





Chile closes Allende case after confirming suicide

SANTIAGO, Chile, Dec. 29, 2011 (AP): A judge in Chile has closed the case on the death of President Salvador Allende after an authoritative autopsy confirmed it was suicide.

An international panel of experts convened by Judge Mario Carroza de-

termined that Allende took his own life with an AK-47 while defending the presidential palace in Chile's 1973 coup (Chile's 9-11).

Carroza ruled out the possibility that a soldier or bodyguard fired the fatal shots. He also disproved a range of other myths surrounding Allende's

death 38 years ago.

Allende was among 726 people who died or disappeared when Gen. Augusto Pinochet seized power, and whose cases were stuck in the courts since then. Carroza is studying these cases anew under orders from the Supreme Court.

District loses appeal over ethnic-studies finding

TUCSON, Ariz., Dec. 27, 2011 (AP): A judge has upheld a state official's finding that the Tucson Unified School District's ethnic studies program violates state law.

The Arizona Daily Star reports that (<http://bit.ly/t8bREJ>) Administrative Law Judge Lewis Kowal on Tuesday upheld the determination by Superintendent

of Public Instruction John Huppenthal and found that grounds exist to withhold 10 percent of the district's monthly state aid until it can come into compliance.

The district has said such a loss would cripple the district.

The Arizona Department of Education has said the only way the district could come into compliance was

to suspend the Mexican-American Studies program and rebuild it.

The program's supporters call challenges to the courses an attack on the state's Latino population, while critics say the program demonizes white people as oppressors of Latinos.

NM's LULAC denounces Romney

ALBUQUERQUE, Jan. 6, 2012 (AP): Immigrant student activists in New Mexico and the state's chapter of the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC) are faulting GOP presidential candidate Mitt Romney for vowing to veto the DREAM Act.

Students and the members of the Latino civil rights group have denounced the former Massachusetts governor's promise. They said the federal proposal would help a number of students who grew up most of their lives in the state but currently are living in the country without documen-

tation.

Under the bill, some immigrants brought to the U.S. without documentation would have a route to legal status through military service or college enrollment.

Romney said Saturday he wouldn't support the legislation if it came to his desk as president.

Obama plans change in immigration rule, Congressional Republicans decry Obama's policy changes

WASHINGTON, DC, Jan. 6, 2012 (AP): The Obama administration plans a rule change to help reduce the time undocumented immigrant spouses and children are separated from citizen relatives while they try to win legal status in the United States, a senior administration official said.

Applications for the waiver can take as long as six months to be acted upon, the official said. The new rule is expected to reduce that processing time to just days or weeks, the official added.

Currently, undocumented immigrants must leave the country before they can ask the government to waive a three- to 10-year ban on legally coming back to the U.S. The length of the ban depends on how long they have lived in the U.S. without permission.

The official said Thursday the new rule would let children and spouses of citizens ask the government to decide on the *waiver request* before the undocumented immigrant heads to his or her home country to apply for a visa. The undocumented immigrants still must go home to finish the visa process to come back to the U.S., but getting the waiver ahead of time could reduce the time an undocumented immigrant is out of the country.

The official spoke on the condition of anonymity because the proposed policy change had not been made public.

The waiver shift is the latest move by President Barack Obama to make changes to immigration policy without congressional action. Congressional Republicans repeatedly have criticized the administration for policy changes they describe as providing "backdoor amnesty" to undocumented others.

Immigrants who do not have criminal records and who have only violated immigration laws can win a *waiver* if they can prove that their absence would cause an "extreme hardship" for their citizen

spouse or parent. The government received about 23,000 hardship applications in 2011 and more than 70 percent were approved, the official said.

Applications for the waiver can take as long as six months to be acted upon, the official said. The new rule is expected to reduce that processing time to just days or weeks, the official added.

"This would streamline the process (and) reduce the time of separation between family members," the official said.

The proposal will be published in the Federal Register on Friday. The official said the administration hopes to change the rule later this year.

Immigration has become a difficult issue for Obama ahead of the November election. As a presidential candidate, he pledged to change what many consider to be a broken immigration system.

To that end, Homeland Security (DHS) Secretary Janet Napolitano announced plans last year to review some 300,000 pending deportation cases in an effort to target criminal undocumented immigrants, repeat immigration law violators and those who pose a national security or public safety threat. Napolitano said the DHS would delay indefinitely the cases of many undocumented immigrants who have no criminal record and those who have been arrested for only minor traffic violations or other misdemeanors.

A pilot program to review about 12,000 cases pending in immigration court in Baltimore and Denver was launched in November and ends next week. The review is expected to expand to other jurisdictions later this year.

Immigration and Cus-



tom's Enforcement (ICE) Director John Morton also issued a memo in June outlining how immigration authorities could use discretion in deciding which undocumented immigrants

to arrest and put into deportation proceedings. Morton wrote in the memo that discretion could be used in a variety of cases, including for people with *no criminal record* and young people brought to the country without documentation as children.

Congressional Republicans have decried the policy changes, arguing that the Obama administration is circumventing Congress to essentially provide amnesty to countless undocumented immigrants.

Rep. Lamar Smith, who chairs the House Judiciary Committee, has been among the most vocal critics and has accused Obama repeatedly of not enforcing immigration law.

