Electronic music innovator comes to Toledo Museum of Art

The Toledo Museum of Art (TMA) welcomes electronic producer *Jlin* to a one-of-a-kind performance in the Museum's GlasSalon Thursday, Feb. 20, 2020. *Jerrilynn Patton*, known as *Jlin*, is one of the most prominent women producers working today.



Jlin grew up in the steel manufacturing town of Gary, Indiana, just 20 miles from downtown Chicago. Her early fame came in the genre of footwork, a high-tempo house/club dance style born in Chicago clubs. She began her career using music samples to construct her tracks, but today her compositions are built of entirely original sounds that *Jlin* herself creates. She makes a practice of discovering new styles and taking on new projects that result in sounds and scores unlike any she's created before. For example, recent projects include an original score for

British choreographer Wayne McGregor's group-performance piece *Autobiography*, and a commission for the Kronos Quartet.

With fewer than 200 tickets available to the concert, TMA encourages fans of electronic music to invite their friends and families to experience the genre in the beautiful and non-intimidating environment of the GlasSalon.

"*Jlin* brings her life experiences, from her days as a steel worker to her close relationship with her family, into her immersive performances," said *Scott Boberg*, TMA manager of programs and audience engagement. "Her

charm and openness with the audience will make this a wonderful experience in an intimate setting. The Museum is thrilled to offer its visitors the chance to experience the work of an important voice in the electronic musical landscape."

Llegan a Guatemala dos familias migrantes desde

CIUDAD DE GUATEMALA, 12 XII 19 (AP): Dos familias de migrantes centroamericanos fueron enviadas el jueves de Estados Unidos a Guatemala.

En este país se percibe que la llegada de éstas y otros migrantes de la región ocurre bajo un acuerdo bilateral que coloca a Guatemala como "tercer país seguro" para recibir a los migrantes detenidos en el norte y que habrían solicitado asilo en Estados Unidos. Sin embargo, autoridades estadounidenses han dicho que los migrantes enviados a Guatemala no tienen casos de asilo abiertos en su territorio.

La Dirección de Migración local confirmó la llegada de 14 migrantes, siete de Honduras y siete de El Salvador, grupos en los que se incluye a dos familias, cada una con un menor de edad. Junto a los migrantes también fueron deportados 119 guatemaltecos, todos provenientes de El Paso, Texas. Los centroamericanos trasladados el jueves se suman a los diez que habían llegado durante las dos semanas pasadas.

Según el Ministro de Gobernación, Enrique Degenhart, todos los hondureños y salvadoreños que llegaron el jueves decidieron no aplicar al asilo y solicitaron su traslado a sus respectivos países. Del total de 24 personas que han sido trasladadas, sólo dos han solicitado protección en el país, dijo el ministro.

El gobierno guatemalteco no provee de nada a los migrantes que arriban al país, ni trabajo, ni alojamiento, aunque el trámite de asilo suele durar

meses. La Organización Internacional de las Migraciones (OIM) y ONGs como Refugio de la Niñez y Casa del Migrante han provisto de alimentos, cuidado médico, albergue o traslados a sus países a quienes lo requieran.

La llegada de las dos familias de migrantes coincide con la presencia en Guatemala de Chad F. Wolf, secretario interino del Departamento de Seguridad Interna estadounidense, que se reúne con los ministros de seguridad Guatemala, Honduras y El Salvador.

Al finalizar, Wolf calificó de éxito importante la reunión sostenida con sus homólogos en el esfuerzo por incrementar la seguridad fronteriza, la migración irregular y contrarrestar las organizaciones criminales transnacionales que afectan la prosperidad en la región.

"Específicamente hemos desarrollado los próximos pasos para implementar completamente nuestros anteriores acuerdos, identificar nuevas oportunidades para promover nuestros objetivos compartidos, proteger a nuestras poblaciones más vulnerables y mantener y reducir aún más los flujos migratorios ilegales; proporcionar vías para que los solicitantes de asilo legítimos busquen protección más cerca de casa", dijo Wolf.

El secretario anunció la firma de un acuerdo con El Salvador sobre el Programa Conjunto de Seguridad (JSP por sus siglas en inglés), el cual

dijo que aseguraría los sistemas de aviación salvadoreños de los pasajeros vinculados al terrorismo, narcóticos, armas y contrabando de divisas.

Wolf expresó que desde junio se han firmado 12 acuerdos operativos de seguridad conjunta con Guatemala, Honduras y El Salvador. "Como resultado de los esfuerzos de nuestra administración, incluidas nuestras asociaciones regionales, migrar ilegalmente a los Estados Unidos nunca había tenido tan pocas probabilidades de éxito", aseguró.

