España espera que Irak sea lección para evitar otras

MADRID (AP): El presidente de gobierno José Luis Rodríguez Zapatero expresó el domingo esperanzas de que la deteriorada situación en Irak sirva como advertencia para impedir otras guerras preventivas en el futuro.

Ante unos 20.000 partidarios reunidos para celebrarel 125 aniversario del Partido Socialista, Rodríguez Zapatero dijo que la misión de Irak «está demostrando cada día que ha sido un fracaso y que debe servir como lección al conjunto de la comunidad internacional: nunca más guerras preventivas, ni vulneración de la legalidad internacional».

Reiteró que ordenó el retiro de los soldados españoles emplazados en Irak el 18 de abril, el día después que asumió en su puesto, porque «nunca deberían haber ido».

Búsqueda de jefe paramilitar en Colombia Por JAVIER BAENA

BOGOTA (AP): La desaparición de Carlos Castaño, jefe histórico de los grupos paramilitares, continua siendo un misterio mientras las autoridades iudiciales v militares intensifican su búsqueda.

Castaño desapareció el pasado 16 de abril, en medio de versiones contradictorias que indican que está muerto o se halla escondido con el propósito

de escapar a los Estados Unidos. Una comisión de la Fiscalía militares adelanta la búsqueda de una fosa común en la que se de una losa contini en la que se hallarían siete cadáveres para determinar si entre ellos se encuentra el de Castaño, según fuentes de la Brigada 17 del Ejército.

La búsqueda se adelanta en la zona rural del municipio de San Pedro de Urabá, al noroccidente del país, en donde desapareció Castaño después de un enfrentamiento entre su escolta y un grupo paramilitar que aparentemente intentaba asesinarlo.

Sin embargo, un importante jefe paramilitar, Adolfo Paz, aseguró que no es cierto que las Autodefensas Unidas de Colombia (AUC) hubieran ordenado asesinar al jefe político que escapara y suministrara información a las autoridades estadounidenses sobre los negocios del narcotráfico en que involucrados jefes paramilitares.


«Creo que Carlos debe estar bien», afirmó Paz, en una entrevista que publica el dominical El Espectador, en la cual reiteró la versión oficial de las AUC, de que no hubo ataque contra Castaño sino un enfrentamiento por error entre tropas amigas.

Aseguró que ni él ni Vicente Castaño, hermano del jefe paramilitar, ordenaron su asesinato como represalia por supuestos intentos de Carlos Castaño de negociar su entrega a la justicia de los Estados Unidos que lo solicitó en extradición y su discurso en contra de la contaminación del paramilitarismo con el negocio de las drogas.

«Las sindicaciones contra mí o el comandante Vicente Castaño son perversas», aseguró el jefe paramilitar que en 1990 hizo parte de un escuadrón de jefes de la mafia que cooperaron con las autoridades para localizar a Pablo Escobar, el todopoderoso jefe del Cartel de Medellín, quien murió enfrentando un escuadrón policial, tras una larga guerra contra el Estado que dejó alrededor de 5.000 muertos.

En contraste con lo que afirman Salvatore Mancuso, jefe militar de las AUC, y Paz, que participan en la mesa de negociaciones de paz con el gobierno, otras fuentes de los paramilitares han dado diversas versiones que indican que Castaño fue asesinado después de que logró escapar transitoriamente del ataque del 16 de abril.

Tanto el Gobierno como la Fiscalía han dicho que Castaño está desaparecido, pues no hay ninguna evidencia de que esté muerto y por lo tanto los esfuerzos de las autoridades se concentran en esclarecer los hechos, buscando pistas en la zona del municipio de San Pedro de Urabá, en donde se afirma que el jefe paramilitar fue asesinado por sus camaradas de armas.

GOP convention debuts Spanishlanguage web site

NEW YORK (AP): Republican National Convention officials announced a Spanish-language web site at a meeting of Latino business leaders Thursday.

"The web site exemplifies the Republican Party's continued commitment to diversity," said Bill Harris, chief executive officer of the GOP convention, taking place at Madison Square Garden starting Aug. 30. "Diversity is one of our country's strengths, it is one of New York City's strengths, and this August and September, diversity willserve as one of the defining characteristics of this convention."

The site can be accessed by clicking on the "En Español" tab on the convention's home page. Harris, who spoke at a

Harris, who spoke at a breakfast meeting of the state Federation of Hispanic Chambers of Commerce in midtown Manhattan, said he had no comment about the city's decision this week to deny a permit to a group planning a large anti-war demonstration in Central Park at the start of the convention.