Several attempts at an immigration law overhaul have failed in recent years, including the so-called *DREAM Act*, which would have allowed for some young undocumented immigrants brought to the U.S. as children to earn legal status if they went to college or joined the military.

Se incrementó migración ilegal a Puerto Rico en el 2011

SAN JUAN, 27 de dic. del 2011 (AP): La cifra de migrantes capturados este año tratando de ingresar ilegalmente a Puerto Rico se incrementó en 60%, informó la Oficina de Aduanas y Protección Fronteriza de Estados Unidos.

El vocero Jeffrey Quiñones señaló que los funcionarios de la agencia

no pueden apuntar hacia ningún factor que explique el aumento, pero agregó que éste es cíclico.

Dijo que el número de inmigrantes atrapados intentando ingresar a territorio estadounidense sin permiso ha bajado en los últimos cinco años.

La mayoría de los 642 migrantes atrapados este año son dominicanos, seguidos

de cubanos y haitianos. Casi todos ellos intentaron llegar a Puerto Rico en embarcaciones desvencijadas que en ocasiones se averiaron en aguas agitadas del Pasaje de Mona, el cual separa Puerto Rico y la isla La Española, la cual es compartida por la República Dominicana y Haití.

US-Americans expected to buy more cars in 2012

DETROIT, Jan. 4, 2012 (AP) — Strong sales in December capped off a great year for U.S. carmakers—especially Chrysler—and 2012 should be even better.

For their biggest Japanese rivals, a year of natural disasters and other struggles ended on a sour note, with U.S. sales falling and the outlook for this year just as challenging.

Chrysler Group, in the midst of a comeback after its 2009 trip through bankruptcy court, said Wednesday that sales surged 37 percent in December and 26 percent for all of 2011. Demand was particularly strong for the Jeep Grand Cherokee and the Chrysler 200. In Toledo, its Jeep plant can't build its products fast enough. Chrysler catapulted itself ahead of Honda Motor Co. as the fourth-largest automaker by sales in the U.S.

General Motors Co. and **Ford Motor Co.** ended the year with more modest double-digit percentage gains. Analysts say U.S. car and truck sales rose for the second year in a row as buyers' confidence in the economy picked up, their aging vehicles wore down and their ability to take out cheap loans improved.

U.S. auto sales rose 10 percent to 12.8 million in 2011. That's up 23 percent from 2009, when the U.S. auto industry and the financial system were in peril.

The best-selling vehicle in 2011 was the **Ford F-Series pickup**—the 30th straight year it's been at the top. That was followed by **Chevrolet's Silverado** pickup. Next were cars: the **Toyota Camry** and **Nissan Altima** sedans. Round-

ing out the top 10 were the **Ford Escape** small SUV, the **Ford Fusion** midsize sedan, the **Ram** pickup, **Toyota's Corolla** compact, the **Honda Accord** sedan and the new **Chevy Cruze** compact.

November and December were the strongest months of the year for U.S. auto sales, and analysts expect the momentum to continue into 2012. Improving employment numbers, low interest rates and building demand to replace older cars should all boost 2012 sales.

GM's December sales rose 5 percent, resulting in a 13 percent bump for the year, while Ford's December sales climbed 10 percent, closing out an 11 percent gain for 2011.

Nissan Motor Co., which recovered more quickly than its rivals from the March earthquake and tsunami in Japan, was the only major Japanese automaker to sell more cars in the U.S. in 2011. Its sales surged nearly 8 percent in December and 15 percent for the year. Nissan's Leaf electric car also outsold GM's Chevrolet Volt in the cars' first full year on the market. Nissan sold 9,674 Leafs, beating the Volt by just over 2,000.

But for **Honda** and **Toyota**, 2011 was a disappointing sales year.

They couldn't get enough cars and trucks to U.S. dealers because of Japan's disasters and flooding in Thailand. Toyota said Wednesday that it doesn't expect its inventory to be at normal levels until March.

Both carmakers, whose sales fell 7 percent in 2011, were also hurt by aging offer-

ings like the Toyota Corolla and poor reviews of the new Honda Civic.

While U.S. sales haven't returned to their pre-recession levels, American motorists are increasingly eager to buy, says Jesse Toprak, vice president of analysis for the car pricing site TrueCar.com.

Buyers snapped up more small cars like the Chevrolet Cruze, Hyundai Elantra and Ford Fiesta. And sales of trucks and SUVs picked up as well, a sign that small businesses are updating their aging fleets, something they were reluctant to do shortly after the Great Recession of 2007-2009.

"They're becoming more comfortable buying a car even though the dust hasn't totally settled," says Toprak.

GM and others predict that total U.S. auto sales will rise by another 1 million or so in 2012 to a range of 13.5 million to 14 million. That's still far below the peak of around 17 million in 2005, but consistent with a slow and steady economic recovery.

The unemployment rate is at a three-and-a-half-year low, and hiring is improving. That's helping consumers feel more confident about a big purchase like a car. Low interest rates - below 3 percent, in some cases - are also enticing buyers, says Don Johnson, GM's U.S. sales chief. And with the average age of a car in the U.S. pushing a record 11 years, there is growing demand to replace old vehicles.

Buyers are coming out even though car prices are relatively high. The average new vehicle cost \$30,686 in December, up

5 percent from a year earlier, as automakers offered more pricy features like navigation systems and backup cameras but cut back on rebates and other deals. Incentive spending dropped 3 percent in December from a year earlier to an average of \$2,562 per vehicle, according to TrueCar.com.

