

Puerto Rico se vuelve más amistoso con los gays

SANJUAN, Puerto Rico, 2 de marzo del 2013 (AP): El avance de los derechos de los homosexuales en Estados Unidos está llegando a Puerto Rico, lo que va convirtiendo a la isla en un sitio relativamente acogedor para la comunidad gay en una región donde las leyes contra la sodomía y el hostigamiento a los son

frecuentes.

El Partido Popular

Democrático en el gobierno promueve un proyecto en la legislatura que prohibiría la discriminación en base a género u orientación sexual, una medida adoptada por aproximadamente la mitad de los estados en Estados Unidos. Otro proyecto haría extensiva la ley sobre violencia doméstica a las

Poco después de asumir el puesto en enero, el gobernador Alejandro García Padilla firmó una orden que extendía el seguro de salud para las parejas de los trabajadores en la rama ejecutiva del gobierno que vivieran con ellos, independientemente de su

Y un popular ex gobernador conservador, Pedro Rosselló, sorprendió tanto a partidarios como a adversarios cuando afirmó el mes pasado que apoyaba inequívocamente el matrimonio entre parejas del mismo sexo.

"Es un momento en que es importante hablar de derechos humanos", dijo Rosselló, quien hace 14 años firmó una ley como gobernador que prohibía el reconocimiento de los casamientos homosexuales formalizados en el exterior.

"A mí me parece extraordinario", dijo Pedro

extraordinario", dijo Pedro Julio Serrano, un activista puertorriqueño por los derechos de los gay. "Hemos llegado a un momento decisivo. Esto es inevitable". "Los temas que se están discutiendo hoy públicamente eran impensables hace unas décadas atrás", afirmó Osvaldo Burgos, vocero del Comité Amplio por la Biásqueda de Amplio por la Búsqueda de Equidad, que representa a más de una decena de organizaciones locales defensoras de los derechos

Los activistas por los derechos de los homosexuales elogiaron que el Departamento de Justicia en la isla esté llevando el juicio de su primer caso de crimen de odio luego del asesinato de un estilista a

quien le prendieron fuego.
Pero la tendencia no ha sido
monolítica. La Corte Suprema de la isla ratificó por estrecho margen la semana pasada una ley que prohíbe que las parejas del mismo sexo adopten niños. Pese a una serie de legalizaciones en Estados Unidos en la última década, las adopciones por parte de dichas parejas siguen estando prohibidas también en muchos estados norteamericanos

Y muchos puertorriqueños siguen disgustados por los cambios. En febrero, grupos eclesiásticos movilizaron a eclesiásticos movilizaron a unas 200.000 personas contra toda iniciativa para extender la ley sobre violencia doméstica a las parejas gay.

El vocero de esa marcha, César Vázquez, dijo que el estado no debía interferir con el matrimonio y la familia. Y

una prominente pastora boricua, Wanda Rolón, dijo que a los niños no se les debe enseñar a temprana edad que pueden existir diferentes tipos de familias, propuesta que el gobierno de García

está sopesando. "Eso es muy peligroso", afirmó. "Les va a despertar unas inquietudes que pueden traer confusión"

"Lo que debemos proteger en este tiempo es fortalecer el matrimonio, fortalecer a la familia", terció Rolón. "Vamos a ser una sociedad mucho más sana".

mucho más sana".

La resistencia a los derechos de los homosexuales era todavía más intensa en la década de 1970, cuando los activistas por dichos derechos protestaron por la ley contra la sodomía y los legisladores aumentaron la pena a diez años de prisión en vez de tres. Muchos homosexuales y

Muchos homosexuales y lesbianas vivían con temor. Un asesino compulsivo en la década de 1980, apodado "el Angel de los solteros", fue vinculado al homicidio de 27

varones homosexuales. La opinión pública se mantuvo mayormente inalterada hasta comienzos de la década del 2000, cuando los legisladores aprobaron unaley contra los crimenes de odio y abolieron la ley de sodomía.

