HACIA FORMULA SAE MICHIGAN 2019

Apoya a estudiantes mexicanos a cumplir su sueño

CIUDAD DE MEXICO, 11 III 19: Estudiantes de nivel superior del *Instituto Politécnico Nacional (IPN)* se encuentran recaudando fondos para participar en la competencia automotriz internacional *Fórmula SAE*, que se llevará a cabo del 8 al 11 de mayo en Brooklyn, Michigan. Con tu ayuda, los estudiantes podrán representar dignamente a México en esta competencia.

"Esta podría ser la primera vez que estudiantes del IPN participen en la *Formula SAE Michigan*", comentó Kevin Uribe, encargado de recursos del

proyecto. "Nos estaremos enfrentando a 150 escuelas a nivel mundial que representan a países con ingeniería bien aplicada. La razón de participar es porque México no tiene mucha ingeniería en cuanto a diseño, somos más un país ensamblador; pero nosotros como ingenieros buscamos la parte de diseño, el mostrar que nuestro país también tiene la capacidad de diseñar, de crear cosas nuevas y llamar la atención de los demás para que inviertan en proyectos como tal, que no nos vean solo como armadores. Queremos crear cosas con la ingeniería mexicana con el ingenio que

nos caracteriza en todo el mundo".

Los estudiantes participarán en la categoría de Motor de combustión interna o eléctrico, donde compiten los mejores del mundo. El equipo estará conformado por estudiantes de nivel superior, posgrado y maestras, de las carreras de ingeniería en mecatrónica, ingeniería mecánica, ingeniería aeronáutica y sistemas automotrices de diferentes escuelas del IPN de la ciudad de México: UPIITA (Unidad Profesional Interdisciplinaria en Ingeniería y Tecnologías Avanzadas), UPIICSA (Unidad Profesional

Interdisciplinaria de Ingeniería y Ciencias Sociales y Administrativas) y E.S.I.M.E (Escuela Superior de Ingeniería Mecánica y Eléctrica). Todos ellos encabezados por el profesor Alfonso Campos.

"Somos una plantilla de 20 alumnos y nos consideramos un equipo pequeño porque hay otros que están conformados hasta por 80 personas, entonces con 20 estamos solventando el trabajo de 80", agregó el entrevistado.

"Nuestro objetivo principal es poner en alto el nombre del IPN y de cada uno de

Detroit: El viernes, 22 de febrero del 2019, el Consulado de Detroit invitó a medios de comunicación, que se desarrollan en Michigan y en Ohio, a una reunión con la intención actualizarlos acerca de futuras actividades.

El Cónsul de México en Detroit, Sr. Fernando González Saiffe, abrió la reunión con una cordial bienvenida y se expresó con palabras amables y de agradecimiento. El Sr. González Saiffe demostró un alto interés en establecer una comunidad fluida con los medios y desea reforzar los lazos de amistad.

También compartió que una de las prioridades del Consulado es tener una colaboración fuerte con la Gobernación de Michigan. Al igual que mantener una relación positiva con el

Servicio de Inmigración y Control de Aduanas de Estados Unidos (ICE, por sus siglas en inglés).

Al igual, durante la jornada, otros representantes dieron un panorama de lo que vendrá. Así lo hizo el Sr. Jesús Gutiérrez, del Departamento de Comunidades. Él dijo que entre el 1 al 5 de abril se proveerá una educación en forma sencilla sobre cuestiones financieras, llamadas "Mas vale estar preparados." Estos talleres tienen como objetivo dar información y herramientas relacionadas a decisiones económicas personales.

eventualmente le dará a quienes atiendan la oportunidad de conocer diferentes sectores de México a través de sus comidas.

Luego, Claudio Uribe, del Departamento de Protección, dio una perspectiva sobre los servicios otorgados. Entre ellos, las visitas a prisiones donde ofrecen más que nada un acercamiento social. "Ofrecemos apoyo para que no se sientan olvidados", dijo el Sr. Uribe. También, en algunos casos, si las personas detenidas requieren asistencia de abogacía, el departamento realiza una evaluación y en conjunto con un grupo de abogados se establece un plan de estrategia. Su departamento también se encarga de Pasaportes de Emergencia, aunque este se ejecuta con ciertas restricciones.