Many analysts had predicted a price war in 2011 as Toyota and Honda factories resumed normal production and they sought to win customers. But the big discounts never materialized, and GM's Johnson doesn't expect them in 2012, either.

But others think Toyota and Honda will use incentives to try to win back the market share they lost in 2011. Toyota ended the year with market share of 12.9 percent, down from 15 percent in 2010.

"I still expect Toyota and Honda to be a little more aggressive in the first half," says Paul Ballew, a former GM chief economist who now works for Nationwide Insurance.

Other automakers reporting Wednesday:

- Volkswagen AG says 2011 sales were up 26 percent on strong demand for the Jetta and Passat sedans. December sales were up 36 percent to 32,502, the company's best December in the U.S. since 1972.

- Hyundai Motor Co. says 2011 sales rose 20 percent on strong demand for the Sonata and Elantra sedans. December sales were up 13 percent.

- Kia Motors Corp. says 2011 sales rose 36 percent on sales of the new Optima, Soul and Sorento. December sales were up 43 percent.

Detroit auto show, Cobo Center sign 5-year deal

DETROIT, Jan. 5, 2012 (AP) — The Detroit auto show will remain at Cobo Center at least through 2017 under an agreement completed Thursday.

The **Detroit Auto Dealers Association** signed a five-year contract to keep the annual North American International Auto Show at Cobo. This year's show is open to the public Jan. 14-22.

The dealers had repeatedly warned that Detroit could lose the show to another city unless Cobo expanded and improved.

The Detroit Regional Convention Facility Authority took control of Cobo from the city in 2009 and began what are expected to be \$200 million in renovations. That's adding about 150,000 square

feet of display space to the 700,000 it has now.

"This is a triumph for the city of Detroit, the region and the state and a huge endorsement of the transformation we're making at Cobo Center," said authority chairman Larry Alexander. "Four short years ago, we were in danger of losing this region's most recognized annual event and one of its most valuable assets."

Bill Perkins, a co-chairman of this year's auto show, said organizers are "thrilled about the changes we've seen at Cobo Center."

"We wanted to make this commitment because of the remarkable changes that have occurred and are planned over the next few years," Perkins said.

Amp Electric Vehicles unveils Converted Jeep Grand Cherokee at North American International Auto Show

DETROIT, Jan. 8, 2012: **U.S. Sen. Sherrod Brown** (D-OH) joined a southwest Ohio electric vehicle company to reveal a new electric jeep model at the North American International Auto Show. Amp Electric Vehicles, based in Loveland, displayed a converted Jeep Grand Cherokee during the auto show in Detroit. The company also released final pricing while introducing its first dealer, Mercedes of Cincinnati.

"More and more Americans are demanding high-tech, energy-efficient vehicles, and Ohioans are developing and building them. AMP is all about Ohio talent breeding Ohio innovation," Brown said. "Our state's companies can compete with anyone in the world, but we need a national manufacturing strategy that prioritizes the type of high-tech, clean energy industries that create good-paying jobs and lead to long-term growth."

Radio in Spanish gives US Latinos a voice

FRESNO, Jan. 1, 2012 (AP) Phones at the radio studios on the outskirts of town kept ringing.

Saul from Visalia lamented cuts to public education, calling in on a December afternoon to *Línea Abierta*, the first nationwide Spanish-language public affairs show. Miguel from Madera asked how county taxes are distributed and Manuel from Calexico wanted to know whether schools still receive lottery funds.

The public affairs show is produced daily by *Radio Bilingüe*, the nation's only public, non-commercial Spanish-language radio network. With seven FM stations in California and more than 100 affiliates nationwide airing its programs, the Fresno-based network reaches an estimated 500,000 Latino listeners per week.

Controlled by Latinos and run by a Harvard-educated former farmworker, the network fills a crucial gap in public broadcasting, which attracts overwhelmingly white, middle- or upper-class, English speaking audiences. The industry

has been struggling to capture Latino listeners.

"We want to offer news and information that's relevant to the lives of our listeners," said Línea Abierta's executive producer Samuel Orozco, "so that they can use it as citizens, to be able to participate in the decision making process and be active members of society."

Radio Bilingüe focuses on immigrant and first generation Latinos who are predominantly low-income, young and under-educated. It offers a platform to the working poor, the undocumented, Indians from Mexico and farmworkers.

The network is now expanding and building five stations along the U.S.-Mexico border.

Experts say *Radio Bilingüe*'s efforts to foster civic engagement are key as the number of Latinos in the U.S. keeps growing and the nation moves toward a presidential election.

"They're a model of how Latino public broadcasting can flourish," said Florence Hernández-Ramos, director of Denver-based Latino Public Radio Consortium. "There are a lot of people in the U.S. that

speak primarily in Spanish. They have a right to engage in the national conversation."

Hugo Morales, a former farmworker who graduated from Harvard Law School, founded *Radio Bilingüe* more than 30 years ago because he felt poor Latino farmworkers had no voice.

"I was shocked that the mainstream saw our community as basically having no brains," Morales said.

A Mixtec Indian born in the Mexican state of Oaxaca, Morales arrived in California when he was 9 years old, joining his farmworker father on a prune farm near Santa Rosa. He worked in the orchards, studied and helped his brother run a local Spanish-language radio show.

