DETROIT: Más vale estar preparado, cuida tu patrimonio y la integridad de tu familia. Si eres mexicano y vives en Estados Unidos, la Comisión Nacional para Protección y Defensa de los Usuarios de Servicios Financieros (CONDUSEF) cuenta con un portal en internet en donde se puede encontrar entre otras cosas, las opciones para abrir una cuenta de ahorro, enviar dinero a México y cuidar el patrimonio. Así como videos, artículos y otros temas de interés sobre mejorar las finanzas; además de un buzón para enviar dudas sobre el manejo del dinero, entre otras.

Antes de destacar algunas de estos puntos, es importante mencionar que toda persona tiene derecho a recibir un sueldo o prestación por cualquier trabajo que haya realizado, independientemente de su condición migratoria, es decir, sin importar que no tenga permiso de trabajo o un número de seguridad social. En caso de ser detenido, hay que notificarlo con el empleador para que envíe el último sueldo a la nueva dirección, incluso cuando se es deportado. Se puede acudir al Consulado más cercano para recibir orientación o bien, si ya se encuentra en México la persona, puede acudir a la

Relaciones Exteriores. En caso de tener deudas al salir de Estados Unidos hay que cubrirlas, inclusive si es un préstamo personal, lapersonapodríacobrar el dinero aunque el deudor ya esté en México, afectando el historial crediticio para la contratación de créditos y servicios en este país. Si se es sujeto deportación inmediata, se debe guardar un registro de la información del acreedory enviarel pago cuando se llegue al nuevo lugar de residencia.

Jubilación en México

Why Pre-K is Important for Toledo's Children

According to the Ohio Kindergarten
Readiness Assessment, only 18% of Toledo
children enter TPS ready to learn. Too many
of Toledo's approximately 4,000 4-year-olds
are not enrolled in Pre-K programs that
result in successful kindergarten readiness.
Factors such as highly trained, compensated
and supported teachers, evidence-based
curriculum, six hours of enriched learning
time per day, routine developmental
assessments and low teacher-child ratios,
all play an important role in a child's early
learning and development. They help ensure
children will grow, thrive and be ready to
succeed in kindergarten and beyond.

For the child, the first few years are when their brains are developing at a rapid pace. In fact, studies show that from birth to age five, a child's brain develops more rapidly than any other time in life. During this time, a child's cognitive and social development is forming—they learn how to share, how to wait their turn, how to form relationships. They learn how to manage their impulses, emotions and behavior. And they should be introduced to language, reading and math.

There are challenges to offering the kind of high-quality Pre-K our kids deserve. The kind our educators know they need to provide to prepare our children for kindergarten. The kind defined as a 3-star or better rating in the Ohio Step Up to Quality (SUTQ) system.

We know that many of our Pre-K providers are trying to offer the high-quality programming our children deserve, but they simply don't have the budget or other resources needed to increase their SUTQ rating. And, with nearly 40% of our 4-year-olds living under the federal poverty level, many families cannot afford the going rate of tuition-based preschool—even with government funding that helps defray these costs.

When we don't provide high-quality learning experiences prior to age five, we've lost perhaps the greatest opportunity to lay the foundation for a child's success in kindergarten and beyond. A foundation that ultimately sets them up for a successful career and life.

"Providing a high-quality early childhood education for our youngest citizens is essential for their educational success. Research has consistently shown that these early years hold the greatest potential for optimal cognitive and social development, resulting in long-term positive outcomes. When we invest in our community's children through education, we are investing in a strong future for our next generation."

According to the Washington Center for Economic Growth, "Pre-K programs are among the most effective public investments. For every \$1 invested in early childhood education, there is up to \$8.90 returned to the community." Over half of the nation's largest cities, and every other major city in Ohio, now have publicly funded Pre-K programs.

The United States Department of Education, in A Matter of Equity: Preschool in America (April, 2015), noted that 'studies show that children who attend high-quality preschool programs are less likely to need special education services and be held back a grade

level. They are also more likely to graduate from high school, attend college and have successful careers." In addition, there is a direct correlation between poverty, crime and lack of educational attainment.

Unfortunately, there are currently 13,992 children (from birth to age 5) in Lucas County who are living below the poverty line. High-quality early childhood education helps break generational poverty and transforms communities. Kids who attend high-quality early childhood education programs throughout their youngest years, and in particular attend Pre-K, are more likely to succeed throughout their educational career.

"No matter a person's age, relationships matter. A high-quality Pre-K experience is important for children so they experience life with others. Skills such as communicating, problem solving, listening, disagreeing, persevering, valuing self and others, thinking, deciding and caring will be capabilities that will be with them forever."

TOLEDO: The list of those seeking to become the 46th Lucas County, Ohio sheriff is the longest and most diverse on the ballot March 17th for Lucas County residents. There will be five Democratic candidates vying for the party nomination during the March primary, including a lone Republican.







Terra State holds sixth annual women's leadership forum

FREMONT, Ohio, March 6, 2019: Courage, mentorship, leadership and education were just of few of the prevailing themes at the Terra State Community College 2020 Women's Leadership Forum held Wednesday, March 4, 2020. Over 150 women from area high schools, colleges, and businesses attended the sixth annual event.

Kay Reiter, Sandusky County Commissioner and Terra State Board of Trustees Chairperson, kicked off the event. Her opening remarks encouraged the women in the room to "get involved young, stay true to yourself and make a difference."