La Sra. Brenda García, del Departamento de

Documentación, dio una breve presentación de los servicios que su departamento ofrece, ya que estos son definitivamente extensos. Entre ellos se encuentra la matrícula de votar, la cartilla militar, las actas de nacimiento, matrimonio y defunción; y mucho más.

Entre otra información compartida, el Consulado está programando varios Consulados Móviles por la región para el año 2019. A través de los cuales se intenta facilitar el acceso de servicios a sus connacionales.

The Greyhound Connection Journal #6

Over the past five weeks, *La Prensa* published stories about the *plight of asylum-seekers* who travel through the Toledo Greyhound bus station. Nightly, a group of volunteers gather to assist and welcome refugees, i.e., asylum-seekers, who witnessed atrocities, experienced torture, and fled violence, poverty, gangs, and drug cartels in their native countries.

Because they fled their homeland to seek asylum in the U.S., they arrive at the bus station without much clothing and lacking basic needs—with only the clothes on their backs and what they can carry.

Just imagine: Fleeing to the U.S. while pregnant or with a child or two, fleeing violence and poverty, and traveling, however you can, north through two or more countries, without money, without your own means of transportation. The families we meet nightly at the bus station arrive from Honduras, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Cuba, Ecuador, Guatemala, Belize, the Dominican Republic, and Venezuela—all tropical, hot-weather climates. They arrive ill-prepared and un-equipped for the challenges and cold weather that lies ahead in the North.

This article is a plea for assistance and/or donations to help and welcome the asylum-seekers.

Items needed:

- *Basic needs* items such as sanitary napkins, diapers, wipes, hand warmers, toothpaste, toothbrushes, hand lotion, and lip balm.
- *Warm Winter Clothing*, such as hats, gloves, socks, coats, and blankets.
- *Food for traveling days on end*, such as breakfast bars, small packages of peanut butter, fruit, coffee, sandwiches/tacos, snacks, bottled water, and Vitamin C (chewable).

- *Educational (bilingual)* card games, toys, books, and anything you would take or want if you and your child were traveling for weeks or months.

Durante las últimas cinco semanas,

La Prensa publicó historias sobre la difícil situación de los solicitantes de asilo que viajan a través de la estación de autobuses del Greyhound de Toledo. Cada noche, un grupo de voluntarios se reúne para ayudar y dar la bienvenida a los solicitantes de asilo que fueron testigos de atrocidades, sufrieron torturas y huyeron de la violencia, la pobreza, las pandillas y los carteles de la droga en sus países de origen.

Huyen de su tierra natal para buscarse en los EE.UU. Llegan a la estación de autobuses sin mucha ropa y escasos de necesidades básicas; solo con la ropa y lo que pueden llevar en sus espaldas.

Solo imagínese: Huir a los Estados Unidos mientras está embarazada o con un hijo o dos, huir de la violencia y la pobreza, y viajar como puedes al norte a través de dos o más países, sin dinero, sin su propio medio de transporte. Las familias con las que nos reunimos, todas las noches, en la estación de autobuses llegan de Honduras, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Cuba, Ecuador, Guatemala, Belice, República Dominicana y Venezuela, todos climas tropicales y caliente. Llegan mal preparados y sinequiparse para los desafíos y el clima frío que se avecina en el norte.

Este artículo es una petición de asistencia y/o donaciones para ayudar y dar la bienvenida a los solicitantes de asilo.

Artículos necesarios:

- *Artículos de necesidades básicas* como toallas sanitarias, pañales, toallitas para la cara y manos, calentadores de manos,

pastadientes, cepillos de dientes, lociones para las manos y bálsamo para los labios.

• *Ropa de invierno*,

- como gorros, guantes, calcetines,

- abrigos y cobijas.

• *Alimentos*,

- como barras de desayuno, paquetes pequeños de mantequilla de maní, fruta, café, sándwiches o

tacos, bocadillos, agua embotellada y vitamina C (masticable).

• *Juegos educativos* como cartas (bilingües), juguetes, libros y cualquier cosa que pueda tomar o desechar si usted y su hijo viajaron durante semanas o meses.