After graduating from law school, Morales lectured for La Raza Studies at California State University in Fresno and founded the radio station. The all-volunteer station eventually went professional and grew into a network with nationally distributed programming. Morales won a MacArthur "genius" grant and the Edward R. Murrow Award, public radio's highest honor, for his work.

The Latino population

nearly quadrupled in size since *Radio Bilingüe* began broadcasting, to more than 50 million or 16 percent of the nation last year. But Latino participation in public media remains minimal. So the network's mission changed to fill that gap: it would serve Latinos in general, not just farmworkers.

The network struggles to secure funding. Unlike traditional public broadcasting — which relies on donations from well-off listeners — *Radio Bilingüe* relies on grants from private foundations and the government.

It has had difficulty securing stations in urban areas, especially Los Angeles, because new frequencies are not available in major markets and purchasing a station is expensive.

About 1,000 public radio stations broadcast today, and fewer than two dozen are Latino, said Joseph Tovares, senior vice president for diversity and innovation at the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, which gives federal funding to public media. Non-Latino stations, Tovares said, have been struggling to provide culturally au-

thentic, relevant content to Latinos.

"We have not been able to provide the content this demographic will need going forward," Tovares said. "There's been a population explosion and we're playing catch-up."

Only about 5 percent of the listeners of NPR, the largest producer of public radio programming, are Latino, which the network is trying to change through diversity initiatives.

"If we are to survive," Tovares said, "we need to reach these folks."

The number of commercial Spanish-language stations,

on the other hand, has skyrocketed to over 1,300, according to Arbitron research. But some commercial programming perpetuates stereotypes against gay and indigenous Latinos, Orozco said.

"What investors are seeing is not Latinos as citizens, but as consumers, as dollar signs," he said. "The service for them is cheap entertainment that caters to the lowest common denominator."

In addition to the public affairs show, *Radio Bilingüe* produces a national news service, a talk show in Mixteco that si-

multaneously airs on stations in Oaxaca, a call-in youth show about sexuality and original reporting on topics from the arts to the environment. It airs programs from radio partners in Mexico.

The network, which also has Internet broadcasts, refuses to air narcocorridos, the popular drug ballads, and doesn't accept money from alcohol companies. It produces educational messages and guides listeners to resources. Music - from Cuban jazz to mariachi to rock en español - is used to attract different audience subsets. In addition to professional producers, 90 volunteers host programs and help at the stations.

"Where *Radio Bilingüe* is pretty extraordinary is that it's pro-social; it uses radio as a medium for positive impact," said Ed Kissam, an independent researcher who has studied the network's impact.

Lourdes Santiago named to head Neighborhoods Dept.

Veteran city administrator and attorney **Lourdes Santiago** was named as the acting director of the Toledo Dept. of Neighborhoods in the wake of a scandal that cost the department's top two administrators their jobs. Toledo's mayor has requested city council confirm the appointment of Ms. Santiago to the post on a permanent basis. Council action is expected at its Jan. 17, 2012 meeting.

Mayor Mike Bell fired director **Katie Bond** and commissioner **Mike Prude** last week,

citing lack of oversight in a department riddled by allegations of bid-rigging, contract-steering, and favoritism related to federal housing funds and the rehabilitation of central-city homes. Several contractors have alleged rehab work was unfairly awarded to specific contractors, resulting in the loss of thousands of dollars' worth of lucrative work in a poor economy.

In their letters of termination, the mayor told the department's top two administrators that recent events "have irretrievably eroded" his confidence in their abilities to perform their jobs. Mayor Bell came down especially hard on Ms. Bond, stating his belief that she "knew or should have known of serious issues" within the department, "failed to adequately address these issues," and "consistently failed to bring matters" to the mayor's attention so they could be addressed.

The mayor followed up those firings this past week by punishing two subordinates to those administrators: housing manager **Jody Prude** and **Toni Thomas**. Both women were issued a ten-day suspension, a demotion, cut in pay, and transferred to a lower position out-

side the department of neighborhoods. A city attorney, Ms. Santiago's signature appears on the agreements outlining their punishment.

However, both women could face additional sanctions, including termination, if a separate criminal investigation by the FBI reveals any further wrongdoing. The mayor's office has not indicated what specifically an internal probe of departmental operations revealed, but Ms. Prude and Ms. Thomas each were charged with failure to follow procedure, gross misconduct, misfeasance, nonfeasance, and insubordination.

Ms. Santiago so far has avoided public comment on her appointment to the post. But Mayor Bell pointed out she has done the job before on a temporary basis. Ms. Santiago moved from the city law department, where she was a city

attorney, to her newly-appointed administrative post.

"She's got experience in that and she is an attorney," said Mayor Bell. "That will put us in a better scope of making sure we're redoing everything legally and I feel very comfortable. Lourdes is a taskmaster. She's very focused and she's very professional. I have a high confidence level that she will do what is necessary to restructure and stabilize that particular department."

Ms. Santiago has served the city in a number of administrative capacities during previous administrations, including appointments in the city's human resources department and as a top advisor to previous mayors. She served for a brief time as an appointed member of Toledo City Council and has run for judge in the past.

This past fall, she entered the race for Lucas County Common Pleas Court, but withdrew her name when the board of elections allowed an endorsed Democratic candidate to be placed on the November ballot.