"We are Republicans so we believe in the Constitutional right of people to say whatever they want to say," he said. "I have every confidence in the security plans of the city of New York."

GOP groups reach out to state Latinos

ASHEVILLE, N.C. (AP): Republican groups are reaching out to the western part of the state's burgeoning Latino population, claiming they share similar goals and religious viewpoints.

Macon County Republicans, who outnumber registered Democrats in the county by about 600, seek to shore up their numbers by pledging to develop a Latino outreach program. The Republicans therehave formed a focus group and say they will soon discuss common issues with Latino leaders in the community.

Buncombe County Republicans may follow suit. Pitt County GOP voters are already ahead of the game—their county party chairman, Javier Castillo, personifies what he calls the natural merger of the two groups.

"We share family values, and we don't like taxation," he said. "Democrats have taken Latinos for granted in the past."

On the national level, the Republican National Committee developed an outreach group in 2000, called the New Majority Council.

Majority Council.
"We're reaching out to
people because they're good,
decent, God-fearing people
and that's the definition of
being a Republican," said
Ferrell Blount, chairman of the
state's Republican Party.

The state board of elections doesn't keep tabs on how many

Latinos have registered as Democrats, Republicans, or independent voters. But Castillo, scouring voter registration lists for common Hispanic sumames, estimates that 35 percent of Latino voters are Democrats, 32 percent are unaffiliated, and 33 percent are Republicans.

"In fact, the majority of registered Latino voters in the state are not Democrats," Castillo said.

Ricardo Velásquez, chairman of the Hispanic Democrats of North Carolina, counters the claim, saying there aretwice as many Latino Democrats in the state as Republicans.

"Hispanics vote Democratic because the Demo-cratic party shares their issues," Velásquez said.

He said Mexican-Americans, who make up the over-whelming majority of Latinos in North Carolina, tend to lean Democrat, seeing the party as the champion for worker and civil rights. Cubans—more populous in states such as Florida and New York—tend to vote Republican because of the traditional GOP stance against Fidel Castro's Cuban government, he said.

Those stereotypes are slowly eroding, said Andrew Taylor, a political science professor at North Carolina State University.

"You'll have Republicans

reachout to them stylistically," he said, such as in references to religion and by sprinkling Spanish into stump speeches.

However, Taylor said, issues such as immigration reform and affirmative action continue to wedge rifts between Latinos and Republicans.

Some Democrats, interest groups unhappy with minority representation on Kerry campaign By GENARO C. ARMAS Associated Press Writer

WASHINGTON (AP): A lack of minority representation at the upper levels of John Kerry's presidential campaign threatens to weaken enthusiasm among black and Latino voters, two core constituencies, some Democrats and advocacy greens say

vocacy groups say.

Kerry's inner circle—the dozen or so advisers who participate inthe campaign's most important decisions—is mostly white.

Senior political adviser
Paul Rivera said a core group
of seven high-ranking staffers
participate in a daily, morning
conference call to talk strategy and make key decisions.
The group includes campaign
manager Mary Beth Cabilit,
deputy campaign managers
Steve Elmendorf and Marcus
Jardotte; communications director Stephanie Cutter; general election strategist Jill
Alper; and senior advisers Art

Collins and Rivera. Jardotte and Collins are black; Rivera is Latino.

Campaign officials say media consultants, pollsters and other top aides are often on the call, including chief speechwriter Bob Shrum, and Tad Devine, an architect of Kerry's general election planning.

tion planning.

Shrum and Devine are white, as is John Marttila, a longtime Kerry ally from Massachusetts who spent a lot of time at campaign headquarters during the Iowa and New Hampshire races and is considered part of the brain trust.

Campaign officials dispute the criticism, saying too much of the focus has been on the influence of Shrum, Devine, and other consultants.

"Throughout the primary process, we've had a very diverse campaign. Now we are building a general election system that is diverse," he said.

The campaign noted that Kerry has enjoyed strong support from minorities during the primaries. Exit polling conducted for The Associated Press in 18 states that have held Democratic primaries this year found Kerry easily winning support among whites, blacks, Latinos, and Asians.

Cahill invited anyone concerned with diversity to visit campaign headquarters in Washington. "In every office in the campaign, we are looking to have people with different backgrounds and experiences and different approaches to the campaign," she said.