A preguntas de periodistas sobre un video publicado por la organización Pro Pública en la que se ve al menor guatemalteco Carlos Gregorio Hernández en agonía y sin recibir asistencia médica por parte de la patrulla fronteriza que lo tenía bajo su custodia en mayo pasado, el secretario dijo que había sido una muerte trágica y que el caso estaba bajo investigación.

El ministro Degenhart dijo que uno de los acuerdos alcanzados en la reunión fue la creación de una unidad regional especializada en el área de investigación criminal que va analizar los delitos financieros cometidos por organizaciones transnacionales que se dedican a la trata de personas. Agregó que se invitará a participar a México, Costa Rica y Panamá al combate de las organizaciones que trafican con personas.

Evo Morales satisfecho de residir en Argentina

BUENOS AIRES, 12 XII 19 (AP): Dos días después de la asunción del peronista Alberto Fernández como presidente, el exmandatario boliviano Evo Morales llegó a Argentina donde solicitó residir como refugiado político.

"Hace un mes llegué a México, país hermano que nos salvó la vida, estaba triste y destrozado. Ahora arribé a Argentina para seguir luchando por los más humildes y para unir a la Patria Grande. Estoy fuerte y animado. Agradezco a México y Argentina por todo su apoyo y solidaridad", publicó Morales en su cuenta de Twitter poco después de pisar suelo argentino.

Morales -quien dejó el poder el 10 de noviembre en medio de protestas sociales y presionado por la falta de apoyo de la policía y las fuerzas armadas- arribó en la mañana al aeropuerto internacional de Ezeiza, en las afueras de Buenos Aires.

El ex gobernante llegó procedente de Cuba, donde estuvo en los últimos días por una consulta médica. Previamente estuvo asilado en México con el apoyo del presidente Andrés Manuel López Obrador, con quien se mostró muy agradecido.

Morales residirá en Argentina junto a sus dos hijos, que llegaron a Buenos Aires el 23 de noviembre tras permanecer en la embajada de México en La Paz.

Acompañando a Morales arribaron el vicepresidente Álvaro García Linera; el ex canciller Diego Pary Rodríguez; la ex ministra de Salud Gabriela Montaña y el ex embajador de Bolivia ante la Organización de Estados Americanos (OEA) José Alberto González, quienes también hicieron

el trámite para ser aceptados como refugiados.

El canciller argentino Felipe Solá indicó que no se sabe aún dónde residirá el exmandatario. "Lo va a tener que comunicar en el pedido oficial de refugio... él se siente mejor acá que en México, que está lejos, y sus dos hijos están acá", dijo el funcionario al canal de cable Todo Noticias.

Argumentó que un refugiado "tiene temores fundados de ser perseguido por distintos motivos" y requiere de la protección que no tiene en su país. "Si no nos ocupáramos de él rápidamente corría peligro su vida", subrayó Solá, quien indicó que el exmandatario "viene para quedarse".

Asimismo puntualizó que Morales debe asumir "el compromiso de no hacer declaraciones políticas en la Argentina".

El gobierno de la presidenta interina de Bolivia, Jeanine Áñez, acusa al líder indígena de sedición y terrorismo tras un mes de convulsión social en el país andino que dejó al menos 32 muertos.

La canciller boliviana Karen Longaric expresó en una rueda de prensa que espera que el gobierno argentino "cumpla las normas internacionales referidas al asilo o refugio político... no queremos que ocurra como en México donde Evo Morales tenía micrófono abierto y una palestra".

La llegada de Morales y sus acompañantes se mantuvo en la mayor reserva.

Es esperable que los recién llegados consigan la condición dada la cercanía de Morales con Fernández, uno de los dirigentes de centro izquierda de la región que más le ha expresado su apoyo.

La Comisión Nacional para los Refugiados integrada, entre otros, por funcionarios de varios ministerios y del Alto Comisionado de las Naciones

Unidas para los Refugiados, decide la concesión de ese estatus. Si la solicitud es rechazada por la comisión, puede ser apelada ante instancias administrativas, judiciales y en última instancia definida por las autoridades de migraciones.

Ningún refugiado puede ser expulsado o extraditado a otro Estado si hay razones para creer que estaría en peligro su vida y libertad.

El antecesor de Fernández, el conservador Mauricio Macri, no había reconocido formalmente a Áñez pero evitó calificar lo sucedido en Bolivia como un golpe de Estado como hicieron otros líderes políticos regionales.