Viernes 8 de marzo en el Centro Chass, ubicado en el 5635 W. Fort St. en Detroit, MI, alas 10:00am se cerrarán las actividades con broche de oro con una feria de recursos como es la defensoría, servicios médicos, asesorías migratorias, entre otros; por parte del Consulado de Michigan.

"Tenemos una jurisdicción grande que abarca Michigan y norte de Ohio, es por eso que estamos haciendo talleres de lunes a jueves en nuestras oficinas y las actividades fuertes las tenemos fuera para poder llegar a los connacionales

de género es porque es un tema importante que requiere la atención de los Consulado y esperamos pronto se puedan sumar otros consulados".

De acuerdo con la experiencia de Uribe en Detroit, ha visto varios casos de mujeres que son víctimas de violencia y en muchas ocasiones no saben que tienen una alternativa para denunciar cuando alguien hace algo en su contra. "A veces ni siquiera saben que son víctimas de violencia. Tenemos un medidor de violencia que se llama violentómetro, el cual mide en una escala de valores los tipos de abuso; el hecho de que tu pareja te prohíba usar cierto tipo de ropa, o que te corrija de cierta manera es el inicio de la violencia que luego puede ejercerse de manera permanente, por eso es importante estar siempre pendientes".

Uno de los testimonios que escucharemos el miércoles 6 de marzo a las 2:20pm por la radio, será el de Brenda García, Cónsul de Documentación. "Es una diplomática mexicana y la intención es que nos pueda narrar desde su perspectiva cuáles son los obstáculos que ha encontrado en su carrera diplomática por el solo hecho de ser mujer. Ella tiene dos años en el servicio exterior y ha visto que el mayor porcentaje de personas que solicitan el ingreso al servicio diplomático son hombres; en ocasiones se debe a que su núcleo familiar no les permite o ven mal salir del país, tener este tipo de vida; es por eso que ella nos va explicar desde su perspectiva cuál es el perfil que tienen las mujeres y los obstáculos a los que se tienen que enfrentar para destacar su igualdad", dijo el entrevistado.

Cabe destacar que esta actividad es una iniciativa del Consulado de México en Detroit y es la primera vez que se realiza. Al respecto, el Vice Cónsul comentó: "Desde octubre del año pasado lo queríamos hacer pero ya teníamos el tiempo encima y por eso lo dejamos para marzo para aprovechar la conmemoración del Día Internacional de la Mujer que es el 8 de marzo. La decisión de hacer una semana de igualdad


para concluir, el Vicecónsul Claudio comentó que esta es la primera vez que se lleva a cabo esta iniciativa por lo que se invita a la comunidad en general a participar y beneficiarse de los servicios. MSU invita a la Conferencia Día de la Mujer 2019: Ella Existe porque Resiste

LANSING, MI: La Universidad Estatal de Michigan (MSU) invita a la 26va edición de la Conferencia Anual Día de la Mujer (DDLM) que se llevará a cabo el próximo 6 de abril [2019] de 8:00am a 5:00pm, en el Centro Kellogg, ubicado en el 219 S. Harrison Ave. East Lansing. El tema de este año es: Ella Existe porque Resiste. Además, se ofrecerán cerca de 30 talleres y muchas mesas de exhibición para que las diferentes instituciones de la comunidad, muestren sus materiales y servicios.

Tammi Cervantes, Co-Presidenta del Comité Organizador de DDLM y Presidenta de *Culturas de las Razas Unidas* (CRU), comentó: "Este año el tema es Ella Existe porque Resiste porque las mujeres de este país, de Latinoamérica y del mundo, pelean por ellas y viven resistiendo siempre a las injusticias, al machismo y muchas cosas más para sobrevivir. Estamos haciendo honor a esa resistencia".

DDLM es coordinada por la Oficina de Transiciones Académicas y Culturales (OCAT) y patrocinada por CRU, así como otros departamentos de MSU, es un evento que se ha convertido

en una fuente de educación y desarrollo para los cientos de personas que atrae cada año. DDLM proporciona un entorno donde se hacen conexiones de redes para oportunidades de empleo y educación para el empoderamiento de las latinas de Michigan.