Otro momento clave sobrevino en noviembre del 2009, cuando la policía halló el cuerpo decapitado y parcialmente quemado del studiante universitario Jorge Steven López Mercado, de 19 años, conocido por su trabajo con organizaciones partidarias de la prevención del VIH y de los derechos de

los gays. Poco después, el popular cantante puertorriqueño Ricky Martin anunció que era homosexual. Dijo que no podía mantenerse callado ante ese tipo de manifestaciones de odio, y los legisladores empezaron a considerar proyectos sobre los derechos de los homosexuales. El año pasado el boxeador pluma *Orlando Cruz* al parecer fue el primer boxeador en declararse

abiertamente gay mientras aún participa en los cuadriláteros. "En Puerto Rico por fin se reconoció que la homofobia era un mal social que había que combatir", dijo Serrano, vocero de la Fuerza Especial Nacional de Gays y Lesbianas, con sede en Estados Unidos. "Luego de eso, las cosas empezaron a cambiar rápidamente".

rápidamente".

Muchas otras naciones insulares del Caribe siguen manifiestamente hostiles a la homosexualidad.

Jamaica, Barbados, Guyana y Granada todavía conservan leyes contra la muchos sodomía y muchos homosexuales viven bajo el temor a ser expuestos y a ser víctimas de violencia. Esos temores no son injustificados: pistoleros en mascarados invadieron una cabaña de vacaciones en Santa Lucía en marzo del 2011 y golpearon a tres turistas estadounidenses homosexuales. Dos de cinco sospechosos fueron arrestados.

Un año antes, en Jamaica, la policía halló el cadáver de un activista por los derechos gay, de 26 años, muerto a

Puerto Rico: marchan a favor de "estadidad"

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico, 2 de marzo del 2013 (AP): Cientos de personas en Puerto Rico y Estados Unidos marcharon en demanda de que la isla se convierta en el 51er estado del país.

Los simpatizantes de dicha idea se reunieron el sábado en la capital, San Juan, para pedir que el presidente Barack Obama honre el resultado del referéndum de noviembre respecto al estatus político de la isla. Otros grupos se reunieron en Orlando, Florida, y Washington.

La manifestación coincidió con el 96to aniversario de la ley que garantizó la ciudadanía

puertorriqueños.

A la primera pregunta del referendo, 54% de los votantes dijeron que no estaban de acuerdo con un estatus actual de Puerto Rico, de estado libre asociado.

La segunda pregunta fue para saber cuál estatus preferían los votantes. De alrededor de 1,3 millones de personas que acudieron a las urnas, casi 800.000 apoyaron la llamada "estadidad", es decir, que se convierta en el 51er estado. Unos 437.000 favorecían la libre asociación soberana y 72.560 preferían la independencia. Sin embargo, casi 500.000 dejaron esa respuesta en blanco.





Líder opositor: gobierno miente sobre Chávez

CARACAS, Venezuela, 2 de marzo del 2013 (AP): El vicepresidente Nicolás Madurosalió el viernes al paso a las críticas de un prominente líder opositor acerca de que las autoridades han mentido sobre la condición de salud del presidente venezolano hugo Chávez, y afirmó que contrario a los rumores el mandatario sigue su tratamiento con buen ánimo y fortaleza.

Por la noche, en declaraciones difundidas por la televisión estatal, el vicepresidente reiteró que Chávez, de 58 años, se ha sometido a tratamientos "complejos y duros" luego de la operación a la que fue sometido el 11 de diciembre de 2012 en Cuba, y defendió la actuación del gobierno, al señalar, que ha informado "permanentemente sobre su estado de salud".

Maduro recordó que a finales de enero Chávez comenzó un tratamiento complementario contra el cáncer tras recuperarse de una infección respiratoria sobrevenida como consecuencia de complicaciones después de una delicada la cirugía, y que incluyen quimioterapias.

"A mediados de enero fue mejorando, se pudo controla la infección, pero siguió con los problemas de insuficiencia respiratoria. Después hubo un ejoramiento general, como lo informamos, de todo el cuadro clínico, de sus órganos vitales, de su fortaleza, y los médicos con el presidente Chávez decidieron iniciar los t r a t a m i e n t o s complementarios". "¿Ustedes saben qué son los tratamientos complementarios, verdad? Son las quimioterapias que se aplican a los pacientes

después de las operaciones. Así como él pasó quimioterapias y radioterapias después de las operaciones del 2011 y 2012 y lo informamos de la misma manera", explicó.

Resaltó que en febrero, el mandatario conversó con sus médicos, familiares y su equipo de gobierno y él les dijo, "bueno, he tomado la decisión de regresar a Venezuela, voy a entrar a una nueva fase con los trata a miento a tras en complementarios, más intensos y más duros y yo quiero estaren Caracas, así que hagan todo lo que haya que hacer para regresar a Caracas en condiciones seguras", y así se hizo.