Mensaje del embajador Arturo Sarukhan a las comunidades mexicanas

Estimado Paisano,

Como lo he hecho cada año desde que asumí la titularidad de esta Embajada, deseo aprovechar las fiestas decembrinas para felicitarlo y desechar a usted y a su familia un próspero año nuevo.

En mis visitas de trabajo durante este año a distintos estados y ciudades de Estados Unidos ha sido cada vez más evidente que la interacción entre México y Estados Unidos, y entre nuestras sociedades, ocurre y se intensifica a lo largo y ancho de ambos países. Mis conversaciones con autoridades, empresarios, académicos y líderes comunitarios en todos los rincones de Estados Unidos han tenido como finalidad continuar promoviendo una mejor y más estrecha relación entre ambos países. Al mismo tiempo, han respondido al objetivo de que nuestras comunidades tengan las mejores condiciones de vida y oportunidades para prosperar en este país.

También tengo claro que 2011 fue un año de claroscuros para nuestras comunidades. Por una parte, estados como California, Maryland, Illinois y Rhode Island, reconociendo las aportaciones de miles de jóvenes a sus comunidades y a la economía estadounidense, aprobaron medidas que permitirán a los jóvenes indocumentados proseguir su educación en universidades estatales. Asimismo, un número creciente de ciudades, desde Nueva York hasta Dayton, Ohio, han manifestado su compromiso por combatir la intolerancia y ofrecer espacios de inclusión e integración y que dan la bienvenida a sus inmigrantes. Estos estados y ciudades sin duda reconocen la necesidad de encontrar soluciones humanas y duraderas para reformar el sistema migratorio en este país. Por la otra, este año representó, sin embargo, un enorme reto frente a la reproducción de iniciativas estatales de control migratorio similares a la SB 1070 de Arizona. Las acciones de protección consular que llevamos a cabo en 2010 fueron fortalecidas y multiplicadas en 2011 de cara a cinco leyes estatales que fueron promulgadas en Utah, Indiana, Carolina del Sur, Georgia y Alabama.

El Gobierno de México seguirá respondiendo en forma decidida para proteger a sus connacionales frente al embate de estas leyes. Desde que se presentaron las iniciativas en los congresos estatales, emitimos claros posicionamientos condenando su contenido potencialmente discriminatorio. Al ser aprobadas, se intensificó la difusión sobre sus efectos en nuestras comunidades mediante folletos informativos, reuniones comunitarias y campañas preventivas en medios de comunicación. Dentro de la estrategia de respuesta legal, el Gobierno de México presentó escritos de "Amigo de la Corte" para apoyar las demandas de organizaciones de la sociedad civil y que busca proteger a sus familiares que nacieron en este país. Sin importar su condición migratoria, tienen derechos civiles y humanos que se deben respetar.

Aún cuando México también entrará de lleno en su propio proceso electoral el próximo año, y a pesar de los reclamos reciprocos que podrían surgir al calor de las campañas, la percepción que tiene la opinión pública mexicana sobre la relación con Estados Unidos es positiva, como lo ha comprobado la más reciente encuesta del CIDE sobre política exterior. Seguiremos trabajando

actores de la sociedad civil sobre los efectos perniciosos de este tipo de propuestas para nuestras comunidades y la relación bilateral en su conjunto. A lo largo de 2011, dichos intercambios contribuyeron a que un número importante de estados rechazara estas medidas en distintos momentos del proceso legislativo. La reciente decisión de la Suprema Corte de Justicia para abordar en 2012 uno de los litigios sobre la constitucionalidad de la SB 1070 en Arizona, marcará un parteaguas fundamental, tanto en el papel y atribución de los estados a futuro en esta materia, como en las posibilidades de que una reforma migratoria integral vuelva a discutirse de manera seria e informada a nivel Federal. Estaremos muy atentos a su deliberación y evaluando las opciones de política pública legales y diplomáticas que instrumentará el Gobierno de México en función del fallo que la Suprema Corte emita.

La paradoja del auge de estas iniciativas es que se dan en un año donde se están confirmando importantes tendencias de disminución de los flujos migratorios de México hacia Estados Unidos, en parte como resultado del crecimiento de la economía mexicana. El censo estadounidense de 2010 confirma para la comunidad hispana un incremento en el número de familias de composición mixta (donde los padres son inmigrantes y los hijos nacidos en EU) y el crecimiento impulsado más por nacimientos que por migración, mientras que datos del censo mexicano señalan un equilibrio entre el número de migrantes que han dejado nuestro país y los que han regresado de Estados Unidos en los últimos cinco años. Es decir, por primera vez en décadas la tasa neta de migración de México a Estados Unidos es igual a cero. Esta estabilidad en los flujos migratorios en América del Norte debería abrir una ventana de oportunidad para repensar los marcos normativos que regulan la migración y para detonar el potencial económico que representa el carácter complementario de nuestras economías.

No obstante esta oportunidad para recalibrar la narrativa sobre la migración en Estados Unidos, el próximo año será escenario de una contienda electoral en este país, y como se ha visto desde ahora, este contexto ha sido y seguirá siendo utilizado por algunos para demonizar al inmigrante y para culparlo injustamente de los diferentes retos que enfrenta este país. Quiero ser muy claro al respecto. No vamos a permitir que se use al inmigrante mexicano como chivo expiatorio en las campañas electorales. Seguiremos usando todos los foros a mi alcance para reiterar mi mensaje de estos últimos años: los inmigrantes son gente que viene a trabajar en forma honrada, que contribuye a sus nuevas comunidades y que busca proteger a sus familiares que nacieron en este país. Sin importar su condición migratoria, tienen derechos civiles y humanos que se deben respetar.