El objetivo de la conferencia es empoderar, motivar, inspirar, capacitar y trabajar colectivamente para ampliar las oportunidades para las mujeres latinas y todas las mujeres. De acuerdo con la Iniciativa de la Casa Blanca sobre Excelencia Educativa para Hispanas - Latinas en los Estados Unidos (2015), las latinas tienen la tasa más baja de graduación de la escuela secundaria en comparación con otros subgrupos principales y tienen menos probabilidades de completar un título universitario. Además, la tasa de finalización de estudios universitarios es del 19 por ciento en comparación con casi el 44 por ciento de las mujeres blancas.

Muchas de las barreras que dificultan a las latinas se relacionan con la pobreza y el acceso a la salud y la educación. Durante 26 años, DDLM ha estado

difundiendo información y estrategias basadas en datos para los asistentes a través de una serie de talleres informativos, oradores principales y exposiciones. Este año se ofrecerán 28 talleres que se enfocaron en educación, liderazgo, negocios, finanzas, salud, desarrollo comunitario, crecimiento interpersonal y autoempoderamiento.

Cervantes dijo que aparte de los talleres, Rosa Clemente será la oradora principal del evento. "Es una mujer destacada que compartirá con nosotros sus experiencias, ella disfruta de dar pláticas en colegios y participar en diferentes conferencias; de la misma manera, nosotros disfrutaremos al máximo de su presentación".

Rosa Alicia Clemente es una organizadora, comentarista política y periodista independiente. Afro-puertorriqueña nacida y criada en el Bronx, Nueva York, ha dedicado su vida a la organización y el activismo. Rosa es una de las más destacadas de su generación en temas académicos sobre la identidad de Afro-Latinx. Es Presidenta y fundadora de *Know Thy Self Productions*, en donde ha producido siete importantes giras de activismo comunitario y consultas sobre temas como el feminismo del hip-hop, la justicia de medios, el compromiso de los votantes entre los jóvenes de color, la política de terceros, los presos

políticos de los Estados Unidos y el derecho de Puerto Rico a convertirse en una nación independiente, libre de la dominación colonial de los Estados Unidos. Es invitada frecuente a programas de televisión, radio y medios de comunicación en línea, para opinar sobre diferentes eventos actuales. Su artículo innovador, "¿Quién es negro?", publicado en 2001, fue el catalizador de muchas discusiones sobre la identidad política y cultural de los negros en la comunidad Latinx.

Actualmente está completando su doctorado en el W.E.B. Centro DuBois en la Universidad de Massachusetts Amherst. Rosa fue la primera mujer afro-latina en postularse para la Vicepresidencia de los Estados Unidos en 2008 a través del Partido Verde.

Toledo Museum of Art appoints director of special projects to oversee Master Plan implementation

The Toledo Museum of Art (TMA) has appointed John S. Stanley as director of special projects to oversee the Master Plan from design through construction, including project planning, budget development, community engagement, and funding strategies. Stanley started his new role March 4.

Stanley began his career at TMA in 1979 and served as the chief operating officer and deputy/assistant director at TMA from 1987 to 1995 before joining the *Museum of Fine Arts, Boston*, where he served as the chief operating officer (COO) and deputy director for programs and services. Most recently he served as the COO for the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York City.

"We are incredibly fortunate to have someone with John's extensive museum construction experience to shepherd the Master Plan," said Brian Kennedy, the



Museum's Edward Drummond and Florence Scott Libbey director. "We know that he will draw on his past time at TMA, as well as his experience working at museums in Boston and New York City, to provide guidance and build consensus as we prepare the Museum for its next 100 years."

During Stanley's career, he has been responsible for the successful completion of dozens of new construction and renovation building projects including working with three

Pritzker Prize winning architects: Frank Gehry, Norman Foster, and Renzo Piano. Project leadership has included the successful acquisition of required public and agency approvals. Among his responsibilities while at the Whitney was overseeing the construction of its new Renzo Piano-designed building in downtown Manhattan.

"I am excited to have the opportunity to return where I started my museum career and help TMA's leadership bring to life the Master Plan, which offers a wonderful vision for the campus, Museum visitors, and the community," Stanley said.

