# Voto simbólico a la reforma judicial y cero autocrítica en el último informe del presidente mexicano

CIUDAD DE MÉXICO, Sep 2, 2024 (AP): El presidente más popular de la historia reciente de México inició el domingo su despedida con un baño de masas en el Zócalo capitalino, donde enumeró los avances sociales de su sexenio, minimizó la violencia que sigue azotando al país y hasta llevó a cabo una simbólica votación sobre la reforma del poder judicial, su propuesta más controvertida y que está lista para ser votada en el Congreso.

“Me voy a jubilar con la conciencia tranquila y muy contento”, declaró Andrés Manuel López Obrador en la plaza mayor de la ciudad, quien dejará su cargo el 30 de septiembre para retirarse por completo de la política.

La gran victoria en las elecciones de junio, en las que su sucesora Claudia Sheinbaum ganó con casi el 60% de los votos, borró cualquier oportunidad para la autocrítica, y en sus más de dos horas de discurso enumeró los resultados de lo que llamó “democracia verdadera”.

Un ejemplo de este concepto fue la votación a mano alzada sobre la reforma judicial que, según los críticos, eliminaría la independencia de la justicia al elegirse los jueces en votaciones populares y que ha suscitado paros laborales del sector, protestas —una incluso el mismo domingo— y numerosas críticas nacionales e internacionales por los riesgos que puede suponer para el estado de derecho, el comercio internacional y las inversiones.

“Que levanten la mano los que piensan que es mejor que a los ministros (de la Corte Suprema) y a los jueces los elijan el presidente y los senadores... pues no veo a nadie”, manifestó el

gobernante. “Que levanten la mano los que consideran que es mejor que los elija el pueblo”. Un mar de brazos se alzó entre gritos y vítores.

“Que lo internalicen nuestros amigos y vecinos de Estados Unidos”, agregó, en referencia a que ese país ha sido uno de los mayores críticos de la propuesta.

La Cámara de Diputados salida de las urnas de junio, que inició sesiones el domingo por la tarde con una amplia mayoría del oficialismo, tiene lista esta iniciativa y por la noche anunció que la reforma se someterá a votación en los próximos días, pese a que el sábado una jueza aceptó un amparo para suspender temporalmente su discusión.

Los partidos de oposición exigieron atender la decisión judicial y denunciaron que el trámite de la iniciativa había sido acelerado, realizado por los diputados salientes e impuesto a los nuevos parlamentarios sin debate, muchos de los cuales ni habían podido leer la iniciativa.

Pero el oficialismo se negó a aceptar lo determinado por la

magistrada. Según Ricardo Monreal, coordinador del partido del presidente, Morena, no se someterían a la “tiranía” de “jueces incompetentes”.

En la Cámara de Diputados, Morena y sus socios tienen los dos tercios de los votos necesarios para reformar la Carta Magna. Los cambios aprobados ahí pasarán luego al Senado, donde al oficialismo sólo le faltaría un voto, pero no duda en lograrlo.

De ahí la satisfacción del presidente horas antes, cuando se dirigió a sus seguidores después de seis años de gobierno, consciente de la buena marcha prevista para la veintena de cambios a la Constitución que él propuso en febrero —entre los que también está la eliminación de organismos independientes que sirven de contrapeso al poder ejecutivo— y que dibujarán un nuevo —y polémico— modelo de Estado.

Nadie duda que los principales logros de López Obrador han sido los avances en programas sociales, la pensión universal o tener mejores salarios, asuntos que centraron gran parte de un discurso, así como la

disminución de la pobreza, aunque quienes siguen pobres están en peores condiciones, según datos oficiales.

México es hoy un país más militarizado que hace seis años, donde no se ha podido controlar la violencia, ni el avance de los cárteles ni la impunidad, pero el presidente elogió el trabajo de las fuerzas armadas —no sólo en seguridad sino en la construcción de grandes infraestructuras—, y dijo que el número de delitos ha disminuido, aunque los homicidios rondaron los 30.000 por año.

Además, aseguró que su estrategia de seguridad de apoyar a jóvenes con más becas para evitar que ingresen a la delincuencia ha funcionado.

“¿Se va a resolver el problema sólo deteniendo a capos del narcotráfico? ¿Se va a resolver el problema desapareciendo el fentanilo? Si hay consumidores van a



“Nos dio la dignidad nuevamente”.

Pero en el Zócalo también hubo ejemplos de la otra cara del gobierno de López Obrador.

Una reportera, Reyna Haydee Ramírez, que había criticado duramente al mandatario en varias de sus conferencias matutinas, acusándolo de polarizar a la sociedad, no pudo evitar ser insultada por algunos asistentes mientras cubría el informe.

Y junto a la bandera mexicana que ondea en el centro de la principal plaza del país, un puñado de familias de los más de 110.000 desaparecidos que tiene México mantenía su protesta exigiendo justicia. Sólo unas vallas les separaban de los miles que gritaban una y otra vez “gracias” al mandatario.