Aún cuando México también entrará de lleno en su propio proceso electoral el próximo año, y a pesar de los reclamos reciprocos que podrían surgir al calor de las campañas, la percepción que tiene la opinión pública mexicana sobre la relación con Estados Unidos es positiva, como lo ha comprobado la más reciente encuesta del CIDE sobre política exterior. Seguiremos trabajando

desde la Embajada para blindar la relación bilateral y para destacar la importancia que tienen la cultura, el comercio México-Estados Unidos, el turismo entre ambos países, y la población de origen mexicano en este lado de la frontera, entre otros factores, para el progreso de nuestros pueblos. En este esfuerzo, el trabajo digno, honesto y cotidiano de nuestras comunidades, seguirá nutriendo el arco de prosperidad que debe unir a México y Estados Unidos.

En 2012, por segunda vez en nuestra historia, miles de mexicanos votarán en la elección presidencial desde el exterior. Lamentablemente, siguen pendientes las reformas en el Congreso mexicano para que el IFE pueda credencializar en el extranjero. En el proceso electoral en curso, aquéllos con credencial para votar con fotografía tienen hasta el 15 de enero de 2012 para registrarse ante el IFE y ejercer este derecho cívico estando fuera de México. Adicionalmente, para garantizar los principios de legalidad, honradez, transparencia, lealtad, imparcialidad y eficiencia, he girado instrucciones puntuales, contundentes e inequívocas a todo el personal de la Embajada y de nuestra red Consular en este país: no se tolerará el proselitismo electoral ni se permitirá que de manera inescrupulosa alguien busque condicionar los servicios consulares que brindamos a diario en función de preferencias políticas.

Finalmente, si en estas fechas va a viajar a México, le deseo una travesía segura y le recomiendo que pase antes por el Consulado mexicano más cercano para informarse sobre sus derechos y obligaciones al ingresar a nuestro país. No olvide que cuenta también con los servicios que durante más de veinte años ha brindado el Programa Paisano, a través del cual puede denunciar de manera anónima tanto delitos como abusos de funcionarios cometidos en su contra.

Paisano, como descendiente de familias refugiadas que emigraron a México escapando del fascismo y el genocidio, tengo un compromiso profundo y personal con la protección de los derechos de los migrantes, con la tolerancia y las políticas de inclusión. Creo firmemente en luchar sin tregua contra medidas deleznables que fomentan el miedo, la exclusión, y la intolerancia como las que actualmente se implementan en Alabama. Tengo también la firme convicción de que nuestra generación tiene la responsabilidad de construir un México plenamente democrático, plural, incluyente y abierto al debate de las mejores ideas y de todas las opiniones, pero sobre todo, un México más equitativo que ofrece suficientes oportunidades de bienestar, justicia social y prosperidad para toda la sociedad. Ese es el México que debemos seguir construyendo todos, más allá de nuestras preferencias o filiaciones ideológicas o partidistas, y que esté cada vez más a la altura de las aspiraciones y expectativas de todas y todos los mexicanos.

Les reitero mi compromiso con la bandera del trabajo arduo, la entrega y la honradez que nuestras comunidades mexicanas enarbolan a diario a ambos lados de nuestra frontera común. ¡Felices fiestas, y todo lo mejor para el 2012!

**La Mexicana...**

Sucedío hace unos días, en uno de esos estados que antes eran nuestros y que está lleno de paisanos, Nuevo México. Una política local le dijo a otra "La Mexicana", y después dijo que "no tenía intención de insultarla".

Pero a "la mexicana" si le pareció insulto, y puso el grito en el cielo. Y a otra "mexicana" que estuvo en medio del debate, le pareció igual de insultante que le dijeron que "estaba acarreando agua mexicana para el cuarto piso".

El caso es curioso a más no poder, porque la primera política, la que soltó el epíteto de "mexicana" resulta ser la Representante Estatal Demócrata Sheryl Williams Stapleton, quien a pesar del tremendamente blanco nombre que porta, aún más curiosamente se autodescribe como "mitad negra y mitad hispana". Por lo menos eso le dijo al periódico El Paso Times, justificando entonces que sus exclamaciones no pueden ser racistas.

Las insultadas son la Representante Estatal Nora Espinoza, y ni más ni menos que la primera gobernadora de un estado en Estados Unidos de ascendencia mexicana, la Republicana Susana Martínez, cuyos padres son oriundos de México.

La referencia de "llevar agua mexicana al cuarto piso" se refiere, una de dos, a que Espinoza anda de mandilona de Susana llevándole botellas de agua a la oficina, o simplemente a que su ascendencia tiene connotaciones políticas de algún terrible complot mexicano para apoderarse de Nuevo México o algo así. A la mejor es la segunda, porque a muchos blancos, aunque sean "negros-latinos" y Demócratas como Williams Stapleton, parece que les cuesta trabajo asimilar que el 46 por ciento de los pobladores de Nuevo México son latinos.