A graduate of the *University of Toledo*, Stanley earned his MBA from *Bowling Green State University*, attended the Museum Management Institute at the *University of California at Berkeley*, and pursued postgraduate coursework in art history at the *University of Toledo*.

Federal Trial begins in ACLU's Ohio Gerrymandering lawsuit

CINCINNATI: A federal trial started Monday, March 4, 2019 in an ACLU Ohio lawsuit challenging Ohio's gerrymandering. According to the ACLU, "due to an aggressive redistricting operation, Ohio's current congressional map, enacted in December 2011, is gerrymandered to lock in a 12-to-4 advantage for Republican candidates. Although the number of Democrat and Republican voters in Ohio is roughly even, gerrymandering has allowed the Republican Party to secure 75 percent of the seats in the U.S. House of Representatives in every election since the map was drawn."

The ACLU of Ohio, the ACLU, and the law firm of Covington and Burling has challenged that map, seeking to replace it with a new one before the 2020 election. A judicial panel has ruled that the ACLU provided sufficient

evidence in discovery to proceed to trial on the claim that Ohio's map violates the US Constitution.

Freida Levinson, Legal Director for the ACLU of Ohio said, "The map has consistently performed exactly as its architects planned, guaranteeing 75% of the seats to the Republican Party. Not one single seat has changed in all 8 elections – even in the November 2018 "Blue Wave" election. It's critical that the courts remedy this, because obviously Ohio's voters cannot vote themselves out of this situation."

Plaintiffs are the Ohio A. Philip Randolph Institute, League of Women Voters of Ohio, Northeast Ohio Young Black Democrats, OSU College Democrats, Hamilton County Young Democrats, and individuals from every congressional district in Ohio. Named defendants include Ohio Secretary of State Frank LaRose, Ohio House Speaker Larry Householder,

and Senate President Larry Obhof.

The witness list currently includes plaintiffs, political scientists, former state Senator Nina Turner, U.S. Rep. Marcia Fudge, and former U.S. House Speaker John Boehner, among others.

A three-judge panel — Judges Karen Nelson Moore, Timothy S. Black, and Michael H. Watson — is presiding over the trial at Potter Stewart U.S. Courthouse (8th Floor). The trial is expected to run through Friday, March 15.

LCCA Head Start thrilled by federal review

After monitoring the program for a full week last fall, federal reviewers reported that LCCA meets all the stringent requirements, federal performance standards, laws and regulations demanded of the funding.

Fact-finders examined every aspect of LCCA's Head Start program in detail. They found that LCCA intentionally uses data and information to improve teach-

ing, assessments, family engagement and more. The agency was also found to use community partnerships and collaborations effectively in providing resources to Head Start families.

LCCA's work to direct budgetary resources toward areas of highest priority while taking school readiness seriously and providing families with the best possible service was noted.

"The comprehensive nature of this review is a reflection of

so much more than whether we have the correct documents filed away," said Shauna Matelski, LCCA Head Start Director. "Head Start Works in Lorain County because everyone involved with the program does their part on behalf of children and families."

LCCA has operated Head Start in Lorain County since 1966. Head Start is a federally funded, comprehensive child development program shown to promote early childhood wellness, school readiness, and academic achievement. LCCA serves approximately 1,100 children and their families annually.

Cleveland Foundation expands Arts Mastery Initiative to include Tri-C Vocal Program

College receives \$150,000 for program in partnership with Cleveland Public Library

New Tri-C/CSU program changes dynamic for local students

Cleveland State University and *Cuyahoga Community College* (Tri-C®) have launched an initiative that builds on efforts to nurture a college-going culture, broaden access to higher education and increase degree attainment.

The *Degree Link* program will provide students with structured academic pathways to four-year degrees while allowing students to move seamlessly between the two largest higher education institutions in Cleveland. The goal is to improve college access and academic success — a critical component in elevating the region's workforce and increasing economic opportunity.

The program will also boost the efforts of Cleveland's recently announced *Say Yes to Education* initiative, which works to put a college degree within reach of urban high school graduates.

Degree Link was announced at a Feb. 28 event featuring *Tri-C President Alex Johnson* and *CSU President Harlan M. Sands*. It included a signing ceremony for an enhanced partnership agreement between the institutions.

