Breve*Aristide sale de Haití*


PUERTO PRÍNCIPE (AP): Jean Bertrand Aristide abandonó Haití el domingo, ante las presiones de los insurgentes en su país, dijo a la AP Leslie Volaire, su ministro del gabinete y uno de los más cercanos asesores del presidente.

Por lo menos otras tres fuentes confirmaron la información, incluidos diplomáticos y un asesor de seguridad que habría acompañado al presidente.

Voltaire dijo que Aristide, el primer presidente electo libremente en los 200 años de Haití como país independiente, volaba a República Dominicana, y buscaría asilo en Marruecos, Taiwán o Panamá.

Aristide deja el país en un momento en que los combatientes de una rebelión popular surgida hace tres semanas se encontraban a 40 kilómetros de Puerto Príncipe y amenazaban con atacar a menos de que renunciara.

Applications down under University of Michigan's new undergrad policy

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (AP): Seven months after the U.S. Supreme Court struck down the University of Michigan's undergraduate formula of awarding admission points based on race, the number of applications from blacks, Latinos, and American Indians is down 23 percent from the same time last year.

And the number of those admitted is down 30 percent.

Officials stressed the figures are only preliminary and thousands more applications will continue to be reviewed in a process the school hopes to finish by the first week of April. The application deadline was Feb. 1.

Overall, applications for this fall's incoming freshman class are down 18 percent, according to the preliminary data compiled Feb. 5 and released to The Associated Press Monday in response to a Freedom of Information Act request.

Despite the decrease in applications, the total number of students admitted so far—8,584—is down only 1 percent from the same time last year, and officials say the academic profile of those admitted is as good if not better than in previous years. The university plans to admit 12,000 to 13,000 students and hopes that will yield an enrollment of 5,545 for this fall.

"I'm proud that our staff were able to process ... a lot

of applications in a time frame very close to what it was last year," Ted Spencer, director of admissions, said Monday.

The high court in June upheld a general affirmative action policy at the University of Michigan law school but struck down the university's undergraduate formula as too rigid because it awarded admission points based on race.

Spencer said minority students and their families may not want to thrust themselves into the center of the debate over affirmative action.

"The residual kinds of impact of all this discussion and dialogue, particularly from the other side of this issue, that diversity is bad, it makes a lot of students think, 'Well, maybe I don't want to be put into that sort of environment,'" Spencer said.

The university said it has reviewed 44 percent of applications from minority students, while 69 percent of non-minority applications have been reviewed, indicating that minority students' applications also have been arriving later in the admissions cycle.

Ohio State University, which also revised a similar point-based admissions policy in the wake of the Supreme Court's ruling, said applications from American Indians are holding steady and Latino applications are up 6.2 percent from the same time last year, but applications from blacks are down 18.6 percent.

"The mere conversation in the minority community seems to be what lawyers

call a chilling effect," said Mabel Freeman, assistant vice president for undergraduate admissions. "It seems to be the idea of wait and see for a year if (Ohio State) is really going to continue taking minority students."

"Our roll is to show yes, we are."

University of Michigan adopted a new application that still considers race, but does not award points, and includes new short-answer questions and an optional essay. Ohio State also added four short answers to its application. The changes meant applications were made available to students about a month later than usual, which stalled the start of the admissions process.

Michigan associate admissions director Chris Lucier said essay answers are "providing the breadth and the richness of information that we really were hoping to get from students."

The additional questions also mean additional work for high school seniors. Spencer, Lucier and Ohio State's Freeman all noted that's a factor likely contributing to the lower application numbers.

"We started the year with an anticipation that when you simply make that kind of change in applications alone, you can anticipate close to a 10 percent decrease (in applications)," Freeman said. "You lose students who have borderline interest."

Latinos' graduation rates low, report says

BOSTON (AP), Feb. 26: Low graduation rates among Latino, as well as black, high school students in the U.S.'s "hidden crisis" because states often ignore dropout statistics to help boost graduation figures, according to a new report.

Ohio has the second worst rate in the nation for black students, according to information compiled by the Civil Rights Project at Harvard University and the Urban Institute. The study used 2000-2001 school year data.

Only 40 percent of black students who enter ninth grade in Ohio earn diplomas, compared with 76 percent of white students, according to the report. Forty-three percent of Ohio's Latino students graduate, according to the report, below the 53 percent national average.

Ohio Department of Education figures show higher rates for both groups, but the state still needs to improve, said Joseph F. Johnson, an aide to state Superintendent Susan T. Zelman. Johnson said state figures show 61 percent of black and 66 percent of Latino students graduate.

