

México obtiene su tercer título Miss Universo

CIUDAD DE MÉXICO, 17 V 21 (AP): En una noche marcada por preguntas sobre la pandemia, y tras más de un año de ausencia del certamen internacional de la belleza, Miss México Andrea Meza fue coronada Miss Universo, dándole a su país por tercera vez el título.

Meza, de 26 años, superó el domingo a las semifinalistas de Brasil, Perú, República Dominicana e India tras responder qué habría hecho en caso de haber sido líder de su país durante la pandemia.

"Creo que no hay una forma perfecta de manejar una situación tan difícil como el COVID-19, pero creo que lo que yo habría hecho es un cierre antes de que todo se hiciera tan grande", dijo, en inglés. "Porque hemos perdido tantas vidas y no podemos permitirnos eso, tenemos que cuidar a nuestra gente, por eso yo la habría cuidado desde el principio".

Con más de 220,000 muertes por COVID-19, México es el cuarto país con mayor número de víctimas fatales del virus en el mundo, después de Estados Unidos, Brasil e India.

En otra oportunidad para hablar con el jurado en el Seminole Hard Rock Hotel & Casino en Hollywood, Florida, la espiada concursante de 1,80 metros



fue ovacionada por el público al responder cuáles eran para ella los estándares de belleza en la actualidad.

"Así como hemos avanzado como sociedad, también hemos avanzado en los estereotipos", dijo esta vez en español. "Hoy en día la belleza no radica solamente en cómo nos vemos. Para mí la belleza radica en nuestro espíritu, en nuestra alma y en los valores con los que nos manejamos. No permitan nunca que alguien les diga que no tienen valor".

Meza, la 69na Miss Universo, es la tercera mexicana en ostentar el título después de Lupita Jones (1991) y Ximena Navarrete (2010). Estudió ingeniería en sistemas y trabaja como activista por los derechos de las mujeres, además de promover el turismo en su estado natal, Chihuahua. También ha recaudado fondos para personas de escasos recursos en India, Indonesia y China. Es una maquillista certificada, modelo y vegana.

Sucede a Miss Universo 2019, la sudáfricana Zozibini Tunzi, quien por motivos de la pandemia tuvo el reinado más largo de la historia, pues el concurso no se celebró en 2020. Tunzi dijo que trató de aprovechar al máximo su tiempo como Miss Universo, a pesar de que fue muy atípico porque no pudo viajar por el mundo como suelen hacer las ganadoras.

"Nunca imaginé que habría una pandemia de talla

espectadores que no olviden la crisis que atraviesa su país: "Nuestra gente está muriendo y recibiendo disparos todos los días", dijo en el clip. "Les pediría a todos que hablen sobre Myanmar".

El jurado, en su totalidad femenino, estuvo integrado por la actriz y empresaria Arden Cho, la ex Miss Universo Brook Lee, la presidenta de la compañía de cruceros Carnival Christine Duffy, la empresaria de belleza Deepica Mutyala, la presentadora y autora Keltie Knight, la directora general de Mary Kay Inc. Sheryl Adkins-Green, la empresaria colombiana de entretenimiento Tatyana Orozco y la ex Miss Universo puertorriqueña Zuleyka Rivera.

La gala contó con un número musical del astro boricua Luis Fonsi y tuvo como anfitriones a la ex Miss Universo Olivia Culpo y al actor Mario López. Las ex Miss Universo Paulina Vega de Colombia y Demi-Leigh Tebow de Sudáfrica participaron como presentadoras.

Otras concursantes latinoamericanas lograron destacarse. El grupo de 10 finalistas incluyó también a las representantes de Puerto Rico y Costa Rica.

A summer of music: camps can train, inspire young musicians

Busy schedules during the school year often limit time spent on music education, but summer music camps can offer a rare chance for kids to try a new instrument or deepen their knowledge of one they're already studying.

Camps range widely depending on a child's age and level of expertise and commitment, as well as by musical genre.

For beginners and younger children, half-day to full-day camps lasting a week or two are often best, program organizers say.

For older kids, particularly those with a higher level of experience, sleepaway music camps—many of which require an audition tape—can be transformational. The value of these camps, music educators say, is as much about the chance for students to bond with other kids passionate about music as it is about the intensive teaching and performance opportunities.

"Our major summer program is quite intensive and is really a sampling of all that our undergraduate program has to offer. It's five weeks long and is not at all a 'dip your toe in the water' sort of a summer camp," explains Oisín McAuley, director of summer programs at Berklee College of Music in Boston.

"These are kids who are extremely serious about music and are already preparing for ca-

reers in music," he says. "At \$9,000 (for tuition and housing), it's a very expensive program, but the level of confidence they gain is extraordinary. They quickly find they are among their own tribe, and they leave here knowing that they have performed with some of the best musicians in the world and can hold their own at that level."