"*Degree Link* amplifies the power of a Tri-C education by providing a clear path to continued academic success at Cleveland State," Johnson said. "This partnership takes another step toward creating greater access and opportunity for area residents while positioning them for degree attainment, higher-paying jobs and

economic stability in their households."

"Numerous students begin their academic careers at a two-year institution with the goal of ultimately transferring to a university to obtain a bachelor's degree," Sands said. "This program will help make the transition easier for students by providing academic assistance and targeted resources designed to help students be best prepared to graduate Tri-C and enter CSU."

Degree Link will chart degree maps showing students the route from an associate degree at Tri-C to a bachelor's degree at CSU. The program includes access to CSU courses, advising services and facilities to assist individuals in meeting that goal. Carefully designed strategies will meet the needs of specific student populations.

The expanded partnership builds on the already strong relationship between the two institutions, which saw more than 5,600 Tri-C students transfer to CSU between 2015 and 2017 alone.

Degree Link will establish clear guidelines for what students must do at Tri-C to qualify for full admission to CSU. It will also leverage the existing cross-registration program to allow Tri-C students to take one course per term at CSU for the second, third and fourth semesters of their associate degree program. In addition, advising and success coaching will support students from the beginning of their studies at

Tri-C through graduation from CSU. Finally, Tri-C students in the program will have access to facilities and services at CSU, including the library, computer labs and recreation center — an arrangement designed to make them feel part of both institutions as they advance academically.

This new collaboration is also a significant component of CSU and Tri-C's efforts to support *Say Yes to Education*. The initiative seeks to revitalize communities by providing every public high school graduate access to college or other postsecondary scholarships. Cleveland became the nation's fourth *Say Yes* city on Jan. 17.

To further opportunities for *Say Yes* students, CMSD graduates attending Tri-C with an intent to transfer to CSU will be given access to KeyBank Scholars Program support staff and resources at the university to maintain momentum toward graduation. In addition, Tri-C and CSU will work with the Higher Education Compact of Greater Cleveland to introduce more CMSD students to the possibilities offered through postsecondary education, with the goal of enhancing higher education enrollment.

"CSU and Tri-C are firmly committed to *Say Yes'* goal of ensuring all urban high school students have the opportunity and ability to obtain a four-year degree," Sands said. "*Degree Link* will help arm our students with the tools they need to accomplish that goal."

Minority Arts and Education Fund announces 2019 grant recipients

More than \$350,000 awarded to 34 minority-led organizations to assist with capacity building

CLEVELAND, Feb. 28, 2019: The City of Cleveland's *Cable Television Minority Arts and Education Fund* (MAEF), a supporting organization of the Cleveland Foundation, has announced that a record 34 Greater Cleveland organizations will receive more than \$350,000 in support of capacity-building and artist fellowships at their respective organizations for 2019.

Established in 1994, MAEF today strengthens and builds the capacity of organizations that promote the arts and cultures of communities of color and provides meaningful creative opportunities for artists of

color. Grants range from \$5,000-\$20,000 for organizations that serve, engage in, and promote the arts and cultures — both traditional and new — of communities of African, Latinx, Asian, Pacific Islander, Indigenous and Middle Eastern descent.

For the first time, the *Cleveland Foundation* contributed to the normal annual disbursement from the fund after the MAEF board approved new guidelines that focus on providing resources to organizations led by people of color. In recognition of the need for equitable funding across systems, the foundation's \$200,000 grant allowed for the largest number of recipients in the fund's history.

"As we mark the 25th anniversary of the program, the Fund

board was extremely encouraged by the 50 percent increase in applicants," said *Courtney Barton*, Cleveland Foundation program manager for arts and culture. "While people of color make up 37 percent of our country, arts organizations led by and serving people of color receive only four percent of institutional funding. We believe increasing the dedicated financial resources available for arts organizations and artists of color will enrich, enliven and energize our region."

MAEF is an endowed fund with assets of nearly \$4 million that provides grantmaking in the local community from investment income. The 2019 grantees are included in the attached PDF and can also be found online.