Solá dijo que no está programada para el jueves ninguna reunión de Morales con el presidente argentino, quien abogó por que el líder indígena viajara a México para ser asilado por el gobierno de López Obrador.

"Paranosotros en Bolivia hay un gobierno de facto", sostuvo Solá y puntualizó que se apuesta a la pronta celebración de elecciones en ese país.

Según la canciller boliviana "por nuestros amigos" se supo que Morales viajó de Cuba a Buenos Aires en una aerolínea mexicana.

Morales renunció cercado por las protestas en rechazo al supuesto fraude en las elecciones del 20 de octubre en las que buscaba su reelección para un cuarto mandato. El exmandatario ha negado que hubiera irregularidades pese a que una auditoría de la OEA detectó manipulación y falsificación de las actas electorales para favorecer al ex gobernante.

Bolivia y CIDH acuerdan investigar muertes por crisis

La Paz, Bolivia, 12 XII 19 (AP): El gobierno interno de Bolivia y la Comisión Interamericana de Derechos Humanos (CIDH) acordaron realizar una investigación internacional profunda sobre las muertes de 36 personas en las fuertes protestas poselectorales.

La decisión se da a dos días de que el organismo presentara un informe preliminar que criticó el uso de la fuerza del gobierno de la declarada presidenta interina, Jeanine Áñez. Posteriormente, su administración lo rechazó.

La canciller Karen Longaric informó la noticia el jueves en rueda de prensa. "Es para que tengan

reuniones con todos los diferentes sectores para que puedan rectificar aquel informe que tiene muchas imprecisiones y que no es conveniente al gobierno porque no se ajusta a la verdad de los hechos", dijo.

El informe preliminar de la CIDH condenó "las masacres de Sacaba y Senkata, en las que se habrían cometido graves violaciones de los derechos humanos". Estos enfrentamientos dejaron 18 muertos, al parecer seguidores del expresidente Evo Morales que habrían fallecido por disparos de armas de fuego durante una incursión de las fuerzas del orden.

Longaric mencionó que el gobierno invitó a la CIDH a que realice una investigación que abarque de septiembre a diciembre, un mes antes y uno


después de la crisis poselectoral.

De acuerdo a un tuit de la comisión, la investigación será encabezada por el Grupo Independiente de Expertos Internacionales (GIEI), que la CIDH ha llevado a México ante la desaparición de los 41 estudiantes en 2014 y en Nicaragua en 2018.

Las 36 muertes reportadas se dieron antes y después de la renuncia del expresidente Evo Morales a raíz de las fallidas elecciones del 20 de octubre, en las que el exmandatario se declaró ganador.

Morales, presionado por las protestas que fueron apoyadas por policías y militares, se fue asilado a México y actualmente está refugiado en Argentina.

Se realizará una entrevista al pintor venezolano Doon Pérez, quien es arquitecto y músico de la ciudad de Barquisimeto, Venezuela. VUM es una organización sin fines de lucro establecida en el condado de Oakland, Michigan que realiza apoyo comunitario local en Lansing, proporcionando agua potable, o Detroit, con ropa y donaciones médicas; Puerto Rico, Texas y Ciudad de México, después de los devastadores huracanes de años anteriores con alimentos y ropa. Además, han enviado medicamentos, alimentos, pañales, fórmulas, etc., a Venezuela, entregados por Amigos de los Niños de Venezuela y el Programa de Ayuda Humanitaria para Venezuela, ambas organizaciones sin fines de lucro.

"Gracias a las ganancias de este tipo de eventos es cómo podemos proveer ayuda humanitaria a diferentes comunidades", destacó Alfred Navarro, quien recordó que UVM inició hace cinco años con el objetivo de ayudar a los venezolanos en los eventos que estaban y siguen ocurriendo en su país. Posteriormente, se convirtieron formalmente en una organización sin fines de lucro. Todo lo que se ha logrado ha sido gracias al trabajo desinteresado de la mesa directiva y el gran equipo de voluntarios que no solo otorgan su tiempo, sino en muchas ocasiones hasta su dinero para sacar adelante los proyectos.