He said the national report doesn't take into account students who moved out of the state.

New York has the worst statewide graduation rates for black and Latino students, according to the report. The report said 35 percent of black students and 32 percent of Latinos graduated on time in New York state.

Other states in the top 10 for worst graduation rates for black and Latino students, according

to the report, are: Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Iowa, Massachusetts, Nebraska, Illinois, and Connecticut.

"The dropout data in use today misleads the public into thinking that most students are earning diplomas," said Christopher Swanson, research associate for the Urban Institute.

Commonly used dropout data undercounts the number of students that leave school, he said.

Nationally, 75 percent of white students graduated in 2001, compared with 53 percent of Latino students, 50 percent of black students, and 51 percent of Native American students, according to the study, which used the most recent statistics available from the U.S. Department of Education.

"High school dropouts are far more likely to be unemployed, in prison and living in poverty," said Jill Chafetz, executive director of Advocates for Children of New York, which helped prepare the report.

Mexican Consulate offices warning immigrants of Bush-proposal-scams

BROWNSVILLE, Texas (AP): Authorities are warning immigrants to beware of scams promising work permits since President George W. Bush announced a proposal to match undocumented immigrants with unfilled jobs.

The Texas Attorney General's Office and Mexican Consulate say fraudulent ads that offer help with immigration paperwork or promise to deliver a work permit have appeared statewide since Bush's proposal in January—but Bush's immigration reform is not likely to become policy for months or even years.

The president's guestworker plan matches foreign workers with U.S. employers that have difficulty filling jobs U.S. citizens don't want. The program is aimed at immigrants who are undocumented and working in the country illegally.

Authorities are worried that immigrants who are confused about the plan could become easy targets for scams that would require immigrants to pay thousands of dollars for services that can't deliver at this time.

"As immigration policy is

given increased national attention, consumers should be aware of those who use this heightened public interest as a means to deceive," Attorney General Greg Abbott said in Sunday's editions of The Brownsville Herald.

Abbott reminded Texans that the legislation proposed by Bush does not exist yet. However, many immigrants are flooding consulate offices and immigration rights organizations with calls asking about how they can be enrolled in the program.

"We're telling them that there's nothing they or anybody can do about this yet," said Arturo Salgado, deputy consul in McAllen. "And they shouldn't listen to anyone saying otherwise."

Since Bush's January 7th speech, many immigrants believe the United States is offering amnesty, said Nathan Selzer, of Proyecto Libertad, an immigrant rights organization in Harlingen.

"We understand that people are so eager to get permanent legal status," he said, "but it's very important for people to understand that this is just a proposal."

Two notary publics shut down under immigrant scam law

HARLINGEN, Texas (AP): State officials sued and shut down the offices of two notary publics on allegations the notaries were swindling hopeful migrants and charging money to process immigration forms, violating a new state law.

Martha Uresti, owner of Uresti Immigration/Notary Services in Brownsville, was in the Cameron County jail on Monday on a criminal charge filed by the Cameron County district attorney's office. An arrest warrant on the same charge was issued for Ruth Thomas, owner of Weslaco-based Trámites Migratorios.

Both face up to six months in jail if convicted.

Texas Attorney General Greg Abbott filed civil lawsuits against both businesses alleging they deceived customers by acting as if they could legally assist migrants

fue colonia, y Estados Unidos, que envió a 20.000 efectivos para restaurar el gobierno de Aristide tras un golpe en 1994, habían exhortado al presidente para que renunciara por el bien de esta nación caribeña de 8 millones de habitantes.

Un avión blanco sin matrícula despegó del aeropuerto capitalino la madrugada del domingo, y Voltaire dijo que Aristide iba a bordo, junto con el jefe de seguridad del palacio presidencial, Frantz Gabriel.

Poco después, una caravana de automóviles llegó a la pista del aeropuerto, donde se encontraba un segundo avión. No fue posible para los periodistas determinar quién viajaba en esa aeronave.

La policía militar canadiense estaba en el aeropuerto, pero se negó a informar quién viajaba en los aviones.

Primer ministro y presidente de Corte Suprema suceden a Aristide

(AP): Con la partida del presidente Jean Baptiste Aristide el domingo, el gobierno de Haití ha quedado acéfalo, en medio de un vacío político.

La renuncia oficial de Aristide allana el camino para

que el presidente de la Corte Suprema, Boniface Alexandre, asuma el poder, según establece la constitución. Pero su asunción requiere la aprobación del parlamento, que no está en funciones desde principios de este año, después que caducaron los cargos de muchos de los legisladores.

