicolás Maduro para conocer más detalles sobre su denuncia.

El diplomático declaró a la prensa que acudió a la sede de la Asamblea Nacional «para tratar de entender lo que dijo (Maduro), porque no tiene nada de verdad».

Los congresistas estadounidenses Cass Ballenger, William Delahunt y Gregory Meeks, que iniciaron el jueves una visita de 24 horas a la capital, desestimaron la denuncia sobre las supuestas actuaciones de la CIA en Venezuela.

«He hablado con miembros de mi gobierno y de la CIA, y he salido de esas conversaciones con la

certidumbre total que la época en que la CIA socavaba gobiernos ya ha pasado», dijo Meeks en rueda de prensa.

«Ahora lo que necesitamos es trabajar más unidos como naciones para luchar contra el tráfico de la droga y para luchar contra cualquier potencial de terrorismo», agregó Meeks.

Delahunt rechazó los señalamientos en cuanto a que funcionarios estadounidenses hayan tenido alguna participación en el fallido golpe del 11 de abril que sacó a Chávez del gobierno por dos días.

«Cualquier esfuerzo de cualquier cuerpo (estadounidense) de socavar cualquier gobierno elegido democráticamente en este hemisferio recibirá la condena inequívoca», manifestó Delahunt.

Maduro presentó el miércoles en rueda de prensa un vídeo en el que aparecen dos hombres, que se identifican como supuestos miembros de la CIA, conversando con un grupo de personas en un salón y dándoles un entrenamiento de inteligencia.

El diputado oficialista

dijo que se pretende utilizar en Venezuela «el mismo formato» que emplearon para derrocar al presidente chileno Salvador Allende en 1973.

Explicó que posee de fuentes que aseguran que la CIA estaría planeando, junto con las policiales de alcaldías controladas por dirigentes opositores, un «conjunto de ataques terroristas» entre el 28 de noviembre y el primero de diciembre, fechas programadas para la recolección de firmas en respaldo a un referendo contra Chávez.

Agregó que se busca generar «caos» para promover a partir del 2 de diciembre un nuevo paro general y propiciar el derrocamiento del gobierno del presidente Chávez.

La Embajada de los Estados Unidos difundió el miércoles un comunicado en el que manifestó que el vídeo presentado como prueba por el congresista forma parte de «un evento de una empresa de seguridad privada. El gobierno de los Estados Unidos no tuvo ninguna participación en ese evento».

Hernández named Deputy Under Secretary

U.S. Secretary of Education Rod Paige announced last week that María Hernández Ferrier has been promoted to the position of deputy under secretary of education. A San Antonio native, Hernández Ferrier found herself at age 30 a divorced mother of two, unable to drive a car or obtain a job that could sustain her family. While working at a minimum wage job, she was encouraged by her supervisor to attend college. She did so and ultimately received a doctoral degree in

education administration.

Hernández Ferrier, the bilingual granddaughter of Mexican immigrants, has 17 years of experience in Texas public schools. Her accomplishments include creating many award-winning model programs for assisting underserved children and youth. Prior to her appointment to OELA, she served as the executive director of City Year, the program model for AmeriCorps, a federal national service organization. City Year brings young people from diverse backgrounds together to provide services for children in low-income elementary schools.

Hernández Ferrier has earned a doctorate in education administration from Texas A&M University, a master of education degree and a bachelor's degree in speech from Our Lady of the Lake in San Antonio.

Hernández Ferrier has four children and three grandchildren. She and her husband, Al Ferrier, reside in Arlington, Va.

Senado de EEUU vota contra restricciones a viajes a Cuba

WASHINGTON (AP): Desafiando una amenaza presidencial de veto, el Senado se unió a la Cámara de Representantes el jueves para avanzar hacia la conclusión de cuatro décadas de restricciones para viajar a Cuba.

"De ninguna manera es constructivo tratar de dañar a Fidel Castro al imponer límites al derecho a viajar que tiene el pueblo estadounidense", dijo el senador demócrata Byron Dorgan.

El Senado aprobó por 59 votos a favor y 36 en contra una medida para prohibir el uso de dinero del gobierno para hacer cumplir las actuales restricciones de viaje.

La Cámara de Representantes aprobó una medida casi idéntica el mes pasado, lo cual provocó un enfrentamiento con el gobierno del presidente George W. Bush, que ha amenazado con vetar una propuesta de ley de 90.000 millones de dólares de los Departamentos de Transporte y del Tesoro si menciona el asunto de los

viajes a Cuba.

"El gobierno cree que es esencial conservar las sanciones y las restricciones de viaje para negarle recursos económicos al brutal régimen de Castro", declaró la Casa Blanca en un comunicado.

El Departamento del Tesoro calcula que aproximadamente 160.000 ciudadanos de Estados Unidos, la mitad de ellos cubano-estadounidenses que visitan a familiares, viajaron legalmente a Cuba el año pasado.

A los grupos humanitarios y educativos, periodistas y diplomáticos también se les permite viajar al país caribeño, pero miles de estadounidenses más lo visitan ilegalmente, viajan a terceros países, arriesgándose a ser encarcelados y multados con miles de dólares.

El senador republicano Larry Craig, que junto con Dorgan promovió la enmienda a la propuesta de ley sobre los gastos, dijo que la Oficina de Control de Activos en el Extranjero (OFAC, por sus siglas en inglés), del Departamento del Tesoro, una agencia cru-



cial en el combate al terrorismo y al narcotráfico, no debería dedicar recursos a vigilar turistas estadounidenses que visitan Cuba.

«El 10% del presupuesto de la OFAC es utilizado para rastrear a abuelitas de la costa oeste que eligen andar en bicicleta en Cuba por medio de una agencia de viajes canadiense», dijo.

Los opositores advirtieron que la propuesta envió una señal equivocada en una época en que el régimen de Castro ha incrementado su represión sobre los opositores. «¿Por qué deberíamos levantar ahora las restricciones para viajar a Cuba, para darle más dinero en efectivo al régimen de Castro?», preguntó el senador republicano Ted Stevens, presidente del Comité de Autorización de Gastos.