Blacks and Latinos typically vote overwhelmingly Democratic, though Republicans are making efforts to capture a larger share of support

Among Latinos, 61 percent voted for Clinton in 1992, followed by 72 percent in 1996. Gore captured about 62 percent of the Latino vote in 2000.

Acampaign staff's makeup suggests what the White House staff could look like if the candidate wins, said Lisa Navarette, a vice president of the National Council of La Raza, a nonpartisan Latino advocacy group.

The average voter may not focus on this, she said, "but for people concerned about the strength of the commitment to diversity, you would have to be concerned."

Census Bureau estimates show that in 2002, 81 percent of Massachusetts residents were white, 7 percent were Latino and 5 percent were black. Nationally, the population is about 68 percent white, 14 percent Latino and 12 percent black.

"The Kerry campaign certainly at the top definitely needs.. Hispanics, it needs to be more diverse," said David Bositis, a political scientist at the Joint Center for Political and Economic Studies, athink tank focused on black issues. "But he's got plenty of time to address this."

Students displayed their various talents from singing to playing the accordion during a sensational talent show. The winners of the talent show-Las Chicas Norteñas-danced the cumbia and played the


"I didn't think people my age had so much talent," said Blanca Pecina, an 8th grader at Jones Jr. High.



Dozens of Mexican candies sold in California have high lead level

SANTA ANA, Calif. (AP): More than 100 brands of candy sold in California, most of them from México, have tested positive for dangerous levels of lead in the past decade and little has been done aboutit, anewspaperreported.

In nearly every case, the candy—mostly marketed to Latino kids—stayed on store shelves and no action was taken against the Mexican manufacturers, the Orange County Register reported in Sunday's editions, citing state and federal records.

The public was rarely informed of test results, the newspaper found.

"Children are eating poison," said Leticia Ayala, of San Diego-based Environmental Health Coalition, a nonprofit group that urged the state to better regulate Mexican candies.

State officials said they lack the resources to tackle the problem and have little jurisdiction over Mexican candy manufacturers.

"We have a lot more responsibilities than looking for lead in candy," said Jim Waddell, chief of the state Health Department's Food and Drug Branch.

Lead poisoning can cause

brain and nerve damage and result in intelligence and behavioral problems, particularly in children. Concerns about lead poisoning led to a ban on lead-based house paint in the 1970s and on lead compounds in gasoline in the 1980s.

The state Department of Health Services has conducted more than 1,500 tests on Mexican candy since 1993 and found high levels of lead in one of every four samples, the newspaper reported.

As many as 15 percent of California children who suffer lead poisoning—about 3,000 over the past three years—have eaten Mexican candy, according to state statistics. About three-quarters of them are Latino.

The government did little to release the information to the public, the paper said.

For example, it knew of high lead levels for years in Chaca Chaca, a popular Mexican treat made from apple pulp and chill powder, but no public warnings were issued until last month.

The Register conducted its own tests on 180 samples purchased over the counter in Southern California, an 32 percent of the tests showed high levels of lead.

The newspaper sent report-



ers to México, and reported thatrawingredientswere carelessly tainted with lead before being shipped to factories, where unsafe manufacturing procedures were commonplace.

Mexican manufacturers said they had no knowledge their candies contained dangerous levels of lead until contacted by the newspaper.

The manager of one candy store in San Luis Rio Colorado, México, told the Yuma Sun that he threw the sweets away after Mexican health officials told him a few weeks ago that the confections posed a health hazard.

In Arizona, officials from the Yuma County Health Department sent out employees several weeks ago to warn more than 80 retailers about the sweets.

The coated candies and lollipops are sold in the area, mostly in small markets in the border cities of San Luis and Somerton.

Health officials also say they are concerned about residents who cross the border and might buy the candies.

Report finds health challenges for immigrant children

NEW YORK (AP): Foreign-born children are more likely than native-born youngsters to suffer from a variety of ills including pesticide poisoning, obesity and post-traumatic stress, according to a new report.

The report, prepared by the Center for New York City Affairs at New School University's Milano Graduate School, found that lead poisoning disproportionately affects certain immigrant communities including Haitians and South Asians.

Haitians make up fewer than 3 percent of foreign-born children in New York City, but they account for almost 27 percent of all foreign-born children with lead poisoning, according to the report.

Children born in India, Pakistan and Bangladesh make up fewer than 9 percent of the city's foreign-born children, but they account for 23 percent of the foreign-born children with lead poisoning.