Otro importante funcionario en línea para asumir la presidencia es el primer ministro Yvon Neptune, un alto miembro del partido de Aristide y ex vocero presidencial.

Otras importantes personalidades en los recientes eventos políticos:

Andy Apaid: El líder de oposición que sacrificó más abiertamente a Aristide, aunque no está aliado con las fuerzas rebeldes.

Evans Paul: Importante miembro de la oposición, ex alcalde de Puerto Príncipe, escritor y periodista.

Guy Philippe: Líder de los rebeldes armados que controlan la mitad del norte haitiano. Se unió a la rebelión al cruzar la frontera desde la vecina República Dominicana, a donde huyó en el 2000 en medio de acusaciones de que conspiraba para dar un golpe de estado.

Butteur Metayer: Líder de pandillas callejeras que comenzaron el levantamiento en Haití el 5 de febrero al expulsar a la policía de Gonaives, ciudad del norte de Haití.

Louis Jodel Chamblain: Líder rebelde, ex sargento del ejército y líder de los escuadrones de la muerte

acusados de torturar, asesinar y de mutilar a centenares de haitianos. Huyó a la República Dominicana cuando las fuerzas estadounidenses intervinieron en 1994. Regresó a Haití hace dos semanas para unirse a la rebelión.

Contingente multinacional irá a Haití, dice embajador de EEUU

PUERTO PR D INCIBE (AP): Un contingente de soldados de varias naciones, entre ellos de Estados Unidos, será emplazado la brevedad en Haití, dijo el domingo el embajador estadounidense James Foley, horas después que el presidente Jean-Bertrand Aristide abandonó el país.

Aristide «adoptó una decisión por el bien del pueblo haitiano», dijo Foley. Afadió que «nosotros no pedimos su renuncia».

El diplomático habló en el curso de una conferencia de prensa donde el presidente de la Corte Suprema de Justicia, Boniface Alexandre, anunció que era el sucesor de Aristide.

«Fuerzas militares internacionales, incluidas de Estados Unidos, llegarán con rapidez a Haití para establecer la seguridad», dijo Foley.

Puerto Príncipe estaba sumida en el caos el domingo, luego que Aristide salió del país, al parecer para pedir asilo político en Sudáfrica. Furiosos simpatizantes de Aristide merodearon por las calles armados con viejos fusiles, pistolas, machetes y bastones. Se escucharon disparos.

La mitad del país está en manos de rebeldes, entre ellos ex oficiales del ejército que desmanteló a Aristide.





Morales vence a Chávez y gana título superpluma del CMB Por TIM DAHLBERG

LAS VEGAS (AP): El mexicano Eric Morales derribó dos veces a su compatriota Jesús Chávez en el segundo asalto y aprovechó después una lesión del campeón, para despojarlo del título superpluma por el Consejo Mundial de Boxeo (CMB), la noche del sábado.

Chávez sufrió una lesión en el hombro derecho, que limitó su desempeño a partir del segundo episodio, para que Morales se convirtiera apenas en el segundo mexicano que gana títulos en tres categorías distintas. El otro mexicano que había logrado la hazaña fue Julio César Chávez, quien vio la pelea desde la primera fila.

El combate comenzó en forma espectacular. Con un derechazo, el campeón causó

dano al retador de Tijuana, cuyas rodillas se doblaron a consecuencia del impacto, en el primer episodio. Sin embargo, Morales siguió en pie y se recuperó asombrosamente en el asalto siguiente, derribando dos veces a Chávez, para tomar el control de la pelea.

Chávez, sometido a una intervención quirúrgica en el hombro derecho, hace unos meses, se lastimó de nuevo en el segundo capítulo. A partir de ese momento se limitó a unos cuantos derechazos, si bien persiguió a Morales en forma audaz, lanzando un zurdazo tras otro, pero recibiendo mucho castigo a cambio.

«No sabía que él estaba lesionado», dijo «El Terrible» Morales. «La esquina no me lo dijo. El tenía muy buen ritmo».

Morales, quien había ganado antes los títulos supergallo y pluma, se llevó el triunfo por 118-108, de acuerdo con un juez, 117-

109 según el otro y 115-112 en opinión del tercero. Según la anotación de la AP, el tijuanense ganó por 118-107.

«La gente vio lo que pude lograr con una sola mano», dijo Chávez. «Con dos, lo hubiera noqueado».

Morales peleó apenas por segunda ocasión como superpluma, pero era favorito en las apuestas sobre Chávez, por 3-1.