Ann Sergent, Terra State's Dean of the Liberal Arts and Business Division, served as the Master of Ceremonies. She said this year is the 100-year anniversary of the passing of the 19th Amendment, providing women the right to vote. She gave advice to share experiences, speak what's on your mind, listen, be confident, inspire and encourage others and acknowledge your weaknesses.

To finish her remarks, she said, "As you move forward in your journeys, remember to be courageous." Following Sergent's opening remarks, attendees had the opportunity to talk and discuss leadership with business leaders seated at their table during lunch.

The highlight of the forum was the panel discussion that featured three women who have demonstrated what leadership is in their chosen fields. The panelists were Barbara Sears, partner in Strategic Health Care; Jessica Anguiano, project controller at SSOE Group; and Haley Crabtree, Associate Professor in Computer Systems at Terra State.

Sears was expected by her family to become a teacher. After obtaining a degree in education, she decided that was not the career path for her and went on to attain a paralegal degree. After working in the field, she, again, felt she needed to do something different. While in a temporary position at a health insurance agency she fell in love and went on to pursue an insurance

Ms. Anguiano was also expected by her family to

become a teacher, but after earning her degree and working for three years as an infant/toddler teacher, she knew she wanted something different. That's when she came back to school and was advised by one of her mentors to major in Architectural/Construction Management. She graduated, transferred her credits and earned a bachelor's degree in Construction Management. Thanks to her internships while in college, she was able to begin her career in construction, which led her to where she is now.

Ms. Crabtree was encouraged by her parents to find a nontraditional career. She began her journey as a Tech Prep student in high school and went on to graduate from college with a bachelor's degree in Computer Information Systems. After working as a programmer, she decided to attain a master's degree. She eventually began teaching adjunct classes and this is how she found her passion in teaching.

Each panelist took the opportunity to talk about their path to their current positions in the workforce, what roles



mentors played in their success, where education fit into their journey, and advice they wish they had when they began their careers. Ms. Anguiano said, The hands-on experience is how you learn what you like and what you want to do." Ms. Crabtree added, "Being involved, networking with other people and taking advantage of co-ops and internships is a great way to give you an advantage." Ms. Sears said, "Put your right foot in front of your left foot and ask for the opportunity. Use your voice."

After the panelists gave

their advice, Lakota High School Guidance Counselor Nancy Slotterbeck spoke about the new women's group she started at Lakota called the Women's Leadership Council. After attending last year's Women's Leadership Forum, she felt inspired to create this group for students and mentors to encourage one other and make a difference at their high school. She described some of the projects the group accomplished over the year, including spreading positive messages through announcements and a "stall talk" newsletter and providing courtesy baskets with feminine hygiene products in the women's restrooms.

The students who attended the forum enjoyed the experience. Mia Kuzma, a junior from Danbury High School, said her primary take away was, "Don't tell people what you can and can't do." Érika González, a junior from St. Joseph Central Catholic High School, said the forum 'encourages women to better themselves and help other people in their community.

Ohio, Michigan have March primaries with early and/or absentee ballot voting available

March 10, 2020: Latino voters have made their voices heard early in the presidential primary with early voting or absentee voting in both Ohio and Michigan for some time.

While most of the presidential politics is focused on the early voting states of Iowa, Nevada, New Hampshire and South Carolina, the bellweather Midwest may decide who stays and goes.

Michigan's primary is today with voting for the presidential candidate of choice and for several local issues, while Ohioans vote just one week later—on St. Patrick's Day-March 17.

Early, in-person voting is underway across Ohio. Increasing numbers are taking advantage of the convenience to avoid long lines on primary voting day. Lucas County is just one of three boards of elections state-wide to designate an early voting center, which is located in the Ohio Means Jobs Building, 1301 Monroe St., Toledo. Other early voting occurs at county boards of elections.

Early voting is avail-

days in Ohio. However, early voting also will occur on Saturdays March 7 and 14, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Sunday, March 15, 1 to 5 p.m., and Monday, March 16, 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Ohioans also can request an absentee ballot to be cast by mail, but those requests must be made by noon on Saturday, March 14, The deadline for voter registration for the March primary already has passed. Complete information, including an Ohio absentee ballot is available at the Secretary of State website: https:/ /www.sos.state.oh.us/.

This is the first presidential primary election in Michigan where voters can request an absentee ballot for any reason. However, there is no early, in-person voting in Michigan. Absentee ballots must be requested directly from local clerks and returned in person or by mail by 8 p.m. on the day of the primary.

Michigan voters approved Proposal 3 in 2018, which removes any caveats to requesting an absentee ballot. However, registered voters still have to request a Republican or Democratic absentee ballot in

able 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. week- order to vote in the presidential primary. There is also a nonpartisan ballot available—but there only will be ballot proposals and no candidates on that ballot.

That doesn't mean Michigan voters have to register their political party. However, the presidential primary is the only election where voters have to publicly state their political preference and that information becomes a public record. Prior to the 2018 election, voters had to give one of six reasons to be eligible to vote absentee.

Local clerks reported immediate and dramatic absentee voting results when the new law went into effect last yeareven doubling and tripling the number of people who voted absentee. The presidential primary is only expected to see those numbers explode even more.

For the traditional voter, March 10 primary voting hours at local polling precincts in Michigan will be 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Presidential primary voting hours in Ohio run 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.