De acuerdo con el Presidente de UVM, hay muchos venezolanos en Michigan. "Cuando hacemos este tipo de eventos viene gente de Grand Rapids, de Ohio y otros lugares más. Nos hemos reunido hasta 500 personas pero sabemos que hay muchos más; aunque no tenemos un número exacto".

a Venezuela: "Soy médico y llegue a Estados Unidos en el 2003. Cuando viví en Venezuela trabajé en diferentes lugares y tenía que comprar lo que necesitaba para mis pacientes porque ellos no podían conseguir inyecciones y hasta antibióticos, en este momento no se encuentra nada de eso. Actualmente, el 85% de venezolanos está en estado de pobreza, el 10% se ha ido del país en estos últimos 3 años. Los hospitales públicos que eran de la mejor calidad hace 20 años están pésimos. La facultad de medicina necesita \$500 dólares mensuales para poder subsistir y ha perdido sus profesores porque no pueden costear el sueldo, son muy pocos los que se

quedan para ayudar a los demás".

"Los que estamos lejos deseamos ayudar a nuestra familia, amigos y a la gente que lo necesita. Mi familia envía dinero a una prima para que compre harina pan y cuando salga a la calle lo entregue a los niños que están pidiendo dinero, así como a los abuelitos que están llegando del sur de Venezuela a las grandes ciudades para pedir dinero y comida. Sabemos que las donaciones que enviamos a diferentes barrios a través de organizaciones que trabajan directamente con barrios pobres, son un grano de arena pero es preferible eso que nada", concluyó.

• **New Amur Tiger at the Zoo**

Join the Zoo in welcoming *Titan*, the new male Amur tiger, to *Tiger Terrace*.

Titan is three and a half years old, weighs 370 pounds and came to Toledo from the *John Ball Zoo in Grand Rapids, Michigan*. He was born at the *Henry Doorly Zoo* in Omaha, Nebraska to mom, *Isabella* and dad, *Sasha*. The tiger's transfer was part of an Association of Zoos and Aquariums Species Survival Plan breeding recommendation.

Upon acclimation to his new home, *Titan* will be introduced to *Talya*, Toledo Zoo's resident eight-year old female tiger, with the hope of producing offspring to bolster the population of

this fascinating feline species. Amur tigers, (*Panthera tigris altaica*) also known as Siberian tigers, are the world's largest cats. The species averages 10 feet in length and can weigh 390 - 660 pounds. Each individual animal has a unique set of stripes that provide crucial camouflage. Listed on the IUCN Red List as Endangered, it is believed only 400 Amur tigers remain in a remote temperate forest of Far East Russia. Amur tigers are nocturnal hunters that prey on elk and boar; however, prey is becoming increasingly scarce. Other threats to the species include poaching for illegal wildlife trade and habitat loss.

To the Editor of La Prensa,

Let's be clear: The Trump administration has illegally trapped nearly 60,000 asylum-seekers in Mexico, and is forcing thousands more to wait for weeks and months to even apply. These attacks have broken with decades of bipartisan policy and are endangering vulnerable people who are looking for shelter at our doorstep.

On Tuesday, we'll be in court fighting one of Trump's several attempts to gut the asylum system. As we prepare, we want to share Julia's story with you.

'Julia' (a pseudonym) is a Nicaraguan teenager who fled her home after participating in student-led protests. On June 20, 2018, Julia was tear-gassed while peacefully marching in the streets. As she ran away, one of her friends was shot in the head and killed next to her.

As the government cracked down on protestors, her family was visited by men who said they were supporters of the government. They told her sister that they would kill Julia along with her entire family.

So, she went on the run.

Thinking that the U.S. would be a safe haven for her, she traveled to the border near El Paso, Texas, where she asked for asylum. There, she was placed into the "Migrant Protection Protocols" – also called "Remain in Mexico" – a new program unrolled this year that forces asylum-seekers who have reached the U.S. back to Mexico where they have to fend for themselves while awaiting their court dates in the U.S.

Now Julia is stuck in Ciudad Juarez, a city known for cartel-related violence and mysterious disappearances of young women.

Her story isn't unique. Across Mexico, people who have been placed into the MPP face insecurity, homelessness, and extreme danger. Human rights groups have documented a pattern of asylum-seekers being targeted for extortion and kidnapping by criminal groups – and even police officers – while they wait for their cases to be heard.

The MPP is illegal. The Trump administration is trying to make racism and xenophobia the law of the land, and frightened asylum-seekers at the southern border are one of its main targets.

But the ACLU is fighting back. We're in court challenging the MPP along with the other attacks on asylum-seekers the government has tried to implement.

ICE, IRS search Super Mercado Jalisco supermarkets on sacred day when 'Our Lady of Guadalupe' is celebrated

ATLANTA, Dec. 12, 2019 (AP): Federal agents executed search warrants at multiple branches of a Hispanic grocery chain in the Atlanta area and took three people into custody on Thursday, an official said.

Agents from U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement were working alongside the IRS at six Super Mercado Jalisco locations, said ICE spokesman Lindsay Williams.

