

Big tour inspires Grupo Vida to rev up live shows on a larger scale. Even in the Lakes Wis and Los Tie

GRUPO Vida lead singer Art Tigerina believes it's not enough to just play music: A band needs to entertain.

"We put ourselves in our fans' shoes," he said. "Do we want to come and see a band that's just playing? You can put a CD on in your car and hear the group. We want them to wonder what Grupo Vida is going to do now, leave them with the anticipation."

Grupo Vida's invitation to join a concert tour was the result of a visit to a San Antonio music store by Dixie Chick Emily Robison.

Tigerina said lessons learned during the band's opening slot on the Dixie Chicks' 2001 Fly tour inspired improvements to its show.

"It's like you're playing in the minor leagues, and then you go to the majors," he said. "The crowds are larger, and everything's on a larger scale. Even in the small shows, it's helped us. We can't do all the pyrotechnics and lights, but it helped us see how to fit a big show into a small show.

"Rather than just playing straightforward, we incorporate little skits into the songs. For instance, on *Cumbia Carrito*, we ask if people have had problems with an old car, we do a skit and incorporate a story line."

The San Antonio-based band also chucked its cowboy hats and starched shirts and adopted an attention-grabbing look. Tigerina shaved his head, and gonzo accordionist Sonny Sauceda donned flashy pants.

Vida continues to make forays into the mainstream country music market. "We just want to show versatility," he said. "We don't want to do a full country set. We want to do Tex-Mex, with the accordion feel, like what the Texas Tornados did."

Of course, lots of bands say they're versatile. But what other group could have opened for both Io Dee Messina in Twin

Lakes, Wis., and Los Tigrillos in Monterrey, Mexico, as Vida did last July? In April, Vida opened for Clay Walker in Tucson, Ariz.

One highlight of recent shows has been the band's take on Freddy Fender's Wasted Days and Wasted Nights. With the band heading in a Tex-Mex/country direction, the choice was logical. But in typical Vida fashion, the song is turned inside out with jazzy drumming and Sauceda's accordion riffs.

The group was established in 1997 after backing Eddie Gonzalez for three years. The camps split acrimoniously, but Vida barely missed a beat thanks to Tigerina's vocals and the group's cohesiveness. Vida's hits include Vueltasy Vueltas and Sin Buenas Condiciones.

Vida's upcoming release, the as yet untitled follow-up to Sangre Para Ti, continues in the group's signature hyper-caffeinated Tejano

Indonesia confirma brote de influenza avícola

YAKARTA, Indonesia (AP) El gobierno de Indonesia confirmó el domingo la existencia de un brote de influenza avícola entre millones de pollos, pero aseguró que la dolencia no ha contagiado a persona alguna.

"El gobierno no intenta ocultar que la influenza avícola ha atacado a millones de pollos en Indonesia", afirmó el funcionario del Departamento de Agricultura Sofjan Sudardjat.

Agregó que serán realizados más análisis para determinar si el virus es del mismo tipo que asoló a otros seis países de la región, matando por lo menos a seis personas y millones de pollos.

"Este tipo de virus sólo afectó a los pollos" en Indonesia, indicó el funcionario. (Continued on Page 3)

México plans to discuss concerns about immigration plan with Bush

MEXICO CITY (AP): A Mexican official said Wednesday his government has 10 questions about President George W. Bush's recently announced immigration plan and has already begun to discuss them with U.S. authorities.

Bush and Mexican
President Vicente Fox are
to meet at Bush's Texas
ranch on March 5-6,
though Geronimo
Gutierrez, undersecretary
for North American affairs
at the Foreign Relations
Department, did not say if
immigration was on the
agenda for that meeting.

He called the Bush plan "a creative proposal on the table."

Fox had already praised Bush's proposal, taking partial credit for keeping the idea of immigration reform alive for an estimated 4.8 million undocumented Mexicans in the United States during meetings with the U.S. president.

Gutierrez said there are two main aspects to the immigration issue: the legal situation of millions of imported U.S. workers and creating formal mechanisms for future

migrant workers.

"What the proposal tries to do is reconcile those two components, using the scheme of temporary workers," Gutierrez said.

Bush gave only broad outlines of his plan when he presented it on Jan. 7, and he said details would emerge as the plan works its way through Congress.

It would create renewable three-year guest worker visas both for foreign workers already in the United States and for those who want to go. They would have to have a job lined up.