Martínez dijo que los comentarios de Williams Stapleton le parecían "tristes y desilusionantes" y ahí paró la cosa. La bronca de fondo, parece ser, es que la "negra-latina" Demócrata no aprueba los planes de reforma escolar de "la mexicana".

Y El Mexicano

Todo esto me recordó a un personaje histórico, al menos en Estados Unidos, inmigrante nacido en México pero nunca reconocido por nuestro país ni por nosotros.

Se llamaba George, o Jorge, en caso de que hubiera actas de nacimiento en la Colonia Dublán, Galeana, en Chihuahua en 1907. Vivió poco allá, para el 1912, unos cuates llamados Pascual Orozco y José Inés Salazar le hicieron la vida de cuadritos a los colonos. Su familia jaló pa'l norte. En sus memorias, George se autodescribe como parte de "las primeras personas desplazadas del Siglo XX".

Ya en gringolandia, en Los Ángeles para ser precisos, al chamaco le apodaban en la escuela "El Mex".

Creció pobre, porque su padre era buen carpintero de la construcción pero malo para los negocios, y dos veces quebró por completo, pero era bien abusado y se metió en negocios con más suerte que su 'ápá, y luego en política.

Durante la Segunda Guerra Mundial, llegó a ser jefazo del Consejo de la Victoria de Detroit, Michigan, organizaciones creadas para aumentar la producción para satisfacer las necesidades de la guerra, y prácticamente le tocó resolver los levantamientos raciales de 1943 en esa ciudad, debidos a la discriminación contra los obreros negros que reemplazaban a los obreros blancos que andaban de soldados en Europa, consiguiéndoles vivienda subsidiada cerca de la planta de la Ford.

Para el 1950, como miembro del Consejo Ciudadano de Planeación de Vivienda, George criticó la segregación racial y agarró prestigio por su "ardiente personalidad". Se lo jalaron como asesor de la AMC, American Motors Company, y en 1954 cuando al gerente se enfermó gravemente, lo pusieron en su puesto. Se redujo un 35 por ciento de salario, armó excelentes relaciones con el sindicato, armó un reparto de utilidades y apoyó la Ley Estatal de Trabajo.

En 1962 se le ocurrió lanzarse para Presidente de Estados Unidos. Le llamaron "Chihuahua George" y perdió las primarias Republicanas contra Richard Nixon.

Se apellidaba Romney, y por ahí en algún momento nació su hijo, Mitt.

Nomás que el hijito, el mexicanito, no se acuerda de su papá y odia a los mexicanos. Capaz México debía darle un homenaje a "el Mex", a "Chihuahua George", algún premio Othli póstumo. Con el ánimo anti-mexicano de los políticos de hoy día, Demócratas y Republicanos, o Mitt Romney no llega ni a la esquina en estas elecciones, o nos damos el lujo de rebote de tener al primer Presidente "Méjico-American" de Estados Unidos...

Se Extiende el Plazo de Presentación al 30 de Marzo Para Algunas Organizaciones Exentas de Impuestos

WASHINGTON — Organizaciones exentas de impuestos con fechas límites de presentación de enero y febrero tendrán hasta el 30 de marzo del 2012 para presentar su declaración anual, anunció hoy el Servicio de Impuestos Internos (IRS).

“Es muy importante que todas las organizaciones exentas de impuestos presten atención a este anuncio” señaló Joe Muñoz, portavoz del IRS. “De otra forma pudieran estar en peligro de perder su estatus de exentos de impuestos.”

El IRS le concede esta prórroga del plazo para presentar debido a que parte del sistema e-file que procesa las declaraciones electrónicas de organizaciones exentas de impuestos va a estar fuera de servicio durante enero y febrero. La agencia subrayó que el resto del sistema e-file continuará operando normalmente y exhortó a todos las personas y las empresas a elegir la precisión, rapidez y conveniencia de la presentación electrónica.

En general, la prórroga aplica a organizaciones exentas de impuestos, cuyo plazo de presentación es normal, ya sea 17 de enero ó 15 de febrero del 2012. Por lo general, estos

plazos aplican a las organizaciones cuyo año fiscal terminó el 31 de agosto ó 30 de septiembre del 2011, respectivamente. La extensión también aplica a las organizaciones que ya obtuvieron un período inicial de tres meses de extensión para presentar y ahora tienen un plazo de presentación extendido que cae el 17 de enero ó 15 de febrero del 2012. La mayoría de las organizaciones exentas de impuestos no se verán afectadas por esta prórroga, ya que operan en base de año calendario y tienen una fecha límite de presentación del 15 de mayo.

La prórroga aplica a las organizaciones afectadas que presentan los Formularios 990, 990-EZ, 990-PF, ó 1120-POL (en inglés). Los que presentan el Formulario 990-N no se verán afectados. No es necesario presentar ningún formulario para obtener la prórroga del 30 de marzo.

Para evitar recibir un aviso de multa por presentar tarde, debe adjuntar una revelación de motivos razonables a la declaración de impuestos. Si las organizaciones reciben avisos de multa por presentar tarde, deben comunicarse con el IRS para que estas multas puedan ser anuladas. El IRS incita a estas organizaciones a considerar presentar por e-file temprano — antes de finales de diciembre — o esperar hasta marzo para presentar electrónicamente.