While Berklee does not require an audition tape, many advanced summer music camps do. For priority selection, audition tapes are generally expected by February or early March deadlines, "although if we receive an application from a great double bass player after that and we have room, we won't turn them away," says Janet Morris of *Interlochen summer camps* in Michigan.

Interlochen Center for the Arts offers camps for kids who have completed third grade through 12th grade, and all the camps are sleepaway. Campers stay in cabins on two large lakes. That rustic atmosphere is as much an attraction as the music training, Morris says. Interlochen camp "majors" include music, creative writing, theatre, dance, motion picture arts and visual arts.

For younger kids and those who aren't as advanced or committed, shorter music day camps "can be a great chance to learn and to improve," says McAuley, "and also to get a better feel for how interested you are about an instrument."

"But if you're trying a

music camp for the first time and have any hesitation whatsoever, a shorter, less intensive music summer camp may be a better choice," he says.

While Berklee's focus is on contemporary music genres, other music summer camps specialize in classical, jazz, rock or folk, and many offer a range of arts classes in addition to music.

"We offer four summer camps for kids of different ages. Three are multidisciplinary arts camps, and there's also Fiddle Camp, for 7-through 12-year-olds with experience on the fiddle," says Alicia Manson of *Old Town School of Folk Music* in Chicago. All are day camps, and most are divided into two-week sessions, she says.

"Every year around this time, parents ask about which music camp is a better fit for their kids. It's a good thing to consider, and an important conversation to have, because fiddle camps, for example, are pretty intensive, and even if your child has the necessary prerequisites under their belt, they may not be ready or happy about that level of intensity," she said.

Area summer camps include: *Toledo Symphony School of Music Classes* and *Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C)* [Cleveland].

Camps for the kid who loves science, tech, engineering, math

For kids whose dream summer camp involves more coding than canoeing, more technology than tennis and more science than swimming, *STEM summer camps*—once considered a contradiction in terms—are popular and plentiful.

The camps, ranging from private half-day camps for younger children to longer sleep-away camps for teenagers, cater to kids who are passionate about STEM subjects (science, technology, engineering and math) or who just love immersing themselves in projects involving thinking creatively and problem-solving.

"We're definitely seeing a lot more summer programs that focus on science, technology, engineering and math, and also programs that combined those elements with art," said Kathy Heraghty, program director and founder of *Destination Science*, based in Orange, California. The group, which began in California in 2000, now runs summer camps for children ages 5 to 11 in five states.

"The education system is slowly coming around to putting more emphasis on the sciences,

and parents are also beginning to change some pretty old-fashioned ideas about summer camps and also about science, which is about way more than data and Bunsen burners," she said.

STEM-oriented summer camps often include more traditional summer pursuits like swimming and crafts, but the focus is on the fun of "thinking like a scientist" in more depth than is often possible during the school year.

"We focus on things that are playful and fun and that kids can connect to, like building a really cool car with a solar cell," Heraghty said.

For older kids looking for a sleep-away experience, options include *BEAM Camp*, in Stafford, New Hampshire, which offers three-and-a-half-week camps for kids ages 10 to 17.

"We're a camp about making things and bringing ideas to life," said co-founder Brian Cohen, who shuns the STEM label because, he said, the emphasis should be on the human side of things and "fashioning physical reality," not on abstract concepts.

"We give kids the experience of making a big idea

happen on their own. Last summer, the kids in one session built a 30-foot kaleidoscope, and another session built a boat powered by a human-size hamster wheel," he said.

In addition to building and problem-solving, campers swim daily and spend time with chefs, artists, architects and engineers to help broaden their ideas about creative career options. The camps, open to boys and girls, have a hefty \$5,200 price tag, but Cohen said about 40 percent of campers receive partial or full scholarships.

STEM summer camps in the area include *Michigan Science Center* (Detroit), *Great Lakes Science Center's Camp Curiosity* (Cleveland), *Horizon Science Academy* (Cleveland), *Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C)* (Cleveland), *Imagination Station* (Toledo), and *University of Toledo's Cosmetic Science and Formulation Design* (Toledo).