In a statement, he said

agents took three people into custody who "had reentered the U.S. after being previously removed." Two of the immigrants were from Guatemala, while one was from Mexico. Officials did not release further details.

Super Mercado Jalisco has seven locations in the Atlanta areas, according to its website. Georgia state corporation records show that members of two families, the Pelayo and Covarrubia

families, serve as officers of the company. The families also control produce, insurance and real estate businesses that trade under the name of Jalisco, the records show.

Jalisco is a Mexican state and common point of origin for many Mexican immigrants to the United States. Locations include Duluth, Lawrenceville, Marietta, Norcross and Roswell, according to state records.

Bush: GOP can't let 'racist' episodes slide

AUSTIN, Texas, Dec. 12, 2019 (AP): George P. Bush, the son of former Florida Gov. Jeb Bush, who was a presidential candidate in 2016.

of former President George H.W. Bush, who died last year, and the member of the Bush dynasty still in public office, condemned Thursday recurring episodes of what he described as racist or hateful rhetoric within the Texas GOP, and ripped what he called false accusations fanned by his Hispanic heritage.

Bush, Texas' land commissioner, first denounced a white GOP state legislator who suggested "Asian" challenges on the ballot in 2020 were motivated by race. He then joined others Saturday in calling for the resignation of a Republican county chairwoman near Houston who used a racial slur in a text message about a black party organizer.

But his latest rebuke was personal: in a tweet Wednesday, Bush questioned whether critics had falsely accused him of plotting to erect a statue of Santa Anna—the Mexican general whose troops killed Texas independence fighters at the Alamo in San Antonio in 1836—because his mother, Columba Bush, was born in Mexico. He called the accusation "flat out racist."

Bush is the grandson

and email seeking comment. Bush said he has "let a lot slide" from critics, adding he has reported some threatening posts on social media to state police. "When you call (out) somebody's loyalty, patriotism or use racist or hateful rhetoric, it's just not productive. And, you know, unfortunately, it feeds into the narrative of what we've seen this past week where I've had to call out fellow Republicans," he said.

As the only Hispanic elected statewide official in Texas who isn't a judge, Bush said he has felt compelled in recent weeks to speak out. Republicans' decades-long grip on Texas weakened in 2018 and party leaders have stressed a need to connect with more minority voters.

"If you just let statements like this in 2019 slide, I think it sets a bad precedent heading into 2020," Bush said. Bush was first elected land commissioner in 2014. On Monday, his 33-year-old cousin, Pierce Bush, announced his first run for public office, jumping into a crowded Republican primary race for a congressional seat in suburban Houston.

The post offers no evidence that Bush plans to erect such a statue. A leader of the group is Rick Range, who unsuccessfully challenged Bush in last year's Republican primary and opposes the Alamo project. Range did not immediately respond Thursday to a phone call





Kasandra Hernández: scholarships lead to Tri-C Degree and 'Growing' Career Prospects

CLEVELAND, Dec. 17, 2019: A colorful array of scholarship announcements speckle the message board posted for students in the Plant Science and Landscape Technology program at Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C®).

Kasandra Hernández always noticed the fliers as she walked by on her way to class. Finally, after a year, she "found the gung-ho" to apply.

The scholarships that followed paid for her college education.

Ms. Hernández graduated from Tri-C this month with an Associate of Applied Science degree and professional certificates in landscape horticulture and landscape contracting. She leaves the College with a flawless 4.0 GPA.

Along the way, she won scholarships from the Irrigation Foundation, the Ohio Landscape Association, the Ohio Nursery and Landscape Association, Proven Winners, STIHL and the Tree Research and Education Endowment (TREE) Fund, among others.

The 24-year-old also received a Presidential Scholarship and KeyBank Hispanic Scholarship through the Cuyahoga Community

College Foundation.

"These scholarships have meant so much," Ms. Hernández said. "For someone to see potential in me... that's just an incredible feeling. You work harder knowing that people believe in your abilities."

Ms. Hernández enrolled at Tri-C in 2016, two years after graduating near the top of her class at Green High School near Akron. A debilitating illness that required surgery created the gap in her studies.

Her long recovery led Ms. Hernández to Tri-C's Eastern Campus in Highland Hills, where she could start taking classes a short drive from home.

An opportunity to shadow a horticulture class at the campus introduced her to the College's Plant Science and Landscape Technology program. The field meshed her interest in science with a love of being outdoors.

She immediately excelled in the nationally recognized program. Her success in the classroom brought get-your-hands-dirty internships with Willoway Nurseries in Avon and Hemlock Landscapes in Geauga County.