## September is National Suicide Prevention Month

KALAMAZOO, MI, August 30, 2024: September is *National Suicide Prevention Month*. As a preventable cause of death, suicide is one of the biggest public health issues we face today. Suicide is the 2<sup>nd</sup> leading cause of death for Americans ages 10-24, and the 10<sup>th</sup> overall leading cause of death. One person dies by suicide every six hours in Michigan.

Resilience and recovery are possible, and prevention works. There are resources available to help those in crisis find the support they need. Gryphon Place, a local nonprofit and leader in suicide prevention services, has been helping those in conflict and crisis since 1970 and is nationally accredited by the American Association of Suicidology. During September, Gryphon Place is offering several opportunities to support and educate the community on suicide prevention.

Suicide is preventable, and knowing the warning signs and resources to help someone in crisis can save a life.

### Some warning signs from the Suicide Prevention Resource Center include:

- Talking about death or dying
- Looking for ways to kill themselves
- Talking about feeling hopeless or having no purpose
- Talking about being a burden to others
- Increased use of drugs or alcohol
- Displaying extreme mood swings

### Some ways you can help someone in crisis:

- Listen to what the person is saying, be sym-

pathetic and nonjudgmental

• Ask if they have had thoughts of suicide and take the person seriously

• Do not leave the person alone

• Remove any firearms, alcohol, drugs, or sharp objects that could be used in a suicide attempt

• If a suicide attempt seems imminent, call 9-8-8

# Ayude a identificar su riesgo de enfermedad de las arterias coronarias.

A pesar de los importantes avances logrados, la enfermedad de las arterias coronarias sigue presente hoy en día a una tasa muy elevada. Por eso, para muchas personas el objetivo es la prevención, es decir, ser proactivos en lugar de reactivos. Para quienes no han sido diagnosticados de enfermedad

de las arterias coronarias, una herramienta de prevención puede ser conocer su puntuación de calcio coronario.

La prueba cardiaca de cuantificación de calcio coronario es una prueba no invasiva que utiliza una tomografía computarizada del tórax con baja dosis de radiación y sin contraste para medir la acumulación de depósitos de calcio en las arterias coronarias.

"Estas pruebas de detección normalmente se recomiendan para las personas de 45 a 70 años de edad y en mayor riesgo de tener cardiopatías, pero que no tienen síntomas", dice la Dra. Agostina Fava, cardióloga en Cleveland Clinic, que ve a los pacientes en el centro de salud Richard E. Jacobs, en Richard E. Jacobs Campus en Avon y en el centro de salud familiar de Lorain.

La prueba detecta la placa aterosclerótica calcificada, lo que ayuda a identificar a las personas con mayor riesgo. Una pequeña parte de los pacientes examinados puede tener placas ateroscleróticas no calcificadas, pero para la mayoría, una puntuación

de calcio coronario más alta sugiere un mayor riesgo de que ocurra un estrechamiento significativo de las arterias coronarias y un posible infarto de miocardio en el futuro.

"La cuantificación de calcio coronario pueden oscilar entre cero y 400, o incluso llegar a miles dependiendo del paciente", dice la Dra. Fava. "Una puntuación de cero baja el riesgo de sufrir un infarto o un evento cardíaco en el futuro, y se recomienda volver a examinarse en cinco años.

Puntuaciones más altas indican que puede haber llegado el momento de consultar a un cardiólogo para empezar a abordar tácticas de prevención, que incluyan la modificación de los factores de riesgo cardiovasculares".

Although we found many environmental programs and exhibits that address natural and biological science content, we found almost no examples of programs or exhibits that focus on water-related engineering, advanced manufacturing, technology, chemistry, or physics," said Science Center President & CEO Kirsten Ellenbogen. "As a region that serves as a gateway to more than 20 percent of the world's freshwater, we have a responsibility to look to the short- and long-term sustainability of this vital resource, the economic impact, and the technology and engineering that will conserve and protect Lake Erie for many years to come. We are grateful to the governor and the state legislature for their support of this project and their recognition of the importance of protecting our Great Lake."

The exhibit will not only educate guests about the vital role of water technology in addressing environmental challenges, but also showcase cutting-edge innovations that promote water conservation and efficiency, and empower guests to take an active role

in effectively using and strongly safeguarding our freshwater for future generations. Prime views of Lake Erie from the Science Center will lend immediate relevancy to the experience.

As the exhibit is developed, featured concepts might include water purification methods, chemistry, advanced manufacturing, amazing feats of engineering, and advancements in sustainable energy generation from water sources. "Community engagement is vital to our Care Response Pilot Program," said *Scott Osiecki, CEO of the ADAMHS Board*. "Working in partnership with neighborhood residents, businesses and those with lived experience has helped us create a roadmap thus far that aligns with the community's needs and priorities. As we launch the pilot in the 44102 and 44105 zip codes, it's important that the community continues to participate and help us build a strong, sustainable model for how we respond to people facing a mental health crisis."