In a point that was controversial among some Mexican-American activists in the United States, the plan would not give any preference in permanent residence or citizenship matters to aliens now illegally in the United States.

Gutierrez said México is concerned about the ease and efficiency with which people can turn to the program as well as how—and for how long—workers can renew the three-year visas.

Other issues included treatment of self-employed migrants, processes for attaining permanent residence and ways of guaranteeing family unity for migrant workers.



He said Mexican officials are interested in whether those earlier deported for illegal entry would be eligible, in clauses on equal opportunities for jobs, the possibility of speeding permanent residence status and possible bilateral migration agreements in addition to the unilateral Bush

México also was interested in how long it will take to implement the measure, Gutierrez said.

Gutierrez spoke at an academic forum on immigration issues where the National Population Council reported that an increasing percentage of Mexican visitors to the United States were undocumented, rising to 75 percent last year from 48 percent in 1993.

"These data reveal the existing discrepancy between U.S. immigration laws and the reality of emigration that its neighboring country experiences," said Elena Zuniga, a delegate for the Council.

She said that about 10 million Mexican-bom people live in the United States.

New Mexico delivers response to Bush's immigration proposal

SANTA FE, N.M. (AP): Gov. Bill Richardson, in a nationally televised Spanish-language speech, said that President Bush's policies have failed to help Latinos and he urged minority voters to back Democrats.

In a Democratic National Committee-sponsored response to the president's State of the Union speech Tuesday night, Richardson said nearly 300,000 Latinos have lost jobs since Bush took office.

The governor's speech was broadcast by the Univision television network immediately following the president's ad-

Richardson said Bush used "very optimistic and positive words to describe" many of the nation's problems.

"But unfortunately, he has failed to give us solutions, and he has lost numerous opportunities to present a plan that attacks our most serious problems," Richardson said in an English language translation of the speech released by his office.

"He has not presented a plan to combat the nearly 50 percent Latino dropout rate. He has not given us the resources necessary to better our education system for our communities."

Richardson said 18 million Latinos were without health insurance, but Bush didn't offer a plan to improve access to health care.

The governor said Bush had "taken a small step forward" with an immigration proposal but the temporary worker program "does not help immigrant workers to obtain the golden dream: legalization and residency without impunity."

"Instead of being a way to a better life, the Bush plan represents a dead-end for immigrants, who after three years don't have a guarantee they'll be able to stay," said Richardson. "The only thing they have to look forward to is the threat of deportation."

Richardson's speech in Spanish comes as Democrats and Republicans are courting Latinos, now the nation's largest minority group.

In his remarks

Richardson pointed out that Latinos account for a large share of the electorate in many states, which will be important for the 2004 presidential contest.

"If we do not register and vote, the two parties will not continue to pay attention to us. This presidential election is more important than ever before," Richardson said.

The Republican Party, the governor said, "has collectively ruined much forus, especially with antiimmigration efforts such as Proposition 187 in California."

"The Democratic Party has always been with us, and we should not forget who really are our true friends and allies," said Richardson.

Richardson, who served as energy secretary and U.N. ambassador in the Clinton administration, is the nation's only Latino governor.

Latinos make up 42 percent of New Mexico's population, the highest proportion for any state, according to the Census Bureau.

Peru ex-spy chief goes on trial for arms trafficking to Colombia

LIMA, Peru (AP) _ Former spymaster Vladimiro Montesinos went on trial Tuesday on charges he directed a scheme to parachute-drop 10,000 assault rifles into the hands of Colombian guerrillas.

Montesinos, security adviser to former President Alberto Fujimori through the 1990s, more than 60 charges ranging from corruption to drug trafficking and authorizing murder. Prosecutors are seeking a 20-year sentence.

This is his fifth trial. Montesinos is already serving nine years on relatively minor corruption convictions. For the most part, he has refused to testify but prosecutors hope the prospect of a stiffer sentence will compel him to talk

During Fujimori's rule, Montesinos, 58, used his post as de facto head of Peru's National Intelligence Service to gain control of the military, the courts, most media outlets and a majority of government agencies.

Rarely seen in public, his influence permeated a nation already weakened by chronic corruption _ until Fujimori's decade-long regime collapsed in November 2000 amid a bribery scandal involving the spymaster. Montesinos fled to Venezuela, where he was captured in June 2001.