One of her instructors, *Anna De Toro*, then pointed her toward an opportunity with the research division of Davey. She currently



works as a lab assistant for the Kent-based tree company.

"Tri-C has done wonders for me," Ms. Hernández said. "People at the College always pushed me to be better. I knew I had their support."

Ms. Hernández shared her Tri-C story from the stage Dec. 17, 2019 at the College's Fall Commencement, where she served as student speaker. Classmates selected her for the honor. Nearly 1,800 students graduated in addition to Ms. Hernández.

Following graduation, she intends to continue her studies at *The Ohio State University* to pursue a bachelor's degree in sustainable plant systems with an emphasis in horticulture. Ms. Hernández earned enough in scholarships to cover her first year at OSU.

Ohio Scholarship Program helps Tri-C strengthen the Technology Workforce

Dec. 12, 2019: Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C®) has been awarded a *Choose Ohio First* grant to provide computer science scholarships and strengthen the state's workforce in technology-related fields. The new scholarship program was announced today by Lt. Governor Jon Husted and Ohio Department of Higher Education Chancellor Randy Gardner. Tri-C is among 35 colleges and universities across the state receiving funding.

Choose Ohio First began in 2008 as a way to increase the number of Ohio students enrolling in and successfully completing science,

technology, engineering, math and medicine (STEMM) programs at the state's public and independent colleges and universities.

This new initiative within the program reflects a focused strategy to increase enrollment and completion in technology-related fields such as coding and cybersecurity. Tri-C was awarded \$104,960 to support computer science students.

"The *Choose Ohio First* program is one of our state's best tools to increase the number of students preparing to work in STEMM-related fields," Husted said. "In today's technology-infused economy, every industry

and business has important tech-focused jobs, and training Ohioans for careers in those positions is key to growing our economy."

Community colleges and public and independent four-year colleges and universities are receiving funds. Gardner said this range of school participation demonstrates the commitment of Ohio's higher education community to respond to student interests and the state's economic needs.

An estimated 1,400 Ohio students will benefit, boosting state efforts to build a talent pipeline to the leading technology occupations.

Tri-C Encore Campus Fridays Opens Registration for Next Two Sessions

Winter and spring classes offer educational opportunities for adults aged 55 and older

CLEVELAND, Dec. 13, 2019: The Encore Campus Fridays program at Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C®) begins new sessions of classes in January and March to enrich the minds and lives of those aged 55 and older.

The winter program begins Jan. 24 and runs every Friday for seven weeks at three locations: Eastern Campus in Highland Hills, Western Campus in Parma and Westshore Campus in Westlake.

Age-eligible students can enroll in one to six courses for one low fee of \$99. The 50-minute classes take place between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.

A seven-week spring session will take place at

the three sites beginning March 20.

Want to take classes but can't make it to Encore Campus Fridays? Check out Tri-C's Neighborhood Scholars 55+ adult education courses, which take place at College sites as well as museums, parks and

other locations around Greater Cleveland.

Neighborhood Scholars includes tours to experience restaurants, landmarks and churches; "Coffee with a Curator" sessions, which provide behind-the-scenes looks at exhibits and collections at University Circle institutions; and hands-on classes such as jewelry making.

These alternate-site classes occur throughout the week and vary in length. Costs range from \$10 to \$79 per class.

CLEVELAND 20/20: A snapshot of our city now

DECEMBER 13, 2019: How do you describe Cleveland? Cleveland 20/20: A Photographic Exploration of Cleveland, an exhibition partnership project of the Cleveland Public Library and the Cleveland Print Room, explores the diverse city—full of life, culture and history.

Cleveland Public Library welcomes the public to the opening on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Monday, January 20, 2020, at 4:30 p.m. in Brett Hall, on the first floor of Main Library in downtown Cleveland.

"The exhibition is a celebration of Cleveland. The culmination of a community effort to document our city's story through words and images, it's a larger than life thank you card to the community for supporting the Library for 150 years," said Aaron Mason, Director of Outreach and Programming Services of Cleveland Public Library.

Cleveland 20/20 consists of nearly 200 photographs with four central themes: water, leisure, intimate moments, and geography. "The exhibition presents 25 points of view of Cleveland, interwoven in groupings that evoke the texture of urban life at various intersections, monuments, and neighborhoods—some familiar, others not," said exhibition curator Lisa Kurzner. Kurzner's port-



folio as an independent curator includes the Cleveland Museum of Art, moCa Cleveland and FRONT International in 2018.