How ‘completely avoidable’ measles cases continue to climb

WASHINGTON, D.C., Feb. 27, 2019 (AP): The U.S. has counted more measles cases in the first two months of this year than in all of 2017—and part of the rising threat is misinformation that makes some parents balk at a crucial vaccine, federal health officials told Congress Wednesday.

Yet the vaccine is hugely effective and very safe—so the rise of measles cases “is really unacceptable,” said Dr. Anthony Fauci, infectious disease chief at the National Institutes of Health.

The disease was declared eliminated in the U.S. in 2000, which means it was not being spread domestically. But cases have been rising in recent years, and 2019 is shaping up to be a bad one.

Republican and Democratic lawmakers at the House Energy and Com-

merce subcommittee hearing bemoaned what’s called “vaccine hesitancy,” meaning when people refuse or delay vaccinations.

“These outbreaks are tragic since they’re completely avoidable,” said Rep. Brett Guthrie, R-Ky.

“This is a public health problem for which science has already provided a solution,” agreed Rep. Frank Pallone, D-N.J.

Here are some questions and answers about measles:

Q: How dangerous is measles?

A: Measles typically begins with a high fever, and several days later a characteristic rash appears on the face and then spreads over the body. Among serious complications, 1 in 20 patients get pneumonia, and 1 in 1,000 get brain swelling

that can lead to seizures, deafness or intellectual disability.

While it’s rare in the U.S., 1 or 2 of every 1,000 children who get measles dies, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Q: How does it spread?

A: By coughing or sneezing, and someone can spread the virus for four days before the telltale rash appears, Fauci warned.

The virus can live for up to two hours in the air or on nearby surfaces. Nine of 10 unvaccinated people who come into contact with someone with measles will catch it. Fauci called it “one of the most contagious viruses known to man.”

Q: How widespread is measles?

A: In the U.S., the CDC has confirmed 159 cases so far this year in 10 states:

California, Colorado, Connecticut, Georgia, Illinois, Kentucky, New York, Oregon, Texas, and Washington. That compares to 372 cases last year, and 120 in 2017.

But measles is far more common around the world— the World Health Organization said it claimed 110,000 lives in 2017. The WHO says there’s been a 30 percent increase in measles cases in recent years. Unvaccinated Americans traveling abroad, or foreign visitors here, can easily bring in the virus.

For example, a huge outbreak in Madagascar has caused more than 68,000 illnesses and 900 deaths since September. But you don’t need to go as far as Madagascar—common tourist destinations like England, France, Italy and Greece had measles outbreaks last year, noted CDC’s Doctor Nancy Messonnier. Nearly 83,000 people contracted measles in Europe in 2018, the highest number in a decade.

Q: How widespread are measles?

A: Overall about 92 percent of U.S. children have gotten the combination vaccine that protects against measles, mumps and rubella, known as the MMR vaccine. Two shots are required, one

who have no way to know what’s false. Instead, “we need to educate them to show them what the evidence is.”

Q: Why isn’t everyone vaccinated?

A: Some people can’t be immunized for medical reasons—including infants and people with weak immune systems—and most states allow religious exemptions. But while vaccination against a list of contagious diseases is required to attend school, 17 states allow some type of non-medical exemption for “personal, moral or other beliefs,” according to the National Conference of State Legislatures.

In Washington state, lawmakers are debating ending that personal or philosophical exemption, as are several other states. California ended a similar exemption in 2015 after a measles outbreak at Disneyland sickened 147 people and spread across the U.S. and into Canada.

around the first birthday and a second between age 4 and 6. Full vaccination is 97 percent effective at preventing measles.

But the CDC says 1 in 12 children doesn’t receive the first dose on time, and in some places vaccination rates are far lower than the national average. For example, an outbreak in Washington state is linked to a community where only about 80 percent of children were properly vaccinated.

Q: Is the vaccine safe?

A: Yes, said Fauci and Messonnier, who point to decades of use by millions of children each year—and who made sure their own children were vaccinated.

In the late 1990s, one study linked MMR vaccine to autism but that study was found to be a fraud, and Fauci said later research found no risk of autism from the vaccine.

Still, misinformation about MMR safety is widespread. Fauci said the solution isn’t to criticize people