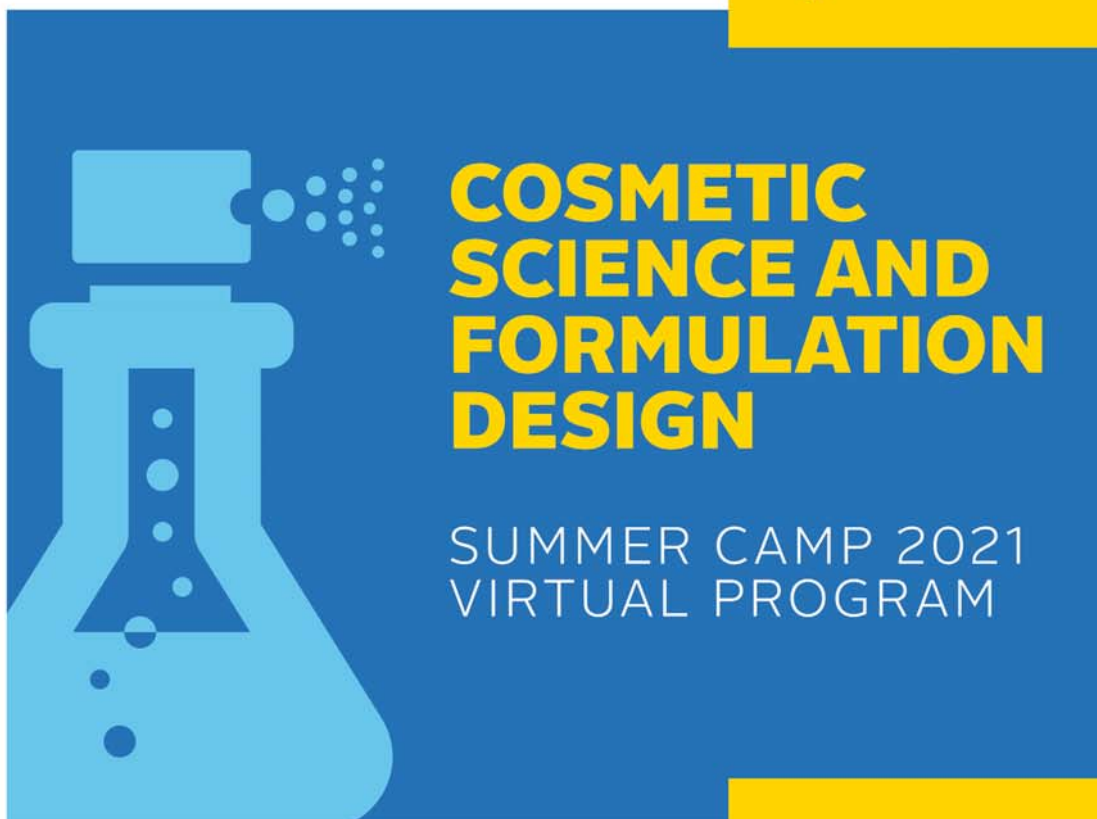

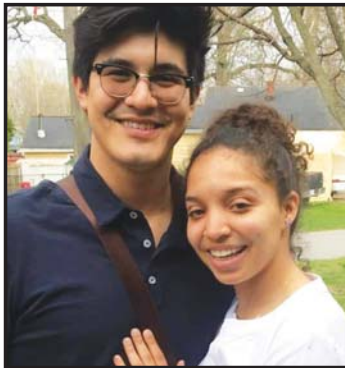

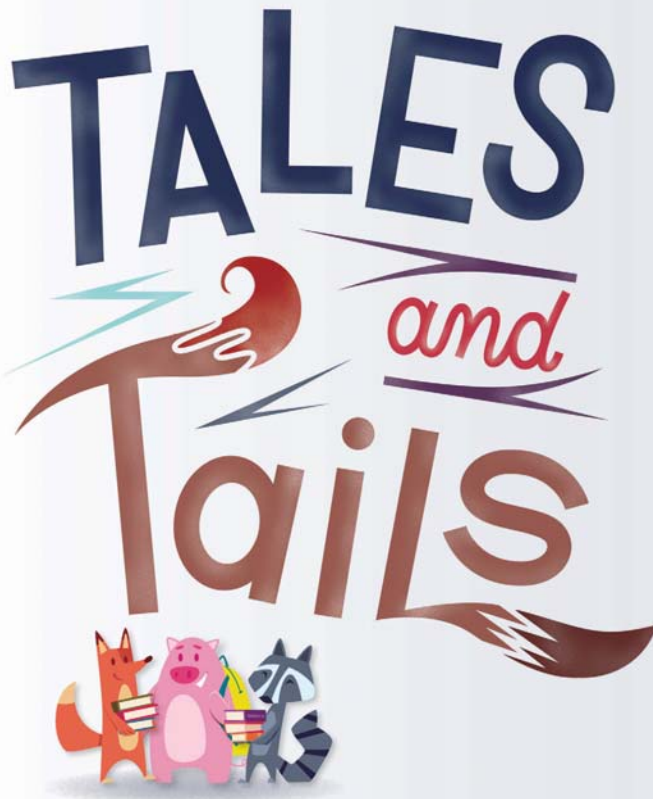