"The project turns an historical archive into a curatorial time capsule. The photographs show the realness of Cleveland that is often taken for granted," explains Shari Wilkins, Executive Director of the Cleveland Print Room.

There are 25 amateur and professional photographers who spent nine months chronicling the people, the places, and the true grit of the city in color and in black and white: *Tim Arai, Enahjae Beasley, Stephen Bivens, Bridget Caswell, Matthew Chasney, Hadley K. Conner, Destanee Cruz, Billy Delfs, Shelly Duncan, Maria Fallon, Aja Grant, Diana Hlywiak, Da'Shaunae Jackson, Adam Jaenke, Jef Janis, Felix Latimer, Daniel*

Levin, Greg Martin, Christopher Mason, Gabrielle Murray, Owen Rodemann, Ruddy Roye, Michael Tsegaye, and Shari Wilkins.

Cleveland 20/20 also features extended contributions by *Ruddy Roye*, a nationally recognized photographer based in New York, whose Cleveland visits yielded a group of impassioned images of street life made in several city neighborhoods. Robert Banks, a Cleveland filmmaker, presents a new film of *Roye* working; catching the photographer interacting with his subjects.

"The photographers captured Cleveland as we know it. We invite people to visit the Main Library to see the exhibition and experience the raw truth and emotion of the subjects. It is history in still form," Mason remarks. Cleveland Public Li-

brary will preserve the images compiled for Cleveland 20/20 in its Photographs Collection, which currently holds 1.3 million photographs, most from the mid-1800s to the 1990s.

In addition to the Cleveland 20/20 photography project in Brett Hall, 90.3 WCPN ideastream will display its CPL150 Storytelling Project, a collection of audio and video stories highlighting the diversity, passions and hopes of those who call Cleveland home.

Sector del turismo en Cuba se resiente por sanciones de EEUU

LA HABANA, 12 XII 19 (AP): Cuba atrajo en lo que va de 2019 a cuatro millones de turistas, una cifra que muestra el impacto de los obstáculos impuestos por Estados Unidos para los viajes de sus nacionales a la isla.

En un mensaje en su cuenta de Twitter el ministro de Turismo de la nación caribeña, *Manuel Marrero Cruz*, informó el número de visitantes internacionales alcanzado esta semana a "pesar del recrudecimiento del bloqueo de los Estados Unidos que impacta directamente en el turismo cubano".

El turismo es uno de los sectores más dinámicos de la isla con ingresos por unos 3.000 millones de dólares anuales y se convirtió en el foco de atención de las políticas de la administración del presidente estadounidense Donald Trump, cuyo objetivo es asfixiar la economía cubana para presionar un cambio de modelo político.

Justamente el martes entró en vigor la prohibición de Washington para que las líneas aéreas procedentes de Estados Unidos aterricen en destinos diferentes a La Habana, como lo venían haciendo.

También a mediados de este año prohibió el arribo de cruceros e impuso limitaciones a las condiciones para los viajes de sus nacionales a Cuba.

Los cruceros que comenzaron a arribar en 2016 a la isla luego del deshielo iniciado por el expresidente Barack Obama, que ahora desmontó Trump, se habían convertido en la modalidad favorita de los visitantes de ese país con un total de 142.721 personas en el primer cuatrimestre de 2019 -antes del cierre-, un incremento de más de 300% respecto del mismo periodo de 2018.

Al momento de la suspensión la Asociación Internacional de Líneas de Cruceros indicó que había 800.000 reservas que se cancelarían para cruceros a Cuba de las principales navieras con asiento en Estados Unidos.

Ya en agosto las cifras oficiales mostraban la tendencia a la baja en el turismo y las autoridades informaron que no se alcanzarían los cinco millones de visitantes previstos para este año. El 2018 se cerró con 4,7 millones de visitantes.

Gerwig comparte como aumentó la vitalidad de “Mujercitas”

NUEVA YORK (AP): La primera película que *Greta Gerwig* vio en un cine fue “*Muppets Take Manhattan*” (“Los muppets toman Nueva York”). Cuando terminó, sus padres no podían encontrarla, había salido corriendo al frente de la sala para poner sus manos en la pantalla.

“Pensé que podía meterme en ella”, dice Gerwig.

Como cineasta, Gerwig a menudo ha estado en pantalla o fuera de ella. En “*Frances Ha*” de 2012, que coescribió, hizo el papel de una bailarina de 27 años de Sacramento que se asegura una posición en Nueva York—una historia no muy distinta a la suya. Su debut semiautobiográfico como única directora, “*Lady Bird*” de 2017, es una especie de precuela de “*Frances Ha*”, transcurre en una escuela secundaria en Sacramento con una joven con ambiciones artísticas.