Returned to Lima, he was locked up in a high-security naval prison he helped design for Peru's most feared guerrilla leaders. It contains the cramped courtroom where the trial got under way Tuesday with Montesinos, seated among 19 co-defendants, looking relaxed in dark slacks and a short-sleeve shirt.

The trial opened with Montesinos' attorney, Estela Valdivia, asking for a postponement, arguing his prison conditions constituted a violation of his legal rights.

Valdivia complained she has not been able to consult freely with Montesinos since late December. She said her client has to sit in a narrow, mosquito-infested room behind a one-way glass partition and communicate via a telephone intercom.

The three-judge panel rejected the motion.

In a case that reads like a John le Carre spy thriller, men allegedly working for Montesinos posed as Peruvian military representatives to purchase Soviet-era assault rifles from Jordan that were delivered in 1999 to the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia, or FARC.

The arms scandal came to light in August 2000 when Fujimori and Montesinos announced that Peruvian authorities had busted a gunrunning ring led by brothers Jose Luis and Luis Frank Aybar, both Peruvian army veterans.

But their version quickly unraveled under skepticism from Colombian and Jordanian officials.

The Aybar brothers implicated Montesinos as their boss and Sarkis Soghanalian, the U.S.-based international arms dealer who brokered the transaction with Jordan, told Peruvian investigators

he personally negotiated the deal with Montesinos.

Soghanalian, a Turkishborn Lebanese citizen and 20-year U.S. resident, is listed as one of 36 co-defendants in the case. He han not been extradited to Peru and is being tried in absentia.

Soghanalian _ whose reputation supplying arms to clients like the Nicaraguan Contras and Iraq's Saddam Hussein earned him the nickname "The Merchant of Death" _ denies any wrongdoing. He maintains that he thought he was brokering a legitimate arms transaction between Jordan and Peru.

The weapons were reportedly bought in three lots and air-dropped during four flights over rebel-held territory in Colombia between March and August 1999 by a Ukraine-registered military surplus cargo jet. Prosecutors believe the Colombian guerrillas paid for the rifles with money raised by selling cocaine to a Brazilian drug trafficker.

The original plan had apparently been to sell another



40,000 rifles to the rebels but Jordan canceled the deal after the CIA told officials in Amman in mid-1999 that the rifles wider turning up in the hands of captured Colombian guerrillas.

After his fall from power, Fujimori took up residence in Tokyo where he remains protected from extradition to Peru by Japanese citizenship extended to him through his Japanese-born parents.

Special State Investigator Ronald Gamarra received permission Tuesday from the judges to seek testimony from additional witnesses, including CIA Director George Tenet. A U.S. Embassy official said he could not immediately comment.

City Council Delivers Safety Tips to Merchants

The Toledo City Council's Public Safety Committee held a special session for small business owners last Thursday afternoon to dispense advice and gather input regarding safety concerns.

Councilwoman Wilma Brown, chairman of the Public Safety Committee, organized the event in the wake of a recent wave of robberies that have targeted small businesses, particularly carryouts.

Police Chief Michael Navarre opened the meeting with a presentation designed to inform small business operators of how to ensure that their places of business are as safe as possible. Navarre highlighted points on a police department handout that included tips on how to prevent robberies, things to remember during a robbery, things to do after a robbery and surveillance equipment information. "Simple common sense recommendations" Navarre called the list.

Joe Walter, the City of Toledo safety director, told the audience of about 20 – just about an even split between media and small business owner/operators – that a community service police officers' program was to commence immediately that would entail on-site inspec-

tions of businesses to assess their safety needs. On site evaluations, said Walter, offer "the most bang for your buck."

Walter also spoke of Mayor Jack Ford's specific concerns about "mom and pop" operations that are in need of surveillance equipment but without the funds to make the investment. Brown noted that the city is setting aside funds to assist such operations in the amount of \$50,000 which would come primarily from non-tax sources and donations.

After city officials concluded their presentations, Brown opened the floor to those in the audience. The topics raised by business owners focused primarily on the response time of the police department to robberies and the permissible use of force when trying to defend a business during a crime of violence.

Ismail Shbat, general manager of World of Coffee on Airport Highway, asked the panel if there was a difference in response times to bank robberies and carry out robberies. Both Navarre and Walter denied that there was a difference.

Roderick Colbert, who owns Convenience 4-U Carryout at Detroit and Palmwood along with his wife Yvonne, tried to elicit from Navarre a precise definition of the guidelines for responding to violence.

"Every situation is different," said Navarre. "I'm not going to sit here and tell someone that if somebody makes mention of a gun, then you have the right to shoot them."