"El comandante nos dio la ordendesiempre informarcado cosa, cada detalle... siempre respetando... la condición humana del paciente que es Hugo Chávez, respetando la condición humana de su madre, de su padre, de sus hijas", añadió.

hijas", añadió.
"Nosotros jamás nos atreveríamos a inventar algo (relacionado con su salud y sus reuniones de trabajo) de un hombre tan puro y transparente como el comandante Hugo Chávez", indicó.

El gobernador del estado Miranda y ex candidato presidencial Henrique Capriles dijo, a través de su cuenta de Twitter, que el vicepresidente Maduro "ha engañado reiteradamente" a los seguidores del gobierno y al resto de los venezolanos sobre lasituación de salud de Chávez, que permanece internado en hospital militar del oeste de la capital, y aseguró que en los próximos días el país "conocerá la verdad".

explican al país en los prox. (próximos) días de todas las mentiras que han dicho sobre la situación del presidente", expresó. Capriles, de 40 años, se enfrentó a Chávez en las elecciones del 7 de octubre de 2012 en las que el mandatario logró una tercera reelección para un sexenio.

Maduro comentó, "como ustedes saben" al gobernante "le hicieron una cánula traqueal para apoyarlo en el tema de la insuficiencia (respiratoria), él se comunica con nosotros por vía escrita y porotras vías que él mismo ha inventado, ustedes saben que el presidente Chávez es muy creativo y ese no se va aquedar de mano para transmitir órdenes, orientaciones, sus preocupaciones".

Resaltó que, contrariamente a las voces de los críticos que dicen que Chávez estaría en un estado crítico y versiones publicadas en medios locales y extranjeros que apuntan a que estaría muerto, el mandatario giana "batalando"

"Tenemos que decirles y ratificarles y reiterarles que los tratamientos que está recibiendo el comandante Chávez son duros; pero él tiene ahorita una fortaleza superiora los tratamientos que está recibiendo y se encuentra en buen estado de ánimo, batallando, recibiendo su tratamiento y bueno, hay que dejarlo tranquilo, tiene derecho a que se respeten sus tratamientos", enfatizó.

Maduro previamente atacó, en cadena de radio y televisión, al diario español ABC y al medio de comunicación colombiano Caracol a los que acusó de ser "fascistas" y de difundir mentiras sobre el estado del mandatario.

También el viernes, el ministro de Ciencia y Tecnología y yerno del mandatario, Jorge Arreaza, afirmó que "el comandante Chávez está batallando, el comandante Chávez le está echando pichón (trabajando duro) y está en el hospital militar de lo más tranquilo con sus médicos, con su familia". Arreaza dijo a la televisora

Arreaza dijo a la televisora estatal, durante un acto en le estado costero de Vargas, que hay una "operación psicológica para confundir al pueblo venezolano" con diversos rumores sobre la condición de Chávez. "Que sepa la burguesía que el pueblo está quieto... dejen quieto al que está quieto, pero que no nos provoquen".

La declaración de Capriles se da un día después que Maduro dijo al país que el mandatario está en el hospital militar "batallando allí por salud. por su vida".

Horas más tarde, una de las hijas del mandatario, María Gabriela Chávez, junto al vicepresidente Maduro y varios de los más cercanos colaboradores, rezaron por la recuperación del enfermo presidente en una modesta capilla construida en pocos días e inaugurada la noche del viernes al lado del Hospital Militar.

María Gabriela, vestida con una chaqueta deportiva verde, se mostró sonriente durante la inauguración de la llamada "Capilla de la Esperanza". Durante la transmisión

Durante la transmisión televisiva de la eucaristía, encabezada por tres presbíteros católicos el rostro de la hija del mandatario sólo fue mostrado unas pocas veces, pero en todas ellas se le vio serena frente al altar. Sonrió al extender la mano para dar la paz a los asistentes y cuando se le dio las gracias por la capilla, cuya construcción ella impulsó. Un pastor protestante también dirigió una oración en el recinto

Decenas de seguidores de Chávez estuvieron concentrados detrás de una cerca que separaba la capilla de la calle, portando fotografías y afiches con su imagen.

Desde que Chávez enfermó de cáncer en junio del 2011, el vicepresidente ha señalado en varias oportunidades que el gobernante está batallando contra su padecimiento.

Maduro declaró en la vísperaque el gobernante "está enfermo porque entregó toda su vida por los que no tienen nada". "¿Saben por qué el

"¿Saben por qué el comandante Chávez descuidó susalud y ha tenido que batallar durante casi dos años siempre al frente al mando de la patria?... Porque se entregó de cuerpo y alma completo y olvidó todas sus obligaciones para con él mismo para darle al pueblo patria", agregó.