Frenan dichos antilatinos ley de Alabama

Alabama.- Durante el debate legislativo sobre la ley antiinmigrante de Alabama, hubo comentarios despectivos hacia los hispanos, por lo que un juez federal decidió aplazar la entrada en vigencia de algunas de sus partes.

Los dos ejemplos que citó el juez correspondían a legisladores demócratas que votaron en contra de la iniciativa de ley, no de republicanos que apoyaron la medida.

El principal impulsor de la ley, el representante republicano Micky Hammon, consideró injusta la decisión del juez. Sin embargo, un abogado que impugnó la medida dijo que la misma mostraba el pensamiento que se tiene de los hispanos en el Congreso de estatal.

El juez federal Myron Thompson emitió una orden preliminar que impide a las autoridades estatales exigir a los ocupantes de una casa rodante que muestren su residencia antes de que consigan el registro anual de su unidad.

Thompson dijo que había pruebas suficientes de prejuicios discriminatorios contra los hispanos que justificaban la decisión que adoptó antes de que emitiera un fallo definitivo.

El juez citó los comentarios que emitieron dos legisladores durante el debate, aunque se abstuvo de destacar que los aludidos eran demócratas o que habían votado en contra del proyecto de ley.

El juez repitió un relato del representante John Rogers de que éste había visto a unos 30 hispanos descender de un vehículo en el área de Hoover.

“Cree que se trataba de un circo. Salián y salían sin parar”, expresó Rogers.

En este contexto, el juez dijo que los comentarios reforzaban el argumento de que el objetivo de la ley, los inmigrantes indocumentados, era más un código de discriminación racial hacia los hispanos.

En tanto, Rogers señaló que él y otros legisladores demócratas negros intentaron retrasar dos días el trámite de la iniciativa mediante táctica legislativa dilatoria para aniquilarla antes de que los republicanos los arrollaran y la aprobaran.

Rogers dijo que su comentario tenía como propósito elogiar la tenacidad de los latinos y el trabajo duro de los mismos aunque reciben bajos salarios.

“Lo que dije es que los hispanos sobreviven porque todos ponen recursos en vivienda y transporte. No lo dije en sentido despectivo”, apuntó.

Por su parte, el representante republicano Hammon expresó su sorpresa de que el juez basara su decisión en los comentarios de dos oponentes contra los proponentes de la iniciativa.

“Es difícil comprender cómo funciona eso”, agregó.

5 mitos sobre la alimentación de tu bebé

Es normal que sigas los consejos de tu mamá, suegra y amigas pero hay patrones y conductas que debes evitar para que tu bebé se desarrolle de manera sana.

Tu doctor es prácticamente la única persona a quien debes escuchar cuando se trata de la alimentación de tu bebé. Hay prácticas que han pasado de generación en generación que pueden poner en riesgo la salud actual y futura de tu hijo. Pon atención y prefiere "quedar mal" con tu tía abuela antes de creer en estos nocivos mitos.

El sobrepeso es bueno

"Un bebé gordo es un bebé sano" es el mito número uno en nuestra lista, por ser el más común y el más dañino para el futuro de tu bebé. No podemos negar que un bebé gordito es hermoso, pero no es saludable: si tu bebé tiene sobrepeso en los primeros años de su vida, lo más probable es que lo tendrá también cuando sea adulto.

El sobrepeso no es normal en los bebés, y si tu hijo sufre de éste debes consultar de inmediato a tu doctor para que te diga qué es lo que estás haciendo mal en cuanto a su alimentación.

La leche y nada más

Muy aparte de tu postura sobre la edad correcta para el destete, tienes que estar consciente que conforme tu hijo crece la leche materna se vuelve nutricionalmente insuficiente por lo que no puede ser el único alimento que tu bebé consuma.

La ablactación (cuando combinas la leche materna con otros alimentos) debe iniciar cuando tu bebé cumple cuatro meses de edad, o tu hijo sufrirá de problemas de desnutrición que comprometerán su buen desarrollo.

Las primeras comidas deben ser dulces

Probablemente has escuchado que en cuanto inicies la alimentación distinta a la leche, las mejores papillas son las que están hechas con fruta. Sin embargo, la realidad es que debes preferir las papillas de verduras.

Si las primeras papillas que tu hijo come están hechas con fruta, su sabor le encantará y comerá de lo lindo... pero cuando intentes que coma las que están hechas con verduras será muy difícil que las acepte porque estará acostumbrado al dulce. Ojo: no se trata de privar a tu bebé de papillas con fruta, sino de iniciar con las de verdura e intercalar las de fruta.

La leche adicionada con Hierro

En el mercado abundan los productos adicionados con Hierro y es importante que sepas que cuando éstos son lácteos (por ejemplo yogures o quesos) el elemento no es absorbido por el organismo, porque "compite" con la absorción de Calcio, y éste último "gana".

Prefiere siempre productos adicionados con Hierro que contengan vitamina C, por ejemplo jugo de naranja, fresa, kiwi, etc.

No jugar con la comida

No seas demasiado estricta con tu bebé y esperes que a la hora de la comida todo sea limpieza y orden. Además de que es imposible, el caos puede traer beneficios para tu hijo.

Recordando no llegar a los extremos, debes permitir que tu bebé toque su comida y "juegue" con ésta, pues es la única forma que tiene de relacionarse en cuanto a textura, olor, forma y color con todo lo que le rodea.