"It was the most stark finding in that it showed that specific immigrant populations are more likely to be impacted by lead poisoning than other immigrant populations," said Mia Lipsit, a program associated at the center and one of the authors of the study.

Possible reasons why lead poisoning rates are so high in these communities include exposure in the children's

Among the report's other findings:

Twenty-eight percent of non-citizen children in New York City lack health insurance, while only 6 percent of native-born children in native citizen families across New York State are without coverage.

Latino children have by far the highest rate of pediatric obesity in the city. Almost one-third of Latino children between the ages of 6 and 11 are obese, compared with 16 percent of white children and 23

percent of black children.

_Rat and roach infestations in the homes where many immigrant children live contribute to high rates of athsma and to exposure to toxic pesticides.

_Many immigrant children are at risk for psychological and behavioral problems resulting from prior exposure to violence.

The report, which was presented at a forum at the New School on Wednesday, relied on data from the 2000 Census, scholarly articles and other sources.

Filing fees immigration-related paperwork to increase

WASHINGTON (AP): Immigrants starting Friday will pay \$50 to \$65 more to become Americans, to live as a legal resident in the country or to apply for a number of other

immigration benefits.

The Bush administration has said it raised the fees, first announced in January, to cover the costs of increased security checks on applicants and rising administration expenses. But one Hispanic group says the increases will hit Latino immigrants hardest and make becoming a citizen more difficult for millions of Latino legal permanent residents who are eligible to be Americans.

As of Friday, a legal resident will pay \$320, up from \$260. For immigrants who want to become legal perma-nent residents, the cost will be \$315,up from \$255. Also, most applicants will have to pay a \$70 fingerprinting fee, an increase of \$20.

"Congress requires us to do a fee study to determine if we are covering the cost of doing business. When we did we found we are losing \$1 million a day," said Chris Bentley, Citizenship and Immigration

Services spokesman.
Critics of the fee increase say the agency should first fix problems in the agency that have led it to have more than 6 million pending applications, because those problems could

be contributing to the higher expenses for the agency. The increases, without improved service, will keep people from pursuing citizenship, said Larry González, Washington director for the National Association of Latino Elected and Appointed Officials Educational Fund.

An analysis conducted for NALEO estimates that about 4.2 million Latinos are eligible for U.S. citizenship. The analysis was developed by Jeffrey Passel, a researcher at the liberal-leaning Urban Institute, based on U.S. Census data. "How ironic that we have

all these folks eligible for citizenship and yet we have a service agency that continues to create barriers to citizenship," said González. His organization works to bring more Latinos into elected office and the political process, in part by promoting U.S. citizenship.

Gonzalez said citizenship is an issue that crosses partisan lines and promoting it should be a legislative priority. He said the Office of Citizenship formed by the Bush administration is underfunded.

"Everyone wants to talk about immigration reform and illegal immigrants," González said. "Not that those are not important, but at the same time we have the issue here of people playing by the rules and doing it right and we have a system that is broken.

Immigration initiative fails to qualify for ballot

LOS ANGELES (AP), April 27: An initiative that would bar undocumented immigrants from obtaining driver's licenses and most public services failed to qualify for the ballot.

The "Save Our State Initiative" fell about 115,000 short of the 598,105 needed to qualify for the November ballot, organizers said Monday.

The initiative never got the support and funding it needed from the Republican leaders. Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger never took a position on it.

Republicans were hurt at

the polls for their support of a similar initiative in 1994. Proposition 187 was approved by 60 percent of voters but it was challenged in court and never took effect. The measure alienated many Latino voters from the Republican Party.







Latino stuck in jail as officials decide who pays for an interpreter

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP): A Latino, who can't speak English, has sat in a jail cell for five months as court officials try to decide who will pay for an interpreter.

Luis Velásquez has been in jail since November, facing assault and DUI charges after being accused of causing a car accident in which two people were seriously hurt. Prosecutors offered the 20-year-old Latino man a plea bargain seven weeks ago, but he cannot take or reject it, because he can't read it.

Velásquez also hasn't been able get his bond lowered or help his attorneys with a defense.

He's stuck because a Jefferson circuit judge and the public defender's office disagree over who is responsible for paying for a Spanish-speaking interpreter.

"This is a ludicrous situation," said Leo G. Smith, an assistant to Chief Public Defender Dan Goyette. "There's a poor person sitting in jail without the help of an attorney because the judge won't authorize an interpreter. ... The case is at a standstill with him sitting in jail."