El ministro de Comunicación Ernesto Villegas exigió el viernes a la oposición respeto hacia los familiares de Chávez, y denunció que a través de las redes sociales y las páginas de internet "se vienen diciendo cosas espantosas" contra el presidente y su familia, según reseñó la estatal Agencia Venezolana de Noticias.

Maduro dijo el pasado martes que a través de las redes sociales y páginas de internet se estarían publicando fotos y notas de prensa que exponen la vida privada de los hijos del presidente Chávez.

El gobernante retornó el 18 de febrero al país tras pasar 70 días en Cuba donde se sometió en diciembre a una compleja operación por la reincidencia del cáncer.

Durante el proceso de postoperatorio Chávez sufrió una infección respiratoria que luego devino en una insuficiencia que no ha logrado superar. Como parte del tratamiento de la insuficiencia, el gobernante está respirando através de una "cánula traqueal" que le está dificultando el habla temporalmente.

Desde que Chávez viajó a La Habana el 10 de diciembre y luego de suregreso al país no ha aparecido en ningún acto público ni ha emitido declaraciones, lo que ha alimentado las dudas sobre estado de salud. El gobierno difundió el 15 de febrero cuatro fotografías de Chávez recostado en una cama junto a sus dos hijas en Cuba. Son las únicas imágenes que se tienen el mandatario desde que tuvo la recaída del cáncer.

NC farmers want help on immigration solution

RALEIGH, N.C., Feb. 27, 2013 (AP): North Carolina farmers want state legislators to lobby Congress to pass an immigration law overhaul so they can hire more people to work in fields and the state's agriculture industry can meet increasing food demands world-

About 300 people associated with the North Carolina Farm Bureau visited the Legislative Building on Wednesday and held a news conference to discuss a survey of state farmers.

The bureau said farmers are worried about losing income, downsizing operations or in some cases shutting down if a state-mandated E-Verify requirement stays in place without an improved federal guest-worker program.

Companies that employ as few as 25 workers will have to check work authorizations starting this July, although there are exemptions for some seasonal workers.

What does a 'secure' border look like?

Feb. 23, 2013: Once, the mesas and canvons extending east of the Pacific Ocean held the most popular routes for undocumented immigrants heading into the United States. Dozens at a time sprinted across the border into San Diego, passing agents who were too busy herding others to give pause.

Now, crossing would mean scaling two fences, passing a phalanx of agents, and eluding cameras.

The difference, Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano has said, is like "a rocket ship and a horse and buggy."

In pure numbers it is this: Where border agents made some 530,000 arrests in San Diego in fiscal year 1993, they had fewer than 30,000 in 2012.

There is no simple yard-stick to measure border security. And yet, as the debate over immigration reform ramps back up, many will try.

"Secure the border first" has become a litmus test for many upon which a broader overhaul is contingent. As U.S. Sen. Marco Rubio said recently: "We need a responsible, permanent solution" to illegal immigration. But first, added the Florida

Republican, "we must follow through on the broken promises of the past to secure our borders.

In fact, the 1.954-mile border with Mexico is more difficult to breach than ever. San Diego is but one example.

Two decades ago, fewer than 4,000 Border Patrol agents manned the entire Southwest border, Today there are 18,500. Apprehensions, meantime, have plummeted to levels not seen since the 1970s-with 356,873 in FY2012. Compare that to 1.2 million apprehensions in 1993, when new strategies began bring-ing officers and technology to border communities. Sensors have been planted, cameras erected, and drones monitor from above.

But for those who live and work along the boundary, "secure" means different things. In Arizona, ranchers scoff at the idea. In New Mexico, locals worry about what's heading south in addition to flowing north. And in Texas, residents firmly believe that reform itself would finally help steady the flow of people and drugs.

These places have been transformed. Sealed? No. But as one border mayor asked: "How secure is secure?

Over 100 Toledo-area residents greeted the new executive director of the Sofia Quintero Art and Cultural Center (SQACC) —la directora, Juanita Durán— at its First Friday, March 1, 2013, and illustrates how the Center is moving to a new, expanded leadership struc-ture as its board of directors seek to expand program of-

ferings and partnerships.

Ms. Durán previously served as the family program coordinator alongside her mom Tonya, who handled sports programming, when the pair launched the *Believe* Center at the former Aurora González Community Center last year.