The best response in a robbery, said the chief, is to comply with the criminals immediately, but if bullets start flying, "take immediate cover ... pick up a baseball bat" or whatever else might be handy is that is the only choice.

James Foster, manager of Flav's Variety Store that was

robbed the previous weekend, had several comments about the police response to his store. The police arrived quickly, he said, within minutes. He added that he certainly was not upset with the police or any of their actions but, nevertheless, he was angry. He was angry during the robbery.

"I wasn't scared, I was angry; don't become lax," Foster advised other small business owners and manager. "I got too comfortable in my surroundings. I'm angry at the individuals who did this."

Navarre's list of tips inlude:

·Conduct background

checks on potential employ-

·Have at least two employees open and close the store.

·Keep front doors and windows clear of signs to allow good two-way visibility.

·Install an alarm system.

·Use cameras or mirrors to observe all areas of the store.

·Practice good cash control; make bank deposits frequently.

·Call police if you notice suspicious people hanging around in or outside of the store.



Gloria Ruiz, madre de Gloria Trevi afirma: "Nosotros sabemos que ya se llegó al fin, entonces si es hoy o mañana, si es en cuatro o cinco días, no importa".

EEUU: Más demandas contra los que copian música de internet distribuía ilícitamente ur

WASHINGTON (AP): La industria discográfica presentó el miércoles 532 demandas contra personas a las que acusa de distribuir ilegalmente temas musicales a través de la internet, en la primera serie de demandas de ese tipo desde que un tribunal impidió el uso de citaciones judiciales para identificar a los demandados.

La acción representa el mayor número de demandas jamás presentadas conjuntamente desde mediados del año pasado, cuando la Asociación de la Industria Discográfica de Estados Unidos lanzó su polémica campaña legal para acabar con la piratería musical a través de la internet.

Los abogados de las disqueras presentaron las nuevas demandas utilizando sólo los de números las direcciones cibernéticas de los usuarios, pero dijeron que esperan colaborar con los tribunales para conseguir sus nombres direcciones.

La AIDEU dijo que cada uno de los acusados

distribuía ilícitamente un promedio de más de 800 canciones a través de la internet. Cada acusado encara posibles multas o arreglos civiles que les podrían costar millares de dólares.

La campaña legal tiene como objetivo disuadir a la gente de continuar copiando material musical de la internet, después que el fallo del tribunal hizo más difícil hallar y demandar a los aficionados a la música que se dedican a esa práctica.

«Nuestra campaña contra los que comparten ilegalmente archivos musicales no ha perdido impulse», dijo Cary Sherman, presidenta de la AIDEU. «El mensaje a los que se dedican a esa actividad debe continuar siendo tan claro como siempre».

Las 532 demandas fueron presentadas en Washington y Nueva York, aunque la AIDEU dijo que los demandados viven posiblemente en cualquier lugar de Estados Unidos.

La Asociación dijo que después de que sus abogados descubran la identidad de cada acusado se pondrán en contacto con él para negociar un eventual acuerdo.

The final round will re-


sume Friday with Chile playing Brazil and Argentina facing Paraguay.

Paraguay and Argentina have three points from qualifying, while Brazil and Chile have zero.

Contreras tells newspaper his family barred from leaving Cuba

MANAGUA, Nicaragua (AP)_New York Yankees pitcher Jose Contreras says his family was barred from leaving Cuba, the newspaper La Prensa reported Monday.

Contreras told the newspaper that Cuban officials had twice refused permission for his wife Miriam Murillo to go to Nicaragua and that she would have to wait four years before applying again.

He told La Prensa that Nicaragua had given a visa to his wife and daughters Naylan, 11, and Naylenis, 3, but that it had expired.

Contreras was a star with the Cuban national baseball team before defecting and signing with the Yankees in December 2002.

He has legal residence in

Nicaragua, though he also has a house in Tampa, Florida. He spoke to the newspaper at a hotel in Managua.

"While they call me a traitor, I don't feel that I'm a traitor," Contreras told La Prensa. "Thave not committed any offense, any crime. I took the decision to leave the island. It was a personal decision, and my

daughters and my wife should not have to pay any price. They aren't guilty of anything, even if any guilt exists.

"For eight years, I gave my best for my country and now they treat me this way. I'm not a politician. I'm a sportsman, and if my country had treated me better, I would not be here, I'd be in Cuba."