The Administrative Office of the Courts, which manages Kentucky's judicial system, pays for interpreters inside the court-room. At issue in the Velásquez case is who pays for time spent outside the court discussing the case.

Jefferson Circuit Judge F. Kenneth Conliffe argues that the public defender should cover the cost, while Smith and others from around the state say that a special fund controlled by the Kentucky Finance and Administration Cabinet in Frankfort can be used to pay for translators for indigent defendants

The state Court of Appeals apparently will have to decide the issue.

In an unusual move, the public defender's office and the commonwealth's attorney have joined forces to ask the court to order Conliffe to authorize the translator's payment from the fund.

Conliffe said he will abide by whatever the appeals court decides.

Velásquez arrested in November and indicted the next month on charges that he drove drunk into another vehicle on Nov. 14. He is being held on a \$50,000 cash bond.

Latino artist Camilo Pardo lives out his dream as chief designer of Ford's GT40 concept car

Growing up in the Detroit suburbs in the era of the muscle cars, Latino artist Camilo Pardo never dreamed that one day he'd be the designer that brought the 1960s-era GT40 racing legend back to life.

An accomplished artist, sculptor, clothing and furniture designer, Pardo's work has been featured in galleries and shows from Monaco and Italy to the Paris Motor Show.

"Icome from a family with a long tradition in art and architecture, said Pardo, whose family includes architects in Colombia and México. His mother, Roseanna Pardo emigrated from Bogota to New York where Camilo was born in 1963. "I am the first one of my family to be born in the United States," he says.

Pardo's mother eventually moved to Detroit and he graduated from Rochester High School in the northern suburbs. He enrolled in the prestigious Center for Creative Studies in 1981 and graduated in 1985 as the recipient of that year's Industrial Design Society of

America Merit Award.

Ford spotted his talent while he was at CCS and hired him immediately upon his graduation. Pardo begins his 19th year at Ford this month. He worked in Ford's Advance Design studio on vehicles ranging from the Ford Thunderbird to the Lincoln LS and the Ford electric vehicles. He also worked in Ford's design studios in Cologne, Germany and Turin, Italy before returning to Dearborn as design manager for Special Vehicle Team

Pardo is now chief designer in the Living Legends studio where every day when he arrives at work, he turns his VCR on to the John Frankenheimer classic "Grand Prix" and watches the opening scenes and listens to the sounds of the race for inspiration. That's no surprise for a man whose passion for automobiles has met its match in his passion for art

"Being an artist really complements my cardesigns. I can't imagine having one without the other. Both require me to deal with propor-



tions, emotions and creativity, which all lead to perfect execution," Pardo explains.

Pardo is keenly aware that he is a unique role model to Latino youth. He recounts how at a recent visit to a San Antonio high school "the kids brought in copies of Auto Week (picturing the GT40) for me to sign, and they even had me sign their tee shirts." A former teacher at CCS, he always tries to make students more aware of art and advises young Latinos to go into design and art as a career path. But Pardo isn't only reaching out to high school students; his recent and upcoming appearances at schools include South Texas University and the University of Architecture in Monterey, México.

Pardo's personal collection of classic cars includes a Ferrari 308 GT and a topless 1964 Thunderbird, a project car with no convertible top and doors that are welded shut to eliminate all gaps in the sheet metal. To get in, Pardo just hops over the side or climbs out by stepping on the seat.

"If it starts raining, you just hope you don't catch any red lights on the way back to the garage. If you're going fast enough, the airflow blows the rainright over the car and off the deck. They knew a little about aero back in the '60s too," he says.

He says he is still excited that his work has allowed him to meet many of the legendary automobile racers he admired as a youth including Parnelli Jones.

Two of Pardo's GT40 paintings hang in the executive offices of Ford World Headquarters in Dearborn and his painting of a 1961 Lincoln Continental can be found on the walls of Ford's

Premier Automotive Group's London headquarters.

"I still do commissions," says Pardo, "but I am so booked up that I only accept them if they are priority. I do have prints available of my work that are on canvas and full size," he adds.

Pardo said he had drawn and re-drawn the GT40 concept design in his mind for more than a decade. Even when he was given permission to do an exploratory clay model of a modern GT40 in 1999, he never really expected to create a fully developed concept car. He says he'll never forget the day in March 2001 when he received the call that began the dream assignment of his lifetime.

Pardo is single and lives in downtown Detroit in an art studio and apartment where he works on his other artistic endeavors in his spare time.