Former director Joe Former director Joe Balderas will serve in a newly created role as director of building and grounds. SQACChasa number of com-munity gardens in addition to several buildings.

The two centers forged a

partnership last year when SQACC reached a long-term lease agreement with the City of Toledo on behalf of the Believe Center for its current location. Ms. Durán's salary will be

Ms. Duran ssalary will be funded through a recent grant awarded to SQACC. She stated the Center will need to think "outside the box" on other funding sources. The Centeralsoplans to hire a development direc-tor to seek outside funding and write grants. However, Ms. Durán herself brings some skills that will be uti-lized at the Center: as a licensed family therapist and experienced grant writer.

"I'm really excited about this position because it's a lot of different elements-art and culture," she said. "Also, there are lots of parts about being Mexican and the Latino side. It adds a cool dynamic to the

"Ms. Durán was selected for her education, resourcefulness, passion and commitment to the South Toledo commu-nity," said María Rodríguez-Winter, board of trustees president. "Having worked in Europe and Japan, SQACC is de-lighted that she returned to Toledo where she can not only broaden the direction and progression of the goals of the SQACC organization but also to serve as a significant role model to the youth of the Latino/ Latina community.'

Ms. Durán informed this reporter: "I just want to give back to the Old South End that was so good to me growing up," she said. "I'd like to help bridge the relationship between all the agencies. We all claim the same territory, but we need to work together. There are a lot of people here who need our help, so we need to collaborate.

She will be responsible for the management and leadership of advancing the mission and vision of the organization, enhancing Latino/Latina Art and Culture through education, cultural diversity, glo-bal awareness, stewardship, responsibility, and social equity.

Ms. Durán has done non-

profit work before, but in housing-with Habitat for Humanit vand the National Fair Housing Center in Washington,



D.C. She also worked in foreign countries at various military bases, working with children as a licensed social-worker con-

Ms. Durán earned a master's degree with honors from the University of Toledo, as well as completed an undergraduate degree at Bowling Green State University, with a minor in eth-nic studies. She attended Queen of Apostles School as a child and has an infant 14-month son, *Leandro*, as shown on the cover of *La Prensa*.

"I would like to enhance the programs that fall in line with the mission of the Center," she said. "We will brainstorm ideas for new programs in the next couple of weeks."

SQACC's monthly First Friday also had on display raised flower beds, picnic tables, and birdhouses that are for sale as a fundraiser for the Center, as the multitude savored comida mexicana. A new SQACC website will debut, which will allow supporters to

donate through PayPal.

SQACC will continue to collaborate with the *Believe Center* on projects and programs. For example, a neighborhood cleanup day is set for

May 4 in the Old South End, which coincides with the late Sofia Quintero's birthday. It's also in memory of *Dan Román*, a Believe Center coach who passed away several years ago.

According to Ms. Durán, the Center will continue to take an active role in the Broadway Corridor Coalition, a group of Old South End agencies who banded together to advocate for the neighborhood and share resources.

On a personal level, the new post allows her to carry on the Durán family legacy of commitment to the Latino/ a communities and non-profit organizations. Her family has served in a variety of capacities over the years in the Old South End with groups, such as the Farm Labor Organizing Commit-tee (FLOC, AFL-CIO), Catholic Charities, and the former Guadalupe Center. Henry Ford Community College instructor's mini-grant expands awareness and helps students learn through giving

Dearborn, Feb. 28, 2013: Henry Ford Community College (HFCC) Business and Economics Instructor Jared Boyd received an HFCC Presidential Mini-Grant of \$2,500 from the College in late 2012 to fund "Learning Through Giving," a project that helps students learn about the importance of supporting global charitable organizations that assist people in need.

In recent weeks Boyd has extended this program to make a greater impact on both his students and charitable organizations.

"Learning Through Giving" required students in Boyd's BEC 151: Macroeconomics class to act as a charity board responsible for deciding how to allocate a donation of \$2,500. Students researched international statistics to find nations with a gross domestic product (GDP) per capita of \$2,500 or less. They researched the institutions. cultures and local issues in the impoverished nations, evaluated the nations based on the developed criteria, and decided on a justifiable nation to direct the funds.