En su más reciente película, “*Little Women*” (“*Mujercitas*”), Gerwig adaptó la novela de *Louisa May Alcott* de 1868 sobre las hermanas de la familia March, pero también añadió nuevos niveles de significado que no están en el libro. Jo March

(interpretada por Saoirse Ronan en el filme), la aspirante a escritora, era de por sí una versión de Alcott, que ajustó para que encajara con las demandas del público. Alcott le encontró un marido para el final del libro, pero luego deseó que Jo hubiera terminado siendo “una solterona literaria”.

En la versión de Gerwig, la séptima de “*Mujercitas*” en la gran pantalla, Jo se convierte en una síntesis del personaje, de Alcott y de Gerwig, llevando la lucha de una mujer escritora del siglo XIX en Nueva Inglaterra al tiempo presente.

En un ventoso día de otoño el mes pasado, Gerwig se sentó con la AP en Tribeca para discutir, con una taza de té, las muchas capas en su “*Mujercitas*”. La película se estrena en Navidad en Estados Unidos.

AP: *Cada fotograma está tan lleno de vida en “Mujercitas”. ¿Cómo le diste tanta vitalidad?*

Gerwig: No quería que fuera hermoso a costas de ser real. Pero sí quería que se sintiera como que uno deseaba saltar y vivir ahí o comerse el filme. Recuerdo que traté de explicarle eso al iluminador y me dijo, “¿Que quieres qué?” Le

dije, “Quiero que el público quiera comérselo. Quiero que se sienta que está volando a la velocidad de la vida”.

AP: *La película tiene una linda conexión con “Frances Ha”, que incluye una escena memorable en la que corres por Nueva York. “Mujercitas” comienza con Jo corriendo por la ciudad.*

Gerwig: Durante mi investigación de Louisa May Alcott me tropecé con del dato de que era una corredora. Corría todos los días por los bosques de Concord. De hecho, rodé un montón de tomas de Saoirse corriendo por el bosque, pero no terminaron encajando en la película, lo cual me entristece. Pero pensé: qué perfecto. A Louisa May Alcott le encantaba correr y yo puedo hacer esto y es algo que vale comentar al pie de página y es también exactamente algo que siempre me ha interesado. Se sintió de lo más moderno capturar a una mujer más rápida de lo que pensamos que tienen permitido moverse.

AP: *¿Cómo explicarías la relación que sentiste entre tú y Jo?*

Gerwig: Me interesaba hacer algo cubista y que honrara este caleidoscopio de autoría. Parte de lo que

quería hacer con la construcción era encontrar al autor en todas partes — encontrar al autor como Jo, encontrar al autor como yo, encontrar al autor como Saoirse. Hay todo este desdoblamiento de seres. Es Louisa escribiendo a Jo. Soy yo escribiendo a Louisa escribiendo a Jo. Es Saoirse interpretando a Jo interpretando a Louisa interpretando mis diálogos. Hay comunicación entre nosotras cuatro. Los (filósofos) trascendentalistas... pensaban de esa manera. Walt Whitman dijo, “Yo contengo multitudes”.

AP: *Tus personajes parecen más cercanos a ti. Estás viviendo la vida que ellos aspiran.*

Gerwig: Sí, ¡puede que eso sea verdad! Aunque puedo darme el lujo de hacer películas, que es lo que siempre quise hacer, la conexión más profunda para mí siempre será con la persona que quería hacer eso, no la persona que lo está haciendo. Y la gente del espectáculo en general, uno tiene que construir un castillo de nuevo cada vez. Existe esa sensación de que no hay garantías de que alguien vendrá. Uno es una máquina de sueños, una máquina de humo, así que está presente la sensación de: no sé si nada de esto es real. Supongo que sólo quiero decir que me identifico más con la luchadora, todavía. Y aún

no puedo creer que puedo hacer esto del todo. Siento que me estoy robando estas películas, que alguien me va a tocar el hombro y me va a decir, “disculpe, señora, ¿puede acompañarnos? Usted no es una directora”.

AP: *Pero obviamente estás hecha para esto.*

Gerwig: Me encanta. Lo amo tanto. Más que cualquier otra cosa que haya hecho, de principio a fin. Todavía me siento como una cineasta joven, aunque tengo 36 años, aunque he estado haciendo películas de una manera u otra por 15 años. Todavía siento que estoy comenzando, con suerte, para hacer la obra que lograré hacer.