Chávez (40-3 con 28 nocauts) defendía por primera vez el título conseguido en agosto, cuando derrotó a Sirimongkol Singmannassuk. Había pronosticado que Morales no podría soportar su potencia de golpeo, y cuando lo sorprendió con un derechazo, al amitad del primer episodio, parecía hacer bueno el pronóstico.

Morales estaba aturdido, pero logró reponerse en el asalto.

Al comienzo del segundo, Morales lanzó un derechazo al maxilar de Chávez, quien se fue a la lona y se levantó a la cuenta de siete. Acto seguido, el retador arremetió con otra serie de golpes que provocó la segunda caída.

Chávez se levantó, pero al final del capítulo se lastimó el hombro, cuando trataba de conectar un golpe.

Morales (46-1 con 34 nocauts) mejoró a una foja de 17-1 en combates por el título, y dijo que planea mantenerse en la división.

En un combate preliminar, Julio César Chávez hijo, el descendiente del legendario campeón mexicano, mejoró a 5-0 su foja, al vencer en cuatro asaltos, por decisión, al irlandés Oisin Fagan.

Bajo la mirada de su padre, el joven de 18 años dominó el combate, asestó buenos golpes y ganó todos los episodios de su pelea, en la división de los ligeros.



Toledoan Devin Vargas goes to the Olympics

Last week, in front of more than 4,000 screaming fans at Cleveland State University, pugilist Devin Vargas became the first Toledoan since 1972 to become a U.S. Olympic boxing champ [Heavyweight division, winning 29-22]. However, Vargas must still win one more time against an adversary from another American country to win a berth to the Olympics in Greece.

This qualifier comes March 12-20 in Tijuana, México, where several heavyweights shall be competing for one of the 16 Olympic slots. Vargas heads for the Olympic training center in Colorado Springs this week to prepare for this fight.

México has already disqualified for the Olympics the U.S. soccer and baseball teams.

But in typical Vida fashion, the song is turned inside out with jazzy drumming and Sauceda's accordion riffs.



Suit alleges Wal-Mart locked janitors into stores

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) Feb. 3: A civil rights suit filed against Wal-Mart Stores Inc. by illegal immigrants was expanded Monday to accuse the U.S.'s biggest retailer of locking its janitors inside stores during their shifts.

The lawsuit is being brought under the federal Racketeer Influenced Corrupt Organizations Act, charging that Wal-Mart systematically violated workers' rights and tried to shield itself from liability by using independent contractors to employ the immigrants.

A lawyer for Wal-Mart denied the new allegation.

INS agents raided Wal-Mart stores across the country on Oct. 23, 2003 in a sweep that resulted in the arrest of hundreds of janitors on immigration charges.

The suit claims some

workers were forced to work seven-day, 70-hour weeks for \$1,500 a month. The amended claim follows a report in The New York Times that contained the separate allegation that janitors were being locked in.

The amendment to the lawsuit comes as a federal grand jury in Pennsylvania weighs evidence to determine whether Wal-Mart will face criminal charges in the use of illegal immigrants to clean its stores.

According to the agreement approved by the port, competitive rates will be offered to U.S. companies that do business with Alimport and use the Port of Lake Charles.

The port also will try to identify additional exporters and shippers in Louisiana and elsewhere to do business with Cuba.

Murray said concern for workers' rights was the reason the chain eliminated the use of cleaning contractors in 80 percent of its stores. Wal-Mart has 3,500 stores nationwide with 1.2 million employees.

Murray acknowledged that doors were kept locked, but insisted that a manager with a key was always present.

"This was simply an effort to keep the employees safe and keep the merchandise secure," Murray said.

in getting U.S. residency, work
permits and other benefits.

"These two businesses uncon-
scionably abused consumers
who are immigrants," Abbott
said. "Perhaps with civil and
criminal charges against them,
these and other scam artists
around Texas can take a moment
to reflect on just how serious we
are about fighting these abuses."

The businesses are the first
charged under the 2001 law,
which was passed to prevent
scam artists from exploiting the
similarity of the term "notary
public" to the Spanish "notario
publico," a title given to experi-
enced lawyers.

In Texas, a notary license
means only that one can officially
witness the signing of documents.

Abbott was joined by Cameron
County District Attorney Yolanda
DeLeón, Hidalgo County Dis-
trict Attorney Rene Guerra and
the Special Crimes Unit of the
Texas Department of Public
Safety in the investigation.

The businesses charged con-
sumers more than \$1,000 to pro-
cess documents that were filed im-
properly, if at all, authorities said.

President Bush's recent pro-
posal to allow undocumented
immigrants to stay three years
with an employer's backing
made immigrants particularly
vulnerable, Abbott said.