In the end, students selected the nation of Niger, in northwest Africa, and the \$2,500 funded two non-profit organizations doing great work in the region. The first organization, Eliminate Pov-Now (http:// eliminatepovertynow.org/), received \$2,000. They invest in poverty reducing projects in various African nations. In Niger they are trying to spread dry land farming technology via a program called Farmers of the Future. The modern farming techniques that are taught improve food production, reduce food insecurity, and increase household incomes

The second non-profit organization is ABC Schools Niger (http:// www.abcschools.org/), which received the remaining \$500. ABC Schools Niger focuses on increasing access to primary school, improving literacy rates, and convincing families of the value in education, especially for young girls in the community.

ness students, will graduate into a global economy and must be knowledgeable of foreign economies including possible emerging economies. 'Learning Through Giving' exposes students to a wide range of national economies, cultures, and issues and focuses on the poor but rising nations," said Boyd, who has taught at HFCC for about eight years.

The "Learning Through Giving" program continues during the current winter semester. This time around, a social media dimension is now available that allows students to post information to share with family, friends and colleagues. This helps increase awareness on the importance of supporting charitable organizations that help people in need throughout the world.

Woman who smoked through hole in throat dies

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 28, 2013 (AP): A woman who smoked a cigarette through a hole in her throat to illus-trate her struggle with nicotine addiction in a Califor-nia public service advertisement has died of cancer health officials and her fam-

ily said Wednesday. Debi Austin died Feb. 22 at Valley Presbyterian Hospital in Van Nuys, according to family friend and spokesman Jim Walker. She was 62.

Austin first appeared on television in 1996, telling viewers she began smoking at age 13 and could never quit. In a quiet, halting rasp, Austin told the camera, "They say nicotine isn't addictive," before inhaling from a lit cigarette held to a hole in her throat.

"How can they say that?" Austin asked viewers, as cigarette smoke wafted from the Called a stoma the hole

in her throat allowed her to breathe after her larynx was

breathe after her larynx was removed at age 42.

The TV spot was "the most-recognized and talked about California tobacco control ad," according to the state health department. state health department.

"Debi was a pioneer in the fight against tobacco and showed tremendous courage by sharing her story to educate Californians on the dangers of smoking," said Dr. Ron Chapman, who heads the health department. "She

was an inspiration for Californians to quit smoking and also influenced countless others not to start.

Four months after the ad, Austin quit smoking _ halt-ing a two- to three-pack-aday habit. She fought various forms of cancer for the rest of her life. She starred in other ads and spent the rest of her life advocating against the use of tobacco.
"True to Debi's spirit,

she was a fighter to the end and leaves a big hole in our hearts and lives. Debi will be remembered fondly by those who love her to be caring, courageous, very funny and always there to offer advice or lend a hand," the family's statement said



Exclusiva AP: Tañón satisfecha tras fin de litigio

MIAMI,20defebrerodel esos errores y hoy me 2013 (AP): Tras meses de pleitos, recriminaciones y acusaciones falsas, Olga Tañón decidió poner punto final a ese capítulo de su vida retirando la demanda contra su ex esposo Igor González tras la disculpa pública que le ofreció el ex pelotero.

"Llega un momento en el que la opinión pública se torna en tu contra y tu familia es la que sufre las consecuencias de unos comentarios dañinos", dijo el miércoles la cantante en entrevista exclusiva con The Associated Press. "Espero no volver a pisar un tribunal en mi vida para no volver a tocar este tema con nadie".

"Durante años me acusó de haber sido la que ocasionó todos los problemas, de no permitirle ver a su hija (Gabriella), que la había tratado de secuestrar y que le robé dinero, lo cual es totalmente falso", relató vía telefónica.

El miércoles en una audiencia en Puerto Rico, en la que se revisaba la demanda interpuesta por Tañón contra González por difamación, incumplimiento de contrato, daños y perjuicios, la cantante decidió retirar el proceso judicial tras la disculpa pública que hizo su ex esposo a través de un comunicado.

"Todo hombre en la vida puede errar en un momento determinado, pero es su deber y responsabilidad enmendar corresponde a mí rectificar. Por eso ofrezco mis sinceras disculpas a la señora Tañón por las acciones y expresiones públicas que, a través de estos años, se han hecho injustamente", dijo el ex pelotero el documento.

JobsOhio: Top salaries paid at Ohio jobs agency

COLUMBUS, March 1. 2013 (AP): An Ohio nonprofit promoted by the governor to create jobs raised almost \$7 million in donations during its first year in business and half of its 26 employees each received at least a \$100,000 salary, records obtained Friday by The Associated Press and other media show.

JobsOhio was created to handle the state's economic development duties, which a state government department previously handled. It was required to submit an audit to the state Development Services Agency by the end of last year.