## ArtsVote Ohio launches statewide advocacy and Get-Out-the-Vote effort featuring artwork from Ohio creatives

COLUMBUS, Ohio: ArtsVote Ohio (AVO), a nonpartisan statewide initiative, has officially launched its campaign to mobilize Ohio's creative sector to participate in the upcoming November elections. A collaboration between CreativeOhio and the Greater Columbus Arts Council (GCAC), ArtsVote Ohio aims to empower Ohio's creatives—artists, arts administrators, arts patrons and more—with the resources and knowledge needed to encourage robust voter turnout and engagement in the legislative process.

“Working in the arts, I see a strong synergy between creativity and democracy. Artists and arts organizations excel at advocacy, often using their platforms to champion social and political causes. At AVO, we envision a creative sector in Ohio that fully recognizes its influence, embraces the right to vote, and uses its collective voice to shape the future of our state and nation,” said Tom Katzenmeyer, president and CEO of the GCAC.

Ohio's arts and culture sector was a \$25 billion industry in 2022, providing 157,721 jobs and \$11.3 billion in total compensation, according to data from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis and the National Endowment for the Arts. This significant

impact underscores the importance of the creative sector in Ohio's economy, representing over three percent of the state's gross domestic product (GDP)—more than utilities, education or agriculture.

“ArtsVote Ohio is designed to remind Ohio's creative sector of their collective power and strength in numbers. The campaign's messaging emphasizes that Ohio's artists and creatives are not only business owners, employers and taxpayers, but also leaders in their communities. Voting decisions at all levels—federal, state and local—can have significant impacts on arts funding and, consequently, on a community's vitality,” said Sarah Sisser, CreativeOhio executive director and CEO.

The collaboration between CreativeOhio and the Greater Columbus Arts Council is part of a broader national network affiliated with Americans for the Arts Action Fund.

“The ArtsVote Ohio campaign originally began in 2022 with the utilization of nationally created tools provided by Arts Action Fund. Over the past

two years, we've evolved into a true statewide coalition, featuring artwork by Ohio artists and fostering community engagement through news, activities, and storytelling,” said Jami Goldstein, vice president of marketing, communications and events at the Greater Columbus Arts

Council.

To date, ArtsVote Ohio has collaborated with 28 artists from 10 Ohio cities to create shareable, nonpartisan graphics that arts supporters can download for free and use to engage their communities. ArtsVote Ohio encourages individuals and organizations to use the hashtag #ArtsVoteOhio and to credit the individual artists whose work they share. The campaign will continue collecting artwork and personal essays from Ohio's creatives, exploring the intersection of creativity and democracy.

In addition to the visual campaign, ArtsVote Ohio offers a toolkit designed for both individuals and organizations. This toolkit provides resources to encourage artists to check their voter registration, register to vote, and inspire others to get out the vote.

## Kaptur visits Toledo-Sandusky-Port Clinton Customs and Border Protection Facility

Port Clinton, OH, August 28, 2024: Congresswoman Marcy Kaptur (OH-09) was briefed by US Customs and Border Protection (CBP) officials in Toledo-Sandusky-Port Clinton, Ohio, calling attention to the urgent need for comprehensive border security measures. Her visit underscores the critical role that Northern border states play in national security, particularly in light of recent data showing a majority of terrorist-related crossings have occurred at the Northern border.

“During briefings I received at the Toledo-Sandusky-Port Clinton CBP facility, it was clear that our dedicated border agents are doing everything they can with the resources they have,” said Congresswoman Marcy Kaptur (OH-09). “However, the recent release of new data is alarming — this fiscal year alone, 88% of land border terrorist

screening encounters occurred at our Northern border. This is a national security issue that affects every American.”

Congresswoman Kaptur emphasized the bipartisan efforts led by Republican Senator James Lankford, which were unfortunately stalled due to political pressures. “It's time to revive and pass the bipartisan border deal that was negotiated in the Senate. We cannot allow self-serving political motives to jeopardize national security. Our Northern and Southern borders both require robust and balanced attention,” she stated.

As a staunch supporter of Operation Stonegarden, Congresswoman Kaptur has consistently advocated for equitable funding for all border states, emphasizing that national security is not just a Southern border issue. “The refusal to allow Congress a vote on critical border security funding to prop up a

political agenda is unacceptable. To truly secure our borders, we must ensure that both Northern and Southern operations are adequately funded in a bi-partisan fashion.”

Congresswoman Kaptur concluded, “The safety of our nation hinges on our ability to protect all points of entry. I urge my colleagues across the aisle to prioritize our nation's security over partisan politics. Let's come together to pass the necessary legislation that will safeguard our borders and ensure the well-being of all Americans.”