The independent audit of JobsOhio's operations from July 5, 2011, to June 30, 2012, reported spending of about \$9 million, with most of it going toward program expenses, professional fees, and payroll and benefits.

John Minor, the private nonprofit's president and chief investment officer, received a \$225,000 salary in 2012, far more than Gov. John Kasich's salary of almost \$149,000. Two other staff members also were employed at \$225,000 a year.

The salaries were comparable to other startup economic development agencies, JobsOhio spokeswoman Laura Jones said. And compensation for some top positions was lower than that paid at other agencies, she said.

The nonprofit isn't required to disclose who gave it money or provided in-kind services. But Jones said that companies in the financial services and insurance sectors were among the contributors

JobsOhio also released an annual report Friday said job creation and retention in targeted industries fell from about 83,000 jobs paying \$4.7 billion in 2011 to about 76,000 jobs paving \$3.4 billion last year. The 2012 projects represent commitments to be completed in the next three years

The report also detailed JobsOhio strategy for boosting and keeping jobs in the state. The nonprofit said it is focusing on finding ways to help existing companies expand in Ohio and on attracting business from around the world. The agency also wants to increase its marketing of the state through websites and traditional advertise-

The agency said that in a typical year, 80 percent of newly created jobs come from companies already doing business in Ohio

UPDATED Reminder: Hispanic and Women Farmers and Ranchers Claims Must be Postmarked by March 25, 2013

WASHINGTON, DC: Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack today reminded Hispanic and women farmers and ranchers who allege discrimination by the USDA in past decades that there are fewer than 30 days remaining in the filing period closing March 25, 2013.

"Hispanic and women farmers who believe they have faced discriminatory practices in the past from the USDA have fewer than 30 days left to file a claim in order to have a chance to receive a cash payment or loan forgiveness," said Secretary Vilsack. "USDA urges potential claimants to contact the Claims Administrator for information and mail their claim packages on or before March 25, 2013."

The process offers a voluntary alternative to litigation for each Hispanic or female farmer and rancher who can prove that USDA denied his or her application for loan or loan servicing assistance for discriminatory reasons for certain time periods between 1981 and 2000.

As announced in February 2011, the voluntary claims process will make available at least \$1.33 billion for cash awards and tax

relief payments, plus up to \$160 million in farm debt relief, to eligible Hispanic and women farmers and ranchers. There are no filing fees to participate in the program.

The Department will continue reaching out to potential Hispanic and female claimants around the country to get the word out to individuals who may be eligible for this program so they have the opportunity to participate.



Under Secretary Vilsack's leadership, USDA has instituted a comprehensive plan to strengthen the Department as a model service provider and to ensure that every farmer and rancher is treated equally and fairly as part of "a new era of civil rights" at USDA. In February 2010, the Secretary announced the Pigford II settlement with African American farmers, and in October 2010, he announced the Keepseagle settlement with Native American farmers. Both of those settlements have since received court approval. Unlike the cases brought by African American and Native American farmers, the cases filed by Hispanic and women farmers over a decade ago

judicate the

were not certified as class actions. The claims process provides a voluntary alternative to continuing litigation for Hispanic and female farmers and ranchers who want to use it.



What's going on with legalization and driver's licenses in Michigan?

Recently, there has been a lot of conversation about possible changes in immigration and driver's license laws. There also have been some actual changes that affect small groups of people. Unfortunately, son unclear reports in the media and some dishonest people have created confusion in our communitie Here's what you need to know to protect yourself and your family as of today (February 21, 2013):

- There is no new legalization program. President Obama and members of Congress have been talking a lot about ideas for change, but there are no new laws.
- President Obama announced a temporary program in June 2012 called "Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals" or "DACA." Some people call it the "DREAM Act" but that isn't correct because the "DREAM Act" did not become law. DACA is just a temporary program. It provides temporary work authorization and temporary legal presence for people who came to the U.S. before the program of the provided of the program of the provided of the their 16th birthdays and meet other requirements
- their 10° birthdays and meet other requirements. The State of Michigan began accepting driver's license applications on February 19, 2013, from people who have applied to Immigration for DACA and been approved. These people have valid "work permits." The State of Michigan had previously said it would not give driver's licenses to people with DACA. The rules about driver's licenses in Michigan did not change for anyone else. Everyone in Michigan still has to prove that they are "legally present" to get a driver's license here. The only change is that Michigan is now considering people with DACA to be "legally present" because they actually are. actually are.
- actually are.

 In January, there was a small change in the way that some people who are applying for status through their U.S. citizen family members can have their cases processed. This change starts on March 4, 2013, and it means that some people will have to spend less time outside of the U.S. waiting for a decision on a "hardship waiver" application. We urge everyone who is applying for family members to get high-quality legal advice about the process. Also, everyone should know that when adult U.S. citizens apply for their undocumented parents, those parents are usually not eligible to apply for these kinds of waivers based on hardship to their adult U.S. citizen children. Parents may have to spend 10 years outside of the U.S. if they leave the country for visa processing.

 The best thing you can do to prepare for future changes in the law is to make sure everyone in your family has a valid passport from your home country that is valid for more than one year. You should also save and keep copies in a safe place of all school and employment records. U.S. citizen children should get U.S. passports. It's reasonable for attorneys to charge consultation fees, but we don't recommend paying any fees to anyone who is promising future services that can only be provided if there is a change in the law.

How can I get real answers to my questions?

You should visit a licensed attorney with experience practicing immigration law or a nonprofit organization that is authorized to provide assistance with immigration matters. District to hold film contest for 'Bully X Project 2013'

Wanna be a filmmaker? Well, students in the Cleveland Metropolitan School District can get a taste of making a film if they win "The Bully X Project 2013."

The film contest, part of "Not on Our Watch" (N.O.W.), is another step in the District's yearlong campaign to stamp out bullying behavior in schools. The project encourages students to submit scripts, songs/raps or poems that tell their peers about the negative consequences of bullving.

Among the entries, five schools will be chosen to produce their work in a feature presentation, which will premier at the end of the school year.

To enter, follow these

• Meet with the school's

N.O.W. team and discuss themes, concepts and content

· Create a script, song, rap or poem that is between 3-5 minutes long and illustrates bullying behavior and how students work to decrease the frequency of bullying

Each entrant must complete an entry form and submit it to the school principal by Friday, March Principals will email scripts, lyrics or poems to humanware@cmsdnet.net no later than 11 p.m. on Friday, March 18, 2013.

In the judging, 50 percent of the scoring will be for the message - it must be positive and forward-thinking on how involved students were in the process and on whether the entry includes

N.O.W. as part of its theme.

The concept and approach are 30 percent of the score. They must be unique. Judges will look to see if entrants used innovative ways to convey their mes-

The final 20 percent of the scoring will be for how easily understood is the dialogue.

"Bullying will be eliminated in our schools only if students are empowered to stand up and speak out against bullying behavjors," said Gayle Gadison, manager of Social Studies. "The Bully X Project allows CMSD students to use their voices to educate their neers about the urgency of creating bully-free schools.'

CMSD, ODE clarify process for determining assignment of state oversight

sure the people of Cleveland have accurate information on the process by which state oversight is assigned to public schools that qualify for assistance, CEO Eric Gordon and representatives of the Ohio Department of Education (ODE) have issued separate, official statements to clarify information.

Prior to the release of the official state report cards for Ohio Schools this week. Cleveland Municipal School District (CMSD) officials had been aware that the school district would be assigned the rating of Academic Emergency. based on the District's test score performance in the school year prior to passage of the Cleveland Plan and the Issue 107 school levy. According to CEO

March 1, 2013: To en- Gordon's press release, "We also knew that CMSD would qualify for assistance from an Academic Distress Commission, if that option, is deemed appropriate by ODE.

> "Contrary to an early report that CMSD had been assigned to state oversight. that process of determination for CMSD and other schools that qualify, has not yet begun. CMSD has been assured by representatives at ODE that the first step in the process-a letter to the qualifying districts—has not yet been sent and that, once sent, will not necessarily mean that a Commission will be assigned. CMSD remains optimistic that the district has the 'Right Plan, Right Now' for reforming its schools."

"Because of community's broad support for system-wide reform, courageous, bipartisan support of Ohio's legislators in passing House Bill 525, the overwhelming passage of Issue 107, and the clearly articulated accountability measures outlined in the Cleveland Plan, we have in place the right plan for Cleveland," said Gordon, "I also expect that we will continue to be supported by the Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio General Assembly."

In a separate statement released, Acting Superintendent Michael Sawvers called the Cleveland Plan "an extraordinary step forward" in getting Cleveland's schools back on track and said its potential impact would weigh heavily on ODE's final determination of whether or not to appoint an Academic Distress Commission for Cleveland.
